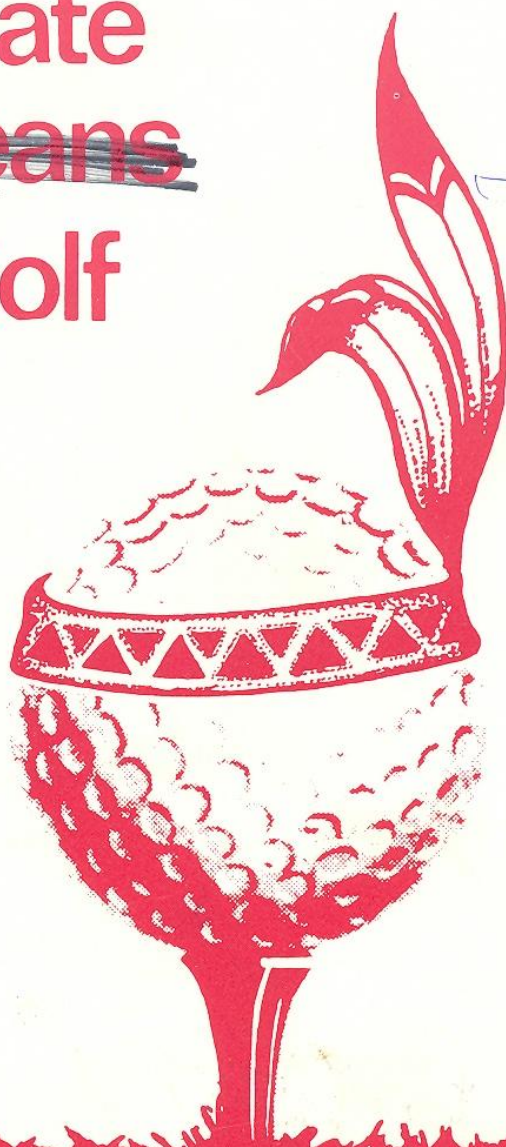

**Scott Fletcher**  
**Head Coach**

Three years ago, veteran club pro Scott Fletcher took over the reins of Florida State's golf program. In his initial season, Fletcher guided the Seminoles through their first "all tournament" schedule, winning five of the seven regular season events. Only one player with any experience returned the next year but the Seminoles managed to capture three second place finishes.

As a club pro for five years at Capital City Country Club and for a year at the University's course, Fletcher had the contact with youthful golfers to give him the background needed for collegiate athletics. "I've always enjoyed working with young golfers, because of their enthusiastic approach to the game," the amiable Fletcher said.

"I think Tallahassee is the ideal place for a collegiate golf future. Besides the several championship courses available to us and the perfect year round weather, everyone connected with the University is intent upon improving what is already a top notch golf program."

The home matches and daily workouts for the Seminoles are held on the University's 6,900 yard, 18-hole course. One of the nation's finest university owned layouts, the challenging course has long fairways, well-trapped greens and a modern club house. The university maintenance and ground departments keep the course in peak condition for year round play.

In addition, the Seminoles also have access to Killearn Country Club and Capital City Country Club courses as well as others in the area, giving them a variety of challenging layouts to play.

Aiding Fletcher with his duties is Assistant Dave Bianchi, who has been associated with the Florida State program for three years as a player.

## PROFILES

**MARK ALWIN—Sr.**, 21, 5-11, 155 lbs., Clearwater. A regular since his Sophomore year . . . has been the team leader the past two seasons with wins at the 1970 Seminole Invitational and this year's Biscayne Invitational . . . consistent and steady play earned his Honorable Mention All-America berth . . . "could be one of the best ever at Florida State," says Coach Scott Fletcher . . . finished no worse than seventh in any tournament past two years . . . was second in Florida Intercollegiate in 1970 . . . exceptionally strong driver, his longest being 346 yards . . . plays outstanding wedge shots . . . his father, Robert, was member of Wisconsin's 1941 NCAA basketball champions.

