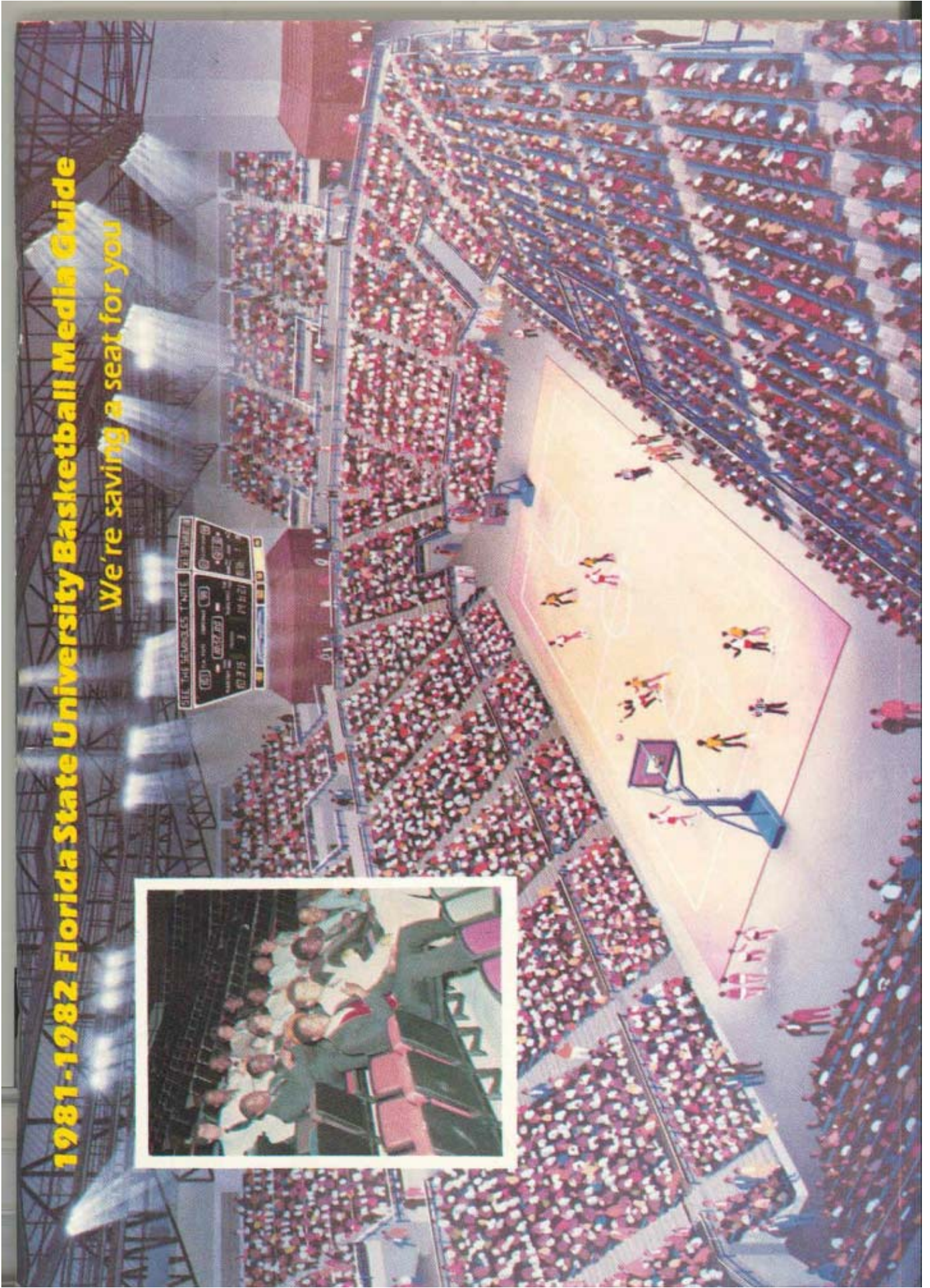

## **MEDIA INFORMATION**

Florida State University's 1981-82 Basketball Guide has been designed for use by the news media and Seminole fans. Any questions not covered in this brochure can be directed to the Florida State Sports Information Office.

All requests for working press, radio, television, photographers or scouting credentials should be made to FSU Sports Information Director Mark Carlson at least one week prior to the playing date.

