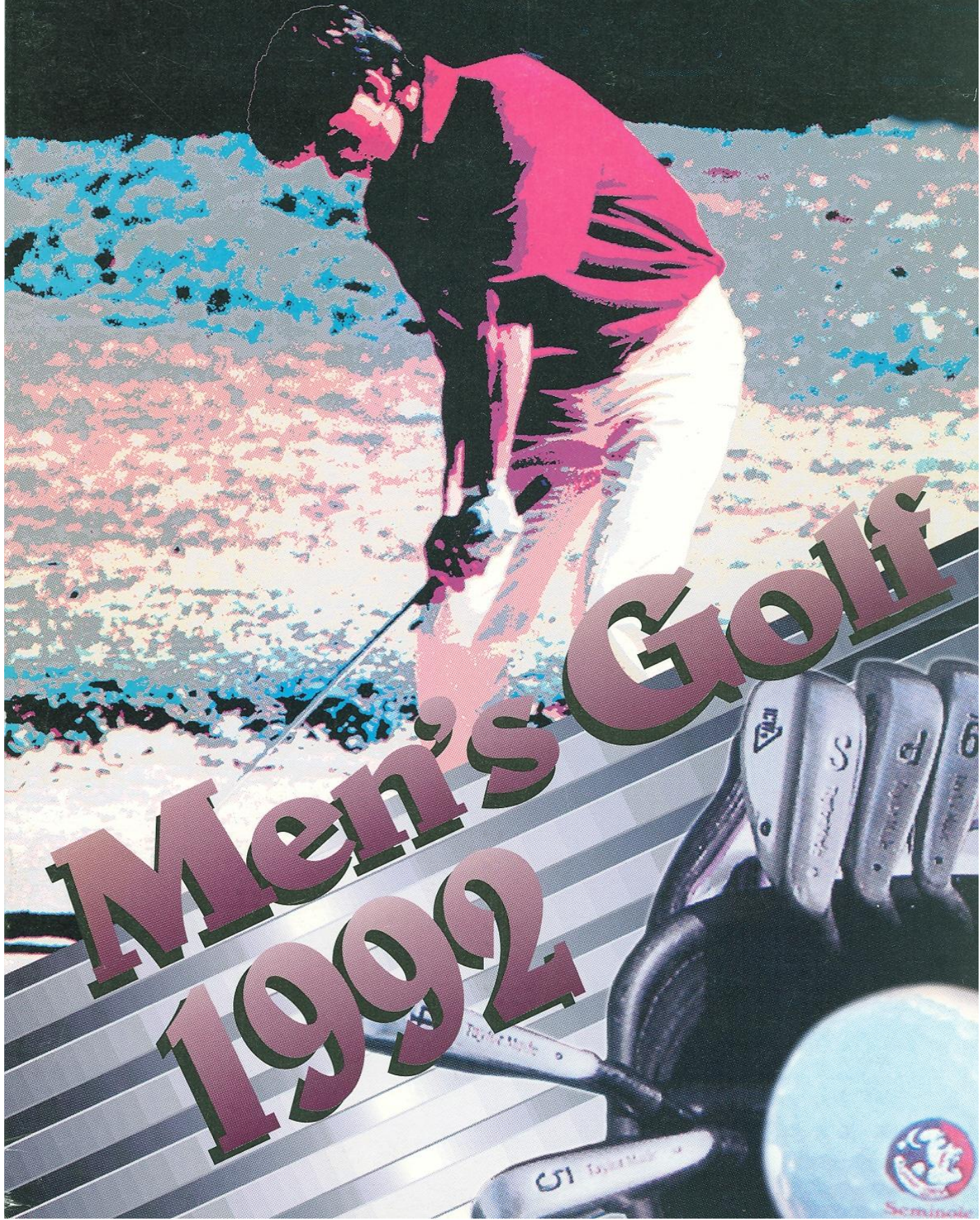

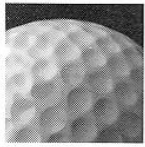

# This is FSU

Florida State University, nearing its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution, is poised on the brink of joining the nation's academic elite.

