## MIKE LONG Head Coach



Florida State's track program--one of the best in the Southeast--is a tribute to the efforts of an ex-Minnesota pole vaulter who became head coach in 1955.

During his ten years, Mike Long's teams have won an astounding 44 dual meets, losing only seven. Four undefeated seasons are included in this total.

Last year, the Seminoles won five dual meets, lost none, including a 75-70 victory over SEC indoor champion Tennessee in Knoxville, a meet which took place only two days after Florida State had defeated Florida in Gainesville.

Long came to Florida State in 1953 as a football and basketball assistant. Prior to that time he was a high school coach in Sarasota and Fort Myers.

The Long family has made contributions to Florida State track other than Mike's coaching. His oldest son Steve, who died in an automobile accident last summer, was an outstanding hurdler and high jumper for the Seminoles, and held the school record in the high hurdles at one time.

Terry, a 25 year old graduate student at FSU, was also a hurdler during his undergraduate years and holds the current record for the 120 highs. Curt, 21, is a member of this year's Florida State team, and Jim, 16, is on the track team at Tallahassee's Florida High.

The Longs also have a daughter, Susan, 7.

Long is a graduate of the University of Minnesota where he won an Olympic regional pole vault title in 1936.

## Graduate Assistant DICK ROBERTS



An outstanding miler for the Seminoles for the past three years, this St. Petersburg native can give FSU's younger track hopefuls some first hand information. Roberts, a 23-year old bachelor, won three letters in track at Florida State. He was Florida Invitational champion in the mile last year.

## 1965 OUTLOOK

Florida State's track team is loaded with veterans and promising sophomores with enough depth to carry the Seminoles in dual competition, although improved opposition may preclude a repeat of last year's undefeated record.

The running events are solid with the 880 the only apparent weak spot. Al Cato and Bob Sable return from last year to lead a top-notch pack of sprinters which includes newcomers Kenny White and Bill Campbell.

The 220 is the specialty of Jerry McDaniel who hasn't been defeated in dual competition during his entire varsity career. He'll be joined by two of the above sprinters.

McDaniel also goes in the 440 where Doug Ferry and soph Don Casteel are also contenders.

The loss of Hank Raehn, school record holder in the 880, leaves the field open to Ross Winter and John Brogle. Both are competent, but plagued by injuries. Loss of either could leave a hole here.

Sophomore Bill Nelson and senior Irv Watson led Florida State's cross country team to an undefeated season last fall and should lead the Tribe in the mile and two mile this spring. Richard Carrico and Tom Graham add depth to the distance events.

Things look fairly good in the hurdles with Floyd Lorenz and Darryl Guthrie in the highs, joined by soph Steve Landis who may be the best of the lot. Doug Ferry set a school record in the intermediates last year. He'll be pushed by Landis and Curt Long.

McDaniel, Cato and Sable all ran on the 440 relay team which set a school record and won the Florida Relays last year. Replacing the departed Hutch Johnson will be either White or Campbell.

McDaniel also anchors the mile relay where he'll be joined by Brogle, Ferry and possibly Casteel or Campbell.

Overall, the running events are strong with particular depth in the sprints, which should hold the relays in good shape. If some distance runners can break loose from the pack, the Seminoles will be rough to handle.

Despite the loss of the South's premier weight man, Al Williams, the field events look better than ever with a group of outstanding youngsters.

Ray Hoxit and David Braggins are expected to take up the slack left by Williams in the shot and discus.

Gary Oates can also throw the discus, along with the javelin where his teammates are Darryl Guthrie and Leslie King. Mike Urich and Dave Thompson could also figure here.

The pole vault is cut to the bone with the academic failure of promising soph Hull Carr, however, Don Pharis is the current school record holder and should win many meets, although seconds and thirds will be hard to come by.

Floyd Lorenz was FSU's top high jumper last year, and should be better than ever during his senior season. Bill Maxwell adds depth.

The broad and triple jumps have a definite sophomore tint, but these sophs are expected to be among the best in the South. King was a surprise winner in the Orange Bowl meet in the broad jump, and Sid Gainey is also a comer. Third man will be either Curt Long, Casteel or Steve Schatz.