**WORKING MEDIA** — Working media will be admitted to the Tall, Leon Co. Civic Center and will be permitted to take their seats at courtside. Tickets may be picked up prior to the game, or held at the Will Call Window.

Requests will be evaluated and credentials issued according to the following criteria.

- a. Local metropolitan press; wire services; national publications; opposing metropolitan press; student newspaper.
- b. Other daily newspapers
- c. Radio and television personnel not actually broadcasting
- d. Non-daily newspapers
- e. Scouts

**PARKING** — To the east of Center and surrounding areas. Press parking will be issued on a first-come first-serve basis.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS** — Accredited photographers upon presenting photo pass will be allowed to shoot under both baskets. NO freelance photographer will be permitted to shoot under the basket.

**TELEVISION** — Facilities are available for both local and network broadcasts. Please have your request prepared several weeks prior to the expected broadcast.

**RADIO** — Sections are reserved for both Florida State and opposing radio in the radio booth. FSU grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on a reciprocal basis.

**PHONES** — Telephone service should be secured directly through Centel Telephone Company of Tallahassee, Florida. Call 904/222-2236. Have them contact the Sports Information Office for location.

**SERVICES** — Half-time stats plus running play-by-play will be provided to the media. Final stats and a final running will also be available following the conclusion of the game.

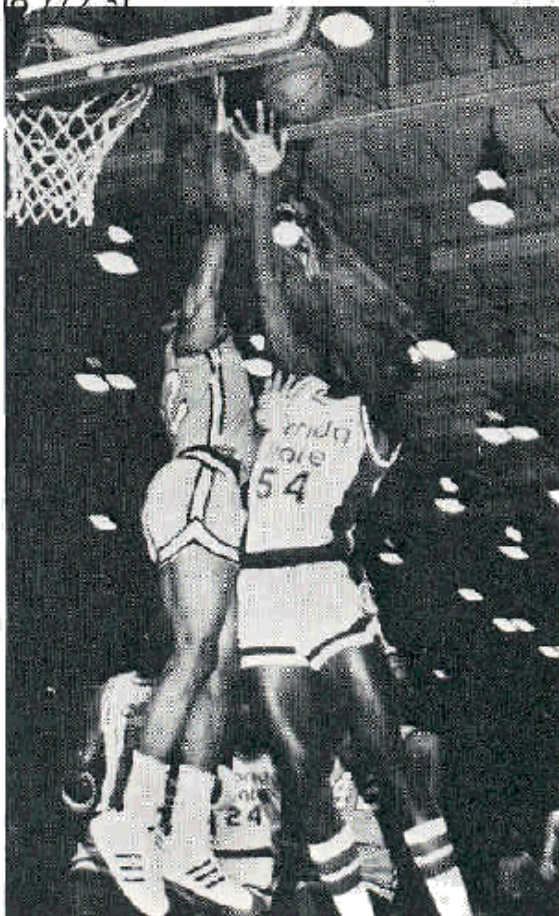

## 1981-82 Season Outlook

"We're counting the days until November. Our players are excited, the coaches are excited and we'll be moving into a new coliseum. I hope it's going to be a fun year for Florida State basketball."

So says FSU fourth year coach Joe Williams. And, while the Seminoles return only one starter from last year's 17-11 squad, expectations run high.

Last season, the Tribe ended six games over .500 and finished second in the Metro Conference. Lost from that team are starters Mickey Dillard (18.3/3.5), Elvis Rolle (15.9/9.1), Kris Anderson (10.1/7.6) and Bobby Parks (6.7/2.3).



While FSU will not boast the senior experience from last year, a combination of returning veterans and newcomers should provide the necessary depth.

Back from last year is starter James Bozeman (10.2/3.8) who was used as a forward, but is expected to switch to guard. Also returning are reserves Oren Gilmore (3.2/2.3), and Pernel Tookes (4.0/2.1).

Sitting out redshirt season's last year, but eligible in 1981 are Clemson transfers Scott Wilkes and Mitchell Wiggins, UNC Charlotte player Michael Johnson and former Georgia center Bobby Miles.

In what Williams describes as "my best recruiting year ever at Florida State," the team added four freshmen and two junior college players. The freshmen include guards Booney Crawford and Maunce Myrick, forward David Speights and center Raphael Phillip. From the junior colleges come guards Tony William and Ronnie Watson.