Building rapidly from the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida, the university has emerged as an institution of national and international esteem, evidenced by a number of exciting recent additions to its record of excellence. Florida State has begun the 1990s with exceptional strength, energy and vision for the future. And, under the new leadership of the university's 11th president, Dr. Dale W. Lick, FSU will continue to build on the foundation of its long history of excellence in scholarship, research and humanity.

A public university and a senior member of the State University System, Florida State was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act and began operating in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee; the university owns a total of 1,172 acres in Leon, Bay and Franklin counties. For many years FSU has extended its reach far beyond Florida through international study programs in England, Italy, Switzerland, Yugoslavia, France, Panama, Costa Rica and the Caribbean.

These far-reaching programs are but a few of the 271 graduate and undergraduate degree programs offered through Florida State's eight independent colleges—Arts and Sciences; Business, Communication; Education; Engineering; Human Sciences; Law; and Social Sciences (incorporating the School of Public Administration and Policy)—and eight independent schools—Criminology and Criminal Justice; Library and Information Studies; Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Work; Theatre; and Visual Arts and Dance.

With 1,533 members, the FSU faculty currently includes five members of both the



National Academy of Sciences and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included five Nobel laureates. The main library facility, the Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked via computerized information system to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library places scientific resources close by the university's main science research complex.

On the top floor of the Dirac Library is the headquarters of the Supercomputer Computations Research Institute, a program that brings together some 100 scientists, engineers and technicians. SCRI is electronically linked to an off-campus research complex and the university's two powerful supercomputers.

Also providing unique research opportunities is the physics department's Tandem Van de Graaff Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory, which houses two powerful atom smashers and is ranked among the top four in the nation by the National Science Foundation.

FSU places a high priority on its nearly 29,000 students, their needs and interests. The Honors and Scholars program, the FSU Distinguished Lecture Series, student government, the one-of-a-kind, all-collegiate Flying High Circus, and intramural sports are among more than 200 organizations and activities in which students can participate.

In the heart of the state's thriving capital city, Florida State bonds the educational and social aspects of campus life just as it blends Gothic and modern styles of architecture with the oaks, pines, dogwoods, palms and azaleas of North Florida.

In all areas of teaching, research and service, Florida State University is advancing boldly into the 21st century.

# Outlook

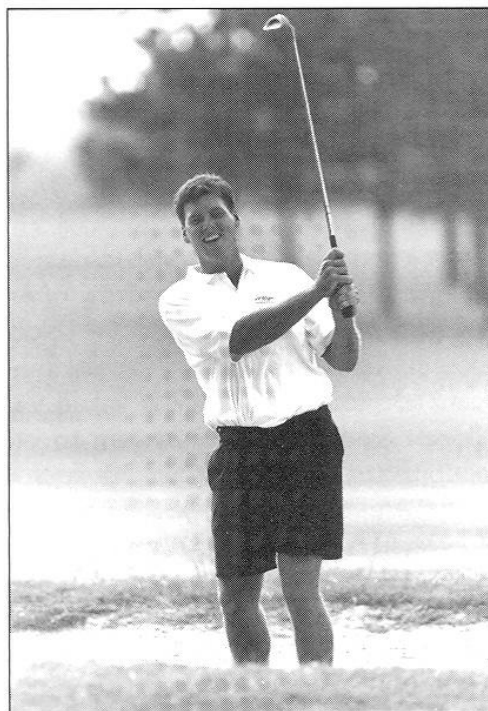
The 1991-92 Seminole Golf team has entered the season with many changes in its program. Taking over the Head Golf Coach position is Dr. Ernie Lanford, a Florida State graduate, who hopes to rejuvenate the Florida State golf program in the near future. Dr. Lanford is working on many improvements for the Seminole Golf teams, both men and

women, that he hopes to incorporate into the program throughout the year.

Dr. Lanford takes over a team that had a slow season in 1990-91 with relatively few top ten finishes. Last season showed the Seminoles strengths and weaknesses with players finishing in second place and 88th place. The team as a whole finished in both first (in the Forest Hill Invitational) and 17th (in the Golf World/Palmetto Dunes Collegiate). After losing two seniors from the team, Christian Williams and Anthony Ballestero, the coach has an optimistic outlook for the coming season.

