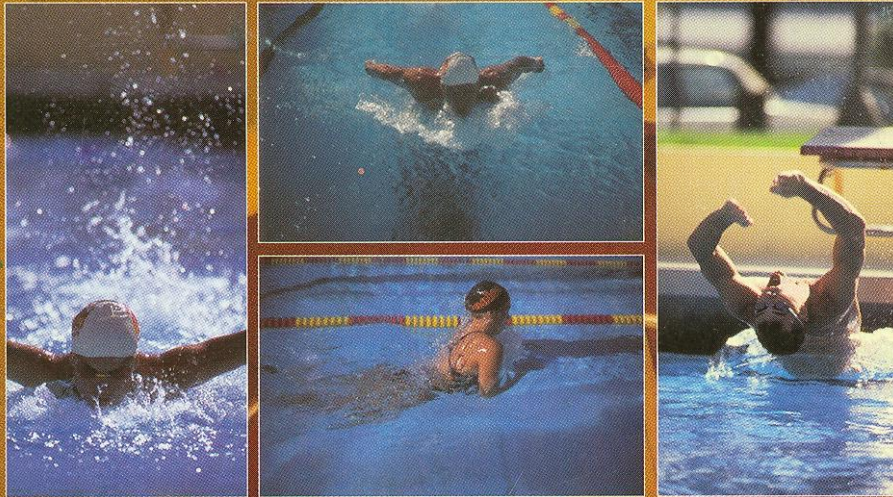

# Florida State University

From its beginning as "The Seminary West of the Suwannee" in 1857, Florida State University has grown to stretch across 347 acres of rolling oak and pine-covered hills to comprise a campus which has educated millions of students over the last century.

Florida State University has boasted a heritage of service and scholarship since its beginning when the legislature passed an act authorizing two state colleges — one east (now University of Florida) and one west of the meandering Suwannee River.

Starting with a 130-member coed enrollment in 1857, the Seminary survived the Civil War, reconstruction, radical social changes, and a variety of name changes to emerge in 1909 as the Florida State College for Women.

It was helped back into coed status in 1947 by a legislature anxious to open up the state's educational resources to thousands of degree-seeking ex-GI's from World War II. It also was granted a new name, "Florida State University." The university's expanse and complexity today contrast vividly with its beginning. Sixteen schools and colleges within the University serve

more than 29,000 students who are enrolled in the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs and live and work among 1,300 faculty and 2,600 staff members. About 5,000 degrees are awarded every year.



In the past several years, the University has joined an elite group of universities in the United States which produce more than 200 doctoral graduates annually. Emphasis on graduate research and study at the University continues to grow, and today more than 4,000 graduate students pursue a variety of degrees.

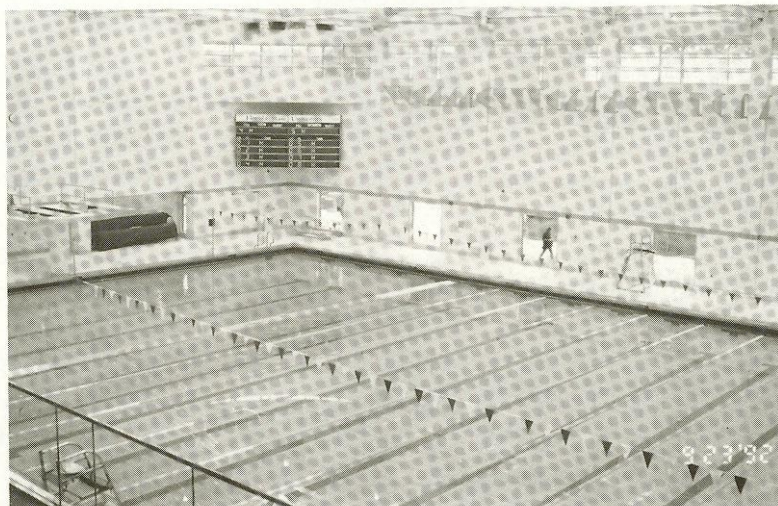
Student life at Florida State University also offers young people ample opportunity to

acquire leadership skills and to apply their classroom learning in student government, residence hall government, Greek social organizations, honors programs, departmental organizations and more than 200 other registered student

organizations active on campus. The FSU Artist Series, the Distinguished Lecture Series and outstanding music, theater and dance productions provide enjoyable evenings for the entire community.

Being a student at Florida State University means stepping into a tradition of more than 130 years of higher education. From its Fly-

ing High Circus to its Supercomputer Computations Research, Florida State provides a panorama of excitement, blending the educational and social sides of campus life.

Coaches' Profiles

**D**on Gibb enters his second year on the Seminole staff and first as FSU's head coach, after five seasons as the top assistant for the University of Florida men's program. A 1985 graduate of the University of Florida with a degree in psychology, Gibb swam for the Gators for two seasons (1981-82 and 1982-83) and was a member of the Florida 1982-83 national championship team. Individually, he was the SEC 100-yard freestyle champion in 1982, and also a World Games Trials finalist in the 100m freestyle.