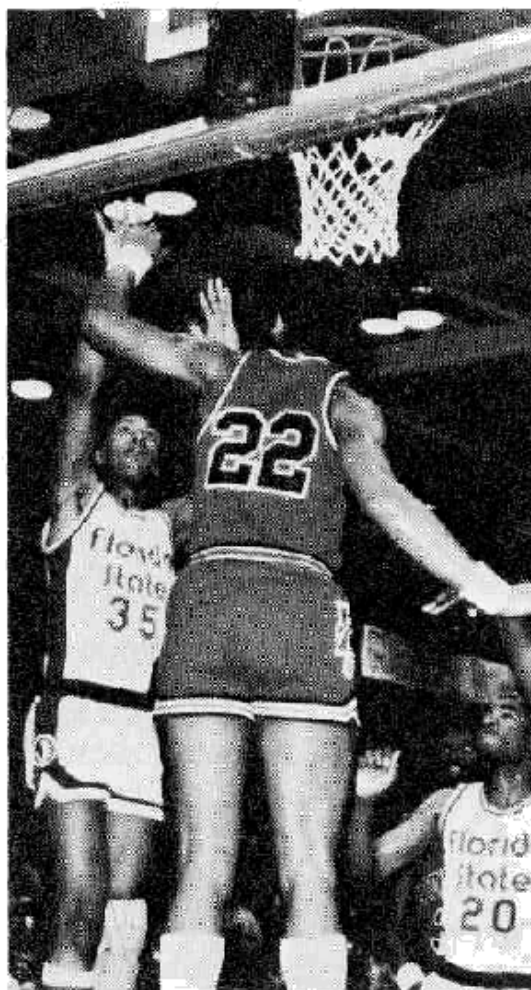
The Tribe will team up William, Watson, Crawford, Young and Wilkes at the point guard, Bozeman, Myrick and Wilkes at the second guard, Wiggins, Myrick and Johnson at the wing, Speights, Tookes, Johnson and Miles at the high post and Gilmore, Phillip and Miles at the low post.

"This team's top attributes are its quickness and ability to shoot," Williams said. "It's a very young team,

but I expect it to be a very sound ballclub by January.

"I'm expecting our incoming players and the players that are eligible this year to make an immediate impact. It will take dedication and team leadership to make things happen. This team has no real superstars, but we're hoping that several players will come through and play for us."

The Seminoles will get the opportunity to show off their new home November 29, when basketball comes to the newly opened Tallahassee Leon County Civic Center (12,500).



## Joe Williams Head Basketball Coach

In his fourth season at the Seminole basketball helm, Florida State head coach Joe Williams has already left his mark at the Tallahassee school as his three predecessors before him.

A native of Morton, Mississippi, Williams accepted the task of guiding the nationally-touted Seminole program in 1978 after previous coaching stints at Jacksonville and Furman where his teams combined for a 234-148 record.

Williams best year with the Tribe was his second campaign when the squad finished with a 22-9 record including a second place Metro finish and a berth in the NCAA Mideast Regionals.

Last season, the Tribe finished 17-11 making Williams' coaching record



292-178 (.621) over a 17 year span. At FSU, Williams is 58-30 (.659) in three seasons.

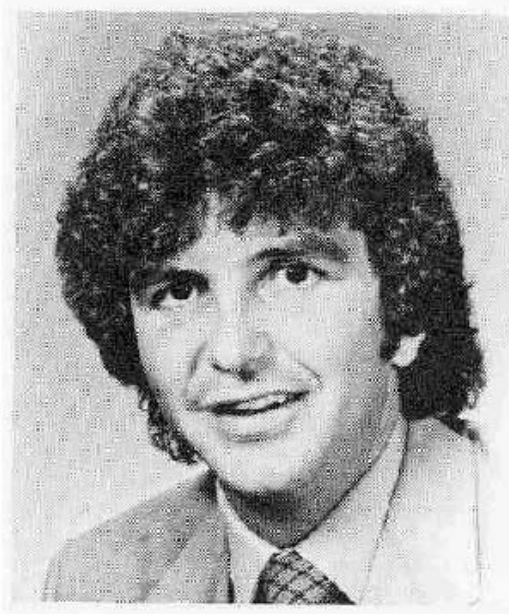

Florida State was Williams first collegiate coaching assignment in 1962 when he was freshman coach for the late Bud Kennedy. He advanced to Furman in 1963 as an assistant coach before taking the top job at Jacksonville in 1964.