Dustin Phillips, a senior out of Deerfield Beach, Florida, had an outstanding season as an All-America candidate with five top ten finishes out of ten competitions throughout his junior year. His highest finishes included two seventh place finishes in the Florida State Intercollegiate and the Taylor Made/Red River Classic.

A relative newcomer to the Seminole scene, Bobby Cochran of Cordova, Tennessee, played well for his first full season of play. The key to his success as a Seminole was two top ten finishes during the season. He tied for 10th in both the Southeastern Intercollegiate and the Bank South Invita-



tional which pitted him against some of the leading college golfers in the country.

Wayne "Chip" Johnson, a senior out of Ellenton, Florida and a transfer student from Sarasota Junior College, had a promising start for the Seminoles by starting in six tournaments in the season. His highest finishes were in the FSC/ImperiaLakes Golf Classic and the Budget/

UCF Golf Classic in which he tied for 23rd.

A sophomore out of Gulf Breeze, Florida, Christian Raynor, will be one to watch in the 1991-92 season. He sat out a redshirt season in 1990-91, and has made the cut to take one of the starting positions for the fall and spring for the Seminoles.

Junior David Holt, out of Ormond Beach, Florida, will also make his presence known in the 1991-92 season. He has played and practiced for the last three years, competing in his time off as well as competing with the team. He is one of the rising stars of the Seminole golf team.

Another sophomore out of Ormond Beach, Florida, Ken Staton, is trying to assert his position in the starting line-up for the spring. He has had experience during summer competition and has competed for the one of the starting positions for the Tribe.

All in all, the Florida State men's golf team has the talent it needs to become one of the best and biggest contenders on the golf scene in 1991-92. With newly appointed Dr. Ernie Lanford, all of this has the possibility of becoming a reality. Look forward to seeing young and fresh talent for the upcoming season and years at Florida State.

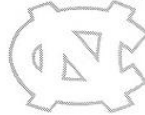

## Dr. Ernie Lanford

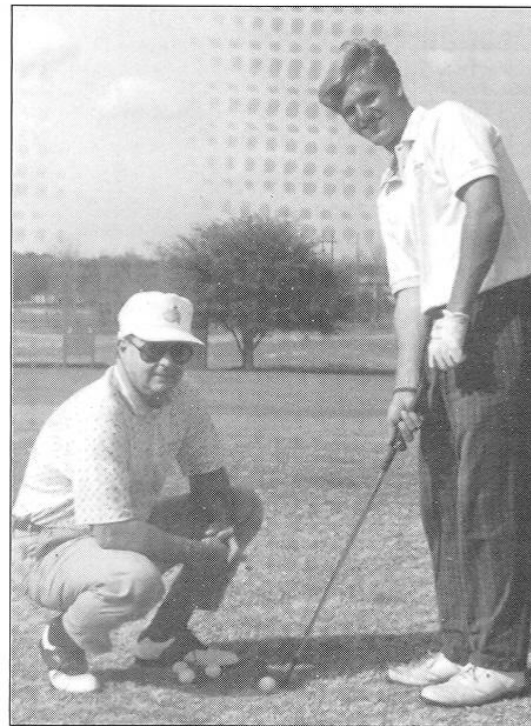
Dr. Lanford begins his season at Florida State with a multitude of talent in his background. A graduate of Florida State with his bachelor's, Michigan State with his masters, and Brigham Young with his doctorate, Dr. Lanford will bring experience in the field of golf, excellence in education, and a demand for both from his student-athletes.

For the last nine years, Dr. Lanford has worked at Augusta College in Augusta, Georgia as a teacher of Kinesiology, Exercise Physiology, Anatomy, Recreation, Fitness for Living, Secondary Method's of PE, Curriculum, Organization & Administration of Athletics, and Foundations of PE. He held the position of head golf coach, and was the head basketball coach from 1982-85.

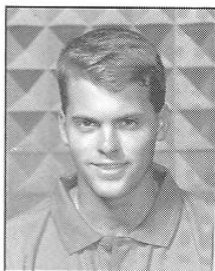
While at Augusta College, Dr. Lanford received many awards for his performance as the head golf coach. He was the NCAA Division I Golf Coach of the Year in 1985, '86, '87, '90, and '91. His teams consistently won the Big South Conference Championship in 1985, '86, '87, '90, and '91. He was also active in Augusta area junior golf and directed over 15 tournaments and clinics a year in cooperation with area golf clubs, he raised funds and

recruited volunteers in the Augusta areas for these tournaments and oversaw a School Development Program specifically for junior golf promotion.

