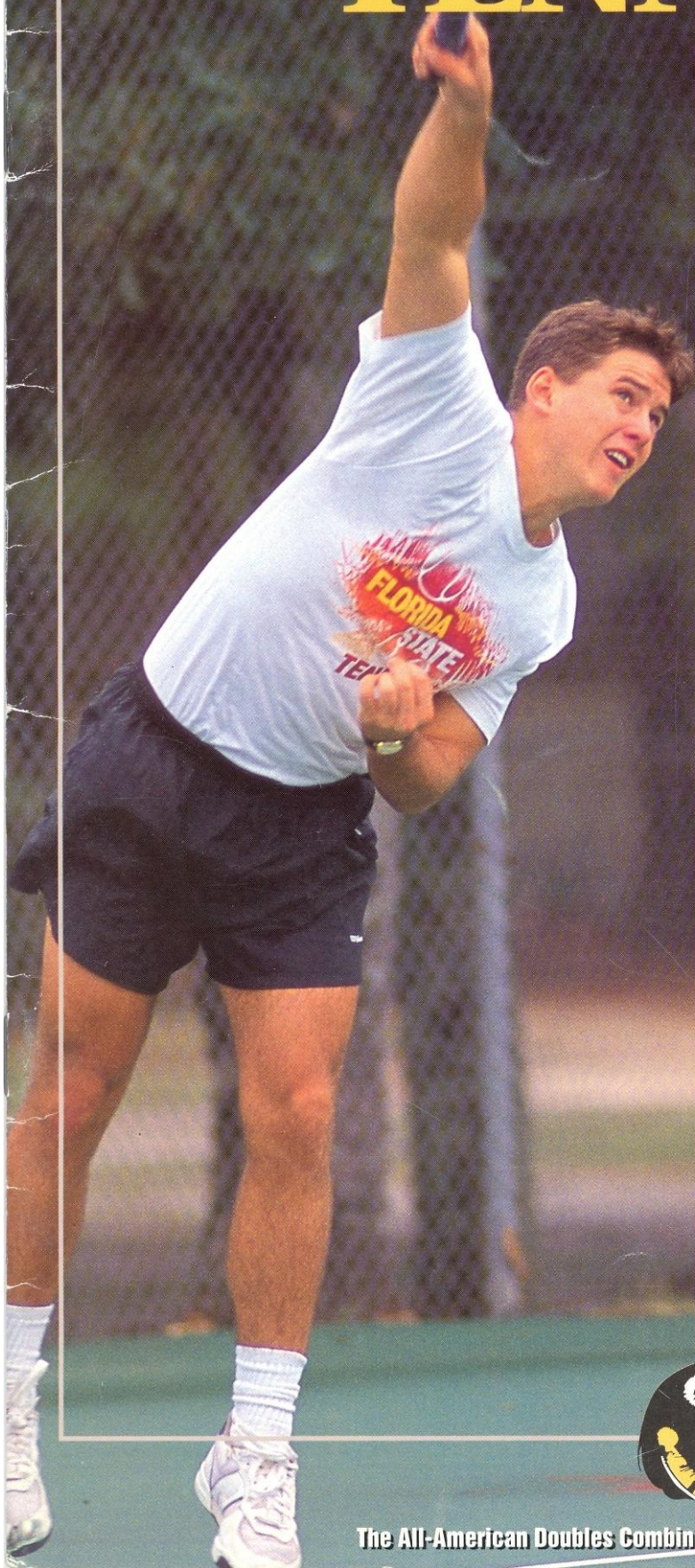

Florida State excels into the twenty-first century

Florida State University is leading the way toward a new century exploring science through supercomputing, pioneering in Florida's growing film industry and scouting new avenues of cultural exchange in a world opening the paths to freedom.

Florida State offers graduate and undergraduate degree programs through its eight colleges- Arts and Sciences, Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, Human Sciences, Law, and Social Sciences and eight schools- Criminology, Library and Information Studies, Music, Nursing, Social Work, Theater, Visual Arts and Dance, and Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts. The University awards approximately 5,000 de-

grees every year.

