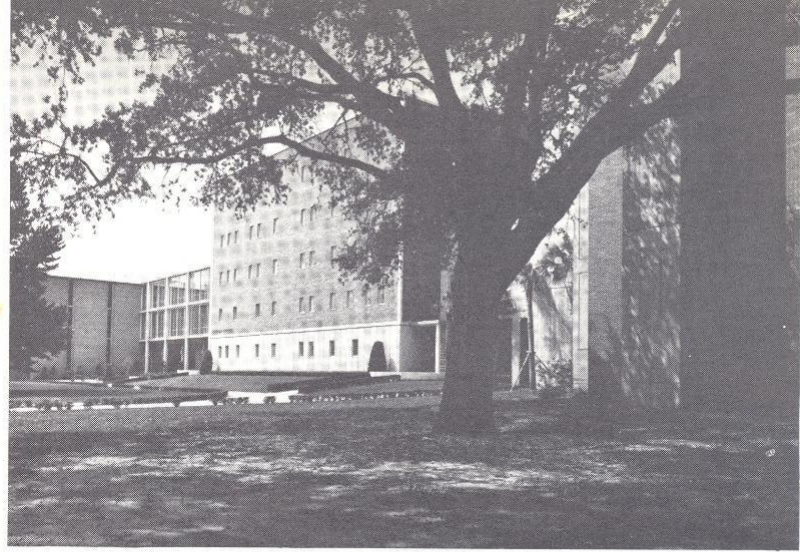

Florida State University this year celebrates its 113th year as an institution of higher learning but is just now reaching the age of 24 as a major coeducational public university.

For almost 40 years the university was a college for women. It achieved university status and its present name in 1947, and its growth during the last 24 years has been termed "an educational miracle."

The University was founded in 1857 as the Seminary West of the Suwannee. It went successively through a series of name changes and primary missions until it became Florida State College for Women in the early 1900's.

The enrollment last fall topped 18,000 and it is one of 24 institutions in the country which confers more than 100 Ph.D. degrees in a year. (More than 200 yearly in recent years).

Since its inception in 1957, the University's Nuclear Science Program has gained international prominence as the earliest, and to date, the largest interdisciplinary program of its kind to be initially equipped with state funds. A \$4.8 million grant from the National Science Foundation has provided for the development of centers of excellence at Florida State in the specific areas of physics, chemistry, statistics and psychobiology; and the State of Florida has provided \$2 million in matching funds for these endeavors.

Overseeing the operation of the second largest of the nine universities comprising the State University System of Florida is Dr. Stanley Marshall. Energetic and enthusiastic, Dr. Marshall brought a "fight-to-win" frame of mind with him to the presidency, which he assumed in June 1969.

He is a firm believer in and a supporter of athletics as a means of building character and releasing the tensions of modern living — not to mention those of a university president in this era. "Athletics contribute a great deal to the development of the individual," says Marshall. One of his favorite expressions is: "When you enter the fray, expect to take whatever wounds the game involves; and if you don't want to get hurt, don't play the game."

The Florida State athletic program is under the direction of Vaughn Mancha, who has guided the Seminoles' program into one of the nation's best all-around. Over the last three years, only one sport has had a losing season, and nine teams, plus many more individuals have competed in post season championship play.

STULTS

There are few schools in the South or across the nation, that can match the all-around accomplishments of Florida State's swimming program.

Since its inception in the winter of 1949, Bim Stults has been the only Head Coach of the Seminole swimming team. Only in that first year did the Tribe have a losing season. In six of his 22 seasons Stults has guided the Seminoles to undefeated records. On six other occasions the Tribe has lost just one meet, and only four times have they lost as many as three meets in

a single season.

The wall of Stults' Union Pool office is lined with no fewer than 20 All-America swimming certificates, earned by Seminole swimmers and divers. Included is a national championship won by Curt Genders in the 1961 one-meter diving competition.

But winning is just one part of Stults' success story. Many former Seminoles have gone on to become outstanding coaches — in both high school and college.

A past president of the College Swimming Coaches Association and a member of the Board of Directors of the Swimming Hall of Fame, Stults is also a member of the AAU National diving committee. In 1966, he toured the Middle East with an All-Star swimming and diving team and has served as a judge at the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Assisting Stults this season will be Bill Barton, John Simmons and Dennis Shiels. Barton comes to the Seminoles after four years at Pinecrest High School in Ft. Lauderdale, where he also coached the Gold Coast Aquatic Club AAU team. One member of his AAU club was the Seminoles' All-America diver, Phil Boggs.