Prior to his position at Augusta College, Dr. Lanford was the Athletic Director, the Physical Education Chairman, an Assistant Professor, and the Men's Basketball head coach at Flagler College in St. Augustine, Florida. He has held positions at other institutions, including the State University of New York, Brigham Young University, Michigan State University, and other facilities which round out his overall experience and determination to succeed.



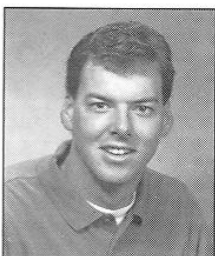

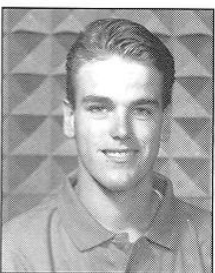

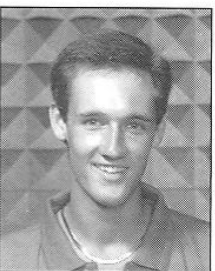

*Sophomore, Boca Raton, Florida*

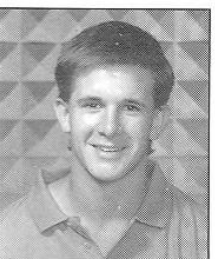

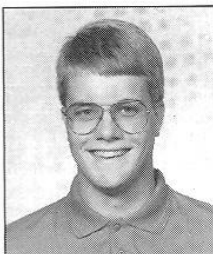


## Corey Hamlin

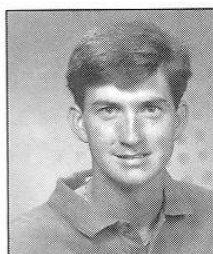

*Junior, Ormond Beach, Florida*

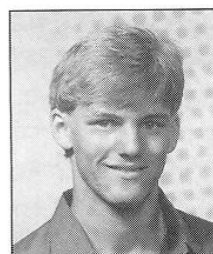

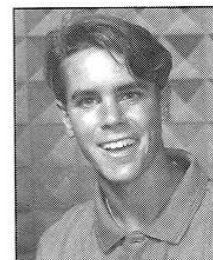

*Senior, Deerfield Beach, Florida*

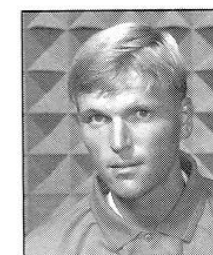

## Academic Advising

The primary concern of being a student-athlete at Florida State University is getting an education and taking advantage of the many opportunities offered to assist golfers. Trudy Raybun's Office of Academic Advising aids students who participate in all of the non-revenue sports with their admissions, class schedules, registration process, and the normal progress towards a degree. Raybun and her two graduate assistants also monitor each athlete in their class performance and recommend tutors when necessary.

Academic Support is supervised by Nick Menacof, who oversees the study hall area and tutorials his office provides. As student-athletes learn to juggle practicing 20 hours a week and making eight road trips during their season, plus a full class load, they find comfort in knowing there is a support staff to help them accomplish the ultimate goal of receiving a quality education.

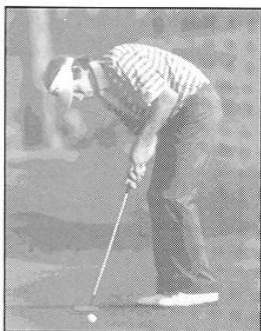
## Prevention Care and Treatment

Being an athlete at Florida State University means receiving the best care and treatment possible. All of the student-athletes undergo pre-season screening so a certified trainer can detect any potential injuries an athlete may incur throughout the season. If a problem is detected, the athlete is placed on a prevention care program which may include any kind of treatment from icing to exercising.

Rehabilitation is another important component of the Seminole training room. Even though preventing injuries is the main objective, they are unavoidable for the 125 athletes who participate in the non-revenue sports. More serious injuries and illnesses are referred to the Seminole team physicians at Haney, Henderson, & Stowers who, for many years, have worked in conjunction with the FSU training room in successfully rehabilitating numerous athletes after an injury.

