**Terry Maul**  
(Florida State '68)  
Head Coach

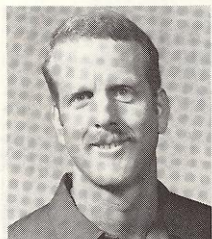
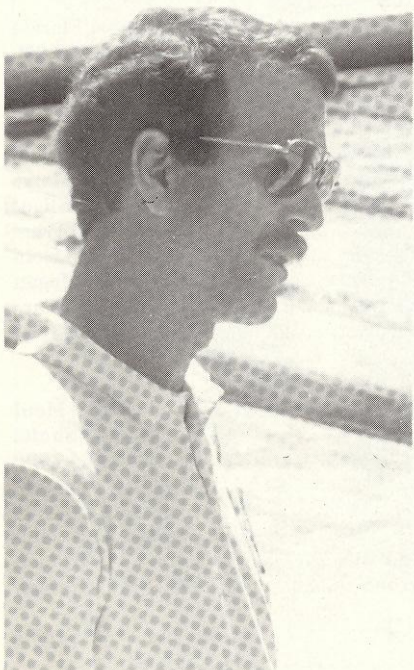
Well known nationally, Terry Maul enters his 14th season as Florida State's head coach. Since reorganizing the program three years ago, Maul has taken on very specific duties in the innovative coaching arrangement. He personally directs the overall training regimen for the entire swim team. Under his supervision, Maul will design the physiological cycles for water workouts, set the periodization and application of strength training and the implementation of psychological support systems.

Working from the philosophy that each individual should have the opportunity to develop to their fullest potential academically, emotionally and athletically, Maul has built a reputation for success, while at the same time insuring the development of the individual athlete in the college environment.

Throughout his 13 seasons at Florida State, Maul has been recognized for his coaching achievements. He has coached 28 All-Americans, compiled a 92-39-2 dual meet record, and finished number two behind Texas in the 1982 AIAW National Championships.

During his career, Maul has also gained international coaching experience, as he was named head coach of the United States' s team in the 1984 South American Cup in Rio de Janiero. He also served as head coach of the South team at the 1987 U.S. Olympic Festival in Chapel Hill.

As a student at Florida State, Maul graduated from FSU with a bachelor's degree in Biology in 1968 and went on to earn a Master's in Sports Psychology in 1975 and completed his coursework for a doctorate of Sports Psychology.



**Bill Shults**  
(New Hampshire '76)  
Head Coach

Now in his seventh year as head coach of Florida State, Bill Shults has helped to key FSU's resurgence to national prominence. Under the co-coach system, Shults is responsible for the administrative aspects of the entire swimming program. He also is available for poolside coaching duties. But the success he is most responsible for is the swimming program's success in the classroom. During the last two years, FSU's team grade point average has reached a "B" average and last year the swim teams won all four academic awards, given by the FSU athletic department. Most of the program's academic success is due to the the support systems which he oversees. Shults assists Florida State athletes with academic study hall monitoring and career counseling.

He brings to the position the expertise of a coach who has established himself as a top coach and administrator. Under his direction, the men's team has twice finished in the nation's top 30.

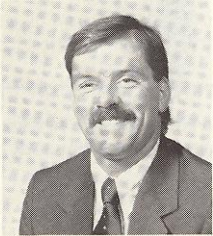
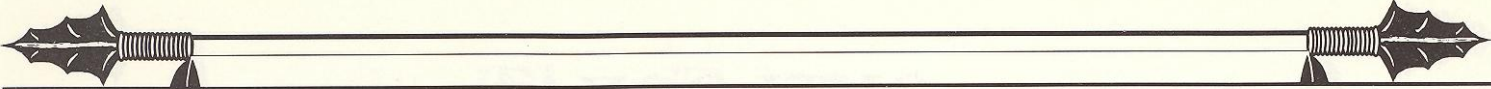
Shults became only the fourth head coach of the men's program in 1981 after serving as assistant coach under former head coach John Stafford. As an assistant, Shults was the chief recruiter and was generally credited with signing several swimmers who later were All-Americans.

