## THE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Whenever Alabama disciples gather to talk football, the conversation invariably gets around to Vaughn Hall Mancha, a living symbol of the Crimson Tide's great teams of the mid-forties.

Mancha is practically as legendary in Alabama football circles as Don Hutson and Harry Gilmer. For Florida State University's personable new director of athletics was a 240-pound All-Southeastern Conference center at Alabama for four seasons, (1944-47) and everyone's All-America center.

Mancha was a solid choice to return to Florida State as athletic director last November, ending a three-year absence from the FSU campus. He gained wide popularity with Florida State officials and fans while serving as line coach at FSU from 1952 through 1956. During that time, Mancha was credited with the recruitment of a number of players that led FSU to success.

Born in Sugarvalley, Ga., in 1921, Vaughn entered Alabama in 1944. He was issued jersey No. 41, a number that Alabama's football opponents tried to dodge for the next four years. Mancha earned a BS Degree in Education at Alabama in 1947 and played one season of professional football with the old Boston Yankees in 1948. In 1949, he returned to Alabama to earn a Masters Degree in Education.

Turning to the coaching field, Mancha put in a highly-successful three-year tenure as coach, head of the Department of Physical Education, and athletic director at Livingston (Ala.) State.

Mancha first came to Florida State in 1952 as assistant football coach under Dr. Don Veller and as an instructor of Physical Education.

In 1957, Mancha went to Columbia University as an assistant football coach and associate member of the Department of Physical Education, positions he held for the past three years. While at Columbia, he completed all work for the Doctorate with the exception of the dissertation.

Married to the former Sybil Little of Birmingham, he is the father of three children: Clare, 10; Nan, 8, and Vaughn, Jr., 1 year.

## B A S E B A L L

On a warm, January day at St. Petersburg's Al Lang Field in 1959, former professional baseball greats from all corners of the nation gathered for the fourth annual Oldtimers' game.

It was a scoreless duel until the bottom of the sixth inning, when a husky National League standout of by-gone days stepped to the plate. He was Florida State's Danny Litwhiler, who promptly settled the issue with a booming home run out of the park.

The game-winning smash was typical of Litwhiler's determination, as a player and as a teacher of players.

Danny has been described as one of the most imaginative and dynamic coaches in college baseball. When he came to Florida State six years ago it was his expressed desire to put the Seminoles out front in the collegiate baseball scramble.

In five seasons, his Seminoles have won 106 games while losing only 38, appearing in four NCAA District playoffs and one College World Series (1957). It adds up to a .736 percentage, a championship reading in anybody's league.

There was an extra measure of success during the past three seasons. One of Litwhiler's prodigies, 145-pound shortstop Dick Howser of West Palm Beach, was named to the NCAA's first-team All-America squad in both 1957 and 1958. Last season, sophomore—now—junior Bob Clem won a second-team All-America spot as a second baseman. Numerous Seminole players have signed with major league clubs.

Litwhiler has the perfect background to be a solid baseball coach. He built up a storehouse of ideas during his major league playing days with the St. Louis Cardinals, Philadelphia Phillies, Cincinnati Reds, and the old Boston Braves.

Danny went down in the books for several outstanding performances before retiring as an active player in 1950. He batted safely in 21 straight games in his first major league season. He belted a home run in every National League park in 1941.

In 1942 he became the first major leaguer to play a complete errorless season. He handled 317 chances in 151 games that year and over a period of two seasons set a record of playing 187 consecutive games without an error.

The glove Litwhiler used in that string was retired in baseball's Hall of Fame.

In 1942 and 1943 he tied a National League record for the most years—two—leading in fielding percentage by an outfielder appearing in 100 or more games.

Litwhiler, 43, was born in Ringtown, Pa., and is a graduate of Bloomsburg (Pa.) State Teachers College.

After retiring as an active player, Danny coached with Cincinnati in 1951 and has managed minor league clubs at Fargo, N. D., Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Jamestown, N. Y., and Duluth, Minn.