Body fat, weight control and drug testing are all responsibilities of the athletic training team which is dedicated to providing the best care possible for all FSU student-athletes.

## Seminole Golf Course

The Seminole Golf Course is located approximately two miles west of the university campus. The course was designed by William W. Amick. The first nine holes were completed in 1963 and the completion of the additional nine in 1968.

The golf course measures 7,033 yards from the championship tees, and is considered an excellent test of golf. The greens, TIFTON 328 (Bermuda) are of medium size, approximately 6,200 square feet each. The course rating is 72.0.

The course and practice facilities are considered to be among the best in the country. The Seminole Golf Course is now run and operated by Club Consultation and Management, a private golf course management firm. There have been many improvements made and within the next five years it should prove to be one of the finest courses in the area.

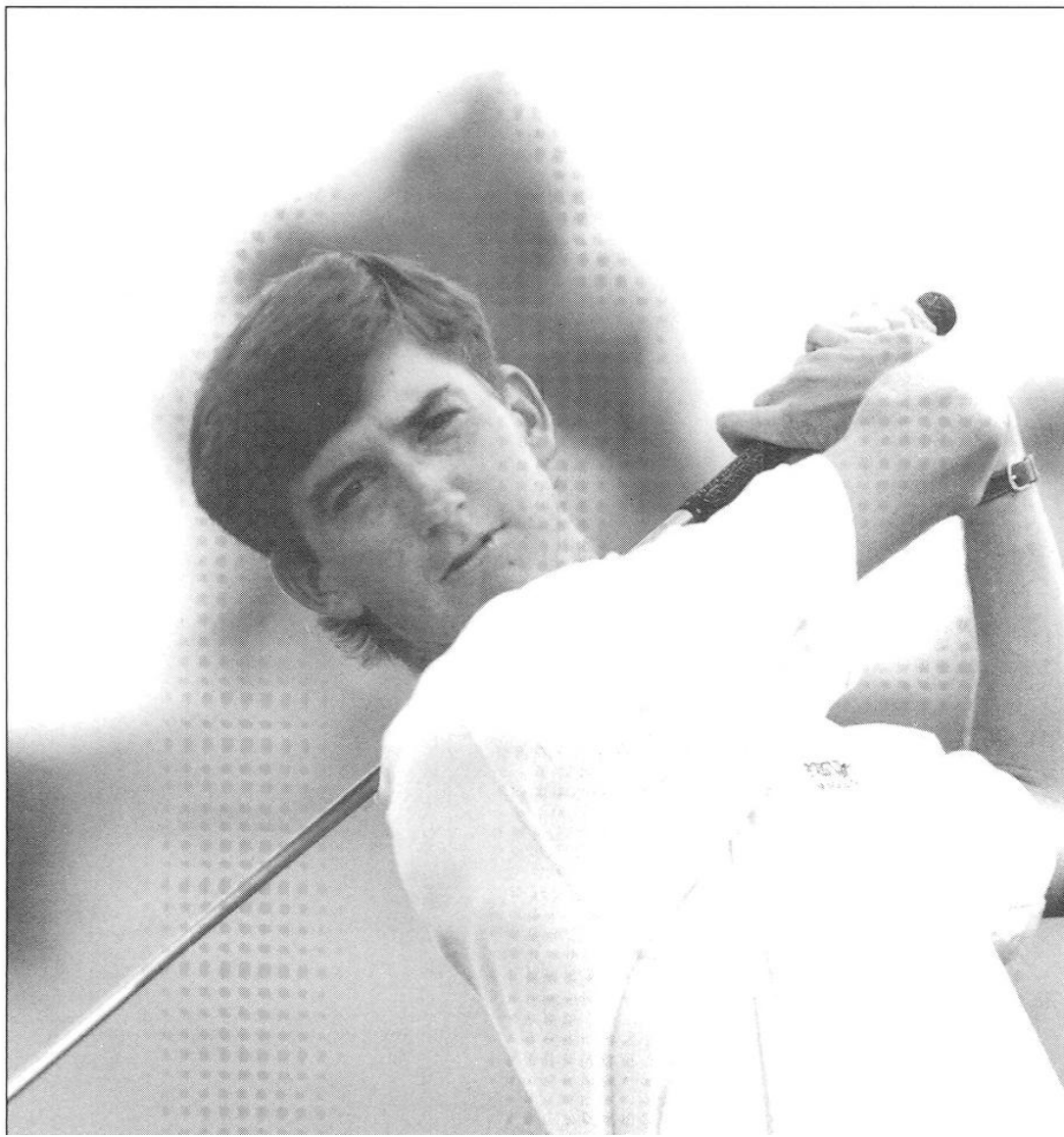

