SEMINOLE LEGACY GOLF CLUB

The Seminole Legacy Golf Club held its opening ceremony in March 2020 to commence a new in Florida State Golf. The eye-popping and picturesque renovated course managed by ClubCorp and designed by Jack Nicklaus Design is a mammoth undertaking, stretching out to 7,800 yards from the back tees.

The golf course offers surprising elevation changes of up to 50 feet, and offers stunning visuals highlighted by 100-year old live oaks and stately pine trees.

All tees, fairways, rough, bunkers, greens and cart paths are new. Additionally, the old Don Veller course sat on about 210 acres, which included two driving ranges, a small short game area for the golf teams and a 7,147-yard par-73 golf course. Additional amenities include the The Burr Family Renegade Grill, a state-of-the-art clubhouse, a fully stocked golf pro shop and on-site PGA-certified staff who can assist players of all ages and abilities.

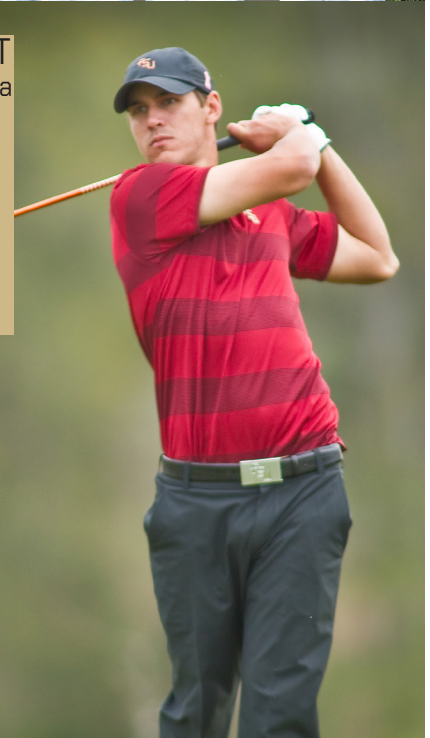
STARTING THEM YOUNG

When it comes to getting as much as you can out of your freshmen, no one has proven to do it better in the ACC than Florida State. In three of the last seven seasons, an FSU Men's Golfer has been named the ACC Freshman of the Year. They include Hank Lebioda (2013), Jack Maguire (2014) and John Pak (2018).



WHEN THE STAKES ARE HIGHEST

In four of the last 10 full seasons, Florida State Men's Golf has finished in the Top 11 of the NCAA Division I Championship. Included in the high finishes are two seasons where FSU finished in the Top eight, including the 2010 NCAA Championship where the Seminoles finished third nationally.



KOEPKA EMERGES

One of the best young golfers on the PGA Tour, Brooks Koepka accelerated his game while being a two-time ACC Player of the Year at Florida State. In 2010 and 2012, the native of West Palm Beach, Fla., earned top individual honors in the conference.



ACC CHAMPIONS

Current PGA Tour player Jonas Blixt (right) and former Seminole legend Matt Savage (left) helped Florida State Men's Golf to an ACC title in 2008. Florida State held off Duke by three strokes, closing the final round with a 280 to finish with an aggregate score of 838 overall.



ALL-AMERICA RUN

Seminole Men's Golf has enjoyed a healthy run of All-Americans, especially over the last eight seasons which has coincided with the program's successful stretch. Since 2012, FSU has had at least one All-American in each season, including 2015 PGA Tour Rookie of the Year Daniel Berger (shown in 2013).



THIS IS FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY

Florida State University is an elite, research-intensive, public institution and one of just two preeminent universities in Florida. Located in Tallahassee, Florida's capital city, the university affords students and faculty opportunities for interaction with state and federal agencies for internships, research and part-time employment, as well as numerous social, cultural and recreational activities. FSU's welcoming campus is located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida, in a community that fosters free inquiry and embraces diversity.

BEGINNINGS

Florida State was established as the Seminary West of the Suwannee by an act of the Florida Legislature in 1851. The institution first offered instruction at the postsecondary level in 1857 and is the longest continuous site of higher education in Florida. In 1905, the Buckman Act reorganized higher education in the state and designated the Tallahassee school as the Florida Female College. In 1909, it was renamed Florida State College for Women. In 1947, the school returned to coeducational status, and the name was changed to Florida State University.

