

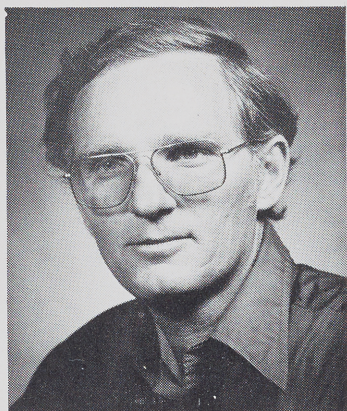

SEMINOLE SWIMMING PROGRAM

Swimming is a traditional winner in Florida State's intercollegiate history. In 27 years of competition, an overall record of 194-57-2 has been compiled by the Seminole tankers. In other words, 77% of the time they have taken to the water, they have emerged the winner.

Only three times in 27 years of competition have the Seminoles finished with a losing season and only

eight times have there been as many as three meets lost. Head Coach Terry Carlisle, now entering his third year, is enthusiastic about continuing the winning tradition.

The 1975 season was a strong indicator that Florida State is making a significant move toward reestablishing itself as a major swimming school in the South. For the first time in six years, the Seminoles defeated rival Florida, and continued to show their strength against conference schools defeating North Carolina, LSU and Georgia.

Over the years, the Seminoles boast nearly two dozen All-American swimmers and divers. Included are a pair of National Champions—one earned by Curt Genders in one-meter diving in 1969 and the other by Phil Boggs in three-meter diving in 1971.

The winning tradition and current move toward further excellence are only part of Florida State's success story. Many former Seminoles have gone on to become outstanding coaches in both high school and college. It is believed that more graduates from FSU are now coaching than from any other school in the country.

Coach Carlisle was previously an assistant coach at Tennessee, where he received his masters' degree in Educational Administration. He received his undergraduate degree at Yale, where he lettered in swimming.

Carlisle will be assisted by three former collegiate performers now studying at Florida State.

Rich Matheney, a Detroit, Michigan native, returns to Florida State to coach the divers after a year devoted to graduate work. Matheney won All-American honors at Ohio State University as a diver in 1973.

Serving his first year with the Seminoles will be former North Carolina swimmer, Mike Eddy. Eddy was an assistant coach with the Atlanta Swimming Association last year and has been described as a "student of the game". The experienced Atlanta, GA native will be tutoring the breaststroke and individual medley.

Also in his first year as a Seminole coach is Rod Havriluk. Co-captain of his swimming squad at Franklin and Marshall, Havriluk will be coming to FSU after 13 months in the armed services. He will concentrate on distance swimmers and the butterfly.

MIKE GRATTAN, Sprint Freestyle, Sophomore, St. Petersburg, Fla. — National AAU finalist over past summer... first swimmer to represent Florida State at the Pan American Games... NCAA qualifier in the 50- and 100-yard freestyle... dark horse for Olympic birth.

JEFF BAUER, Diver, Senior, Sarasota, Fla. — Qualified for NCAA Championships as freshman, sophomore and junior on one-meter board... will be top diver on the squad this year... expected to provide leadership on the boards... with confidence, could be All-American.

PETER EUNSON, Freestyle, I.M., Sophomore, Clearwater, Fla. — NCAA qualifier in 400-yard Individual Medley last year... Honor Student... should be one of the top distance men in the South.

STEVE MEISEL, Freestyle, I.M., Junior, Winter Park, Fla. — After outstanding summer, should provide leadership to this year's squad... 1974 All-American on 800-yard Freestyle Relay... Honor Student... possible scorer at NCAA Championships.

STEVE ROSENBAUM, Butterfly, Junior, Sarasota, Fla. — Two time NCAA qualifier... qualified last year in the 100-yard butterfly... school record holder in 100- and 200-yard butterfly... outstanding competitor on Medley Relay.

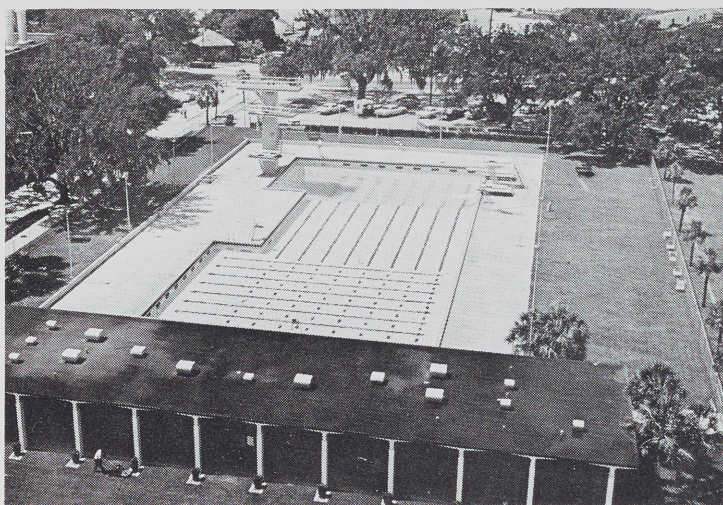
LARRY BROWN, Butterfly, Freshman, Mobile, Ala. — High School All-American in 100-yard butterfly... versatile swimmer... capable of swimming freestyle, Individual Medley or breaststroke... expected to challenge for a spot on the Medley Relay team... highly recruited throughout South.

