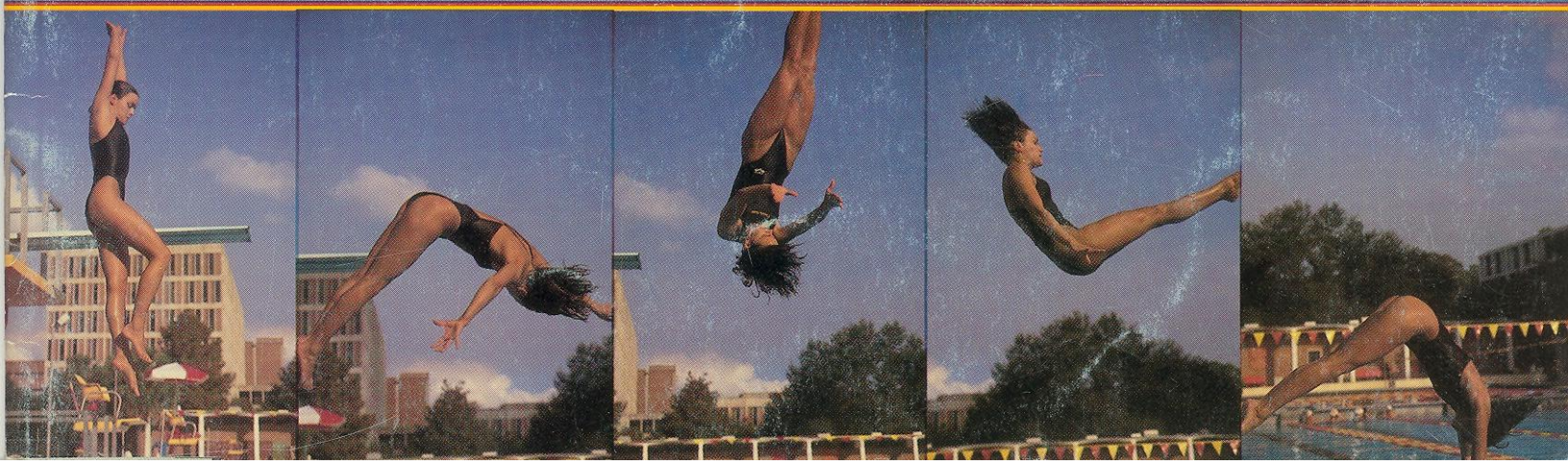

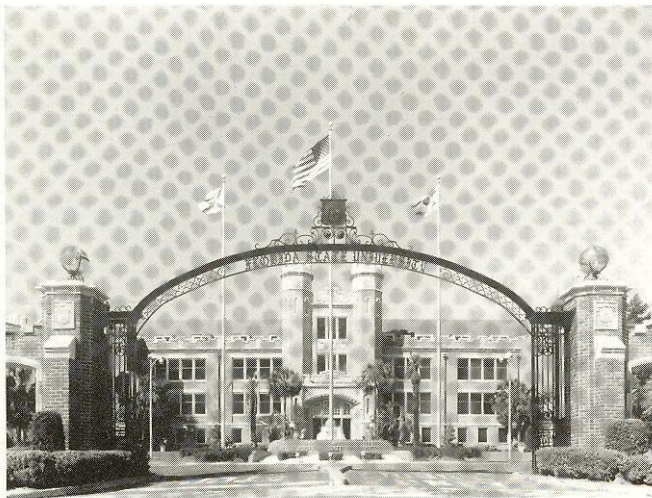

FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY

From its beginning as "The Seminary West of the Suwannee" in 1857, Florida State University has grown to stretch across 347 acres of rolling oak and pine-covered hills to comprise a campus which has educated millions of students over the last century.

Florida State University has boasted a heritage of service and scholarship since the beginning when the legislature passed an act authorizing two state colleges — one east (now University of Florida) and one west of the meandering Suwannee River.



Starting with a 130-member coed enrollment in 1857, the Seminary survived the Civil War, reconstruction, radical social changes, and a variety of name changes to emerge in 1909 as the Florida State College for Women.

