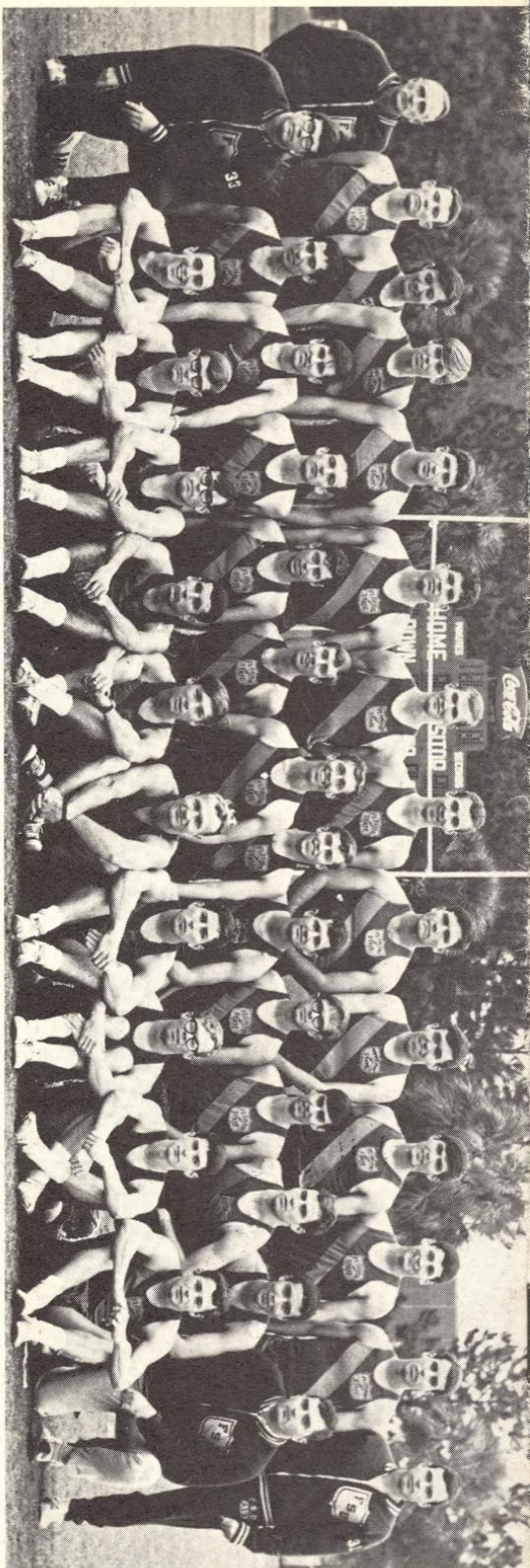
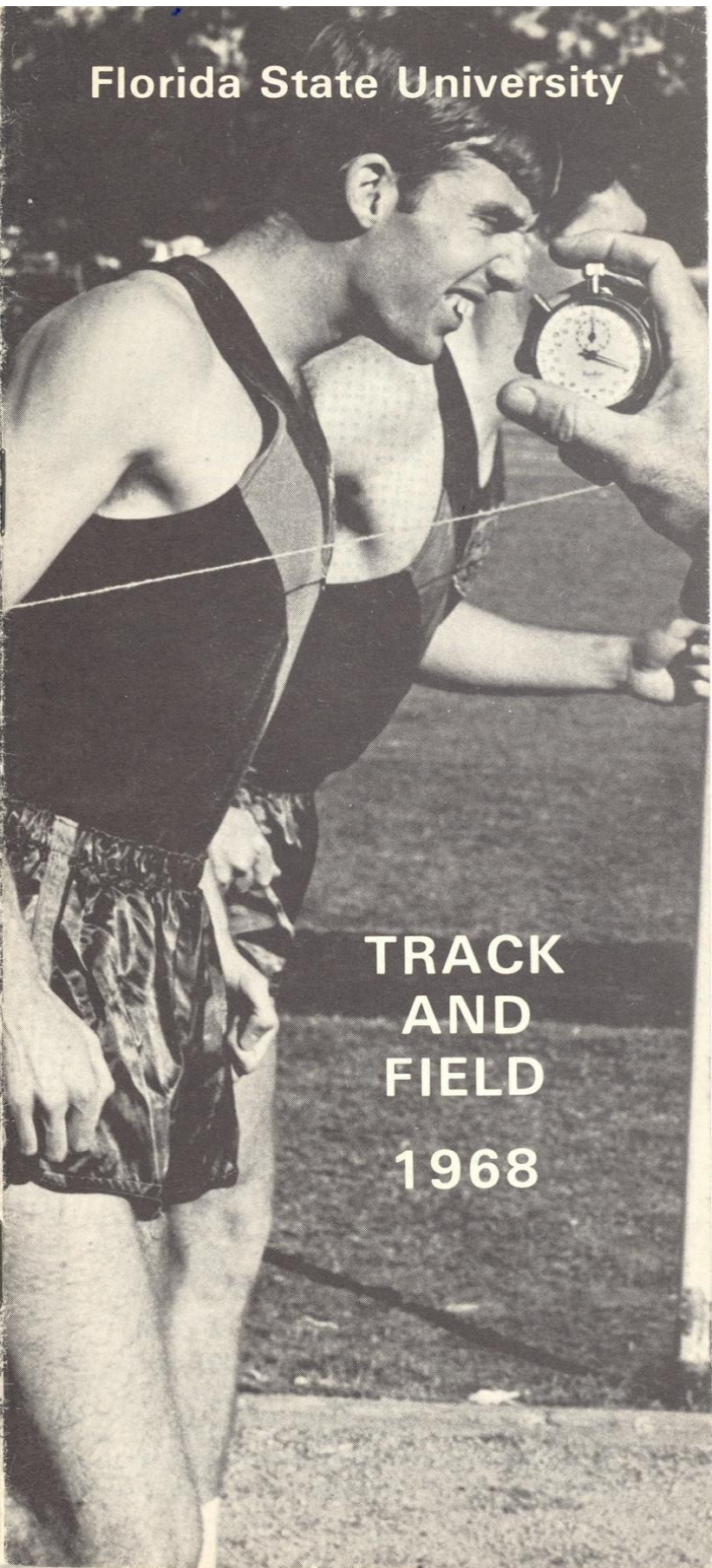

