B A S E B A L L

On a warm, sunny day at St. Petersburg's Al Lang Field last January, former professional baseball greats from all corners of the nation gathered for the fourth annual Old Timers' game.

It was a scoreless duel until the bottom of the sixth inning, when a husky National League standout of bygone days strode to the plate. He was Florida State's Danny Litwhiler, who promptly settled the issue with a booming home run out of the park.

The game-winning smash was typical of Litwhiler's determination, as a player and as a teacher.

Danny has been described as one of the most imaginative and dynamic coaches in college baseball. When he came to Florida State five years ago it was his expressed desire to put the seminoles out front in the collegiate baseball scramble.

In four seasons, his Seminoles have won 84 games while losing only 27, appearing in three District playoffs and one College World Series. It adds up to a .757 percentage, a championship reading in anybody's league.

There was an extra measure of success during the past two seasons. One of Litwhiler's prodigies, 145-pound shortstop Dick Howser of West Palm Beach, was named to the NCAA's first-team All-America squad in both 1957 and 1958. Twelve players from the 1958 Seminole roster have signed with major league clubs.

Litwhiler has the perfect background to be a good baseball coach. He built up a vast storehouse of ideas during his major league playing days with the St. Louis Cardinals, Philadelphia Phillies, Cincinnati Reds, and the old Boston Braves.

Danny went down in the books for several outstanding performances before retiring as an active player in 1950. He batted safely in 21 straight games in his first major league season. He belted a home run in every National League park in 1941.

In 1942 he became the first major leaguer to play a complete errorless season. He handled 317 chances in 151 games that year and over a period of two years set a record of playing 187 consecutive games without an error.

The glove Litwhiler used in that string was retired in baseball's Hall of Fame.

In 1942 and 1943 he tied a National League record for the most years—two—leading in fielding percentage by an outfielder appearing in 100 or more games.

Litwhiler, 42, was born in Ringtown, Pa., and is a graduate of Bloomsburg (Pa.) State Teachers College.

After retiring as an active player, Danny coached Cincinnati in 1951 and has managed minor league clubs at Fargo, N. D., Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Jamestown, N. Y., and Duluth, Minn.

GOLF

Bill Odeneal has enjoyed just about every success a coach could want in his few years, but he's always looking for a new challenge.

This season, the challenge will be keeping Florida State's nationally-ranked golf team topside in the nation's collegiate circle. Seminole golfers the past three years have finished 5th (1956), 4th (1957), and 14th (1958) in NCAA tournament action.

Odeneal is in his second year as Florida State's golf coach. His Seminole volleyball teams won several national titles before the sport was dropped from the intercollegiate athletic program.

Several topflight golfers departed the 1958 team, but Odeneal has some outstanding returnees to balance the loss. Heading the list are St. Petersburg senior Bob Shave, selected to the NCAA All-America squad last season, and senior Mel Fleischer, a steady swinger from Sanford.

A fine golfer and all-around athlete in his own right, Odeneal graduated from Springfield College with a BS and a Masters. During his undergraduate days at that institution, he lettered in track and football and was a member of the Volleyball Club.

Odeneal also was a member of the Golf Club and was twice winner of the annual Senior-Alumni golf trophy. In addition to his athletic activities, he was president of the junior class, member of Alpha Phi Omega, national scouting fraternity, and Sigma Delta Psi, honorary athletic fraternity.

Florida State's 1959 tennis squad should gain a lot of polish under their new tennis coach. For 26-year-old John Powless is only two years removed from being an All-America tennis standout himself.

John is in his first year as coach of the Seminole netters, coming to Florida State from Tilghman High School of Paducah, Ky., where he was cross-country and basketball coach.

A 1957 graduate of Murray (Ky.) State College, Powless was a varsity basketball regular for four years and twice gained the quarterfinals of the NCAA tennis singles championships. He was selected to the NCAA's 1957 tennis All-America team. Powless once scored 34 points in a Kentucky Invitational Tournament game and finished one season as the nation's No. 2 free-throw shooter.

Powless is still quite active in tennis circles. He currently is ranked No. 3 in the Western United States and he and his father have captured the National Clay Courts Father and Son Tennis Championship two years running. The Flora, Ill., native has won the Illinois State Open Championship for the past eight years. At Tampa last January, John teamed up with a Swedish star for the Dixie International Doubles Championship.

Powless inherits seven lettermen from last year's squad, including senior Lex Hester of Neptune Beach, Florida State's No. 1 singles player last season. Other returning veterans are Jim Berry, Frank Bryan, Jackie Crew, Howard Levy and Fred Serret. Sophomores Rebel Bellamy and William McClain should add depth.

Personable, hard-working Mike Long is entering his fifth year as Florida State's track coach. And already Mike is being recognized as one of the finest cinder coaches in the Southeast.

Take a look at the Seminole record during Long's four seasons—20 victories against only three losses in dual competition. That's an .870 percentage that will be hard to match.

Long's building program for the Seminoles reached a zenith last year, when Florida State went undefeated in dual meets and won impressive championships in the Coliseum Relays and Florida Relays. The 1958 Seminole squad, which chalked up 10 individual school records, was generally recognized as one of the South's finest.

The Seminoles will have their work cut out this season. They'll face four tough opponents in dual action as well as competing in some of the nation's more outstanding meets (Coliseum Relays, Penn Relays, Florida Relays).

Gone from last year's team are sprint standout Jack Terwilliger, distance star Mike Conley, and javelin ace Jerry Henderson. But solid performers like junior Jim Casteel, and seniors Doyle Ruff and Dick Elwood should make for another fine season.

Long came to Florida State in 1953 as an assistant coach in football and basketball. As head track coach, he now limits his abilities to running the show on the cinders.

Before graduating from Minnesota in 1937, Mike established himself as an outstanding performer by winning the regional Olympic pole vault title in 1936.

He came to Florida State from Fort Myers, where he was head basketball and track coach and an assistant football coach. Previously he had coached high school sports in Sarasota.
