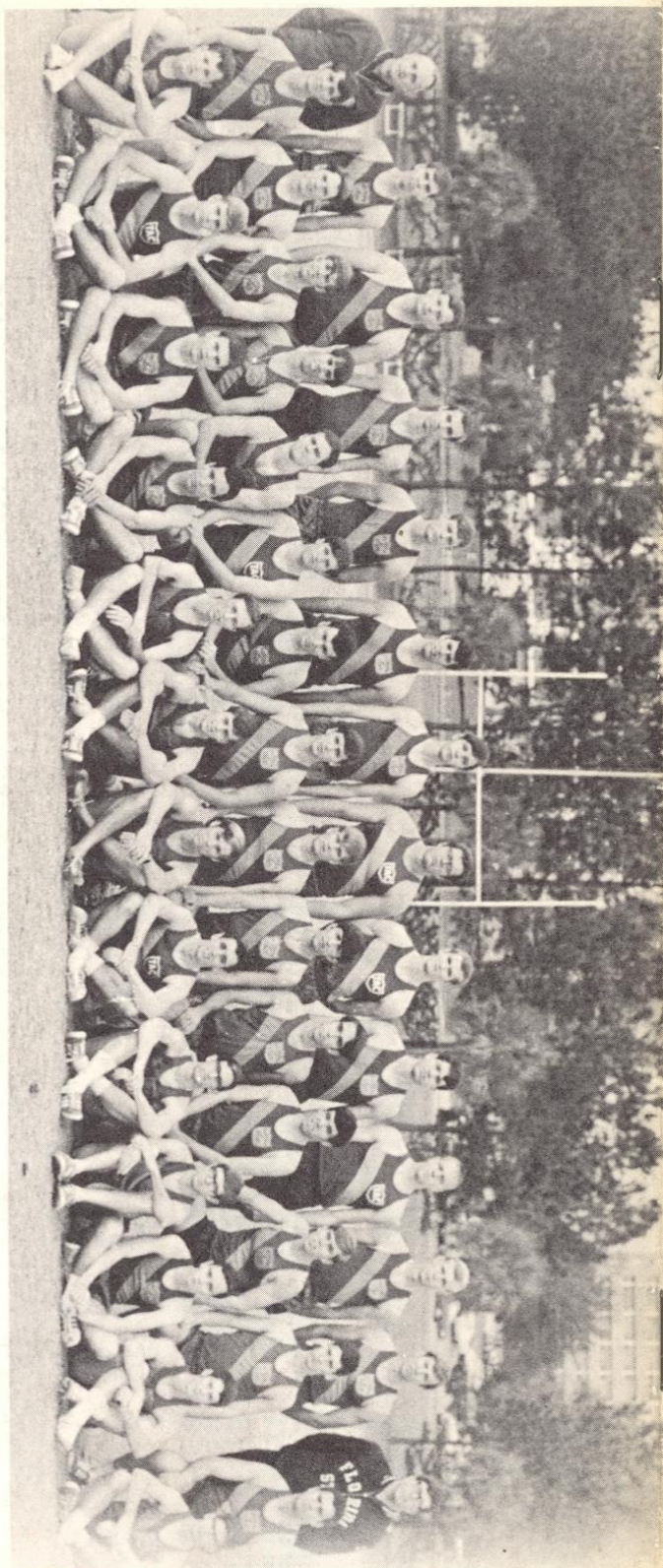

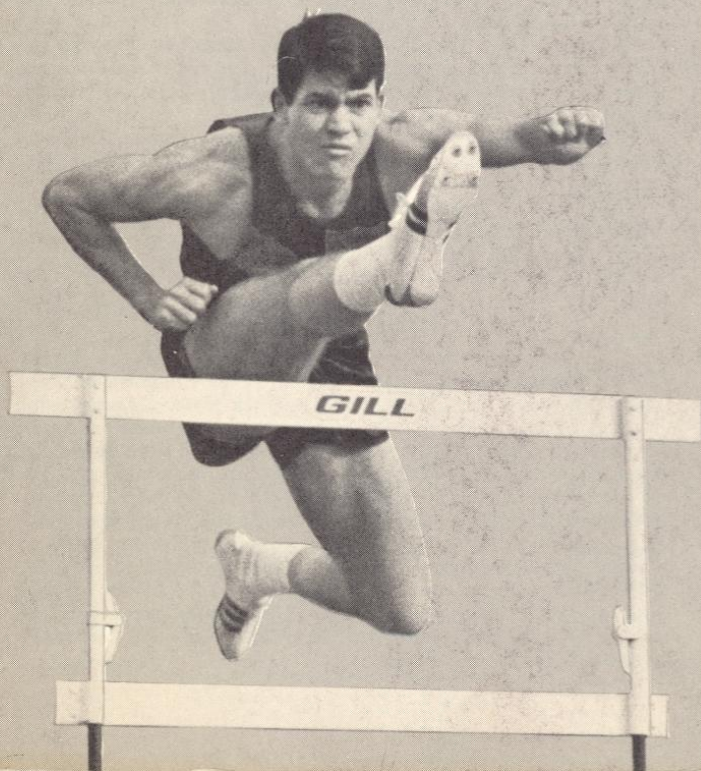

## 1969 OUTLOOK

This could be a banner year for the Seminoles. Quality athletes staff almost every one of the 17 events and the early work has been encouraging. Biggest drawback, however, is depth. While the Seminoles have at least one or two strong individuals in each event, there is no margin for error or illness.