KEVIN CONNELL, Freestyle, I.M. Breaststroke, Freshman, Poughkeepsie, N.Y. — Voted by New York sportswriters as best swimmer in New York last year... finalist in National Junior Olympics over the summer... expected to provide needed depth to the squad this year.

BRIAN MULLER, Breaststroke, I.M., Freestyle, Freshman, Willow Grove, Pa. — One of Eastern U.S. outstanding prep school swimmers... High School All-American in 200 yard Individual Medley... expected to challenge for breaststroke leg of Medley Relay... biggest, strongest swimmer on the squad.

BRAD STETSON, Distance Freestyle, Freshman, Glenview, Ill. — Finalist in the 1500 meters in the National Junior Olympics over the summer... expected to team with Eunson to give one-two punch in the distance events... shows promise to be outstanding freshman performer.

KEVIN MARSHBURN, Breaststroke, Sophomore, Winter Haven, Fla. — Biggest surprise among last year's freshman... school record holder in 100 and 200 yard breaststroke... finalist in the NIC Championships last year... most outstanding of Seminole performers at NCAA Championships... could score this year at NCAA Championships.



UNION AQUATIC CENTER

The mild climate of the Tallahassee winter allows the Seminole program to work outside all year in the Union Aquatic Center on FSU's campus.

The standard 25-yard "collegiate course" has eight lanes set into a 60' wide area. This leaves each of the outside lanes two feet from the wall, making them as fast as the middle lanes. The same is true for the eight lane, 50-meter course.

The diving area meets or exceeds all the latest published specifications as outlined by the NCAA and the AAU. Included in the diving area are a pair of one meter and two three-meter boards and a platform tower. All four Duraflex boards are mounted on Durafirm fulcrums. The tower has platforms at five, seven and one-half and 10 meters.

Adjacent to the pool area is a "porta pit" complex for "dry diving." It includes a Duraflex Board on a moveable fulcrum.

Dressing facilities at the pool are available for varsity swimmers, as well as men and women's visiting teams. Additional facilities for championship meets are also available.

Timing and judging for all union pool meets is handled by the Kyroscope electronic timer which registers time to thousandths (.000) for six lanes.

OUTLOOK

Florida State's swimming program is on the verge of breaking into a new day. The Seminoles have always been winners, but now they are emerging as a consistent quality threat to any opponent.

They say it takes a little time. Coming off a 5-4 season in which a couple of breaks and a few contracts would have enhanced the record considerably, third year Head Coach Terry Carlisle sees the 1976 squad as solidly superior to any Seminole team in this decade.

Several factors substantiate his view.

First, all but one of last year's scorers return for this year's campaign. Second, Florida State had a sterling recruiting season (perhaps the best in the state) and can count on the quality depth that these freshmen afford. And, third, this is the largest squad that has entered a new season since 1970.

The "young team" of last year has grown up. "This is a seasoned club," said Carlisle. "There is no way we can fall back on being 'young' anymore. We've got a lot of experience back with us this time." Indeed, of his 27 swimmers, 17 have lettered. Of those 17, ten have lettered more than once.

These factors combined with the quality talent Carlisle has developed across every event focus a picture of a solid team, the beginning of the kind of team he would like to see every year.

The distance events: The Seminoles look to be "tremendously stronger" in the 1000-yard freestyle with NCAA qualifier Peter Eunson leading the way and big freshman Brad Stetson pressing close behind. With the same personnel as the 1000, the 500-yard freestyle is also improved over last season.

The 200-yard freestyle, last year's strongest event, is even stronger. Cliff Schlak, one of three seniors on the squad, is in the early figuring along with junior Bob Horne.

The specialty events: The 200-yard breaststroke, once a weakness for the Seminoles, is expected to be much stronger now with the return of NCAA qualifier and school record holder Kevin Marshburn. Two freshmen, Brian Muller and Kevin Connel, could also make contributions.

It's all up in the air on the 200-yard individual medley. Peter Eunson is initially the number one I.M. prospect, having experience. But three freshmen, Larry Brown, Connel and Muller, have all recorded times equaling the Seminoles' best effort last year.

Booked as the Seminoles strongest event, the 200-yard butterfly boasts two-time NCAA qualifier Steve Rosenbaum.

The sprints: Pan Am Gold Medalist Mike Grattan will be the premier performer in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle. Grattan is tagged as many to be the South's leading sprinter. Certainly he is among the top two or three. Horne and Schlak are expected to provide the depth.

Diving: Senior Jeff Bauer, a three-time NCAA qualifier, continues to improve and will be handling the number one diving slot for the Seminoles.