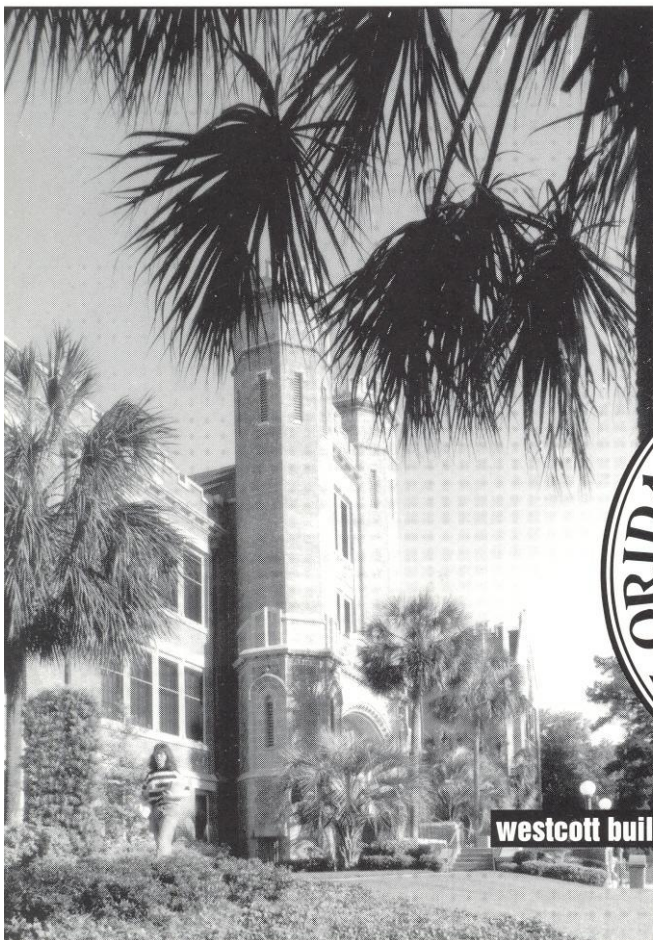
Florida State is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the State University System. Florida State was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act and began operating in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee; the University owns a total of 1,167 acres in Leon, Bay and Franklin counties. Within the state, FSU spreads west to its 20-acre campus in Panama City and south to its marine laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico and its film and theater professional-training programs in Sarasota. In 1990, through a generous gift to the Foundation, the University acquired the Appleton Art Museum in Ocala, which will become a study center for the visual arts. Student activities at FSU create an important balance between the classroom experience and the personal life of the individual scholar.

The sixteen schools and colleges make up the roughly 29,000 students who are enrolled in the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs and live and work among 1,558 faculty and 2,600 staff members. In the past several years, the University has gained national recognition for its accomplishments as an educational institution. In 1994 FSU was among the few elite schools in the country to be selected as a Research Level One University. FSU also boasts one of only three national High Magnetic Field Laboratory research centers in the world.

Florida State offers ample opportunity for students to acquire leadership skills. Whether it is through Student Government, Greek social organizations, Honors programs, or departmental organizations, Florida State offers over 350 active registered student organizations. Furthermore, the Flying High Circus, the world's only all-collegiate circus, makes its home here.

Florida State remains a growing institution. From its roots as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women and then achieving its coeducational status in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution and a top-ranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts, and in all areas of teaching, research and service, Florida State University continues to be a pathfinder into the 21st century.

**scott speicher tennis center
at donald loucks courts**

Completed in the summer of 1993, the Scott Speicher Tennis Center at Donald Loucks Courts, is one of the premier tennis facilities in the country. Costing over \$1.2 million to build, the Center has become the newest focal point in Florida State's commitment to providing top-notch facilities for its athletes.

The Center houses 12 lighted ten-

nis courts and over 1,000 court level seats. It is adjacent to the tennis offices, locker rooms and weight room in Tully Gym.

The Center was named in the honor of Lieutenant Commander Michael Scott Speicher, a graduate of Florida State University and the first American casualty during Operation Desert Storm. By Presiden-

tial directive, the Facility bears the name the "Scott Speicher Tennis Center."

The Facility was designed by EMO/Architects, Inc., a Tallahassee based architectural firm, in collaboration with Global Consult Group, Inc., an internationally recognized Tennis Facility Design Consultant. The complex was funded by a private source in the State University System of Florida.

FSU posts eighth consecutive winning season

Looking forward to the 1994 season, Head Coach Dave Barron was full of optimism. Barron knew his squad had to face one of the tougher schedules in the country, matching up against tennis powerhouses Mississippi State, Duke, and Texas Christian, but with the squad coming off a successful '93 campaign, 1994 was a perfect opportunity for FSU to establish itself among the tennis elite.