Prior to coming to FSU, Shults was the head coach at New Hampshire for one year and recruited the finest recruiting class in school history. He also spent a one-year stint at Trinity College in Hartford, CT.

The 1976 graduate of New Hampshire lettered four years and captained the '76 team.

Shults, 34, is active in a number of positions. He serves as chairman of the Academic Committee to the College Swim Coaches Association and was recently honored as the recipient of the President's Award for Outstanding Service to the CSCA.

He is married to the former Linda Carlton and they have one son, Steve.



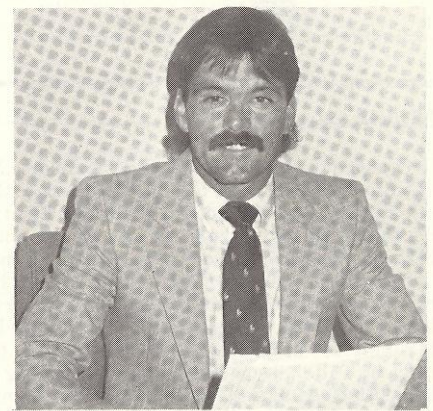
**Gary Cole**  
**(Bowling Green '75)**  
**Diving Coach**

Gary Cole, now in his seventh year as the diving coach at Florida State, has accumulated a wealth of collegiate and international coaching experience that helps enhance the diving program. In June 1987, Cole was selected from applicants from across the nation to coach South Korea's Olympic hopefuls. Before his work with the South Korean national team, Cole also gave clinics for the International Olympic Committee in Chile and Canada.

During his career, Cole has developed divers at all levels, including two world age group champions and collegiate All-Americans. Three of his pupils placed in the top eight at the 1984 Canadian Olympic Trials.

At Florida State, Cole's duties go far beyond his work with the FSU divers. He is also responsible for opponent scouting, meet operations and assists with analysis and instruction of swimming starts and turns.

Cole is a member of the NCAA Diving Rules Committee and a member of the U.S. Professional Diving Coaching Association. A standout diver in high school, Cole was coached by Ron O'Brien, the U.S. Olympic Coach since 1972.



**Sid Cassidy**  
**(North Carolina State '77)**  
**Assistant Coach**

Sid Cassidy, now in his fourth year at Florida State, has gained the reputation as one of the most dynamic young coaches on the collegiate swimming scene.

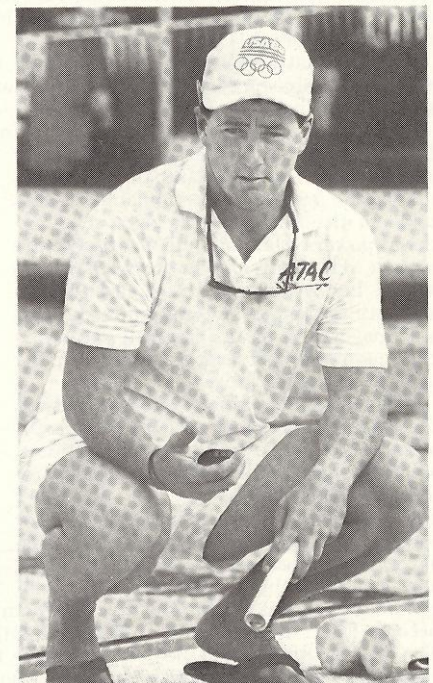
Since coming to Florida State, Cassidy has served as recruiting coordinator and is credited with signing several All-American swimmers during the last two years. These recruits have been instrumental in Florida State's improvement.

Cassidy's on-deck duties include planning and implementation of training methodologies for the distance swimmers, video taping stroke mechanics and assisting with all aspects of training for the entire team. The Kinston, NC native came to Florida State after serving as head coach of the Tampa Bay Swimming Association.