MIKE LONG HEAD COACH

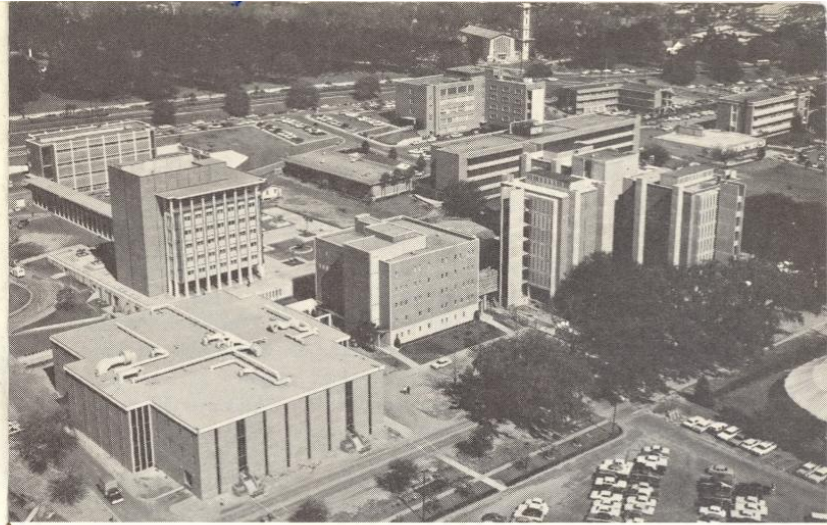
In 13 years as Florida State's head Track and Field Coach, Mike Long has become recognized as one of the South's most successful coaches.

The 1937 University of Minnesota graduate came to Florida State in 1953 as a basketball and football assistant. That spring he became assistant track coach under Dr. Kenneth Miller, and in 1955 took charge of the Seminole runners.