The Seminoles began their season with ten consecutive home matches. This proved to be a great jump start for the '94 campaign. Georgia Southern and Georgia State were the Seminoles' first victims, each being sent home with dominating 7-0 defeats at the hands of FSU.

Mississippi State came to Tallahassee with their #7 national ranking for FSU's third match and served Coach Barron's squad their first defeat of the young season 6-1. The Bulldogs proved to be a good barometer for the Seminoles to measure themselves against the nation's best. After suffering the loss, the Seminoles rebounded with four consecutive victories over Jacksonville, SW Louisiana, #28 Miami, and Florida International, improving their overall record to 6-1 by the end of February.

As March began, the Seminoles were headed into the heart of their Atlantic Coast Conference schedule. North Carolina, Wake Forest, and Duke all made the visit to the Speicher Tennis Center and FSU managed to defeat the Demon Deacons 6-1, but fell to the Tar Heels and Blue Devils in tough fashion, falling 4-3 in both outings.

The Seminoles hit the road for the first time on March 13 and defeated South Florida in Tampa, 5-2. Upon returning home, NC State and the University of

Miami (OH) awaited the 'Noles. FSU was not too cordial a host sending both home with 5-2 and 7-0 defeats respectively.

Standing at 10-3 and 2-2 in the ACC, the Seminoles knew the roughest part of the schedule was ahead of them. By spring break, FSU had completed its home schedule and had to finish the season away from the friendly confines of the Speicher Center. Life on the road was not too kind to FSU as they dropped four out of the next five matches. The Seminoles lost to #18 Virginia Commonwealth, Clemson, Texas A&M, and Texas Christian, with their sole victory coming over Furman.

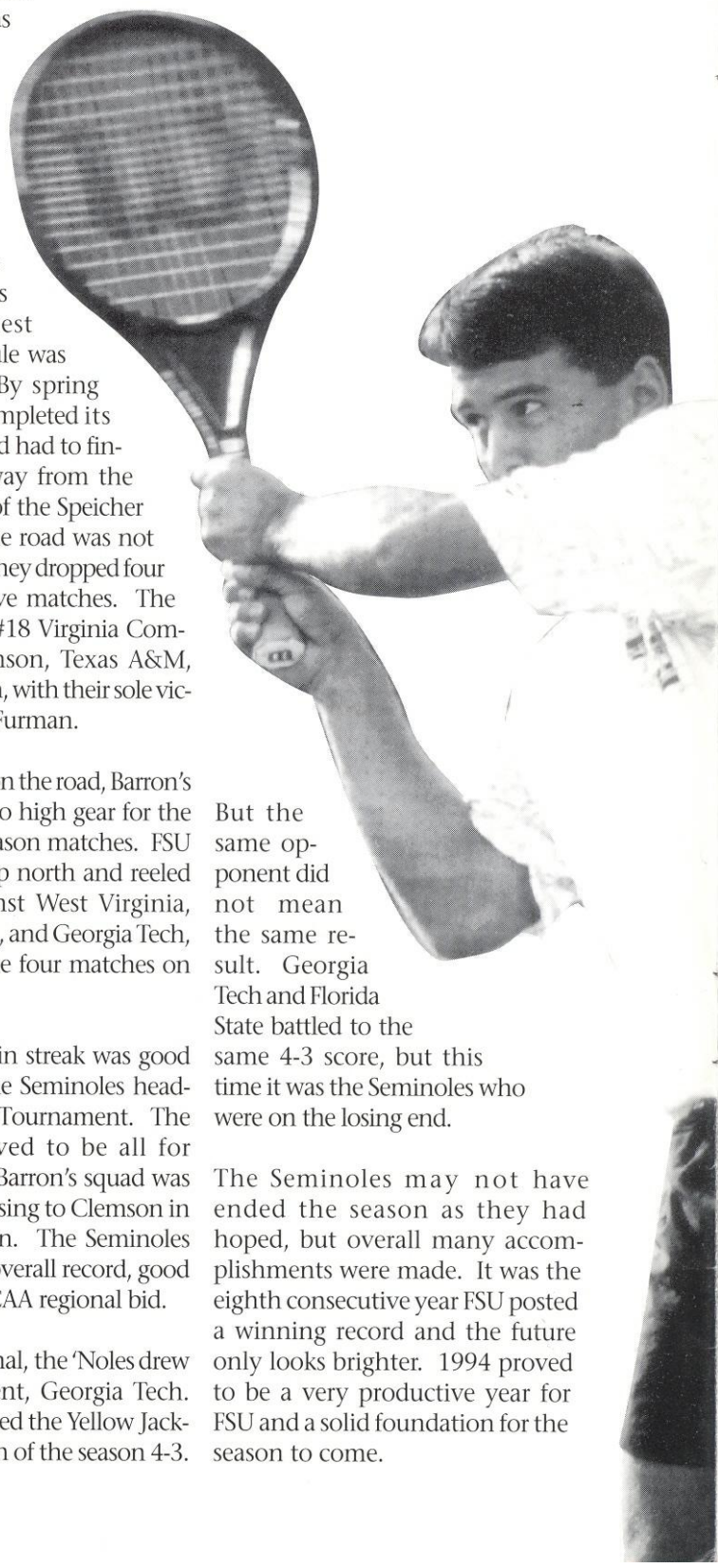
After a rough start on the road, Barron's squad kicked it into high gear for the last four regular season matches. FSU carried its show up north and reeled off victories against West Virginia, Maryland, Virginia, and Georgia Tech, winning two of the four matches on 4-3 counts.

