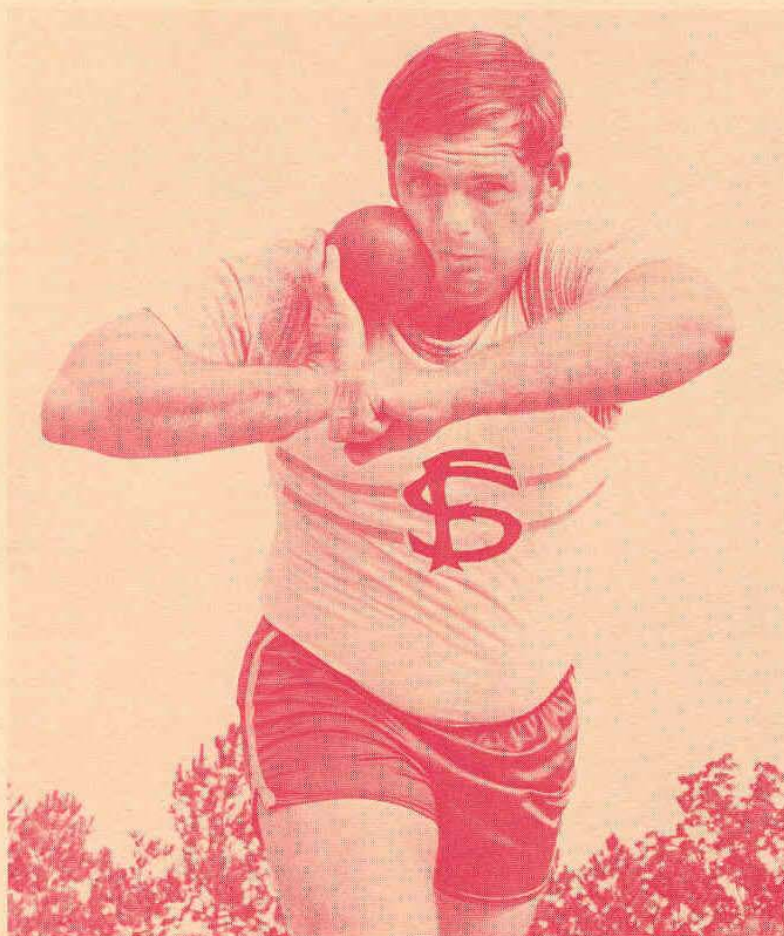

PROFILES

JIM BUCK — Javelin . . . returns for his senior season after establishing himself as one of the South's top javelin men last year . . . placed in both the Florida Relays and Drake Relays last year . . . holds school record at 233-6 . . . a hard worker who is always striving for improvement . . . was National JC Champion two seasons ago at Seminole Junior College . . . has potential to place high in national competition.

CHUCK CROWDER — Shot Put . . . Three-year Seminole veteran . . . steady, reliable performer who has made good progress each season . . . dedicated athlete who works hard to get the most from his potential . . . has a best distance of 55 feet which ranks him third in all-time Seminole history . . . is off to his best start during indoor season.

JAMES CUNNINGHAM — High Jump and High Hurdles . . . one of most versatile athletes on squad . . . will work in both high jump and high hurdles as well as the decathlon . . . big, strong youngster who is capable of becoming a fine performer . . . still developing his potential.

ROY DUNN — Javelin . . . teamed with Jim Buck, gives the Seminoles their strongest one-two punch in the Javelin ever . . . third best Seminole performer in his specialty with consistent throws of 220 feet or better . . . an experienced, tough competitor.

RUDY FALANA — Long Jump and Relays . . . has fine talent as both a runner and a jumper . . . he could become a national class athlete if he can avoid injury . . . was plagued by several ailments last year which held up his development, but still has a lot of potential . . . if he stays healthy could be outstanding.

JOEL GARREN — 220, 440 and Relays . . . strong entry in relays as well as individual events . . . has great strength and good speed . . . good competitor . . . should again rank with the South's top quarter milers.

JOHN STARNES — Intermediate Hurdles . . . had a fine freshman year in which he established himself as one of the South's better hurdlers . . . has a good competitive attitude, continues to improve and should move ahead . . . nicknamed "Snapper".

PROFILES

JAMES THOMAS — Sprints and Triple Jump . . . very good athlete . . . hard worker and a talented jumper . . . if he continues to put forth effort, he should achieve a high level in triple jump . . . has equipment and desire to be good sprinter . . . also a starting defensive back on football squad.

GEORGE KAISER — Middle Distance . . . overcame injury and had a good sophomore year . . . has very good potential . . . can be as good as he wants to be if he stays healthy . . . will be valuable man in relays as well as half mile.

