



MIKE LONG Head Coach



Florida State's track program-one of the best in the Southeast--is a tribute to the efforts of an ex-Minnesota pole vaulter who became head coach in 1955.

During his ten years, Mike Long's teams have won an astounding 49 dual meets, losing only seven. Five undefeated seasons are included in this total.

Last year, the Seminoles won five dual meets, lost none, including a $86\frac{1}{2}-58\frac{1}{2}$ victory over Florida before a record breaking crowd.

Long came to Florida State in 1953 as a football and basketball assistant. Prior to that time he was a high school coach in Sarasota and Fort Myers.

The Long family has made contributions to Florida State track other than Mike's coaching. His oldest son Steve, who died in an automobile accident in 1964 was an outstanding hurdler and high jumper for the Seminoles, and held the school record in the high hurdles at one time.

Terry, a 27 year old graduate student at FSU, was also a hurdler during his undergraduate days and holds the current record for the 120 highs. Curt, 21, is a promising hurdler on this year's squad, and Jim, 17, is a track member of Tallahassee's Florida High team.

The Longs also have a daughter, Susan, 7.

Long graduated from the University of Minnesota where he won an Olympic regional pole vault title in 1936.

ASSISTANT COACHES

DICK ROBERTS: Major responsibility-Middle Distance and Distance Runners. A 23-year old bachelor from St. Petersburg, Roberts won three letters in track at FSU, was Florida Invitational Mile champion two years, and coached 1965's State Cross-Country Champions.

FLOYD LORENZ: Major responsibility-Fields Events. A native of Mascoutah, Ill., Lorenz holds the school high jump mark.

TERRY LONG: Major responsibility-Hurdlers and Sprints. The holder of the school record in the 120 highs, Long is married and has one son.

1966 OUTLOOK

Florida 'State's track team looks formidable again but so does the schedule, which is highlighted by five home meets. Tennessee, Southern Illinois, Auburn, and Miami visit Tallahassee in dual meets while the State Invitational meet in early May concludes the home season.

The Seminoles will also face the talent laden Florida Gators in Gainesville in addition to traditional entries in such big meets as the Penn Relays, the Florida Relays, and the NCAA championships.

The running events are solid for the most part with a chance for outstanding strength here if all hands come through scholastically. Ken White and Bill Campbell figure strongly in the sprints. White, who ran a 9.5 in the 100 last season, is a natural to anchor the sprint relay.

The 440 looks lean on paper based on heavy losses from last year's group; however, Steve Landis and Wayne Currie have made excellent progress this fall and will be tough to handle.

The 880 has potential with two of F.S.U.'s better middle distance men, John Brogle and Ross Winter, heading a strong group.

Bill Nelson, last year's leading miler, returns in that event and will be backed up by sophomores Al Bassett and Sid Merchant. At two miles, seniors Tom Graham, Bob Hohnadel, and Richard Carrico are the leading contenders, with Graham, State cross-country champion, the most experienced in the event.

Both hurdle events look promising with Landis, Curt Long, and Charlie Vickers in the 440 intermediates and Pierce Jones and Dave Frew joining Long and Vickers in the highs.

The shot, discus, and javelin are early season question marks, with second semester additions a possible boost to these spots. David Braggins, from the football squad, is a key man here. During the fall, Tom Gardner in the shot and Gary Oates in the discus were the chief threats.

Oates, Dave Thompson, and Bud Manning will be the FSU entry in the javelin, with all capable of bettering the 190' mark.

In the high jump, Manning and Rett Hensley are consistent scorers. In the broad jump Gainey returns from a spectacular sophomore year and hopes to achieve national ranking this season. The same is true of Don Casteel in the triple jump.

The ability of Casteel and Gainey, along with Steve Landis in the hurdles, Ken White in the dashes, and John Brogle in the 880, all school record holders, will be the key to the 1966 track season.





PROFILES

DON CASTEEL, Junior, Avondale, Ga. A versatile performer who achieved national mention for his efforts in the triple jump, Casteel can broad jump, hurdle, or run on the mile relay. Can become a good one if he develops.

ROSS WINTER, Senior, Mobile, Ala. Once an FSU basketball hopeful, Winter has possibilities of becoming the school's best ever half miler. He had a best of 1:52.8 last year.

SID GAINEY, Junior, Cairo, Ga. School record holder in the broad jump and rapidly improving in the triple jump. Gainey comes from a strong track background and should be one of Florida State's best.

BILL NELSON, Junior, Clearwater. One of the team's most dedicated runners, Nelson showed great promise as a sophomore last year. Fine running style and good speed. Should be a constant threat in the distances.

KEN WHITE, Senior, Pensacola. An outstanding junior college runner, White showed he was a great competitor in college competition, in 1964. Ran 9.5 last year. He runs best in the big meets.

STEVE LANDIS, Junior, Atlanta, Ga. One of the South's leading intermediate hurdlers, and a point winner in the Penn Relays. Should be even more effective this year with the intermediate race being lengthened from 330 yards to 440 yards.

DAVE BRAGGINS, Junior, Lake Wales. A rugged offensive tackle on the Seminole football team, Braggins contributed heavily last year in the weights and should be bigger and better this season.

BILL CAMPBELL, Junior, Tampa. Possibly the fastest man on the football squad, Bill's speed will give F.S.U. a solid 1-2 punch in the sprints along with Ken White. Bill will also hold the key to the Seminole relay teams.

JOHN BROGLE, Senior, St. Petersburg. A big, strong type of runner who likes to set the pace. Brogle ran an impressive 1:52.2 half mile last year and has yet to reach his top potential.

CHARLIE VICKERS, Junior, Orlando. A junior college hurdler from Orlando. A hard competitor with fine technique. Could be a surprise this year.

TOM GRAHAM, Senior, Ft. Lauderdale. Led FSU to state cross-country championships. Most effective at the two mile distance in the spring. The solid type, always in contention.

CURT LONG, Junior, Tallahassee. Rapidly improving junior hurdler. Good speed and a fiercely competitive attitude that could carry him a long way.

BOB HOHNADEL, Senior, Tampa. A member of the cross country team, Bob has stamina and speed and could be among the best of the distance men.

AL BASSETT, Sophomore, Norfolk, Va. Miler with the ability to score consistently well in the mile. Good sound future.

JACK FLANDREAU, Sophomore, Paris, Ky. A gifted athlete with the ability to go all the way to the top if he pays the price.

DAVE THOMPSON, Junior, Miami. Javelin specialist. A hard worker, Thompson has improved until he should be a consistent scorer.

GARY OATES, Junior, Daytona Beach. Steady performer in both the discus and the javelin. Intensive weight program expected to add considerable distance in both events.

BUD MANNING, Sophomore, Gainesville. Last year's leading freshman high jumper. Will also be a threat in the javelin.

RETT HENSLEY, Junior, Bradenton. A junior college athlete from Manatee, Hensley is making excellent progress and along with Manning presents a formidable high jump duo.

TOM GARDNER, Sophomore, Keystone Heights. Up from the frosh. Small for a shot putter, but quick and strong. Aiming for 50' this year.