The four match win streak was good momentum for the Seminoles heading into the ACC Tournament. The momentum proved to be all for naught as Coach Barron's squad was sent home early, losing to Clemson in a close 4-3 decision. The Seminoles stood with a 15-8 overall record, good enough for an NCAA regional bid.

At the NCAA regional, the 'Noles drew a familiar opponent, Georgia Tech. FSU had just defeated the Yellow Jackets in the last match of the season 4-3.

But the same opponent did not mean the same result. Georgia Tech and Florida State battled to the same 4-3 score, but this time it was the Seminoles who were on the losing end.

The Seminoles may not have ended the season as they had hoped, but overall many accomplishments were made. It was the eighth consecutive year FSU posted a winning record and the future only looks brighter. 1994 proved to be a very productive year for FSU and a solid foundation for the season to come.



The '95 team sets this year's goal even higher

Head coach Dave Barron is excited about the upcoming tennis campaign. He believes that the 1995 squad will pick up where they left off last year. "We are definitely a team on the rise," states Barron. This year's squad will be the deepest and most talented in Coach Barron's five years at the helm of the Seminoles.

After finishing 15-9 last season, Barron knows the expectations to win will be high. "We lost some of our talent," says Barron, "but I expect our upper-classmen to step up and lead the way."

Barron will call on the senior leadership of Brian Stanton and Ken McKenzie to carry the team and help develop the younger players.

Stanton, who played last season from the #1 position, should be Barron's ace again this season. He finished last season with an overall record of 27 - 10 and a record of 18-5 in dual

matches. Brian put together consecutive win streaks of 5 and 6 matches en route to competing in the NCAA Tournament, where he defeated the 14th ranked player in the nation. Stanton enters the spring with a #31 national ranking in singles.

McKenzie, last year's #2 player, figures to be an influential part of the FSU squad. Last season he finished with a 20-12 overall record. The ACC competition proved to be overmatched by McKenzie, who was 7-1 in conference play. When teamed up with Stanton, the two proved to be a successful pairing. This fall, the pair won the ITCA Rolex Regional in Chapel Hill, N.C., and carry with them a #7 national ranking.

Barron is also pleased with his first-season players. "I believe that the talent on our team is strong enough to win the ACC this season. The younger players add a new excitement while the veterans are the stabilizing force the team needs", Barron adds.

Antonio Prieto looks to add depth to the Seminole's roster. The junior transfer from Florida Junior College in Jacksonville, has an excellent all around game. He was ranked in the top 10 (junior division) in his native Brazil, has considerable playing experience and looks to play at the top of the line-up this season. Prieto enters the spring season with a #59 ITA national ranking.

The middle of the line-up for Coach Barron will be crucial to

the success of this year's Seminole squad. Jason White had a solid showing last season and hopes to build on last seasons' impressive 16-8 record. White will join Prieto in the middle of the line-up, adding experience to the heart of the Seminole order.

