




THIS IS TALLAHASSEE

KILLEARN COUNTRY CLUB AND INN

The site of 21 PGA Tour and four LPGA Tour tournaments, Killearn Country Club's three nine-hole layouts offers a challenging yet fun golf experience. Killearn's three ninehole course are played in three eighteen hole combinations. These courses are home to several championship events each year and have hosted the PGA Classic and the Sprint Central.

GOLDEN EAGLE COUNTRY CLUB

Golden Eagle Country Club combines gracious Southern Living and championship golf for those who expect the best. Golden Eagle's foremost attraction is its 18-hole golf course, designed by world renowned golf course architect Tom Fazio. It was rated "the most challenging course in Florida" by the United States Golf Association just six months after opening in December 1986. Golfweek Magazine has ranked Golden Eagle among the top 50 real-estate development courses in the Southeast.

CAPITAL CITY COUNTRY CLUB

Capital City Country Club is the oldest and most prestigious private club in Tallahassee. The club is nestled among rolling hills and ancient oak trees. The rolling, tree-lined 6,502 yard 18-hole golf course is as challenging as it is breathtaking. Nine holes of the original design ware carved out by famed golf course architect A.W. Tillinghast who designed such American classics as Winged Foot and Medinah.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

SouthWood Golf Club opened its 18-hole golf course in 2003 to the delight of golfers in Tallahassee. The well-planned course was immediately one of the premier golf facilities in the Florida Panhandle and one of the nation's heralded new golf courses. SouthWood was the only club in Florida to be ranked as one of "America's Best New Courses" by Golf Digest.

FACILITIES 2010-11 MEN'S GOLF

The Dave Middleton Golf Complex and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course are home to the PGA Golf Management Program, which is one of only a few programs in the country that is accredited by the Professional Golfer's Association of America. A 27,000-square-foot clubhouse, the Dave Middleton **Golf Complex boasts private technologically** advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, a team lounge, auditorium and a fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of al 18 greens complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TiffEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts over 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.

SEASON PREVIEW 2010-11 MEN'S GOLF



Florida State University men's golf program has improved their program each year since head coach Trey Jones came to FSUIn 2010 Florida State men's golf concluded the season with a third place finish at the NCAA National Championship. This year, team leaders Drew Kittleson and Brooks Koepka have their sights set on taking the next step.

"Everyone wants to get back to the National Championship, this time instead of losing in the semifinals, we want to get to the finals and actually win it."

Coming off of the NCAA run this team made last year, the expectations are even higher for this year's team.

"The expectations are very high and that is good, that is what we want, that is who we fell like we are," said coach Jones. "Whether we live up to the expectations or not, I am more interested in how each player plays and if they continue to develop. If they do those things, the season will take care of its self."

The Seminoles are a well rounded team with nearly a full squad of postseason veterans like Kyle Cobb, Wesley Graham, and Doug Letson, who all will be fighting for a spot in the Seminole line-up. These veterans will be joined by in-coming freshmen Joaquin Lolas and Tyler Sluman.

SEMINOLES FINISH IN 3RD PLACE AT NCAA Championship

The Florida State men's golf team fell to Augusta State, 4-1, in the semifinals of the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship at The Honors Course thus ending the Seminoles' run at the first national championship in the sport of men's golf in school history.

FLORIDA STATE RANKED SIXTH IN FINAL GOLFSTAT POLL

Florida State finished the 2009-10 season ranked No. 6 in the final GolfStat poll of the season. The GolfStat poll was released following the Seminoles' third place finish in the NCAA. The Seminoles' national ranking of No. 6 is the highest final ranking since head coach Trey Jones' arrival for the 2004 season.

KOEPKA AND KITTLESON EARN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Brooks Koepka and Drew Kittleson were named to the PING All-America team announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America. It marked the first time both golfers had been rewarded with All-American honors during their careers.

KOEPKA NAMED ACC GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Koepka was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year – an award which he shared with Virginia's Ben Kohles. Koepka was the first Seminole since Bobby Cochran in 1994 to be named the ACC Player of the Year.

KOEPKA AND LAUER NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

Koepka and Seath Lauer were named to the 2010 All-ACC Men's Golf Team. It marked the fourth consecutive season that two Florida State players have been named to the All-ACC Team. It also marked the first time Koepka and Lauer have earned All-ACC honors during their careers.


CALL KITTLESON MR. POSTSEASON