In his first year at Florida State, Gibb was instrumental in the success of ACC champions Robert Braknis and Ignacio Merino, FSU's first NCAA qualifiers in two years.

He played an important role in 1983 as a member of the Gators NCAA champion 400-yard free relay team which clinched the national title for Florida. Gibb also took seventh place in the 100-yard (43.62) freestyle at the 1983 NAAs.

Married for seven years, Gibb and his wife Gena, a 1983 graduate of Florida in finance. The couple has a two-year-old daughter, Sarah.

**I**n his twelfth year as the diving coach at Florida State, Gary Cole continues to recruit and train some of the best divers in the nation. Besides his coaching responsibilities, Cole prepares opponent scouting reports and assists with the team's computer management systems.

A member of the NCAA Diving Rules Committee and the U.S. Professional Diving Coaches Association, Cole has coached two World Age Group Champions and four collegiate All-Americans in his career. In 1984, three of his athletes finished in the top eight at the Canadian Olympic Trials. In 1988, Cole was selected as South Korean Olympic Coach and most recently was honored as the Metro Diving Coach of the

Year. After the 1991 and 1992 seasons, Cole was honored as an All-American Diving Coach by the Professional Diving Coaches Association.

Last season, Cole directed two of his divers, Rob Caicedo and Julie Henderson, to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference team. Caicedo finished second at the ACC meet on both the one and three meter boards, while Henderson finished second on the one meter.

Cole, a standout diver in college and high school where he was instructed by U.S. Olympic Coach Ron O'Brien, is married to the former Vickie Welcher of Ormond Beach. They had their first child, Angela Lynne, on July 16th 1992.



## Coaches' Profiles

**B**eginning her first year on the Florida State swim staff, Leigh Ann Fetter-Witt comes to Tallahassee as one of most accomplished swimmers in NCAA history. A 1993 graduate of the University of Texas, Fetter was a four-year letter winner for the powerhouse Longhorn swim program.

Fetter was the first woman in the world to break the 22 second barrier in the 50 freestyle and she currently holds the American record in that event.

She is also an international competition veteran, swimming in the 1988 Olympics, the 1989 Pan Pacific Games, the 1990 Goodwill Games, and the 1991 Pan Pacific Games. While at Texas, Fetter was a 17-time NCAA Champion and worked as a student assistant for the Longhorns after completing her eligibility in 1991.

Fetter is a recent newlywed as well, marrying Mike Witt on August 27th of this year.

**F**irst year graduate assistant coach Kristina Myers is no stranger to the Seminole swimming and diving program. Myers was a four-year letter winner as a member of the Lady Seminole swim team from 1987-1991.

Myers was a member of Florida State's 1991 Metro Conference Championship team and won the Metro 50 freestyle that same



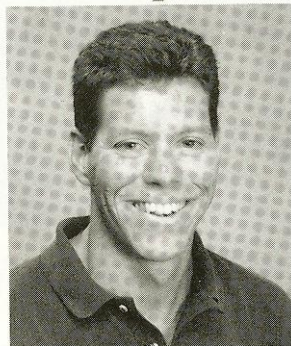

year. In 1988, Myers was an honorable mention All-American and swam at the NCAA Championships. She also participated at the '88 Olympic Swimming Trials in the 50 free.

In her graduate assistant role, Myers will work primarily with FSU's women's team. The Americus, GA native is pursuing a Master's degree in leisure services.

**A**nthony Frangello begins his first year as a graduate assistant with Florida State after spending the past year as a volunteer with the swimming program.

Frangello had an outstanding collegiate career at Brevard Community College in Cocoa, FL, then at the University of Georgia. While at BCC, Frangello was the Junior College National Champ in the 100

and 200 butterfly and was a five-time NJCAA All-American. At Georgia, he set the Bulldog school record in the 200 fly three times and was a Southeastern Conference finalist in both the 100 and 200 fly.

Frangello is pursuing a Master's degree in Asian studies and worked at the Seminole Swim Camp last summer.



# FSU Lady Seminole Outlook

In Florida State's first two years in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Lady Seminole swimming and diving team finished in fifth and fourth places respectively. But entering the 1993-94 season, first year head coach Don Gibb sees bigger things for his FSU women.

"I think we have the potential to have one of the top couple of teams in the ACC," said Gibb matter of factly. "We are returning our two conference champions and a few other conference finalists. We have a strong group of divers and we also added a talented recruiting class."

What that adds up to might just be Florida State's first ACC Swimming and Diving Championship come February.

Leading the way for the Lady Seminoles are 1993 Atlantic Coast Conference Champions Helen Jepson and Dora Bralic.

