THE UNIVERSITY

Florida State University, like all of its athletic teams, is characterized by energetic growth, exuberant activity and eager competition at the intercollegiate levels. Led today by one of the nation's younger university presidents, Dr. John E. Champion (45), Florida State is known as a record-setting institution in the realm of academics as well as athletics and takes great pride in the production of prowess in both fields. Dedicated to the educa-

tion of the whole student and the development of physical, as well as mental, abilities, the University enjoys an enviable reputation in its annual schedule of spring sports activitiesswimming, track, baseball, golf and tennis. Just as each of these fine teams has grown to championship calibre in the past score of years, so the University has come of age in an era of phenomenal growth in its enrollments and its academic stature. Presently educating more than 15,000 students, the University's 10 colleges and schools (Arts and Sciences, Education, Business, Home Economics, Librarianship, Music, Nursing, Engineering Science, Law and Social Welfare) are taking an intercollegiate lead at both the graduate and undergraduate levels of instruction. By 1975, Florida State expects to have more than 25,000 students, of which some 10,000 will be studying for graduate and postgraduate degrees. Whether one looks to the University's distinguished professors (including the 1966 Nobel Prize Winner in Chemistry, Dr. Robert S. Mulliken), its distinguished astronaut (Dr. Anthony Llewellyn), or its distinguished athletes, there is ample evidence that Florida State is "in the swim," "in the running," and "on the ball" both in the classroom and on the playing field.

Vaughn Mancha is in his eighth year as Florida State's Athletic Director. A former All-America football player at Alabama and a one-time assistant coach for the Seminoles, he has a deep interest in all athletic programs.

In his short tenure he has made giant strides in taking Florida State toward its ultimate athletic goal, the strongest overall program in the country.

Bim Stults begins his 20th season as Florida State's head swimming coach this year. In the past 19 seasons his teams have won an amazing 148 dual meets while losing only 25, a winning percentage of .856.

Stults became the University's first and only swimming coach in 1948. His first team won only three meets while losing five, but since then he has not had a losing season.

During his career at Florida State, the Seminoles have had six undefeated seasons, while six other teams were beaten only once. Only twice in the nearly two decades since that first year have the Seminoles suffered more than two losses in a single season.

This record has established Florida State as one of the South's best, as well as one of the nation's outstanding swimming schools. Six Seminole swimmers have been All-Americas, and in 1961 diver Curt Genders became the first Florida State athlete to win a national championship.

A native of Ohio, Stults graduated from Washington and Lee University in 1930. In 1939 he became the assistant swimming coach at Ohio State.

World War II interrupted Stults' coaching career and he served as a line officer with the U.S. Naval forces in both the Atlantic and Pacific. He retired with the rank of Lt. Commander.

After the war Stults returned to Ohio State and remained there until coming to Florida State.

Stults is a past president of the College Swimming Coaches Association, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Swimming Hall of Fame at Ft. Lauderdale.

Presently he is serving as a member of the Amateur Athletic Union diving committee. In June 1966 Stults toured the Middle East with an All-Star swimming and diving team, and last summer was nominated for both the swimming and diving coaches positions on the U.S. Olympic team.

JOHN SIMMONS

A valuable member of the staff, John Simmons handles the many important details in staging meets at the Florida State University Union Pool.

GERRY BREDEN

This former Seminole swimmer returns to his alma mater after five years as coach at Ft. Myers Lee High School. Last season Breden's Lee team swept all nine of its meets and won the county championship. While an undergraduate at Florida State, the 1962 graduate swam the butterfly. He is working on his Masters degree in Educational Administration.

THE 1968 OUTLOOK

The Seminoles should have another of their usually strong teams on tap this year, but Coach Bim Stults is not sure whether this will be enough to get through the 1968 season. "This new freshman eligibility rule that the SEC and most of the southern independents are using is going to put us in a bind," Stults noted. "Most of the schools have recruited high caliber freshman this year which will make them stronger than ever. We don't have any freshman who are really outstanding, and will probably use only upper classmen on our varsity."

The Seminole squad itself is smaller in number than in previous seasons, but it appears to have the strength and depth necessary for a competitive season. Whether it will be strong enough to be a consistent winner is the question mark.

Once again it appears the Tribe will be strongest in the freestyle and diving events.

Leading the freestylers will be Seeley Feldmeyer and Bob Bell. Both are veteran swimmers with fine backgrounds. Feldmeyer is possibly the best freestyler ever at Florida State, and Bell is just a notch behind. They will see most of their duty in the 50 and 100 sprints and relays.

Danny Harrison made a good showing last year with the freshmen, and should be added help in the 100 and 200. He will be joined in the 200 by Jim Thompson, who will also get the call in the 500. Steve McNerney will aid Thompson in the 500 and handle the 1,000.

The Seminoles should be in good shape in the breaststroke as Chick Newell and Danny Brendle step up from the freshman team last season. Newell is a top competitor in and out of the water and Brendle, with experience, should come on strong.

Bill Pocock is another sophomore who will be counted on this winter. A strong swimmer he is expected to become the team's top backstroker. Junior Jim Smith and seniors Hod Gray and Terry Schlichenmaier will add depth here.

In Individual Medley we will be stronger than last year, as Danny Sheils steps in after a fine freshman season. One of the most versatile swimmers on the team, he will be backed by Schlichenmaier and Gary Trimble.

Butterfly is somewhat of a question mark this year. Record holder Barry Rich has transferred leaving a big hole. Sophomore Bruce Rathman is one of the biggest swimmers on the club, and will probably move into the number one spot. He will have help from senior Terry Maul and sophomores Earl Christy and Kent Davis.

Once again the Seminole squad is blessed with top divers. This year there are four boardmen in the fold, and with two diving events this year the Tribe should be able to pick up points. Randy Stewart and Carl Springfels are veteran pointmakers, and they are receiving a strong challenge from sophomores Howie Acosta and Ken VonRoenn.