During his first season at Jacksonville, the Dolphins advanced to the NAIA national playoffs, and five years later Jacksonville was in the NCAA finals finishing that year 27-2. Williams finished his stint at JU with an amazing 92-61 mark.

He returned to Furman in the 1970-71 season and was to become the schools winningest coach. Williams led the Paladins to a 142-87 record and won the Southern Conference title five times advancing to the NCAA playoffs. When the Seminoles advanced to the NCAA playoffs in 1979-80, Williams became only the second coach ever to take three separate teams to the NCAA.

Williams played basketball under Abe Lemon (currently head coach at Texas) at Oklahoma City University. He received his bachelor's degree from SMU in 1957 and earned his master's from Florida in 1968. Williams and his wife Wendy enjoy fishing, sailing and traveling.



## Rex Morgan

Assistant Basketball Coach

Florida State assistant coach Rex Morgan begins his second season on the FSU basketball staff.

Morgan, who played under head coach Joe Williams from 1968-70 at Jacksonville averaged 23 points per game as a guard and helped lead the Dolphins to the NCAA basketball finals against UCLA in 1970. An All-America in 1969, Morgan was named to the Florida All-Decade team and was selected as the Florida Basketball Man of the Year his senior season.

Following graduation Morgan played three seasons with the Boston Celtics (1970-73) before joining Tom Wasdin's staff at JU for one season. Morgan was formerly head coach of the AAU National team that finished 56-0. He was also a former commissioner for the Junior Pro Basketball Association.

Morgan will be charged with recruiting and game day operations. Rex and his wife, Walda, have a daughter, Lyndsay.





## **Steve Williams**

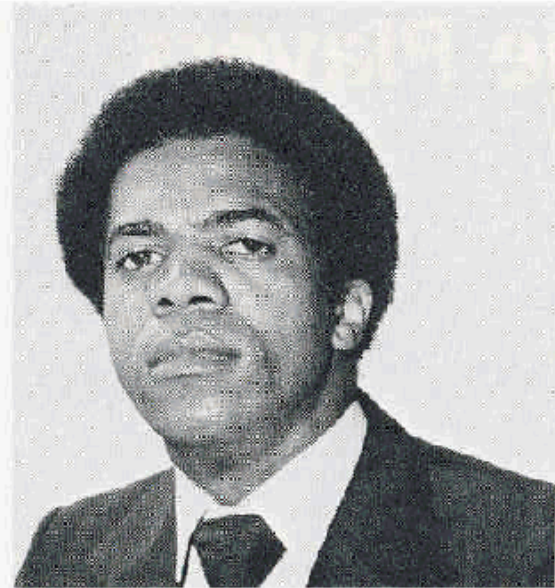
**Assistant Basketball Coach**

Seminole assistant coach Steve Williams returns to the Florida State staff for his second season. Williams was the former coach of AAAA champion Pensacola Washington High School.

Williams first made a name for himself in the state where he was voted to the All-SEC freshman team and earned Most Valuable Player honors. He again made All-SEC his sophomore season and concluded his career making the All-Conference defensive team and winning the Don Fleming Award as Florida's outstanding captain.

Williams' first assignment out of college was Newberry (Fla.) High School where he guided the team to a 17-2 record while establishing himself as the youngest basketball coach in the school's history. In 1976 he led Washington High to a 17-12 record, but followed the next year with a 29-5 report card and a semifinal berth in the state championship. Bridesmaid status was again Pensacola's fate in 1978 and 1979 when the teams finished 22-11 and 25-3 respectively. In 1980, Pensacola went 23-7 and won the state crown.

A 1974 graduate of Florida, Williams is charged with recruiting and day-to-day practice sessions. Steve and his wife, Harriet, are expecting a child in December.



## **Frank Gilmore**

**Part-Time Assistant**

Beginning his fourth season as a member of Joe Williams' coaching staff, Frank Gilmore remains involved in the daily practice sessions, weight training and academic counseling.

Gilmore, who played professional basketball in Europe, returned to the United States in 1978 as the Seminoles' part-time assistant coach.

Gilmore, the younger brother of former Jacksonville University All-American and Chicago Bull star Artis Gilmore and older brother of Seminole Oren Gilmore, played two years in Karkkila, Finland, and one season in Salo, Finland, before accepting his present post at Florida State.