Coach Barron has the luxury of having plenty of talent competing for the final few positions. Scott Schuhriemen, Alex Golub, Adam Baron, and senior Dean Ehrlich all had impressive fall outings, and will carry their combined fall record of 16-5 into the spring duals.

In addition, the Seminoles return sophomore Murphy Payne and junior Nathan Turney who both should see action this season.

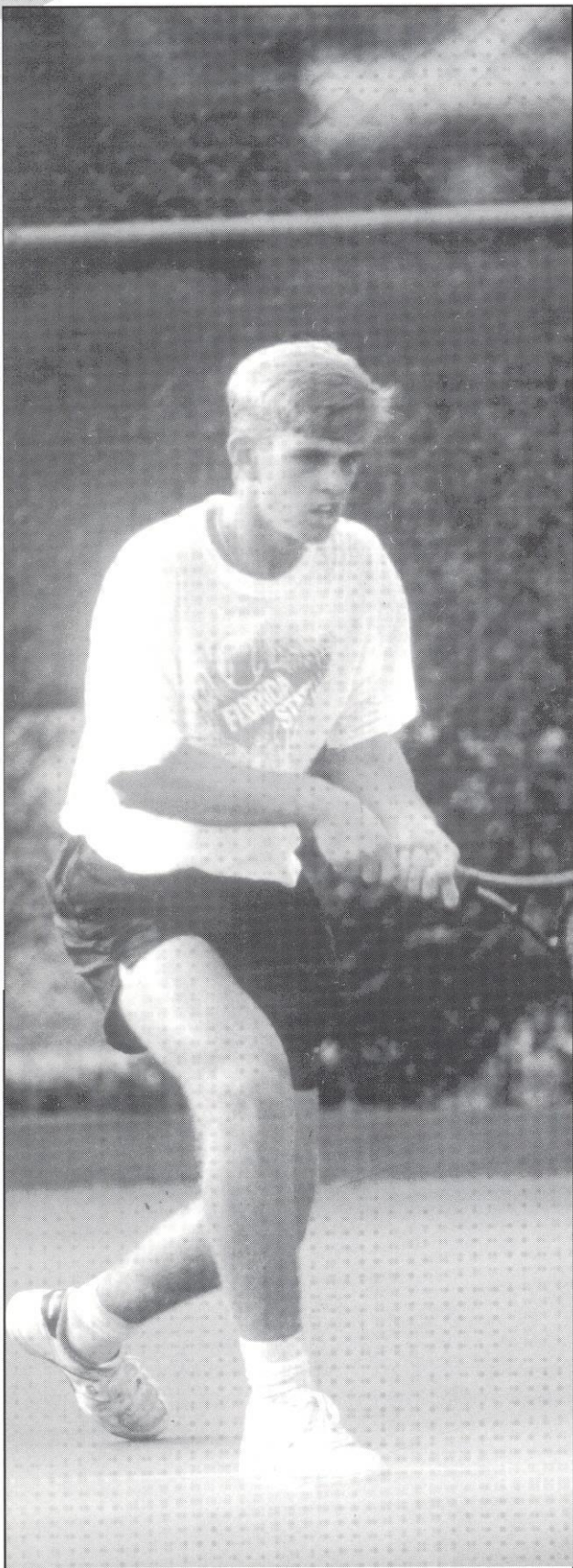
Barron who heads into his fifth campaign as the leader of the Seminoles is very optimistic about his squad. "They have the potential to be a very, very good team," he admits. "We have great depth and a tenacious, gutsy attitude which should help us when we get into the heart of our season."

Joining Coach Barron and the Seminoles this season will be first-year assistant John Vinson. Vinson will bring a wealth of tennis experience to the squad. Vinson has experience coaching at the collegiate level, as he was an assistant under Richard McKee at FSU from 1986-88.

Florida State is confident that it

FSU & THE ACC 1995



The Atlantic Coast Conference has a rich tradition in men's tennis and 1994 was no exception. The ACC had at one time or another six schools in the top 50. Duke, North Carolina, Wake forest, Clemson, Virginia, Georgia Tech, and Florida State all positioned themselves among the elite top 50. Duke finished the season tied for 8th, North Carolina finished tied for 19th, and Florida State came in at 35th. For the third consecutive season the Seminoles finished third in the conference championships.

