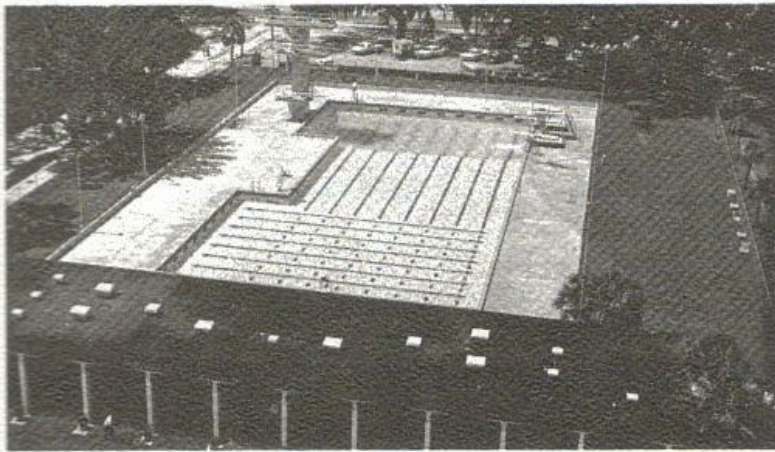

UNION POOL

The mild climate of the Tallahassee winter allows the Seminole program to work outside all year in Union Pool on FSU's campus.

The standard 25-yard "collegiate course" has eight lanes set into a 60' wide area. This leaves each of the outside lanes two feet from the wall, making them as fast as the middle lanes. The same is true for the eight lane, 50-meter course.

The diving area meets or exceeds all the latest published specifications as outlined by the NCAA and the AAU. Included in the diving area are a pair of one meter and two three-meter boards and a platform tower. All four Duraflex boards are mounted on Durafirm fulcrums. The tower has platforms at five, seven and one-half and 10 meters.

Adjacent to the pool area is a "porta pit" complex for "dry diving." It includes a Duraflex Board on a moveable fulcrum.

Dressing facilities at the pool are available for varsity swimmers, as well as men and women's visiting teams. Additional facilities for championship meets are also available.

Timing and judging for all union pool meets is handled by the Kyroscope electronic timer which registers time to thousandths (.000) for six lanes.

OUTLOOK

Head Coach Terry Carlisle tags his 1974-75 Florida State swimming team "vastly improved and experienced." And experience and improvement, indeed, will be keys to handling the toughest schedule in FSU's history.

While only posting a 4-5 record in his first year as Head Coach, Carlisle points to the record book and late season competition as indication of a strong future. First, all but two varsity swimming records were shattered by last year's squad from which only two seniors were lost. A strong Miami squad found itself pressed for the National Independent Championship by the Seminoles in late competition last year.

This year's schedule, which picks up 3rd ranked Tennessee for the first time, provides one of the "toughest and best schedules in the country." Carlisle admits that the Seminoles will have to swim "above themselves" during the season as they meet two "Top 10" and four "Top 20" teams. He believes that "if we compete with the best during the regular season, then we should be able to go into the championship meet better prepared."

Carlisle will be looking to 13 returning lettermen for leadership and strength on the team. All-Americans Cliff Schlak, Bob Horne and Steve Meisel have continued to improve and should be the nucleus of a more balanced team.

Junior diver Jeff Bauer will be expected to make a strong contribution. Bauer qualified for the NCAA's as both a freshman and sophomore and he is expected to continue to improve.

Two sophomores to be watched are Steve Rosenbaum and Paul Wise. Rosenbaum, defending record holder for the NIC 100 fly and an individual qualifier for the NCAA Championships, will give strength in the butterfly and freestyle competition. Wise is the school record holder in the 1000 and 1650 free and is much improved.

Swimming is a traditional winner in Florida State's intercollegiate history. Twenty-six years of competition has produced a 189-53-2 record. In other words 77% of the time Florida State took to the water, they won.

Only three times in 26 years of competition have the Seminoles finished with a losing season and only seven times were as many as three meets lost. Head Coach Terry Carlisle, now entering his second year, sees the challenge of building even further on this winning tradition.

