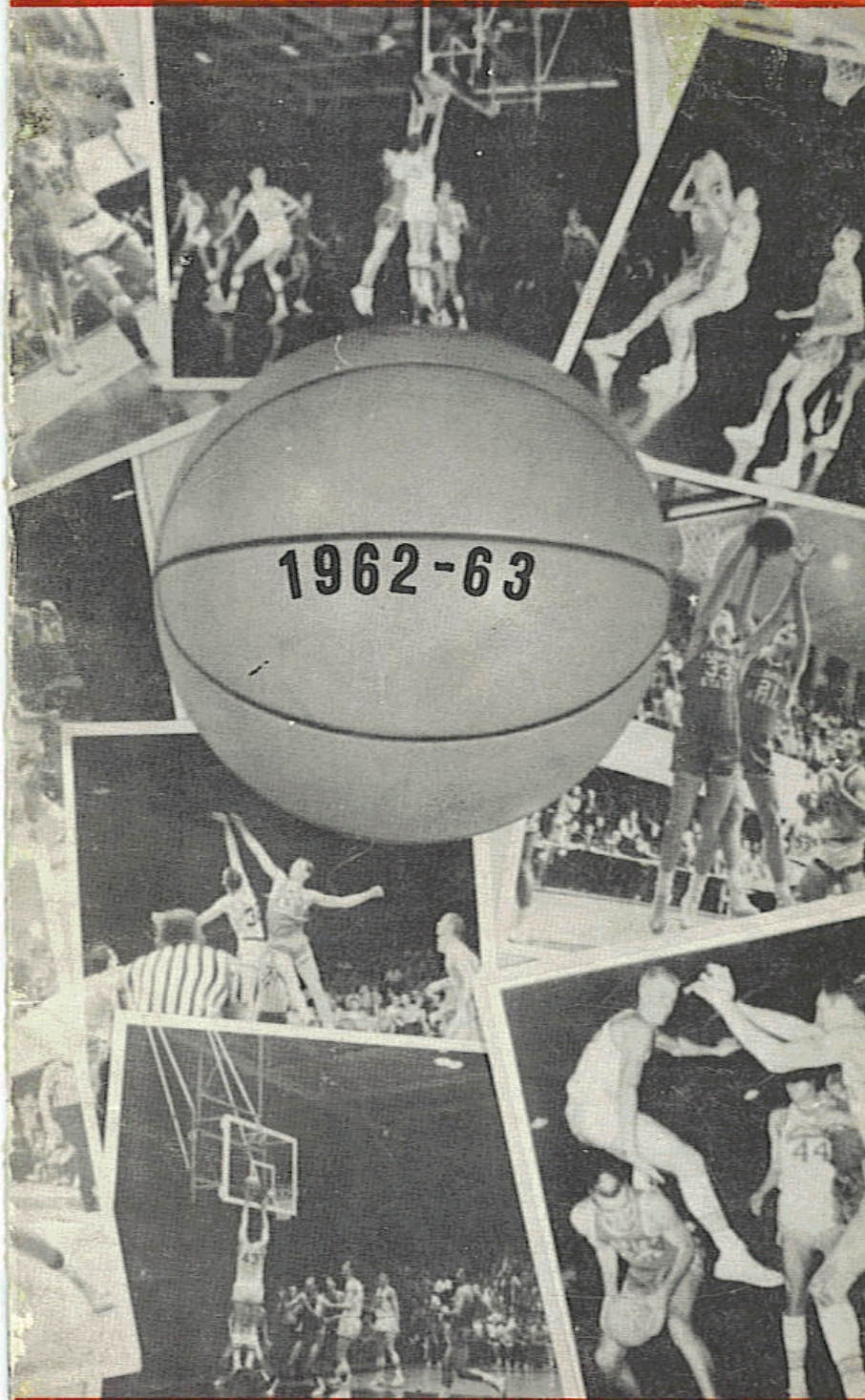

Vaughn Mancha

Start naming those sports figures who are known almost anywhere they wander, and one of them is certain to be Florida State's dynamic athletic director: Vaughn Mancha.

Mancha has been an All-American and a professional as a football player, a successful small college coach, an equally successful assistant coach at two different schools, and--since coming back to Florida State in November of 1959--a hard driving director of athletics.

Born in Sugar Valley, Georgia, in 1921, Mancha went on to become one of the most legendary football figures in the University of Alabama's history--making everybody's All-American team at center. For four seasons he was All-Southeastern Conference in Football.

He was such a standout in the 1945 Sugar Bowl that he was named to the All-Time Sugar Bowl team(1945-52 period). And in 1955 he was named to Alabama's All-Time Crimson Tide.

He sandwiched a year of play with the professional Boston Yankees in 1948 while earning his B. S. and M. A. degrees at Alabama. In 1949 he went to Livingston (Ala.) State as the head coach and athletic director for three years.

Mancha first came to Florida State in 1952 as an assistant football coach and an assistant professor of physical education. In 1957, he left for Columbia, where he became a coach and--at the same time--completed all work for his Doctorate with the exception of the dissertation.