Barton spent his collegiate career at Indiana where he was a member of the Hoosiers' squad and held three national and two world records.

Shiels was one of Florida State's most versatile swimmers. A holder of many records for the Seminoles while he was an undergraduate, he is considered one of the best to swim for the Tribe.

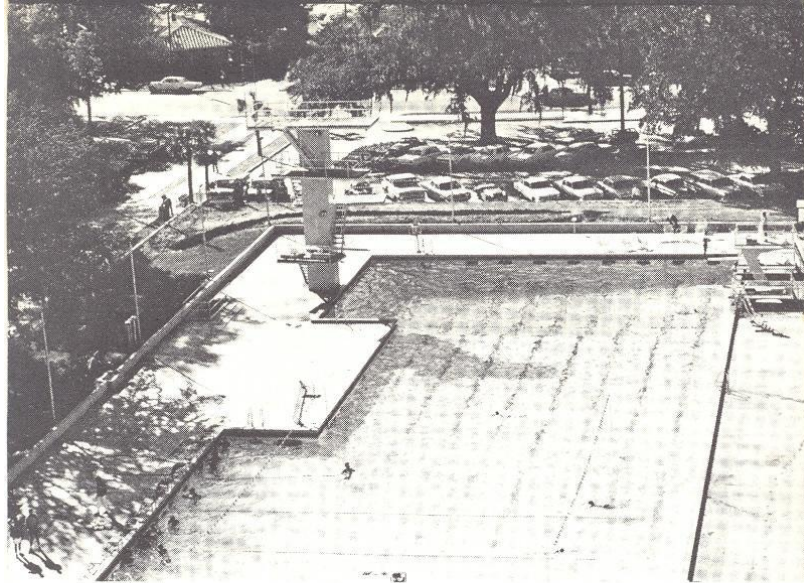
Dr. Simmons handles many of the important details in staging the Seminoles' home meets and is a valuable asset to the coaching staff.

The mild climate of Tallahassee's winters allows the Seminole program to work outside all year in Union Pool on the Florida State campus.

The site of all Seminole home meets, Union Pool consists of 16 swimming lanes, along with diving and warm-up areas.

The standard 25-yard "collegiate course" has eight lanes set into a 60' wide area. This leaves each of the outside lanes two feet from the wall, making them as fast as the middle lanes. The same is true for the eight lane, 50-meter, course.

The diving area meets or exceeds all the latest published specifications as outlined by the NCAA and the AAU. Included in the diving area are a pair of one-meter and two three-meter boards and a platform tower. All four Duraflex boards are mounted on Dura-firm fulcrums. The tower has platforms at five, seven and one-half and 10 meters.

Adjacent to the pool area is a "Porta Pit" complex for "dry diving." It includes a Duraflex Board on a moveable fulcrum.

Dressing facilities at the pool are available for varsity swimmers, as well as men and women's visiting teams. Additional facilities for championship meets are also available.

Timing and judging for all union pool meets is handled by the Kyroscope electronic timer. The latest in computer timing, it is completely automatic from gun to touchplates and registers time to thousandths (.000) for six lanes.

PAN AMERICAN GAME TOWER DIVING TRIALS

The Tower Diving Trials for the United States Team in the 1971 Pan American Games will be held at Florida State's Union Pool.

The selection of Florida State to host this prestigious event — it is the only event in the swimming and diving area to be conducted independently of the national championships — is a salute not only to coach Bim Stults and the Seminole program, but also to Florida State's outstanding diving facilities.

A two-day event, The Tower Diving Trials will be held in June, 1971, for both men and women.

1971 OUTLOOK

Florida's State's young swimming teams of the last two years have provided the nucleus for one of the Seminoles' hardest working and most dedicated squads in recent seasons.

In both 1969 and 1970, Coach Bim Stults had to go with young, untried swimmers as graduation and illness took the toll of more experienced performers. But even with freshmen and relatively untried sophomores manning several of the events, the Tribe had a respectable 16-5 mark the last two years.