Coach Carlisle set two major goals when he became Florida State's second swimming mentor following Bim Stults. First, he would like to see an NCAA Championship for FSU. Secondly, he hopes every standing school record would be broken.

The 1973 Seminoles hit the water with records in mind and came out with nine new ones. The only swimming records left untouched were the 50 and 100 yard freestyle events both held by All-America Dean Jerger. In addition to the new records, Florida State also produced an All-America 800-yard freestyle relay team.

The Seminoles boast nearly two dozen All-Americans in past years swimming and diving. Included are a pair of National Championship awards, one earned by Curt Genders in one-meter diving in 1969 and the other by Phil Boggs in three-meter diving in 1971.

The winning tradition is just a part of Florida State's success story. Many former Seminoles have gone on to become outstanding coaches in both high school and college. It is believed that more graduates from FSU are now coaching than from any other school in the country.

Coach Carlisle previously was an assistant coach at Tennessee, where he received his Masters Degree in Educational Administration. He received his undergraduate degree at Yale, where he lettered in swimming.

Assisting Carlisle this season will be two former Seminole stars.

John Rangeley returns for his second year as assistant swimming coach. Rangeley added experience to the staff last year and should continue to do so this year. He will also be the Head Coach for the Lady Seminoles this year. The Chattanooga, Tenn. native was very successful for seven years as head coach at Sarasota High School before returning to his alma mater. Rangeley was a member of the FSU squad that went undefeated in 1964 and 1965.

Serving his first year with the Seminoles is former FSU diver Terry Maxhimer. The Massillon, Ohio native returns to Florida State after serving as assistant coach under Bill Barton at Cornell.

PROFILES

JEFF BAUER, Diver, Junior, Sarasota Fla.—Qualified for NCAA Championships as a freshman and Sophomore in one meter diving competition . . . with improvement could be among the top divers in the nation . . . will be called on to keep FSU diving tradition going.

BRENT FICHTER, Diver, Freshman, Massillon Ohio—Highly recruited . . . has full list of dives both on one and three meter boards . . . expected to challenge Bauer in his first year . . . caliber of Phil Boggs.

PETER EUNSON, Distance freestyle, Freshman Clearwater, Fla.—All-America High School . . . Florida State Champion, 200 and 400 meter freestyle . . . expected to give FSU lift in middle and distance races . . . excellent IM swimmer also.

MIKE GRATTAN, Sprint Freestyle, Freshman, St. Petersburg, Fla.—All-America in High School, 50 and 100 freestyle . . . fastest freshman freestyle swimmer ever to enter FSU . . . should give strength to area that was weak last year.

CLIFF SCHLAK, Freestyle, Junior, Williams Bay Wis.—1974 College All-America, 800 Freestyle Relay . . . has all the physical assets . . . most versatile swimmer right now . . . much improved over summer.

STEVE ROSENBAUM, Freestyle, Sophomore, Sarasota, Fla.—Defending NIC record holder in 100 Fly . . . individual qualifier in the NCAA Championships last year . . . can swim butterfly and any freestyle.

BOB HORNE, Sprint Freestyle, Sophomore, Miami Fla.—1974 College All-America 800 Freestyle Relay . . . best sprinter to emerge from last year's team . . . hope to explore some of his talents at middle distance and backstroke.

STEVE MEISEL, Freestyle, Sophomore, Winter Park Fla.—1974 College All-America, 800 Freestyle Relay . . . biggest surprise from last year's freshman squad . . . has potential to be super in 200 and 400 IM events . . . plan to explore freestyle potential shown last year.

PAT REAUME, Breaststroke, Senior, Los Angeles Calif.—Only Senior on team . . . expected to provide leadership . . . improved tremendously over summer . . . hopes to fill weakness in breaststroke from last year . . . team captain.

PAUL WISE, Distance Freestyle, Sophomore, Columbus, Ohio—School record holder in 1000 and 1650 freestyle . . . fourth in Summer 1974 National Junior Olympics 200 Fly . . . much improved . . . expected to swim more fly this year.