It was helped back into coed status in 1947 by a legislature anxious to open up the state's educational resources to thousands of degree-seeking ex-GI's from World War II. It also was granted a new name "Florida State University." The university's expanse and complexity today contrast vividly with its beginning. Sixteen schools and colleges within the University serve more than 28,300 students who are enrolled in the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs and live and work among 1,300 faculty and 2,600 staff members. About 5,000 degrees are awarded every year.

In the past several years, the University has joined an elite group of universities in the United States which produce more than 200 doctoral graduates annually. Emphasis on graduate research and study at the University continues to grow, and today more than 4,000 graduate students pursue a variety of degrees.

Student life at Florida State University also offers young people ample opportunity to acquire leadership skills and to apply their classroom learning in student government,

residence hall government, Greek social organizations, honors programs, departmental organizations and more than 200 other registered student organizations active on campus. The FSU Artist Series, the Distinguished Lecture Series and outstanding music, theater and dance production provide enjoyable evenings for the entire community.

Being a student at Florida State University means stepping into a tradition of more than 130 years of higher education. From its Flying High Circus to its Supercomputer Computations Research, Florida State provides a panorama of excitement, blending the educational and social sides of campus life.

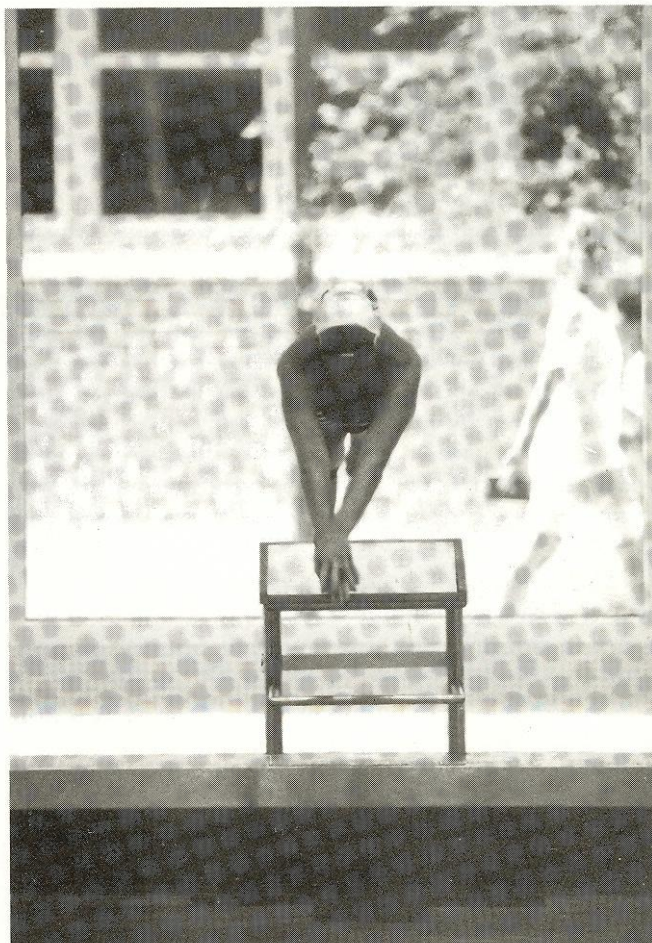

COACHES' PROFILES

HEAD COACH

TERRY MAUL

(FLORIDA STATE, '68)

Terry Maul works from the philosophy that each individual should have the opportunity to develop to their fullest potential academically, emotionally, and athletically. From this philosophy, Maul has built a reputation for success, while at the same time, insuring the development of the individual athlete in the college environment.

In his sixteen seasons at Florida State, Maul has guided 32 All-Americans. He has served as the women's head coach since its initial season in 1976, and led his squad to an AIAW National Championship runner-up behind Texas in 1982. In 1987, he was joined by Bill Shults as co-head coach of both the men's and women's teams and in 1990, Maul was appointed head coach of both programs.