42,876 & COUNTING

In 1946, there were 2,583 students enrolled. In 2018, enrollment stood at 42,876. Of that number, 77 percent were undergraduates, 20.3 percent were graduate students and 2.7 percent were unclassified; 81.7 percent were in-state students; 93.2 percent were from the United States; students hailed from all 50 states and the District of Columbia; 18 states contributed 100 or more students each; 23 foreign countries contributed 30 or more students each; 57.1 percent were female and 42.9 percent were male; 35.2 percent were minorities and 5.2 percent were international students.

LAY OF THE LAND

The university's main campus encompasses 476 acres in Tallahassee, Leon County; the Panama City Campus has 25.6 acres in Panama City, Bay County. The university owns more than 1,673 acres in Leon, Bay, Collier, Franklin, Sarasota and Gadsden counties. In addition, sites are leased in various counties in Florida and other locations overseas.

WEALTH OF OPPORTUNITY

With 18 colleges and The Graduate School, students may take courses of study leading to a baccalaureate degree in 227 fields in 105 degree programs, to a master's or advanced master's degree in 111 degree programs in 278 fields, to a specialist degree in 11 degree programs, to a doctoral degree in 67 degree programs, as well as to a professional degree in three degree programs. The academic divisions are the Colleges of Applied Studies; Arts and Sciences; Business; Communication and Information; Criminology and Criminal Justice; Education; Engineering; Entrepreneurship; Fine Arts; Hospitality; Human Sciences; Law; Medicine; Motion Picture Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Sciences and Public Policy; Social Work; and The Graduate School.

The Legacy of Florida State Golf

- ◆ One of five Universities to boast four Major Winners as Alumni, joining Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Houston and Texas.
- ◆ Has totaled 70 wins on professional golf tours, including 59 on the PGA Tour and 11 on the Champions Tour.
- ◆ Home of three Ryder Cup participants (Brooks Koepka, Paul Azinger and Hubert Green) as well as one Ryder Cup Captain (Azinger).
- ◆ Home of the 2015 PGA Rookie of the Year in Daniel Berger and four-time Major champion Brooks Koepka.
- ◆ Boasts one Walker Cup captain in Downing Grey as well as four Walker Cup Participants (Grey, Jeremy Robinson, Harry Ellis, John Pak).



Paul Azinger

Starting the PGA Tour in 1982, Paul Azinger had 12 wins including the 1993 PGA Championship. After transferring from Brevard Community College, Azinger completed his collegiate career at Florida State in 1981. While at Florida State, Azinger led the Seminole golf team to its then-highest ranking ever and was named the Metro Conference Champion and the Most Valuable Player in 1981. Azinger was named to the FSU Hall of Fame in 1988.

The Holyoke, Mass., native was a member of the U.S. Ryder Cup Team four times (1989, 1991, 1993, 2002) and captain of the 2008 team that won at Valhalla Golf Club in Louisville, Ky. Throughout his career Azinger was passionate about playing in the Ryder Cup and his hard work paid off as he and America's top golfers returned the Ryder Cup to the United States for the first time since 1999.

Azinger got his first win in 1987 as he went on to win the Phoenix Open, Panasonic Las Vegas Invitational and Canon Sammy Davis Jr. Greater Hartford Open. In 1992 he won The Tour Championship and followed up with his best year in 1993. He won the coveted PGA Championship along with the Memorial Tournament and New England Classic. After battling cancer, Azinger came back strong by winning the 2000 Sony Open in Hawaii. He spent almost 300 weeks in the top-10 of the Official World Golf Rankings between 1988 and 1994.



Hubert Green

Seminole golf legend Hubert Green, who won 23 events professionally, was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2007 and was honored at the Induction Ceremony on Nov. 12, 2007, at the World Golf Village in St. Augustine, Fla.

Green came to Florida State in 1965 and served as the captain of the golf team in 1968. He led Florida State to a 10th place finish in the NCAA Championship in 1968 and guided the Seminoles to several impressive dual meet victories over many teams in the Southeastern United States including Florida during his collegiate career. Green was inducted in the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1977. He graduated from Florida State and turned professional in 1969.

Green was one of the most successful professional golfers in the history of the sport. He won 19 events while playing on the PGA Tour including the U.S. Open Championship in 1977 and the PGA Championship in 1985. He played on the 1977, 1979 and 1985 U.S. Ryder Cup Teams and also won four events on the Champions Tour before retiring in 2009. His most recent championship came in 2002 at the Lightpath Long Island Classic, winning in a playoff over Hale Irwin. Green passed away on June 19, 2018, at the age of 71.