*J K "Bud" Kennedy*

Before the 1962-63 basketball season was to get underway, a silver haired gentleman with a wheat farmer twang was propped in the basketball office at Florida State viewing films of the 1948-49 Seminoles in action.

"Would you look at that?" he cracked to an assistant. "That used to be basketball. Can you believe it?"

J. K. "Bud" Kennedy wasn't trying to slur the players who performed for him on his first team at FSU 14 years ago. He was simply establishing the fact that times certainly have changed since he moved onto the Semonole scene.

Kennedy's first squad, of course, was the one in 1948-9 which finished the season with a 12-12 record. Two years later, he had the Seminoles in the NAIB (later NAIA) Tournament. And FSU basketball hasn't slowed down since. Kennedy's 14 year record as a FSU coach is 177 wins against 163 losses.

Bud was born at Lawrence, Kansas--the state which has produced many basketball greats. He attended the University of Kansas, Baker University, and Kansas State Teachers College, playing basketball at all three schools. He was a standout football player at Baker and Kansas State Teachers.

His first coaching experience before leaving college was at San Diego, California, where he played and coached the Athletic Club for two years. Through his next few years, Kennedy coached various high school teams in the midwest. Then he went into the Navy and did coaching there too as a Naval officer.

Kennedy's first appointment at Florida State was as the Athletic Business Manager in 1948. He assisted in the basketball program that year, and became the head coach the following season.

Hugh Durham is beginning his third year as assistant varsity basketball coach at Florida State University.

Before he became assistant varsity coach, Durham spent one year as the Frosh coach and his boys compiled a very fine 8-1 record. His three big guns on that team will figure to be the big men for the varsity this year. They are Dale Reeves, Charlie Long and Dale Ricketts.

Before coaching, Hugh was a star standout on the Seminoles and holds the record for most points scored in one game. He is without question one of the finest guards in Seminole history.

Hugh is married and has one son, who someday hopes to be able to fill his daddy's shoes.

Joe Williams, a 28-year old Oklahoman, is in his first year as Florida State's freshman basketball coach. He was named to the post last summer after guiding Jacksonville's Ribault High to the conference championship in his first year as head coach.

Williams attended Oklahoma City College and was graduated from Southern Methodist University. He had been a prep star in both football and basketball in Muskogee and Durant, Oklahoma.

As the coach at Ribault High, Williams strongly advocated three basics: hustle, defense, and fundamentals--the same three used at FSU. And he has his work cut out at Florida State: last year's frosh team finished 16-4 and was called the best in school history.

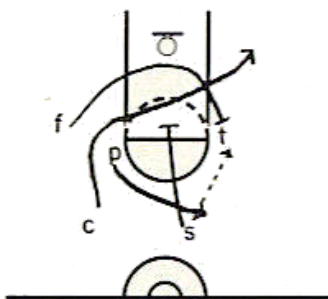
# OUTLOOK FOR 1962-63

Coach Bud Kennedy is optimistic about the coming season though he won't have the overall experience he has had in the past. Three of the starting five from last year's squad have graduated. Coach expects big things from his two returning starters, Charlie Long and Dale Ricketts. Along with Junior Dale Reeves, they should carry the load. Seven Sophomores will be trying for the remaining starting births along with three other Juniors. The team spirit has never been higher and the boys are ready for a good season. They will be out to defend their field goal percentage (51.2) which led the nation last season. Armed with their Seminole System, the Florida State basketball players are ready to do so. From the looks of the Seminoles' 26 game schedule, loaded with vengeful opponents ready to battle, they will have to stay on the war path all season long.

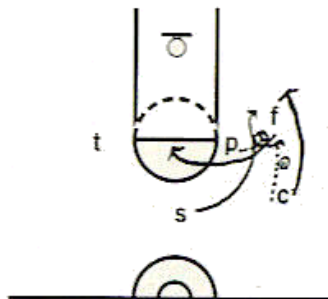
## Seminole System

For the past two years Florida State University has come up with an amazing field goal percentage. Leading the nation during the 1961-62 season, the Seminoles hit on 51.2% of their shots from the floor. To find the answer to this tremendous shooting, we consulted Coach Bud Kennedy. First he set the record straight by stating that the Seminoles have been blessed with some outstanding shooters the past few seasons, but there have also been some offensive changes. Kennedy continued by saying, "In revamping the offense the coaching staff has taken some of the strong points of several offenses, blending the Drake Shuffle with the standard single post." This combination has formed the "Seminole System". The following diagrams help to explain one option from each.

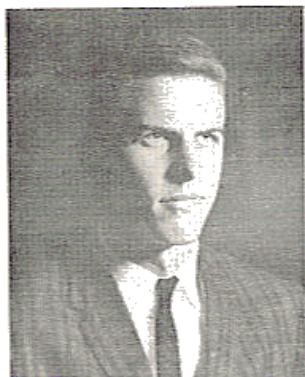
**Wally Dale No 41 G — 6-0 176 jr**