Before his Tampa assignment, Cassidy was head coach of the Wilmington Aquatic Club, the same club where he spent his scholastic years under the tutelage of the internationally acclaimed Bob Matson.

In 1985, Cassidy was chosen as an U.S. assistant coach at the Arena Championship in Bonn, West Germany. He also coached the Mexican Olympic National Team in Mexico City.

As a collegiate swimmer at North Carolina State, Cassidy twice earned All-American honors. At the conclusion of his college career, he became a world-ranked professional marathon swimmer. Presently, he coaches the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club's senior team.



**Patty McDonnell**  
**(Michigan State '80)**  
**Assistant Coach**

Patty McDonnell is entering her fourth season on the Florida State staff. She works with both swimmers and divers in the area of sports psychology, goal setting, stress management, learning and performance strategies and motivation. McDonnell was an FSU diver as a freshman during the 1976-77 season. She then transferred to Michigan State, where she was a Big Ten finalist and AIAW national qualifier on both the 1 and 3 meter boards.

She graduated from MSU in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in Psychology and became the men's and women's diving coach at Central Missouri State. McDonnell received her master's degree in psychology at CMSU and moved on to Ball State for two years, before a one year stint at Oakland University.



# OUTLOOK

## Men's Outlook

One at a time last year, Florida State faced the best teams in collegiate swimming. Each time, FSU left the pool with renewed respect from the other team. Over the course of the dual meet season, Florida State's vast depth and youthful exuberance wore opponents down, giving Florida State a number of upset victories in dual meet competition.

During the last two years, Florida State has taken on a dozen of the top swimming teams in the nation and each time the FSU opponents leave the pool and wonder if it just played a board game like Scrabble or Monopoly. Opponents have found swimming against FSU in Tallahassee can be as devastating as landing on Boardwalk, Park Place or any other space. The Seminoles are loaded from top to bottom with quality swimmers. FSU boasts at least two to four swimmers in each event capable of winning a dual meet or scoring at the Conference Championships.

To make matters worse for the opposition, the Seminoles think they're playing Scrabble by earning double points with words like depth, upset and competitiveness.

The strategy is all part of a master plan designed by head coaches Terry Maul and Bill Shults as the pair directs the FSU program into the top 20. Already, the swimming establishment has taken notice with exciting wins over national powers Alabama and Georgia and a narrow one-point season-opening loss to Miami last year. FSU will also test its strength in the Metro Conference Championships, where it has finished second to champion and host South Carolina for the last two years.

"Two solid recruiting classes, along with the steady improvement of returning athletes is creating a lot of optimism," Maul said. "The gap is closing between South Carolina and Florida State."

FSU's headliner entering the season is junior Vance Tankersley, who comes off a fine sophomore season and summer. Tankersley swam at the Olympic Trials in the 400 free and is a leading contender to qualify for the NCAA Championships. He will vie to become FSU's first individual Metro Champion in a couple of years. The Miami native will be joined in the freestyle by a number of returnees and newcomers who could qualify as well.

In the sprint free events, FSU added junior national 100 free champion Scott Mundell to an already talented tandem of Skip Laing and Matt Muller. Besides having a chance to qualify as individuals, FSU coaches expect Mundell, Laing and Muller to form the nucleus of an NCAA qualifying sprint free relay team.

Mirroring closely the sprint events is the distance free with three swimmers—John Kenny, Jay Wilkerson and Kris Zuments—all within striking distance of NCAA standards in the 1650 free.

Sophomore Charlie Rose and junior Mike Hermann return in the backstroke to solidify an area Maul has stressed improvement in.

"Both the 100 and 200 backstroke have not been as strong as necessary in the past two years," Maul said. "These two athletes are being given the task of rising to the occasion."