Maul's specific duties for the Seminole swimming and diving team include personally directing the overall training regimen for the entire program. He designs a combination of water workouts, weight training as well as the typical conditioning exercises.

Outside of Seminole Territory, Maul has twice been named head coach of the U.S. Olympic Festival swim teams and headed the U.S. National team in the South American Cup in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Maul graduated from FSU with a bachelor's degree in Biology in 1968 and went on to earn a master's degree in sports psychology in 1975. He has completed course work for a doctorate in sports psychology and is a frequent speaker on the subject at United States Swimming sponsored coaching clinics.

DIVING COACH

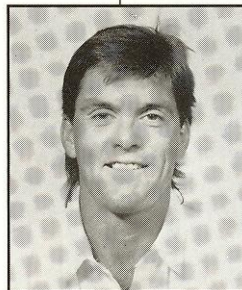
GARY COLE

(BOWLING GREEN, '75)

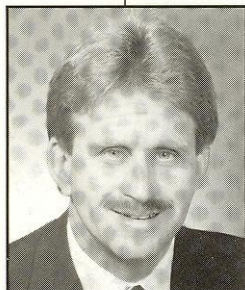
In his tenth year as the diving coach at Florida State, Gary Cole continues to recruit and train some of the best divers in the nation. Besides his coaching responsibilities, Cole prepares opponent scouting reports and assists with the team computer management systems.

A member of the NCAA Diving Rules Committee and the U.S. Professional Diving Coaches Association, Cole has coached two World Age Group Champions and four collegiate All-Americans in his career. In 1984, three of his athletes finished in the top eight at the Canadian Olympic Trials. In 1988, Cole was selected as South Korean Olympic Coach and most recently honored as the Metro Diving Coach of the Year.

Cole, a standout diver in college and high school where he was instructed by U.S. Olympic Coach Ron O'Brien, is married to the former Vickie Welcher of Ormond Beach.

ASSOCIATE COACH
BILL SHULTS
(NEW HAMPSHIRE, '76)

In his tenth year as part of the rising Florida State swim program, Bill Shults shares his duties as an assistant athletic administrator and associate swim coach. Shults assists Associate Athletics Director, Dr. Jan Stocker while still performing support duties for the swimming program.

In 1981, Shults became the fourth head coach of the men's program after serving as an assistant under John Stafford. He led the men to two top 30 finishes as a head coach, and is credited with coaching several swimmers to All-American status.

Shults is active on a number of advisory boards including the Academic Committee to the CSCAA where he was honored as a recipient of the President's Award for outstanding service to the organization. He is also a member of the NCAA Swimming Committee which is responsible for rule changes.

Shults is married to the former Linda Carlton and they have two sons, Stevie and Ricky.



and directed the Wilmington (DE) Aquatic Club, a team he swam for during his prep career. Last summer, Cassidy was named head coach of the Olympic Festival West team which he led to a team championship in Los Angeles. He was also selected by the USS as a national coach for the International Distance Camp in Hawaii and as a staff member for the 1991 World Championships in Perth, Australia.

Cassidy, a former world-ranked professional marathon swimmer, is credited with guiding former FSU swimmer Jay Wilkerson to two consecutive national championships in open-water swimming. He now spends his summers as a member of the Atlantic City Beach Patrol coaching both pool and open-water swimmers.

ASSISTANT COACH
MARIAN CASSIDY
(PITTSBURGH, '88)

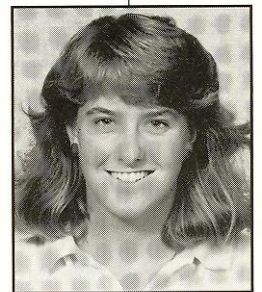
Marian Cassidy returns for her third year as a member of the coaching staff at Florida State after a successful four year career at the University of Pittsburgh.

Cassidy earned her bachelor's degree in exercise physiology in 1988 then served as an assistant coach at Pitt during the 1988-89 campaign. She is currently completing her masters of science in exercise physiology at FSU.