Playing a strong guard position, Gilmore played two years at Martin (Tennessee) Junior College before completing his collegiate career at the College of Charleston. At Charleston, he was selected All-Conference in 1973.

A bachelor, Gilmore is a native of Panama City, Fla., and is currently working on his degree at Florida State.

# The Metro Conference

Six years ago, the Metropolitan Collegiate Athletic Conference was the new kid on the college basketball block.

Now, known simply as the Metro to fans, friends and foes alike, it boasts the 1979-80 NCAA basketball champion Louisville Cardinals and continues to be one of the nation's top basketball conferences.

Metro Commissioner Larry Albus envisioned the league while he was the Director of Athletics at St. Louis University. His dream became a reality in June, 1975, when six schools—Cincinnati, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Memphis State, St. Louis and Tulane—announced they had officially joined the Metro Conference.

In 1976, the Metro expanded to bring Florida State into the fold. When Georgia Tech relinquished its Metro membership after the 1977-78 season, the league wasted no time filling the void with Virginia Tech which went to the NCAA tournament in 1976, 1979 and 1980 and won the National Invitational Tournament in 1973 and returned to the NIT in 1977.

Metro schools have played an active role in national post season tournaments the last six years sending a pair of teams to the NCAA Basketball Tournament the last four of five years and three teams in 1980—Cincinnati and Memphis State in 1976, Louisville and Cincinnati in 1977, Florida State and Louisville in 1978, Virginia Tech and Louisville in 1979, Florida State, Virginia Tech and champion Louisville in 1980 and Louisville in 1981. In addition, the Metro had a representative at the NIT in 1976 (Louisville) and 1977 (Memphis State).

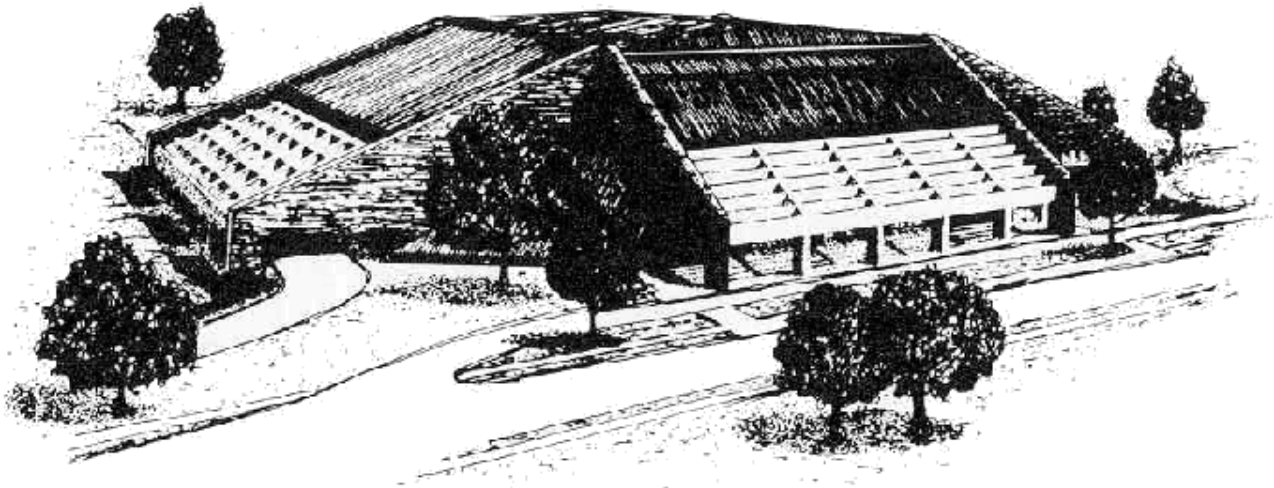
The Metro conducts a post season tournament each year to determine its representative in the NCAA Tournament. This year's tournament will be held in Memphis, Tenn., March 5-7, 1982. Louisville is the defending Metro Champion.