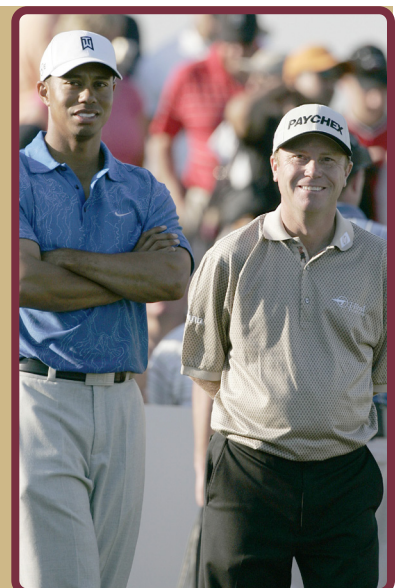


Jeff Sluman

Born and raised in Rochester, N.Y., Jeff Sluman transferred to Florida State in 1978 and became one of the best golfers on the team until he graduated with a finance degree in 1980. While on the PGA Tour, he won six titles including the 1988 PGA Championship. Named to the 1989 Florida State Hall of Fame Class, his time at Florida State was well spent as he led the team to three tournament wins and the NCAA tournament.

Before he arrived in Tallahassee, he won the 1978 New York State Amateur Tournament. Playing on the PGA Tour from 1980-2009, he finished in the top ten 105 times. His first tour victory happened to be the 1988 PGA Championship but he did not win another tournament until the 1997 Tucson Chrysler Classic. He followed up with another win at the 1998 Greater Milwaukee Open and the 1999 Sony Open in Hawaii. In 2001 he won the B.C. Open and had his last PGA Victory with the 2002 Greater Milwaukee Open.

Sluman still plays professional golf on the Champions Tour, recording eight Top 10 finishes in the 2014 and 2015 seasons. He's had six wins since 2008 including the 2014 Big Cedar Lodge Legends Tournament, the 2013 Liberty Mutual Insurance Legends of Golf, the 2011 Nature Valley First Tee Open at Pebble Beach, the 2009 and 2008 Walmart First Tee Open at Pebble Beach and the 2008 Bank of America Championship.