WES KOENIG — Middle Distance . . . Freshman who should contribute . . . strong candidate in half, quarter and relays . . . was a fine quarter miler in high school . . . injury during fall slowed his development . . . still a long way from his potential . . . shows ability to become a class athlete.

EDDIE McMILLAN — Sprints and Relays . . . one of the key men on the squad . . . potentially one of the finest sprinters in the South . . . will anchor 440 relay as well as compete in 100 and 220 . . . has physical ability to be an outstanding performer . . . key to how far he will go will be how much time he will spend on track and how much he loses in spring football practice . . . defensive starter on Seminole team.

ALLEN McMILLEN — Pole Vault . . . leading pole vault candidate . . . big strong individual . . . fierce competitive spirit . . . placed very high in junior college rankings last year . . . is already vaulting national qualifying heights . . . could be the best ever at Florida State . . . transfer from Seminole JC.

DEL RAMERS — Distances . . . with graduation of Ken Misner, steps up as the leading distance runner . . . a former state high school champion . . . tough competitor . . . works hard to develop his ability.

GEORGE SPARLING — 440 and Relays . . . was a top relay performer last year . . . will add 440 duties this season . . . has excellent potential . . . strong competitor who has a strong finish . . . is improving steadily, if not spectacularly . . . definitely counted on for big contribution in relays and could establish himself as one of the South's best.



UNIVERSITY TRACK

Florida State's outdoor track facilities are among the finest in the nation. A completely enclosed quarter mile track is located in the heart of campus. It's surrounded by tall pines which help make the wind factor almost negligible. In addition, Florida State is one of the few tracks where a straight 220 could be run if necessary. This long front straightaway also makes it possible to run the 100 or 120 high hurdles from either end, in the event there is a wind factor. The track itself is a clay-cinder composition that many of the nation's top athletes have called one of the finest they have run on. Florida State runners also agree they prefer it over most all other track surfaces they have participated on. A large field area enclosed by track is completely sodded and only the finest equipment is used.

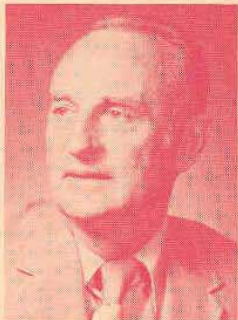
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TRACK PROGRAM

There are few track programs in the United States that can match the overall success of Florida State under Head Coach Mike Long. Since 1955 when Long took over the reins of the struggling Seminoles, the Tribe has won 81 of 101 dual meets. Long's first four teams ran up a 20-3 record. In 13 of his 17 years as a Head Coach, his clubs have lost no more than one meet and five of his teams have gone undefeated.



Developing winners is only part of Mike Long's success story. Even if he does not come out on top, it is almost a surety that a Long coached performer has given his very best effort. Considered one of the nation's finest "on the track" coaches, Long has that special knack for bringing out only the greatest effort by a youngster. In addition to a keen competitive spirit

that his performers carry with them during their years at Florida State, he also instills the techniques and qualities that have made several former stars outstanding coaches in their own right.

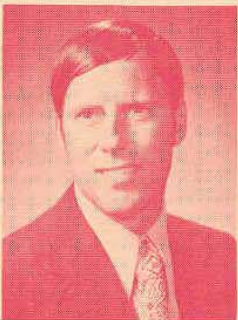
His coaching approach to the squad also brings about a tight bond among the members that make them an even stronger dual meet team. He received perhaps his greatest honor when several former members of his teams presented him and his wife Louise an all-expense paid trip to the 1968 Olympics.

A graduate of Minnesota where he competed as a pole vaulter, Long had six years coaching experience in Gopher State high schools and another ten in Florida before coming to the Seminoles in the fall of 1953 as an assistant coach in track, football, and basketball. After a year he assumed full responsibility of the track program.

Assisting Long this year will be former Seminole star distance runner Dick Roberts. Now in his third season as a Tribe assistant, he works closest with the distance runners and pole vaulters.

The 30-year old native of St. Petersburg returned to his alma mater after a highly successful tenure as track and cross-country coach at Dunedin High School. His Dunedin teams captured the state track championship, produced 10 individual state champions and set 13 state high school records.

During the fall Roberts is in charge of the Seminole cross-country team. His 1970 squad was the Seminoles' best ever, easily winning the state championship by placing the first four finishers. An energetic and highly successful recruiter, Roberts has brought many of the South's finest track athletes into the Seminole fold.



In January of this year he was one of the invited speakers at the NCAA-U.S. Track Coaches Association meetings. His topic was the "Physiology of Exercise for Middle Distance Training."

Dick and his wife, Judy, have no children.

Also working with this year's squad are former Seminole stars Jack Castner and Phil Parker. Castner will handle many of the tedious meet and practice planning and coordinating duties, while Parker will work directly with the high jumpers, long jumpers and triple jumpers.