While a swimmer at Pittsburgh, Cassidy was a Big East Conference Champion, an NCAA qualifier, and was named a Big East Post Graduate Scholar Athlete in 1988.

This summer, Cassidy was named to the Pan Pacific coaching staff in open water swimming where she coached Amy Dunleavy to a silver medal in Edmonton, Canada.

The younger sister of coach Sid Cassidy, Marian was born in Kinston, NC and grew up in Wilmington, DE, where she swam for the Wilmington Aquatic Club. Cassidy is currently ranked seventh in the world in open water marathon swimming after placing third in the 42K in Canada and second in the 22.5 mile swim around Atlantic City this summer.



ASSISTANT COACH
STEPHEN A. "SID" CASSIDY
(NORTH CAROLINA STATE, '77)

Sid Cassidy has clearly established himself as one of the top assistant coaches on the swimming scene. A former two-time Division I All-American, Cassidy begins his seventh year at Florida State and his thirteenth year of coaching in the sport.

Cassidy has been an important key to Florida State's continued success since his arrival in 1985. His duties as assistant coach include recruiting new student-athletes, planning individual training routines, and assisting in the overall conditioning of the team.

A Kinston, NC native, Cassidy served as head coach of the Greater Tampa Swimming Association

The ACC is an established swimming and diving conference with North Carolina, Clemson, North Carolina State and Virginia consistently at the top of the conference and national polls. FSU, having faced traditional powers

"Competition will be much greater as we challenge to break into the top four in the ACC Championships," said Head Coach Terry Maul.

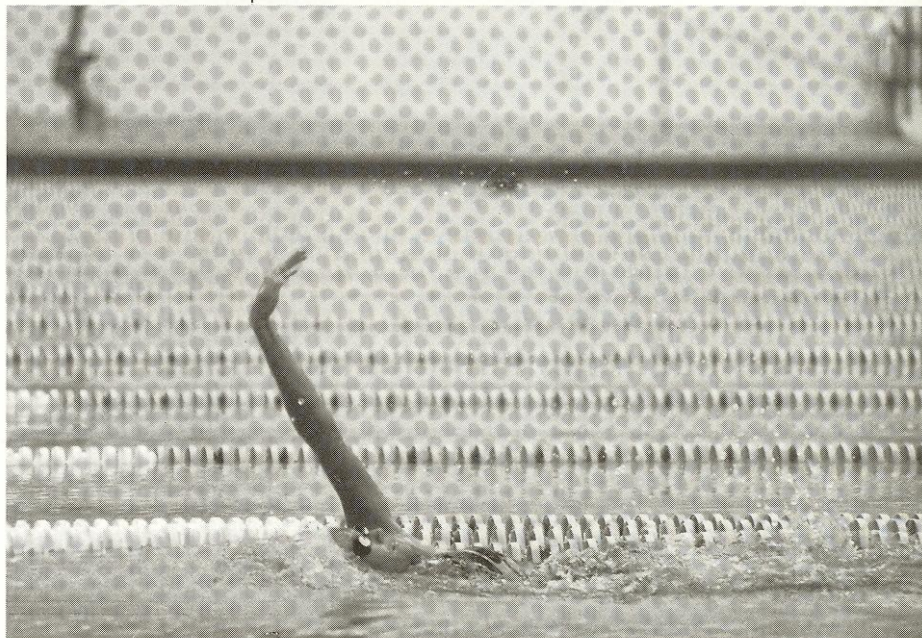
Enhancing the Seminoles preparation to meet the challenge is their new home, FSU's brand new Bobby E. Leach Recreational Center. The center, which houses a 16 lane, 25 yard natatorium with one and three meter diving boards, gives the team an opportunity to fill two major voids — the team can now train indoors as well as compete in home dual meets during the winter months.