"Our depth is the crucial factor, there is no questioning that," says Coach Mike Long. "We don't have the numbers some of the larger schools in the South now have and that makes it tough in dual meet competition."

Leading returnee is nationally ranked hurdler and co-captain Mike Kelly (cover). His 13.8 clocking in the highs at Berkeley last summer set a new school standard and placed him fifth over all. A week earlier he placed sixth in the highs at the National AAU's at 14.0 and sixth again in the intermediates with a 51.6 showing.

Distance man Ken Misner is also expected to make national ripples this spring in the two and three mile events. Only a sophomore, Misner has already established himself as one of the South's leading runners.

The field events lack the outstanding individuals found among the runners, but should be stronger all around than in recent years.

Phil Parker in the triple and long jumps may be the top point maker here.

If the Seminoles can beat the illness and injuries, it could be the Tribe's best season.

## 1968 RESULTS

The Seminoles showed surprising success for a sophomore-freshman laden team during 1968's indoor-outdoor campaign. Hurdler Mike Kelly's fifth place finish at the NCAA high hurdle Championships was the culmination of individual achievement. The Tribe collected nine firsts and four seconds at the Coliseum Relays in Montgomery, Ala. It also came up with three more winners at the Tennessee Relays in Knoxville. Team efforts found the Seminoles placing second in the Jesuit Invitational and again in the Gulf Coast Five-way meet. Dual meets left the Tribe with a 3-2 record, with wins over Alabama (96-49), Auburn (80-65) and Quantico Marines (44-39). The losses were to Tennessee and Florida, generally regarded as the two strongest track schools in the South.

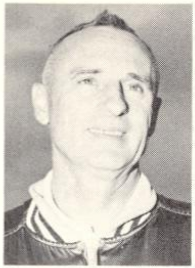

## TRACK COACH MIKE LONG

Florida State's Track program, under the direction of Mike Long for the past 14 years, has gained a reputation as one of the finest in the South.



Five times in his tenure as Seminole mentor, Long has directed the Tribe to undefeated dual meet seasons. On five occasions he lost only one meet.

It has not been until the recent upsurge in track at other institutions in the South that this dominance has been challenged.

Long, a graduate of Minnesota came to Florida State in the fall of 1953, and that year served as an assistant coach for football, basketball and track. He took complete charge of the Seminole runners in 1955.

At Minnesota, Long was a pole vaulter on the Gopher squad, and in 1936 he won an Olympic regional pole vault championship. He brought with him to Florida State 16 years of coaching experience—six in Minnesota and 10 in Florida.

He is married to the former Louise Creeger. They have four sons and a daughter. All of the boys have competed in the Seminole track program.

This past spring several former track stars who served under Long's direction at Florida State presented him with an all-expense paid trip to the Olympic games in Mexico City in recognition for all that he has done for track not only at Florida State, but also throughout the South.

## ASSISTANT COACH DARRYL GUTHRIE

Darryl Guthrie returns to his alma mater to assist Coach Mike Long with the overall track program, although he will concentrate on the field events primarily.



A 1965 graduate of Florida State, the 29 year old Guthrie was tutored by Coach Long both as a Seminole and when he was in junior high school at Ft. Myers.

Following his high school graduation he served with the Army where he was active in football and baseball, but not track. At Florida State later, he ran the high hurdles and participated in the javelin and triple jump.

He comes to the Seminoles after a year as the track coach at Ft. Myers Jr. High.

He and his wife Nicki have no children.

## EVENT BY EVENT

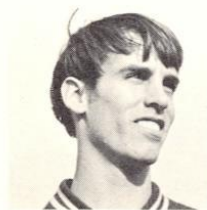
**SPRINTS**—From a depth standpoint the sprints may be the Seminoles strongest events. Two sophomores and a senior lead the pack. Andy Guy is the lone senior and a strong runner. His best 100 time was 9.7, but coaches believe he can top that if he stays healthy. Has been a hard luck case with injuries slowing him the last two seasons. If Guy stays well he may be the Seminoles best-ever sprinter. Sophomores Doug Brown and Denson Pepper ran extremely well as freshmen last year and are capable of pushing Guy for a spot in both the 100 and 220 events. If all three stay healthy, the Seminoles will pick up points in the sprints. Randy Stow takes over as the leading contender in the 440 as junior Mike Link moves up to the half mile. A sophomore, Stow will be backed by Greg Kaufman, Denson Pepper and Link. Once again, the Seminoles will start the quarter-mile with a solid base, but without the one outstanding runner sometimes needed here. Either Link or Stow could develop to fill that gap, however.