Now at last, the Seminoles have a veteran team returning, with experienced men in almost every event. Only in one event, the breaststroke, will the Tribe have to go with a relatively untried group. The rest of the events have at least one and in several cases two or more experienced swimmers to call on.

"From an experience standpoint we are in better shape than in any of the last few years," said Stults. "We have juniors and seniors with a couple of years experience and many of the sophomores saw a lot of action last year."

The Seminoles' strongest areas appear to be the shorter freestyle differences and the diving events. In both, they have a returning All-America to lead the way.

Senior Dean Jerger earned an All-America rating in the 50-yard freestyle last year, and will lead the Tribe in both the 50 and 100 yard free events this winter. This year Jerger is serving as team co-captain along with junior diver Terry Maxhimer.

Phil Boggs leads the Seminole diving corps. As a sophomore Boggs earned a single All-America rating. Last year he captured the honor in both one and three meter competition. With national champion Jim Henry (Indiana) graduated, Boggs, who placed second in last year's one meter competition, has a chance to win it all.

Joining Jerger in the 50 and 100 will be Jerry Stevens, Lee Eisinger, Mike Seelie and Chuck Mitchell. Eisinger, Seelie and Mitchell will also perform in the 200 along with Mark Jenkins, Jody Hoch and Lawton Harrison, who also double in the 500. Jerry Norris, Ed Anderson and Harrison will man the 1,000.

The backstroke will be handled by Bill Gest, John Hegert, Bill Orendorff and Jim Phillips. Hegert and Bill Gest will also be counted on in the Individual Medley where they will be joined by Mark Middleton, Tom Gest, Jeff Stone and Doug Shropshire.

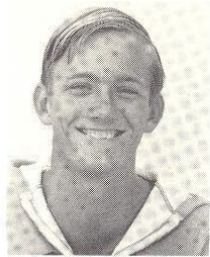
Middleton and Chet Miltenberger, last year's biggest surprises as freshmen, will again be handling the butterfly with help from another sophomore Roger Russell.

Steve Driver is the only breaststroker with any amount of experience who returns. He will be joined by Dennis Bunn.

Joining Boggs on the boards will be Maxhimer and a pair of freshmen, Dave Trepanier and Bill Leaks.

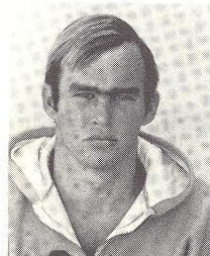
DEAN JERGER, Freestyle, Sr., St. Petersburg — The best freestyle sprinter in school history . . . earned All-America rating last season, was among top ranked sprinters all year . . . holds record in 50-yard freestyle and member of record setting medley and free relay teams . . . team co-captain for second straight year . . . is an outstanding leader and fine competitor . . . refuses to accept second best . . . was married over the summer.

ED ANDERSON, Freestyle, Jr., Warren, Mich. — Should be his best season yet . . . made strong showing as a freshman and showed improvement last year . . . has apparently completed his physical development and should be stronger . . . a key in the 500 and 1,000 . . . could be the best Seminole distance man before he is through.

BILL GEST, Backstroke, Sr., Sarasota — Best backstroker in Florida State history . . . set record in 200 last year after setting mark in the 100 year before . . . named most improved swimmer in 1969, has continued to move up . . . strong competitor . . . has good size—6-3, 175 . . . one of four married members of the squad.

MARK JENKINS, Freestyle, Jr., Akron, O. — One of most versatile freestylers ever to swim for the Seminoles . . . can swim anything from 100 to 1,000 although he will see duty primarily in 200 and 500 . . . strong and a hard worker . . . has made good physical development and should be ready to make a big move.

PHIL BOGGS, Diver, Sr., Akron, O. — An outstanding student athlete . . . a Dean's list student and three time All-America as a diver . . . the best in Seminole history and currently one of the top divers in the country . . . "they don't come any better," says Coach Bim Stults . . . continues to work and improve his dives, even when it appears a dive is in peak form . . . equally strong off one- and three-meter boards . . . placed fourth in three-meter in 1969 NCAA and was second in three and ninth in one in 1970 . . . will be solid contender for National Champion in both this spring and has especially good shot at three . . . married.

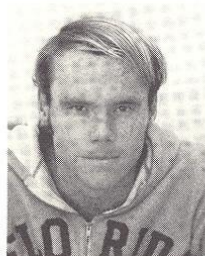