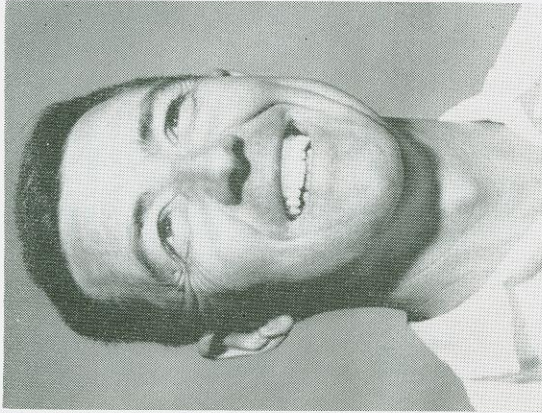

# TENNIS

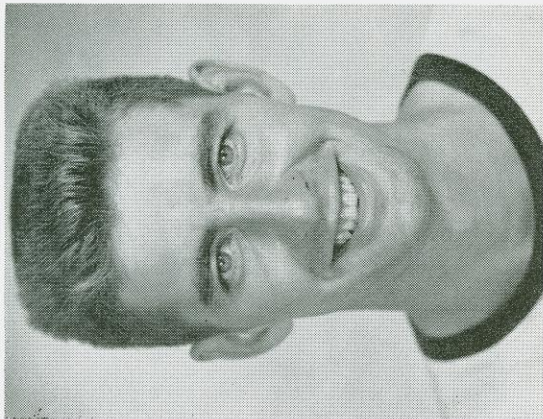
Florida State's tennis teams are gaining a lot of polish under 27-year-old Coach John Powless. For Powless is only three years removed from being an All-America tennis standout himself and is still quite active in amateur tennis circles.

John is in his second year as coach of the Seminoles, coming to Florida State from Tilghman High School of Paducah, Ky., where he was cross-country and basketball coach. He assisted with FSU's varsity basketball team this season.

A 1957 graduate of Murray (Ky.) State College, Powless was a varsity basketball regular for four years and twice gained the quarterfinals of the NCAA tennis singles championships. He was selected to the NCAA's 1957 tennis All-America team. Powless once scored 34 points in a Kentucky Invitational Tournament basketball game and finished one season as the nation's No. 2 free-throw shooter.

Powless currently is ranked No. 2 (behind Gardner Mulloy) in Florida tennis singles. He and John Skogstad of Coral Gables are ranked No. 8 nationally in doubles. Playing in 15 tournaments last summer, John was a singles semi-finalist in the Blue-Gray meet in Montgomery, and singles runner-up in the Southern Tennis Championships at Birmingham. A native of Flora, Ill., Powless won the Illinois State Open Championships eight years in a row.

Six lettermen from last year's squad that posted a fine 14-6 record, including veterans Lex Hester, Jim Berry, Frank Bryan, and Jackie Crew, have graduated. Only returning lettermen are Rebel Bellamy, Howard Levy, and Alex Sutor. Sophomores Ed Fasula and Gordon Smith should add depth.

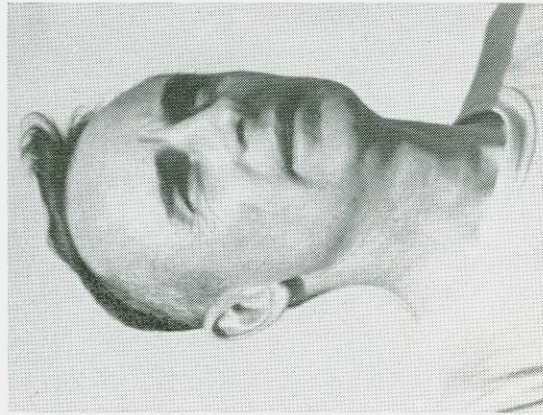

# TRACK

Already recognized as one of the finest cinder coaches in the South, personable, hard-working Mike Long is entering his sixth year as Florida State University's track coach.

Take a look at the Seminole record during Long's five seasons—23 victories against only four losses in dual competition and a host of impressive team championships. That is an .852 percentage that will be hard to match.

Long's building program for the Seminoles reached a zenith in 1958, when FSU was undefeated in dual meets and was generally recognized as one of the South's best teams. Last season, the Seminoles lost only to Southeastern Conference champion LSU in four dual starts and won championships in the Coliseum Relays, Piedmont Relays, Florida AAU, and Georgia AAU.

The Seminoles have their work cut out this season. They will face four tough opponents in dual action and compete in some of the nation's more outstanding meets (Florida Relays, Texas Relays, Penn Relays).

Gone from last year's team are five of the top seven point producers, including 440 and low hurdles record-holder Jim Casteel, 880 ace Doyle Ruff, high hurdles whiz Tom Chivers, and pole vaulter Dick Elwood. But solid performers like Ted Keen (sprints and pole vault), Ron Harrison (440 and relays), Tom Keeney (mile and two miles), Kent Mills (two miles), and Don Ostergaard (shot and discus) should make for another fine season.

Long came to Florida State in 1953 as an assistant coach in football and basketball. As head track coach, he now limits his abilities to running the show on the cinders. Before graduating from Minnesota in 1937, Mike established himself as an outstanding performer by winning the regional Olympic pole vault title in 1936.

Mike came to FSU from Fort Myers, where he was head basketball and track coach and an assistant football coach. Previously he had coached high school sports in Sarasota.