Success in the IM will also hinge on the performance of Rose, who will team with freshman Dieter Holtz in the 200 IM. Rose is coming off a fifth place finish in last year's Conference Championships as a freshman.

In the breaststroke, junior college transfer Craig Zettle enters FSU after qualifying for the Olympic Trials this past summer with a time of 55.8. He will team with returning lettermen Mike Roder and redshirt transfer John McCullough.

A pair of upperclassmen, Graham Carothers and Matt Muller, lead FSU's chances to score in the fly. Carothers is a solid performer, finishing third, two years ago and fifth last season at the Metro Championships.

The Seminole divers lost senior Benoit Seguin to graduation and will feel his loss in the diving events. The 1988 NCAA qualifier will be replaced with freshman Zach McIver of Eugene, OR, who is slated to start the season as FSU's top diver and should benefit from the early dual meet schedule.

With depth and talent in the free, breast, fly and IM, it's easy to see why teams like these will find taking on Florida State is not a game, but an adventure.

## Women's Outlook

For any coach at the college level, this year's Lady Seminole swim team is a dream come true. That's why Florida State's normally stoic head coaches Terry Maul and Bill Shults have to smile when talking about this year's team.

Their optimism is genuine because not a single member off last year's team was lost to graduation.

"I think the biggest single factor about this team is that every swimmer that went to the NCAA Championships returns," Shults said. "That is experience you just can't gain at any dual meet."

Under the direction of the two head coaches, the women's program has completed full cycle. Not since its second place national finish in 1982 has such optimism flowed as it has this season. With FSU's 26th place finish in the NCAA's last year, the Lady Seminoles are ready to make waves in collegiate swimming circles.

With the Lady Seminoles on their schedule, perennial top 20 teams are getting nervous. This year, Florida, LSU, Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina will each test Florida State's top 20 hopes.

This year's team is led by 1988 MVP Kathy Isackson, returning after an outstanding freshman campaign in which she qualified for the NCAA Championship in both the 100 and 200 fly.

"Kathy did a tremendous job of returning successfully to national caliber competition," Maul said. "We will be working very hard to continue her development."

Isackson, with a personal best of 55.6 in the 100 and 2:00.9 in the 200, will be joined by juniors Kathy Turner and Jennie Hugus, sophomore Alison Harvey and freshman Anne Spaeder.

FSU coaches also point to the free events as strengths of a team that will try to better last season's 9-3 dual meet record. In the sprint free, Krissy Myers and Stacia Evans give FSU a 1-2 punch that could score at the NCAA Championships in the sprint events. FSU's advantage continues in the middle distance free, where defending Metro Conference champion Susan North returns after winning the 200-free crown as a freshman.

"Susan will be a stabilizing force in the 200," Maul said. "She will be supported by Kathy Turner, Alison Harvey and Kim Small in the 800 free relay."

Small, a freshman from Rochester, NY, is a junior national champion in the 500, 1,000 and 1,650 free. She is expected to challenge the NCAA qualifying standards in the 500 and 1,650.

One FSU swimmer hoping to return to the NCAA meet is junior breaststroker Jennifer Hazard, who swam 1:05.1 in the 100 last year to make her first appearance at the meet. Hazard will be joined by freshman Daniele Van Dyke, who has the credentials to surpass the NCAA qualifying mark with a personal best of 1:04.5.

During the past year, Maul and Shults placed more emphasis on the backstroke and individual medley, two areas that needed improvement if the FSU program was to compete on a national level. The backstroke received a huge lift with the signing of junior national champion Juliet Yenglin.

In the IM, FSU signed Van Dyke and Anne Spaeder who come to FSU with personal records better than the squad's best times from a year ago. The pair of talented freshmen will team with returnees Kathy Turner, Merrie Brennan and Missy Bunnell.

Florida State's depth continues on the one- and three-meter boards, where Susan Pollack, Stacey Wright and senior Julie Deskin form a trio that should take three of the top 10 places at the Conference Championships.