Long's teams have won 51 of 67 meets and he has led the Tribe to five unbeaten seasons in dual meet competition. On five other occasions his teams have lost just one meet.

At Minnesota, Long was a pole vaulter on the Gopher track team, and in 1936 he won an Olympic regional pole vault championship. He spent 16 years coaching in high school (six in Minnesota and 10 in Florida) before coming to Florida State.

Long is married to the former Louise Creeger of Luverne, Minn. They have four sons and a daughter. All of Long's sons have participated in the Florida State track program. The youngest, Jim, is a sophomore on this year's squad and Curt, who graduated last spring, will remain as a graduate assistant this season.

THE OUTLOOK

The 1968 Florida State track team is potentially one of the better teams in Seminole history, but they may be a year away from reaching that potential.

"We have one of the most promising teams I have seen at Florida State," said Tribe coach Mike Long. "The biggest problem lies in the fact that 35 percent of our team will be freshmen and although they are the best we have ever had at Florida State, I am not sure that they will be up to varsity competition this year."

With the large number of freshmen who will be competing, and playing a key role in the Seminoles' success, this team is also the youngest in Long's 14 year history.

"If I could put this team on a scale ranging from bad to excellent, I think it would fall somewhere between good and very good," the Tribe Coach explained. "But, I am not sure we will be up to the level of our competition. The South has been undergoing a general upgrading in track and field in recent years, and although we have improved, I don't know if it has been enough."

The sprints and hurdles appear to be the Seminoles' strong suit this year although the half-mile and 440-relay could also be strong.

The biggest weakness will be the lack of a really outstanding quarter-miler, which will hamper the Seminoles' effort in the 440 and the mile relay.

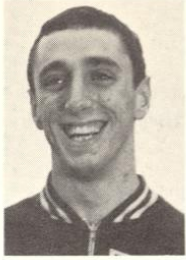

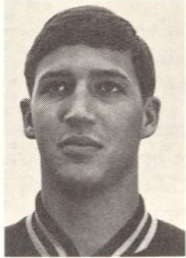
Sprints—Andy Guy and Greg Kaufman both return as veterans, despite the fact they are junior and sophomore respectively. Both are strong runners who display lots of stamina in their running. Guy was an outstanding high school performer, but has not yet reached his potential for the Seminoles. He was hurt during last year's indoor season and was slowed the rest of the year. He should be ready to come on strong this year. Kaufman was one of two freshmen to win a varsity letter last year. He is a dedicated runner and hard worker which overcomes any lack of ability he may have. Freshmen Doug Brown and Gordon Guensler should be the biggest contenders for the third spot. Brown was the 1967 Florida State High School AA champ, and Guensler was not far behind in the finals. The 220 will have Guy, Kaufman, Denson Pepper and Randy Stow vying for the top three places. Pepper and Stow are both freshmen. The former was the Florida 220-champ his junior year, and the latter the Georgia State champion last season. Guensler and Brown could also figure predominantly in the 220 which is the Seminoles' deepest event.

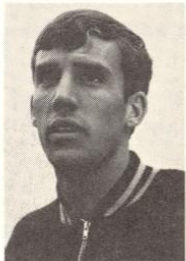
Kaufman

440—The 440 is another deep event for the Tribe, but unlike the sprints, the Seminoles lack that one outstanding performer. Mike Link is a sophomore letterman, and should be the number one man in this event, but his status is questionable as he is still recovering from a knee injury sustained during the fall workouts. Stow, Pepper and Jim Long are other strong possibilities here, along with Phil Scott and Bill Wild. The 440 could be a big key to the Seminoles' season, if one of the boys comes up with an outstanding performance.



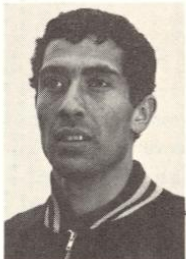
Link

880—There is a lot of potential in the half mile for the Seminoles, especially if Bob Thomas can come up to his potential. A top competitor, Thomas was a member of the Florida State cross country team this fall, and finished third in the state meet. He was the top 880-man last season and looks to be heading for another fine year. Junior College transfer Joe Rooney along with juniors George Griffin and Tom Fox add solid depth here.