**JIM IHNOT—Jr.**, 20, 6-0, 160 lbs., Minneapolis, Minnesota. A two sport star in high school, won the Minnesota State High School Golf Tournament as well as All-State Basketball honors . . . "has great potential and could be an All-American" . . . couples competitiveness, good attitude and dedication with talent. Transferred from Valencia Junior College where he participated in golf and cross country . . . only southpaw on squad . . . his brother, Tom, was a golfer at University of Minnesota.

**MIKE SAN FILIPPO—So.**, 19, 5-9, 136 lbs., Miami. Qualified for the U.S. Amateur in 1968 and again in 1970 . . . was twice a Miami area All-Star while attending Miami Edison High . . . other credentials include runner-up honors at the 1968-69 Junior Orange Bowl Tournament . . . has made a lot of progress since coming to Florida State and is still improving . . . was a solid contributor as a freshman and will be a big asset this season.

**JOHN RUBY—Jr.**, 20, 5-8, 175 lbs., Stratford, Connecticut. 1970 New England Amateur Champion . . . runner-up State High School Champion 1969 . . . has all the tools to become an outstanding golfer . . . outstanding wedge play highlights his all around smooth game . . . was one of the highest ranking freshmen at Miami's Tournament and an occasional starter with the varsity that year . . . was a team leader along with Alwin last season . . . is expected to come into his own his junior and senior years.



**BILL VOYLES—Jr.**, 21, 6-7, 180 lbs., East Point, Ga. Uses size and strength for long drives but must smooth out his game . . . “he and his twin brother, Ben, are the most disciplined, hardest working players on the squad” says Coach Fletcher . . . placed third in Killlearn Country Club Tournament and First at Lakewood Country Club Tournament.

**BEN VOYLES—Jr.**, 21, 6-7, 190 lbs., East Point, Ga. Like twin brother, Bill, has tremendous size and power . . . led Seminole contingent at 1970 Senior Bowl . . . placed 16th in NCAA Championships with a 292 last year . . . works diligently to improve . . . long driver and all around consistent player.

**STEVE SCRAFFORD—Jr.**, 18, 6-0, 175 lbs., Gainesville. One of the outstanding freshmen who will see action with varsity this season . . . brought fine prep credentials including winning the Pennsylvania and National Pre-Youth Classic . . . holds course record for Gainesville Country Club with a 64 . . . Coach Scott Fletcher expects him to be “one of the best if he continues to work.”

**STEVE MULLEN—So.**, 19, 5-9, 160 lbs., Miami. Another All-Star performer from the Miami area . . . won the Miami Junior Championship last year . . . the best scrambler and toughest competitor on the team . . . plays well under pressure but needs to smooth out game . . . has shown great improvement since last year . . . his father was a baseball player at Florida State.

**DOUG FISCHESSE—So.**, 21, 6-0, 170 lbs., Connersville, Ind. Brought the fewest prep credentials as a freshman, but had the lowest average of them all in early rounds . . . a real sleeper who is beginning to bloom . . . selected Most Valuable Golfer at Culver Military Academy . . . an all around player.

**ROY THOMPSON—Jr.**, 20, 5-10, 160 lbs., Newton Square, Pennsylvania. Runner up in Pennsylvania High School Tournament . . . held back last year by a hand injury that kept him out most of the season . . . has made a good comeback from last year's injury and should play a vital role this season . . . competitive attitude makes him a strong plus to the team . . . brother, Andy, was a Seminole golfer on the 1970 squad.

## OUTLOOK

Although seven freshmen dot the Seminole team roster, Coach Scott Fletcher is quick to point out that ten experienced players have returned from last year's squad.

Among these is senior Captain Mark Alwin, who has paced the Seminoles the past two seasons, never finishing lower than seventh place.

Also returning is a strong contingent of experienced juniors including Bill and Ben Voyles, Roy Thompson, John Ruby, and Jim Ihnot.

Coach Fletcher holds high hopes for promising freshmen Tom Toski and Dick Grout and Ohio's top two prep performers, Kim Heisler and Todd Crandall. Heisler won last year's Ohio prep individual and Crandall was the runner up.

Before the season's open, Fletcher foresaw the difficulty that would arise in choosing the top seven golfers. "We have inexperienced and experienced players competing for the top seven positions. With our tournament schedule and the competition at such a keen pitch, we can't help but improve each time we go onto the course."