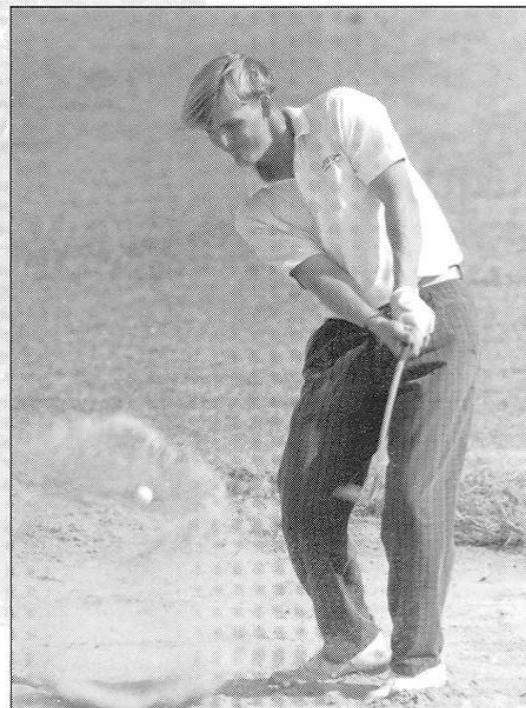

# NCAA Finishes 1990 & 1987

## Florida State in the NCAA Championships

The Florida State Seminoles participated in the 1990 NCAA Championships, held at the Island Golf Course in Tarpon Springs, Florida and came away with one of the best finishes in school history under the present format of the championship. The Seminoles placed eighth in 1990 with a four-day total of 1169, one stroke behind the seventh place finishers, North Carolina. Senior Andy Purnell tied for sixth place and was the highest finisher for the Seminoles. Other FSU finishers included: Roger Winchester (tied 17th), Dustin Phillips (tied 61st), Christian Williams (tied 87th), and John Tighe (tied 126th).

Florida State's best-ever finish was in 1987 at the Scarlet Golf Course in Columbus, Ohio. The Seminoles placed seventh that year, led by All-American Nolan Henke who tied for second, six shots behind the leader. The final four day score of the Seminoles was 1191, four strokes behind sixth-place Arkansas.

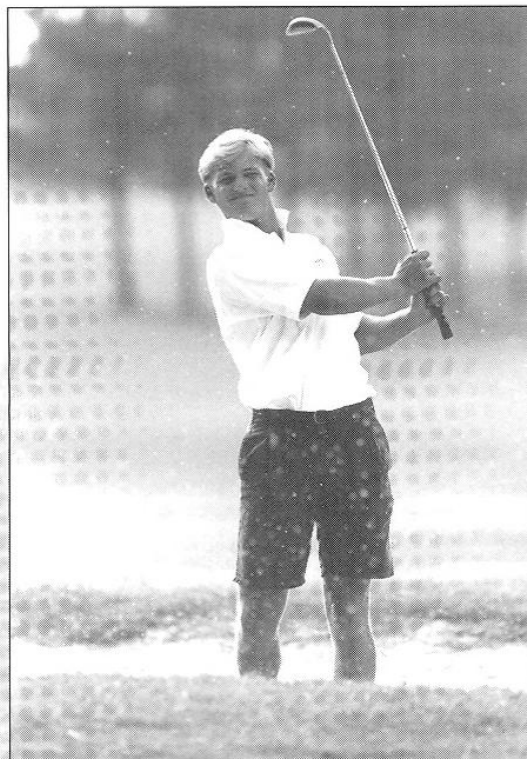