**RELAYS**—The potential in both the 440 and mile events is outstanding. The 440 relay mark was broken twice last season and the five men who combined to do it all return. Greg Kaufman, Doug Brown, Denson Pepper and Steve Lewis did it one time, and then the first three along with Andy Guy running for Lewis the second time. In addition, Randy Stow figures to push for a berth. Last year the mile relay came within a half-second of Seminole standard, and three of those runners return. Stow, Kaufman and Mike Link come back with Denson Pepper likely to fill out the foursome. However, newcomer Steve Oulman and veteran hurdler Mike Kelly may have a shot at the team also.

**MIDDLE DISTANCE**—Veterans Bob Thomas and Joe Law provided a solid base, but after them the ranks were bare, so 440-man Mike Link moved up to the half mile distance also. Thomas, co-captain with Mike Kelly, is a veteran runner with a strong finishing kick. A big year for him could be a key to the Seminoles success. Law is also a veteran middle distance man. Link is a classic runner who could develop into a great one at 880 or 440. Tom Rickards will join Thomas in the mile, but the ranks are thin here.

**DISTANCE**—Ken Misner gives the Seminoles one of the strongest distance entries in the South. Only a sophomore he has not yet reached his potential, but is coming off a very fine cross-country season. He will be the mainstay of the Tribe's two and three mile hopes and may lend a hand in the mile occasionally.

**HURDLES**—Nationally ranked Mike Kelly returns for his final and hopefully best year. A dedicated worker, he made it pay off last summer as he placed fifth in the highs (13.8) at the NCAA championships. He also sur-

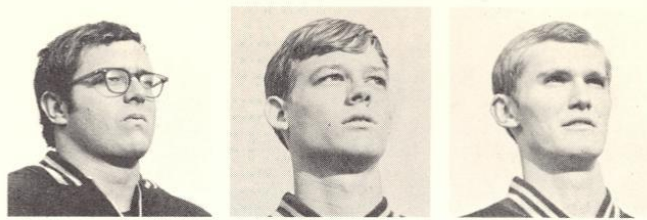

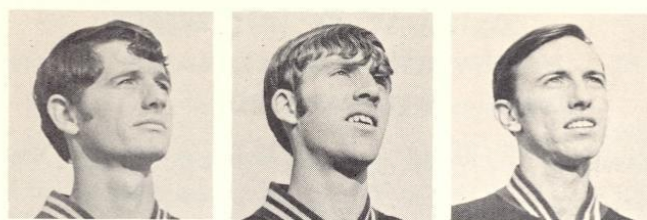

prised all onlookers with sixth place finishes in the National AAU high and intermediate finals. Kelly's 1968 running mate, Charlie Vickers will be missed, but freshman Roger Peterson brings in strong credentials (14.1 highs) and with experience should take up the slack.

**SHOT AND DISCUS**—The outlook here is much improved over 1968. Junior college transfer John Snyder and freshman Chuck Crowder join veterans Dave Barton and George Frank. The competition for the top two spots is expected to be great and should bring the best out of everyone.

**HIGH JUMP**—A critical event for the Seminoles this season. Junior College performer Jim Sauers has reached 6-7 and shows ability to do better. There is no one to back him up however, and hurdler Mike Kelly may be called upon for duty.

**JAVELIN**—This was the weakest event on the team at the start of the season. Harvey Zion, a starter for the Seminole football squad last fall, has come over to give it a try, but he hasn't thrown in competition since his high school

days. His early showings were encouraging, but great things can not be expected. Alan Landis and David Marcincoski are also in contention.

**POLE VAULT**—The withdrawal of sophomore vaulter Phil Edmunds from school in January puts a big damper on Seminole hopes here. The Tennessee State schoolboy record holder had trouble getting started this season and then quit. Another sophomore Bill Jackson remains, but he has been plagued by illness during most of the early work. What looked like a promising event is now a question-mark.

**TRIPLE JUMP and LONG JUMP**—Outlook is excellent in both events with senior Steve Lewis and sophomores Phil Parker and Charles Galloway returning. Parker was hampered by a leg injury in 1968, but is fully recovered and looked extremely strong in the fall sessions. He not only won his events in the December Garnet and Gold meet, but also captured the 100-yd. dash, Lewis is a veteran point getter and Galloway showed well filling in for Parker last season.