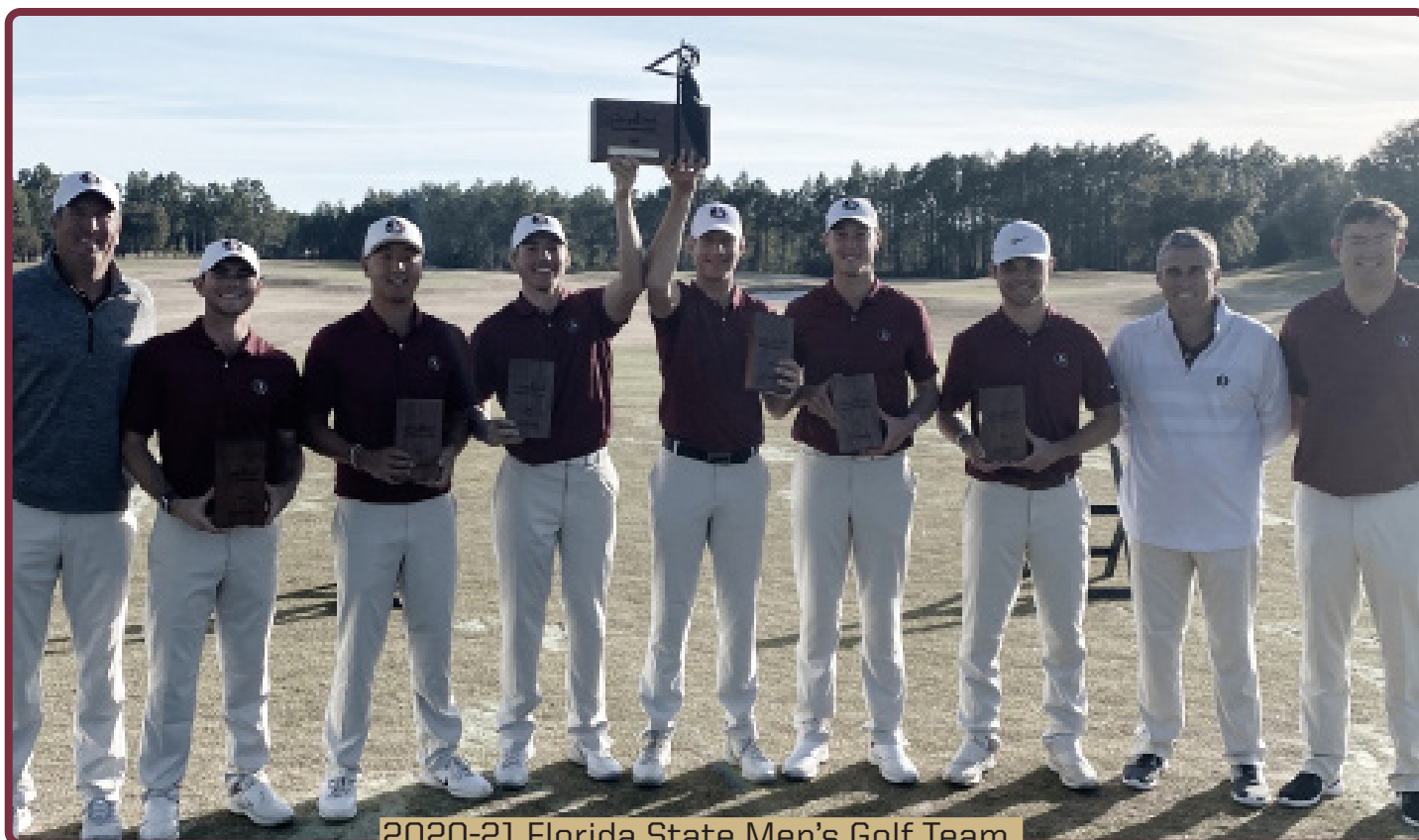

PROMISING SEASON ENDED BY COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Florida State Men's Golf, among all other NCAA-sponsored sports teams, was left wondering "What If" after its 2020-21 year was cut short by COVID-19 in Mid-March. The Seminoles were rounding into form during a productive spring season that saw another win at the Mobile Sports Authority Intercollegiate as well as a Top-5 finish at the Seminole Intercollegiate.

A MOBILE THREE-PEAT

The Seminoles picked up where they left off at the Mobile Sports Authority Intercollegiate in Feb. 2020, shooting 28-under (278-281-277) as a team to defeat runner-up Illinois (-27) by a stroke. John Pak also won his sixth tournament title at the event, his first of two tournament titles in the spring.

PAK GOES FOR HISTORY

Florida State Men's Golf senior John Pak enters his final season with seven tournament titles, and he possibly could have had more if the 2020 spring season wasn't cut short. He won his seventh title at the 2020 Seminole Intercollegiate when he carded an 11-under (70-66-69). Pak is one shy of FSU legend Nolan Henke, who won eight titles from 1985-87.

LI AND PORTER AFFORDED CHANCE TO RETURN

Because of the pandemic, seniors Greyson Porter and Jamie Li each received an additional year of eligibility following the 2019-20 season. The two seniors both took advantage of the opportunity. Li registered a 70.39 scoring average last year, the fifth-lowest by a Seminole. Porter did not compete in the spring season due to injury, but it bracing for a strong year in 2021.

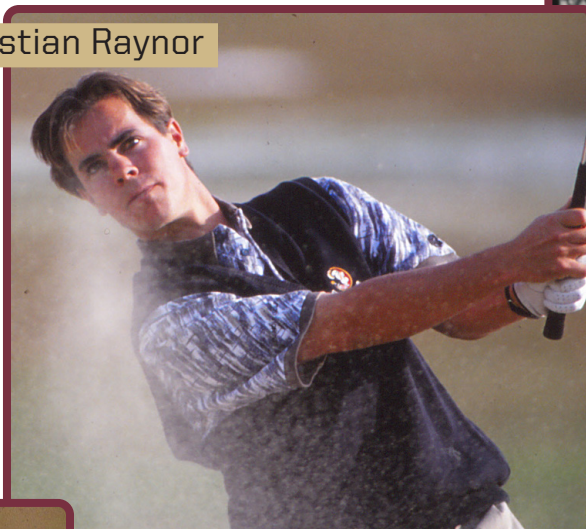

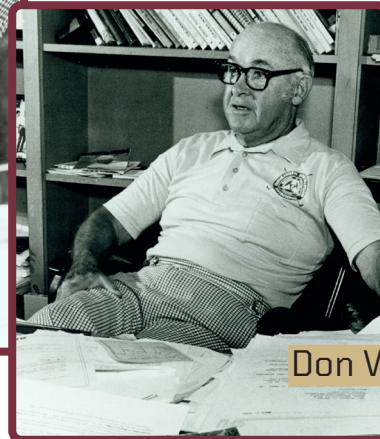
