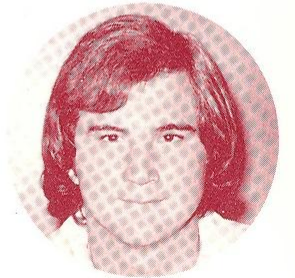

OUTLOOK

From the results of three fall tournaments, Coach Scott Fletcher believes the key to the 1973-74 Seminole Golf Team is balance.

The fall tournaments give Coach Fletcher a chance to see all his golfers in action before they "go to work" preparing for the spring schedule.

There are seven seniors of quality, a talented group of juniors, and enough good newcomers to keep the older players on their toes.

Playing an all tournament schedule, the Seminoles do not compete as often as in previous seasons so intra-squad competition becomes all important in keeping a keen edge. Fletcher is quick to point out that because the squad is so evenly balanced everyone must stay razor sharp. No one can become too complacent because there is always someone else to take over for them.

The seniors Fletcher looks to are co-captain Bob Impaglia, Doug Fischesser, Steve Mullens, John Godwin, and Mark Guttenburg. All are veterans who should be ready for their best seasons.

The strong group of juniors are led by team captain Todd Crandall who received an NCAA singles bid last year. Also Kim Heisler and Frank Zayatz, a transfer from Chipola Junior College who was the National Junior College Champion last year.

Other newcomers to keep an eye on are freshman Rusty Cappelen, Jack Ferenz, and Richard Jeffers, who was recommended to Florida State by former pro Hubert Greene.



Scott Fletcher
Head Coach

This will be Scott Fletcher's fifth season at the helm of the Seminole golf team.

The veteran club pro took over the Tribe reins in 1970 and put the Seminoles through their first "all tournament" schedule. Since that time the Tribe golfers have played nothing but the finest collegiate tournaments in the South and have a record any coach would be proud of.

In his first season, Fletcher directed the Seminoles to five wins in seven tournaments. The same winning attitude has prevailed.

Before coming to Florida State, Fletcher was the club pro at Capital City Country Club for five years and spent one year managing the Florida State course. This background gave him extensive contact with young golfers and provided him a solid base for college coaching.

"I have always enjoyed working with young golfers because of their enthusiastic approach to the game," said Fletcher.

The Seminoles' home matches are played on the University's 6,900 yard 18 hole championship course. One of the finest university owned layouts, the challenging course has long fairways, well trapped greens and a modern club house.

The University maintenance and grounds department keep the course in peak condition for year round play.

DENNIS ALLEN, So., 6-3, 170, Crystal River—An outstanding athlete . . . he won 15 varsity letters in high school . . . a good competitor . . . pitched a no-hitter in high school . . . one of the best swings on the team . . . should be ready to come into his own.

BARRY FLEMING, So., 20, 5-9, 160, Parkersburg, W.Va.—As captain he led his high school golf team to two successive state championships . . . he won the individual state high school championship in 1972 . . . traveled around the country this past summer playing golf tournaments . . . about ready to develop into a fine golfer.

JOHN GODWIN, Sr., 21, 6-2, 170, Columbus, Ga.—Georgia Junior PGA Champion in 1970 . . . was top performer on his high school team . . . fine player, but hasn't shown his ability so far this year . . . his father, Bill, was an All-America football center at Georgia in 1943.

MARK GUTTENBURG, Sr., 21, 6-1, 175, Silver Springs, Md.—A talented player . . . was undefeated in his senior year in high school . . . a good competitor . . . has the potential to make a strong contribution this year.

DICK GROUT, Sr., 21, 6-1, 165, Miami—All City performer for Miami Archbishop Curley and "Golfer of the Year" in Dade County as a high school senior . . . had promising freshman season . . . comes from a golfing family . . . his father is a pro who has worked with Jack Nicklaus.

BILLY SEXTON, Sr., 22, 6-2, 187, Tallahassee—A Leon High School graduate . . . quarterback of the football team . . . talented golfer . . . with a little work could develop into outstanding golfer.

JACK FERENZ, Fr., 18, 5-9, 170, Normandy, Ohio—Another Seminole golfer from Ohio . . . teams most valuable player in junior and senior year in high school . . . a year's work away from making big contribution to the squad.

RICHARD JEFFERS, Fr., 18, 6-1, 160, Birmingham, Ala.—Sent to the Seminoles by golf pro Hubert Greene . . . talented golfer . . . led his high school team to Alabama State Championship . . . should make large contribution to Seminoles with another year's work.

RICH CAMPBELL, Jr., 5-10, 145, Euclid, Ohio—Transfer student from Florida . . . ineligible this season . . . has a low score of 65 to his credit . . . talented golfer with excellent potential.

TODD CRANDALL, Jr., 20, 6-0, 170, Ashtabula, Ohio—Captain of the Seminole Golf Team . . . received NCAA bid last year . . . has done very well in previous years at FSU . . . had a tremendous fall season . . . if he continues to improve he will make solid contribution this year.

FRANK ZAYATZ, Jr., 6-0, 170, Jacksonville—Transfer from Chipola Junior College . . . National Junior College Champion last year . . . very steady . . . capable of playing good tournaments . . . expected to contribute greatly to the team.

BOB IMPAGLIA, Sr., 21, 6-1, 175, Auburn, N.Y.—Team co-captain . . . was MVP at Auburn Community College, two years ago . . . has much talent . . . played very well in the fall . . . has a low of 66 at LSU Invitational Tournament . . . capable of playing with the best . . . should be a great boost to the squad in the spring.

KIM HEISLER, Jr., 20, 5-11, 165, Aurora, Ohio—Was 1971 Ohio High School Champion . . . has really improved tremendously in the last two years . . . sat out two quarters last year . . . should have a real fine spring.