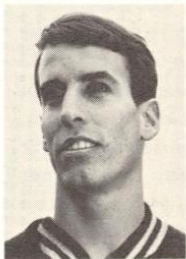

Mile and Two-Mile—Ken Misner, a freshman and junior Marc Williamson are the leading contenders in the mile and two-mile events. Misner was the Seminoles' number-one runner during cross country season, and appears to have beaten Williamson out for the top post here also. Williamson was the top man last year in these two events, but he turned in a disappointing cross country season and has not yet returned to form. Tom Rickards looks good in the distance events, but he needs to add strength to be an outstanding runner. Sid Merchant is a seasoned competitor. A hard worker, he has improved steadily and should be ready for his best year. Jack Castner has been plagued by a recurring hip injury, but if he can avoid further setbacks, he could be a strong contender in the two-mile.



Williamson

Hurdles—School record holders in both the High Hurdles and the Intermediates are back, making these two events the brightest spot in the Seminole outlook. Mike Kelly qualified for national competition last year in both events, and holds the Florida State record in the highs. Charlie Vickers is the record holder in the intermediates. An intense competitor, Vickers broke the existing high hurdle record also, but finished second to Kelly while doing it. The rivalry between the two will make them even stronger. Freshmen John Fuss, Phil Parker and Charles Galloway will also be vying for a spot here.



Misner

Relays—The Seminoles should be strong in the 440 relay with the depth of sprinters they have, but with at least two freshmen running, this relay will be a question mark. Guy, Kaufman, Brown and either Stow or Pepper will make up the team and it could become the best in school history, but that may be a year away. The mile relay may suffer with the lack of an outstanding quarter-miler for the final leg. The team could stay in contention up to the final turn, but unless an outstanding anchorman develops, the last 70-yards could spell defeat. Link, Thomas, Rooney and either Stow or Pepper (whoever does not get the call in the 440 relay) will probably make up this team.

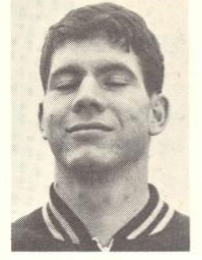
Pole Vault—This event will be staffed by a pair of freshmen, but they have outstanding credentials. Phil Edmunds is the only Tennessee high school vaulter to reach 14 feet. He was hampered by a broken arm, but should be back in form for the start of the season. Bill Jackson was the Georgia AA pole vault champion.

High Jump—Bud Manning, the school record holder, is back. A top competitor, Manning also doubles in the javelin. One of the best men for his size, he can jump nearly a foot over his head. Hurdler Mike Kelly will see action here also. Although he has never jumped at Florida State, he was a fine high jumper in high school.

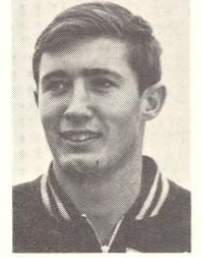
Long Jump and Triple Jump—Sid Gainey, the school record holder in both events, will be missed this year, but several good prospects are on hand. Steve Lewis and Phil Parker are the top contenders. Parker was the Georgia state long jump champion, and was fourth in the Golden West triple jump competition last year. Bob Bleiberg and Rudy Hubbard are possible contenders along with Charles Galloway.

Shot and Discus—Charles Fuchs will be back for the outdoor season, and he could be outstanding in the shot. Sophomore Dave Barton is a good prospect. He is dedicated, and has the size and ability to be a good one. His performance will be a key. George Frank and Bill Dean add depth.

Javelin—Bud Manning and Bill Dean hold down the top two spots, but Allan Landis could challenge. He is small and needs to increase his strength to be a consistent performer.



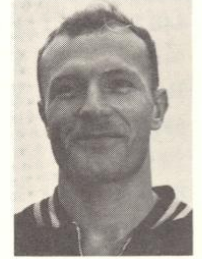

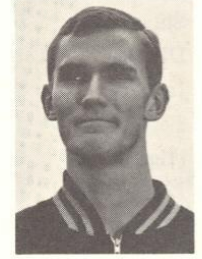