Men's tennis began in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1954. From 1954 to 1978, North Carolina dominated the conference championships. During that time, there were only three years that the Tar Heels were absent from the team championships. In the 80's, it was Clemson who mounted a streak, winning the crown nine times in 10 years. North Carolina and Duke have split the dominance in the early 90's, but Florida State is set in their ways to make a strong run for the title in '95.

will be able to establish itself as a tennis powerhouse. Ranked in the top four in the region, Coach Barron's Seminoles have a bright future ahead of them. "We have set some lofty goals for ourselves this season, including winning the ACC, and qualifying for the NCAA's. "If everyone stays healthy and injury free, we can contend for a top-twenty national ranking."

This season, the Seminoles will face some of the best teams in the nation. Four teams ranked in the preseason top-10 will meet the Seminoles, as will an overall total of nine top-25 teams. Of those nine teams, only Texas A&M (19), and the University of Alabama-Birmingham

ham(21), will challenge the Seminoles at the Scott Speicher Center. It is imperative that the Seminoles get off to a good start, because they play the most difficult opponents at the end of the season. They play four nationally ranked teams in six matches during the latter part of the season and the way they perform then should be a good indication of the success of the team during the post-season.

Coach Barron believes the Seminoles have everything going for them this season. "We are stepping into a national focus. It is a compliment for our program to be added to a schedule with the likes of Georgia and Mississippi State." With Florida State's men's tennis program really coming of age, the time has come for the Seminoles to, as Dave Barron confidently states, "Command the respect that we feel we deserve."

Student-Athletes keep school a high priority

To support Seminole student-athletes as they strive to meet their fullest potential both on and off the field, the athletic department has undertaken several projects to upgrade both their academic support services and facilities. The physical plant expansion of the Moore Athletic Center as part of the University Center project, means FSU student-athletes have expanded access to a state-of-the-art learning environment, which includes individual study areas, the latest in computer technology, and a study hall which also includes a research area.

Florida State student-athletes also benefit from one of the premier academic support systems. A full-time staff assists all incoming student-ath-

letes, in adjusting to their new campus environment and works with them throughout their academic careers at FSU.

Under the direction of Dr. Roger Grooters the Academic Support Program is in place to meet the needs of FSU's student-athletes. Grooters and his staff aid student-athletes with admission, class scheduling, registration, and the normal progression towards a degree.

Regular class attendance is required in order to play tennis at FSU, and attendance is closely monitored during the playing and practice seasons. Throughout the school year, nightly study halls and tutor-

ing sessions help the student-athlete stay on course. Student-athletes have unlimited access to mentors who provide one-on-one tutoring. The academic support staff works closely with the faculty members at Florida State as well as with the athletic department's own office of student services.

The men's tennis team continues to make its mark on the FSU campus with its growing tradition of academic excellence. The men's tennis team has won a FSU's Golden Torch award three of the last four years. Under Coach Barron, the men's tennis program has set new standards in the classroom which all student-athletes aspire to achieve.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Strength conditioning and strength training are an important part of an athlete's performance on the court. At Florida State, a supervised program is developed for tennis, emphasizing the objectives of not building bodies, but strengthening and conditioning them. Strength coach Kevin Fitzgerald individually customizes programs for each of the athletes beginning with pre-conditioning before the season gets underway. The workouts are modeled after the Na-

tional Strength and Conditioning Association's tennis training program. Fitzgerald works with the players in sport specific training which includes conditioning the major muscle groups used in tennis. Head Coach David Barron has his team work out three days per week in the fall and the spring to keep in top form. Florida State takes pride in customizing the programs to help student athletes reach their maximum potential.

the state... is a veteran of the Junior National tennis circuit.