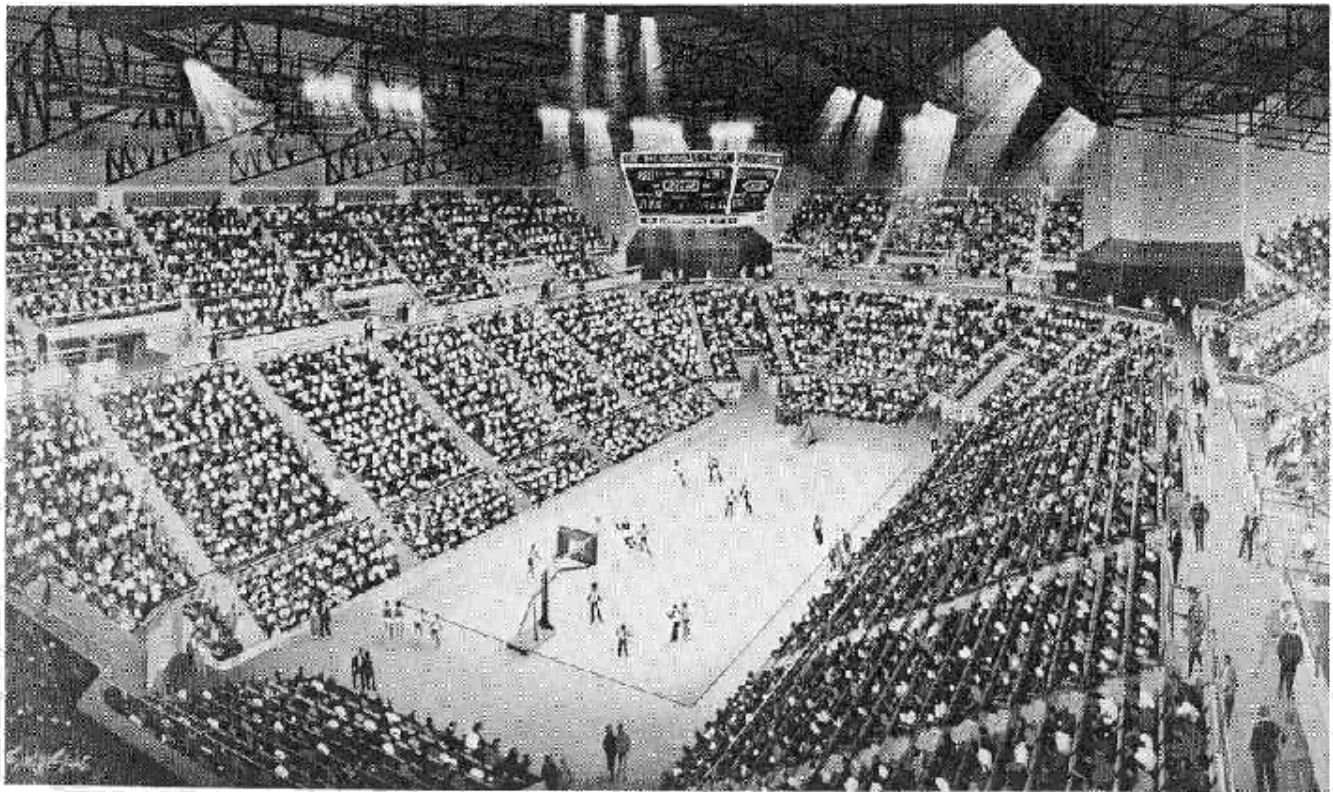

## Dr. Bernard F. Sliger

President

Today, his openness, accessibility, easy-going manner and loyalty to all aspects of Florida State University have made Dr. Bernard F. Sliger one of the most popular presidents in University history.

"Bernie," as he is known to his friends believes a great university such as Florida State should be a source of the education of the total person—providing the best academic facilities and faculty possible and having the best athletic facilities, staff and players available.

"Although studying is the most important factor in students' lives, they need an outlet for their energies. Athletics provides that outlet," Dr. Sliger said. "The athletic program at Florida State University is a means of identification for Florida State and a rallying point for anyone connected in any way with the University, in addition to being an important source of outside giving."



## C.W. "Hootie" Ingram

Athletic Director

C.W. "Hootie" Ingram is in his first year as Florida State's athletic director. He came to the post on January 16, after serving as associate commissioner of the Southeastern Conference.

Ingram brought to the position an outstanding reputation as an athletic administrator.

Ingram's former boss, SEC Commissioner Boyd McWhorter, praised the appointment.

"While I regret the fact that he is leaving, I am most pleased and proud for him to have been appointed to this new, prestigious position," McWhorter said. "He has performed all his duties as a member of the commissioner's staff in an outstanding manner and he has gained a national reputation for being one of the most knowledgeable and dedicated administrators in intercollegiate athletics."