Returning for the Lady Seminoles are a number of Metro Conference finalists who are expected to make the same strong showing in the ACC. Junior **Kiki Steinberg** came within seven-tenths of a second from qualifying for the NCAA Championships. **Missy Connolly**, who holds the school record in the 1650 freestyle, is expected to be a strong contender in the new conference. Bringing strength to the roster this season are **Meghan Henning** and **Nada Cenanic**, conference finalists in the sprint freestyle and **Valerie Moore**, a finalist in the backstroke. Senior captains **Teri Lukes** and **Anne Spaeder**, both recovering from injuries, look to establish themselves at the top of the ACC.

winning the Atlantic Coast Conference and becoming an NCAA power.

The Lady Seminoles hope to continue rebuilding through this season. The key to accomplishing this goal will be providing experience for the freshmen and sophomore athletes. With the talent this team possesses, Coach Maul hopes challenge for a spot in the top four in the ACC the first year.

"We have very talented freshmen and returning athletes, along with excellent senior leadership provided by Anne Spaeder," Maul said. "This should be a very productive season in establishing ourselves in the ACC."

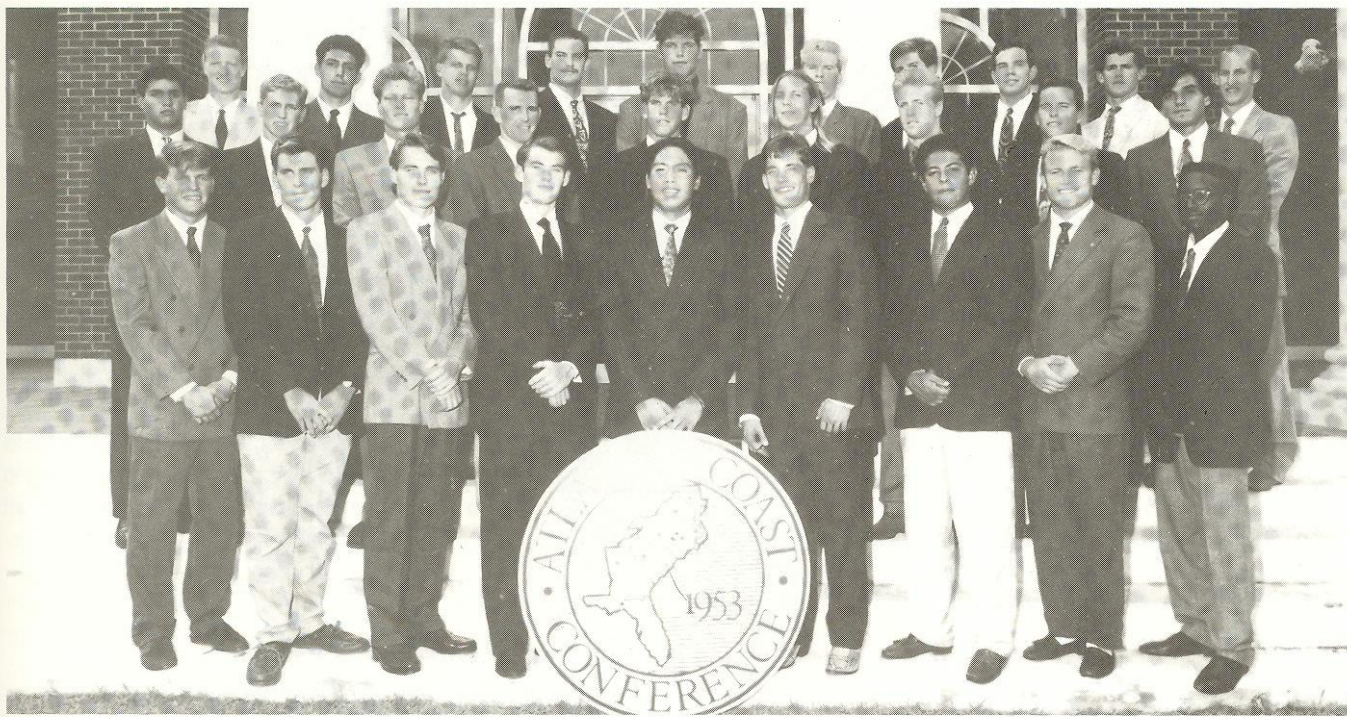