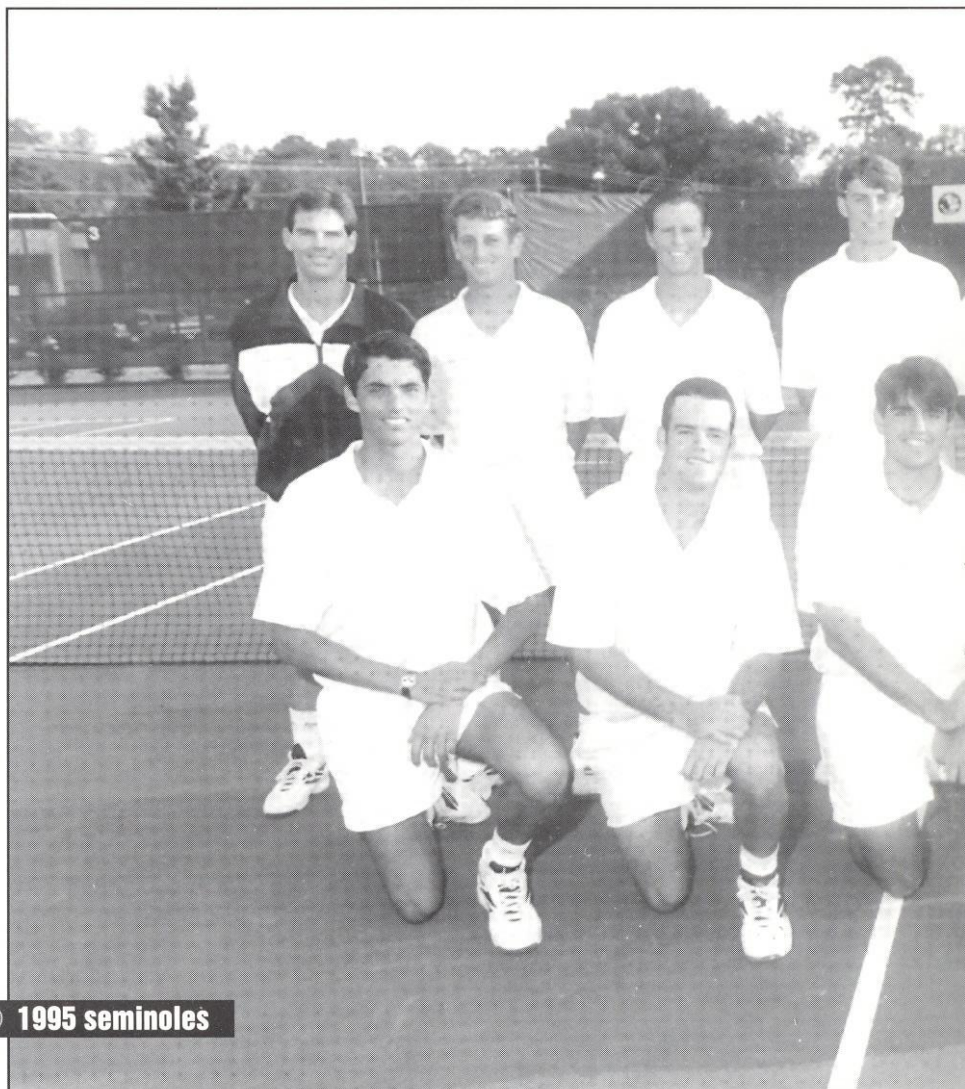
KEN MCKENZIE

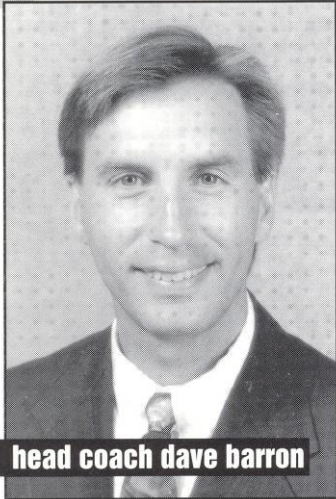
JASON WHITE

head coach dave barron

David Barron has done wonders for the Florida State Seminole men's tennis program. Whether he is coaching, out recruiting, or involving himself in charitable activities, the fifth year head coach takes part in many activities which have brought the FSU program into national prominence.

The 33-year old Evansville graduate will be very busy once again this season as the Seminole's venture into one of the nation's toughest schedules. Despite the tough schedule, the 'Noles are expected to contend once again for the ACC title. The Florida State men's tennis team has steadily improved with the addition of top players to the program, and much of the team's success can be attributed to the recruiting and coaching abilities of David Barron.

Florida State will begin its second campaign in the Scott Speicher Tennis Center, Through his vision and lobbying, Barron did much of the leg work to make the Center a reality on the Florida State campus.