Whereas some universities earmark all athletic funds for strictly athletic purposes, President Sliger holds different views for Florida State. In recent years, Dr. Sliger has channeled a portion of the scholarship funds received through athletics directly into the fund used to attract National Merit Scholars to Florida State. Also under his leadership, the Athletic Department has contributed \$200,000 in the past two years to a special fund for academic emphasis.

In addition, private funds contributed to the "Presidents Club," previously used solely for the president, now are used exclusively for academics.

President Sliger earned his B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. in economics at Michigan State.

He is the author of a text on "Public Finance," presently used in a number of colleges and universities.

Dr. Sliger was executive director of the Louisiana Coordinating Council for Higher Education and Administrator at Louisiana State University. He joined the administrative team at Florida State in 1977 as executive vice president.

On June 10, 1977, Dr. Bernard F. Sliger officially became Florida State University's 10th president.

Dr. Sliger and his wife, Greta, have two sons and two daughters, Paul, Sten, Nan and Greta.

A native of Tuscaloosa, Ala., the home of the University of Alabama, Ingram played football for the Crimson Tide from 1951 through 1954. He was All-SEC as a sophomore when he led the nation in pass interceptions. The '53 Alabama team played in the Orange Bowl and the '54 squad in the Cotton Bowl. Ingram also lettered for the Tide in baseball as an infielder.

After an Army stint, Ingram turned to coaching. He started as an assistant at Bradenton (Fla.) Manatee High School and was later head coach at Tuscaloosa High School for three years.

He later moved into college coaching and had stops at Wake Forest, Virginia Tech, Georgia and Arkansas as an assistant. His only college football head coaching assignment began in 1970 when he succeeded the veteran Frank Howard as head coach at Clemson. Three years later he joined the SEC as assistant commissioner.

During his tenure with the SEC, his duties included supervising football and basketball officials, rules interpretations and eligibility.

Ingram and his wife, Toni, have two daughters, Robin and Lane and a son Cecil.





### **Bob Goin**

Assistant Athletic Director

Bob Goin is the newest member of the Florida State athletic staff. He took over as assistant athletic director on July

1, after serving as athletic director at California (Pa.) State College since 1979.

Goin comes to FSU with a background in both coaching and athletic administration. Prior to taking the California State post, he was assistant director of athletics at West Virginia. Between 1960 and 1976 he served in various capacities at Bethany (W. Va.) College. Included among his Bethany duties were coaching responsibilities in football, basketball and baseball.

Immediately prior to moving to West Virginia, Goin served Bethany as associate professor and chairman of physical education and athletics. That assignment lasted for four years (1972-76). Goin was Bethany's head football coach between 1963 and 1972.

Goin, who received a bachelor's degree from Bethany (1959) and master's at West Virginia (1962), is married and the father of four children.



### **Claude Thigpen**

Assistant to the Director

Claude Thigpen has been a member of the Florida State athletic department staff for 26 years. He has been in his present

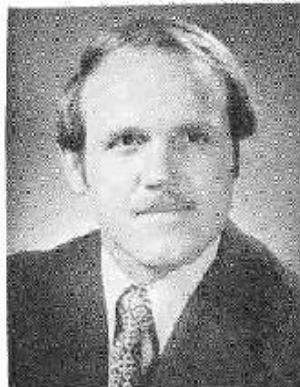
position as assistant to the athletic director since 1973.

His duties also include scheduling for the basketball team and aiding the coaching staff with its travel arrangements during the season. He is also

responsible for management of the athletic department insurance programs.

Pendleton is in his seventh year as a member of the Seminole staff. He returned to his alma mater in 1973 as a graduate assistant football coach and spent the '74 season as an assistant coach.

During 1975 and '76 he served solely as the academic advisor for the football squad. Those duties were expanded to include all athletes in 1977.

A native of Winter Garden, Fla., Pendleton played linebacker and offensive guard for the Seminoles. He twice was selected to the Florida all-star team while starting 33 consecutive games. He is married to the former Carolyn Chalk.

# This Is Florida State

The location of FSU in the Capital City of Florida offers unusual opportunities for study and research in the social and policy sciences, and an optimum environment for internships and on-the-job learning experiences for students in many fields of study.

A city within a city, Florida State has 1,200 faculty members, more than 6,000 additional employees and a construction program that exceed \$50 million.