The triple jump is probably the strongest of all events. Casteel bettered the school record as a freshman last year. Gainey is a solid performer and Schatz was outstanding last season. Long may also help.

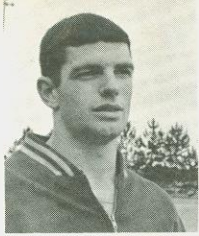

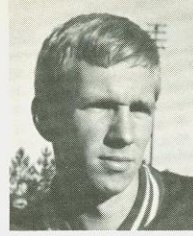

## PROFILES

**DON CASTEEL**, *Soph, Avondale, Ga.* A versatile performer who can make a big impression in his first varsity season. The triple jump is his specialty, but he may also run the intermediate hurdles and is in contention for a spot on the mile relay team. Won the Georgia AAU meet as a freshman last year with a triple jump of 45' 9". He jumped 46' 10" in practice last fall.

**JERRY McDANIEL**, *Senior, Tallahassee.* This powerful runner led the Seminoles in points last season and is expected to be better than ever during his final year. He holds the current school record in the 220 and is expected to add a mark in the 440. He has never been defeated in a dual meet during his two years of varsity track. He could be ready for national competition this season.

**ROSS WINTER**, *Junior, Mobile, Ala.* Plagued by injuries since his arrival at FSU as a basketball hopeful, Winter shows great promise in the middle distances. He contributed a fine clutch performance in the 880 in FSU's victory over Tennessee last year.

**IRV WATSON**, *Senior, Miami.* Particularly strong at two miles. An aggressive runner who sets a fast pace and will challenge the best. One of Florida State's most dedicated athletes.

**DON PHARIS**, *Junior, Douglas, Ga.* The 1965 Orange Bowl champion in the pole vault. Pharis has shown constant improvement and currently holds the school record. He should better 15' consistently this year.

**FLOYD LORENZ**, *Senior, Mascoutah, Ill.* A graceful, versatile performer who has taken dead aim on the school's high jump record this year. A great team man, Lorenz also gathers points in the intermediate and high hurdles.

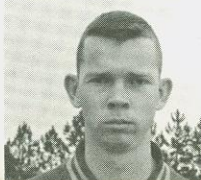
**SID GAINEY**, *Soph, Cairo, Ga.* Sound track background and a promising future. He should be a consistent scorer in both the broad and triple jumps.

**LESLIE KING**, *Soph, Winter Park.* Great possibilities for this youngster in the javelin and broad jump. He was a winner in the latter event in the Orange Bowl Classic this year.

**DOUG FERRY**, *Senior, Melbourne.* Present school record holder in the 330 hurdles. A tenacious battler who can never be taken lightly. Also expected to fill spots in the 440 and relays.

**BILL NELSON**, *Soph, Clearwater.* Led Florida State's cross country team to an undefeated season last fall. Possibly the class of the distance runners.

**KEN WHITE**, *Junior, Pensacola.* This junior college graduate can add some punch to the 100 yard dash, and is being counted on for service on the 440 relay team. Expected to be a valuable asset.

**DARRYL GUTHRIE**, *Junior, Fort Myers.* One of the better hurdlers on the team, however, his strongest event is the javelin where his points are needed.

**RAY HOXIT**, *Senior, Rosman, N.C.* Extremely strong. He's expected to take up the slack left by the graduation of Al Williams. Will have to conquer a tendency toward injury.

**STEVE LANDIS**, *Soph, Atlanta, Ga.* Should be consistently near the top in every meet. Won both hurdle events in last fall's intra-squad meet and ran on both winning relay teams. Tremendous competitor who should be able to go with the best.

**DAVID BRAGGINS**, *Soph, Lake Wales.* Promising tackle on Florida State's football team. He could help the Seminoles in the shot and discus.

**BILL CAMPBELL**, *Soph, Tampa.* Another Seminole footballer, Campbell came out last year and without any practice won the 100 yard dash against Florida's freshmen. He should add depth to the sprints and is a possible breakthrough in the 100 or 220.

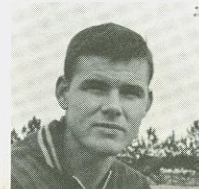
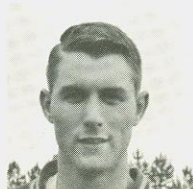