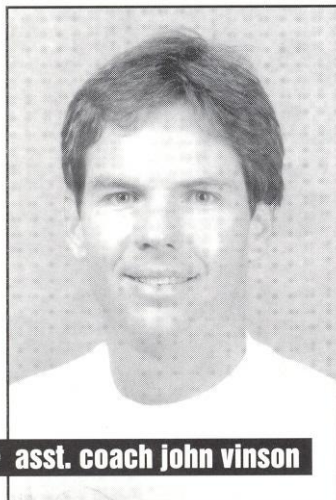
A native of Evansville, Indiana, Barron played on a Junior College National Championship team at the Central Florida Community College before graduating in 1981. He then moved on to the University of Evansville where he was the team MVP in 1983 while earning his bachelor's degree later that same year. Barron then travelled to Nova University where he earned a master's degree in 1985 in business administration.

After Nova, Barron returned to Florida and worked at Nick Bollettieri's prestigious Tennis Academy. While at the Academy, Barron met Andy Brandi who went on to become the head coach of the University of Florida women's tennis team. Brandi brought Barron to Gainesville in 1985 where they proceeded to lead the Lady Gators to become one of the top teams in the country. Although this is only his fifth year as head coach at FSU, Barron is already proving he can produce the same results for the Seminoles.

Recently, other organizations have benefitted from Barron's involvement. The fifth year head coach has been heavily involved in a campaign to raise money for the Children's Miracle Network. By organiz-

ing a tennis Pro-Am this fall, \$20,000 for the pediatric programs at Shands Hospital at the University of Florida has been raised.

Barron, who is married to the former Michelle Sharps, is USPTA (United States Professional Tennis Association) certified. He is currently working on his doctorate in athletic administration here at Florida State. Barron also became the proud father of John David Barron on January 5th.

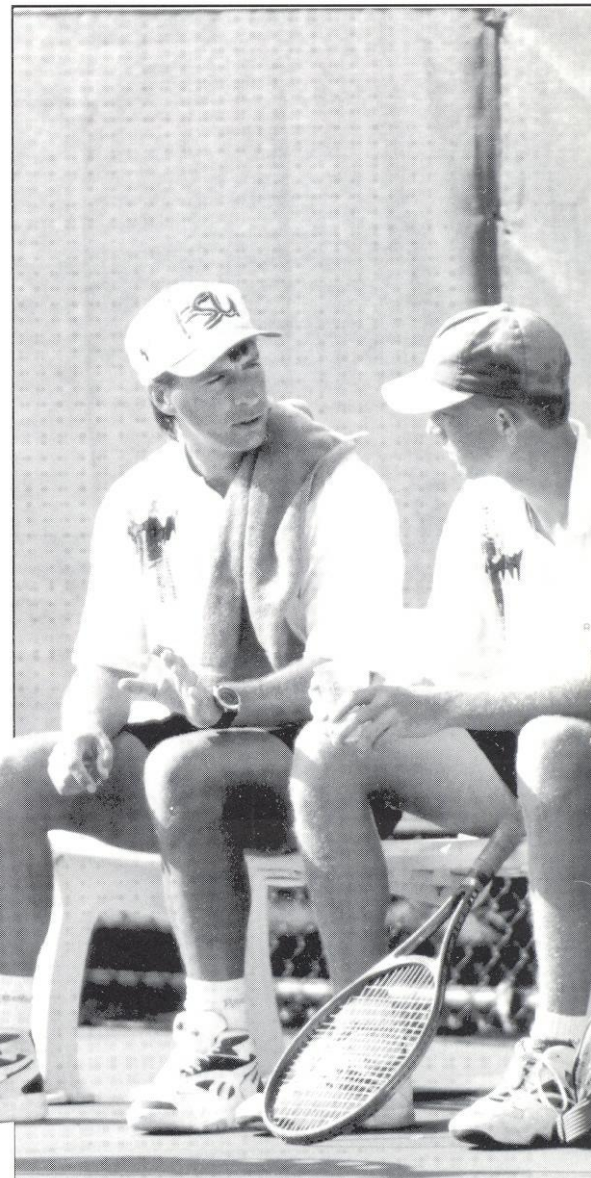


asst. coach john vinson

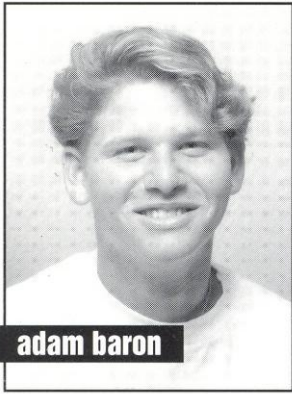
Utah State (men and women).