"I think you're finally starting to see the fruits of our three year rebuilding process," Shults said. "I think we're going to open some eyes with our success."

# THIS IS FSU

Florida State University, home of the world's fastest supercomputer, is setting the pace as higher education in the state prepares to enter the 21st century. The FSU Supercomputer Computations Research Institute attracts international attention with scientists from many nations using the University's two powerful supercomputers in their research.

The Department of Physics' Tandem Van de Graaff Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory, ranked in the top four in the nation by the National Science Foundation, houses two powerful atom smashers which also provide unique research opportunities.

Located in Tallahassee, the capital of Florida, FSU is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the State University System. More than 24,000 students are enrolled, representing all 50 states and 100 foreign countries. The University offers more than 250 graduate and undergraduate degrees in its 15 schools and colleges. Outstanding programs in the colleges of arts and sciences, business, communication, education, engineering, home economics, law and social sciences combine with the schools of criminology, library and information studies, music, nursing, social work, theater and visual arts to make Florida State a nationally acclaimed university.

The Florida State campus, located just blocks away from the state capitol, is beautiful in all seasons. Its 347 acres mirror the picturesque features of the surrounding North Florida region. The buildings are nestled among evergreen live oaks, pines and palms, as well as hardwoods that provide fall color, and dogwoods and azaleas that are covered with a profusion of springtime blossoms.

As an institution, FSU began as coeducational Seminary West of the Suwannee River, approved by the Florida Legislature in 1851 and assigned to Tallahassee in 1857. Name changes over the years included Florida State College in 1901; then in 1905, Florida Female College and, in 1909, Florida State College for Women. Gov. Millard Caldwell signed a bill in 1947 which again made the institution coeducational and changed the name to Florida State University.

The first building to house the institution was completed in 1855. Westcott, the present administrative building, replaced the original building, making this location the state's oldest active university site.

Today, Florida State faculty and administrators generate more than \$50 million annually in external funding to supplement state sponsorship of research. In addition, \$14.5 million in private gifts was raised through the FSU Foundation during the past fiscal year. These contributions from alumni, friends, corporations, the University community and charitable foundations benefit Florida State's academic programs.

The University's location affords excellent research and internship opportunities in government, law and the social sciences. The reputation of Florida State's research programs



and the expertise of its more than 1,500 faculty members—including four members of the National Academy of Sciences and four members of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences—represent major strengths of the University. FSU prides itself on pursuing academic quality while maintaining a friendly, welcoming atmosphere.

Programs in music, dance and theater at Florida State have earned well-deserved national recognition. The visual and performing arts exhibited and produced on campus offer students and the community a wealth of enrichment opportunities.

Student activities at FSU create an important balance between the classroom experience and the personal life of the individual scholar. Honors programs, student government, intramural sports and more than 200 organizations are available for student involvement. Furthermore, the Flying High Circus, the world's only all-collegiate circus, makes its home here.

Florida State academic programs extend well beyond Tallahassee. The FSU Marine Laboratory is located on the Gulf of Mexico, 45 miles away. Students participate in professional training programs at the Asolo State Theater in Sarasota and the Burt Reynolds Institute for Theatre Training in Jupiter. The Panama City Campus of Florida State offers upper-level courses which lead to bachelor's and master's degrees. The Center for Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of the main campus, manages educational outreach activities from Pensacola to Miami.

The physical growth of the University during the 11-year administration of President Bernard Sliger represents new construction expenditures of more than \$100 million. It includes such additions as the University Union expansion project, the new Paul A.M. Dirac Science Library Building, the Jeffersonian-style Village Green project at the College of Law, the new wing of the Rovetta Business Building, and the new FAMU/FSU College of Engineering at Innovation Park.

It is not only the academic programs and facilities of Florida State, but also its people—students, faculty, alumni, administrators and staff—who make this University such a proud monument to learning.