Jepson made big waves as a freshman in Tallahassee last season. The West Yorkshire, England native was the conference champ in the 200 butterfly, setting the FSU record (2:00.92) in the process. She spent the summer representing Great Britain in the World University in Buffalo, NY.

Bralic won the ACC 100 breaststroke and finished second in the 200 breast. The junior from Rijeka, Croatia swam for her country this past summer at both the Mediterranean Games and the European Championships.

"I really expect Helen and Dora to be our leaders this year in and out of the pool," Gibb

said. "They are very dedicated and that shows in what they did this summer."

Florida State will also count heavily on junior Ruth Kominski, and sophomores Christy Lindsey and Claudia Wilson.

Kominski, from Silver Spring, MD, was a conference finalist in the 100 butterfly a year ago. She may also contend for conference honors in the 100 and 200 breaststroke.

Wilson had an impact as a rookie last season. She was Florida State's top 400 IM swimmer and is the Lady Seminole's top returner in the backstroke.

Lindsey is expected to be FSU's top sprint freestyler, after a freshman season in which she was an ACC consolation finalist in the 50 and 100 free.

Diving coach Gary Cole has assembled what might be the deepest pool of talent in the conference.

Sophomores Julie Henderson and Susan Petry are Florida State's top returners on the boards.

Henderson, from Orlando, placed second on the ACC one-meter board and sixth on the three-meter. Petry took seventh on the three-meter.

Cole also put together an impressive recruiting class by signing Pennsylvania high school state champ Amy Koffel and top three-meter diver Erin Gillooly.

Impact newcomers in the pool should include Cara Duncan of Longwood, FL and junior college transfer, Betty Engel, the NJCAA Swimmer of the Year.

As always, the Lady Seminoles face a demanding schedule. Among the toughest tests are ACC foes Virginia and North Carolina, and state rivals Florida and Miami. But the highlight of this year's slate is the ACC Championships that come to Tallahassee for the first time February 18-26.

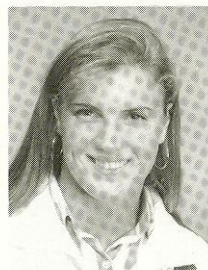


## Nada Cenanovic

# FSU Men's Seminole Outlook

Coming off an encouraging finish to the 1992-93 season, the Florida State men's swimming and diving team has high expectations entering the upcoming year.

Mix two returning Atlantic Coast Conference champions that were NCAA qualifiers with five other conference finalists and a top-notch recruiting class and Seminole head coach Don Gibb has a lot to smile about.

"This will be one of Florida State's best men's swimming teams in recent history," said Gibb, in his first year as the swimming head man. "We have some great returning swimmers and we surrounded them with a very good recruiting class."

Heading the list of returning swimmers are conference champions Robert Braknis and Ignacio Merino, both of whom qualified for the NCAA Championship meet.

Braknis, a sophomore from Chateauguay, Quebec, Canada, made a splashing debut in his first year at Florida State. He captured the ACC title in the 100 backstroke (48.81) and also was a finalist in two other events, finishing second in the 200 back (1:46.70) and sixth in the 50 freestyle (:20.52). His times in both backstroke events set Florida State school records.

Quito, Ecuador native Merino is an FSU record holder in three events (200 breaststroke, 2:00.01; 100 butterfly, :48.64; and 200 butterfly, 1:47.29) and was the ACC champion in the 200 fly last year. The junior placed second and sixth at the conference meet in the 200 breaststroke and 100 fly, respectively.

"Those guys are two of the best swimmers in the Atlantic Coast Conference," Gibb said. "They worked hard over the summer and I expect them to pick up where they left off. They have the potential to score at the NCAA Championships."

Other top returnees include: seniors Brad Hoffman and Jose Gutierrez, and juniors Brian Davey and Greg Miller.

Gibb expects Hoffman to return to his sophomore season form, when the Bell Vernon, PA native was a ACC finalist in three events. Hoffman and Miller, who was a two-event finalist at last year's ACC Championships (100 back and 100 fly), along with Braknis make FSU very strong in the backstroke.

Gutierrez and Davey will provide points in the freestyle to compliment Braknis. Gutierrez has been a part of three school record setting relay teams (400 free, 800 free, and 400 medley) and Davey finished fourth at the ACC meet in the 1650 free last year.

Among the newcomers, Frank Bradley, Chip Haberstroh, and Jair Castrillion have the best chance to make an immediate impact.

Bradley competed at the US Olympic Festival this past summer and is a possible NCAA qualifier in the breaststroke. The same can be said about Haberstroh, who will swim the IM and butterfly. Castrillion is a diving transfer from Oral Roberts who was the NAIA runner-up last year.

Castrillion has big shoes to fill because the Seminoles biggest loss was All-ACC diver Rob Caicedo, who placed second at the ACC meet on both the one and three meter boards last season.

National power Florida and ACC rivals North Carolina and Virginia highlight the difficult schedule. FSU will also host the ACC Swimming and Diving Championships in February.

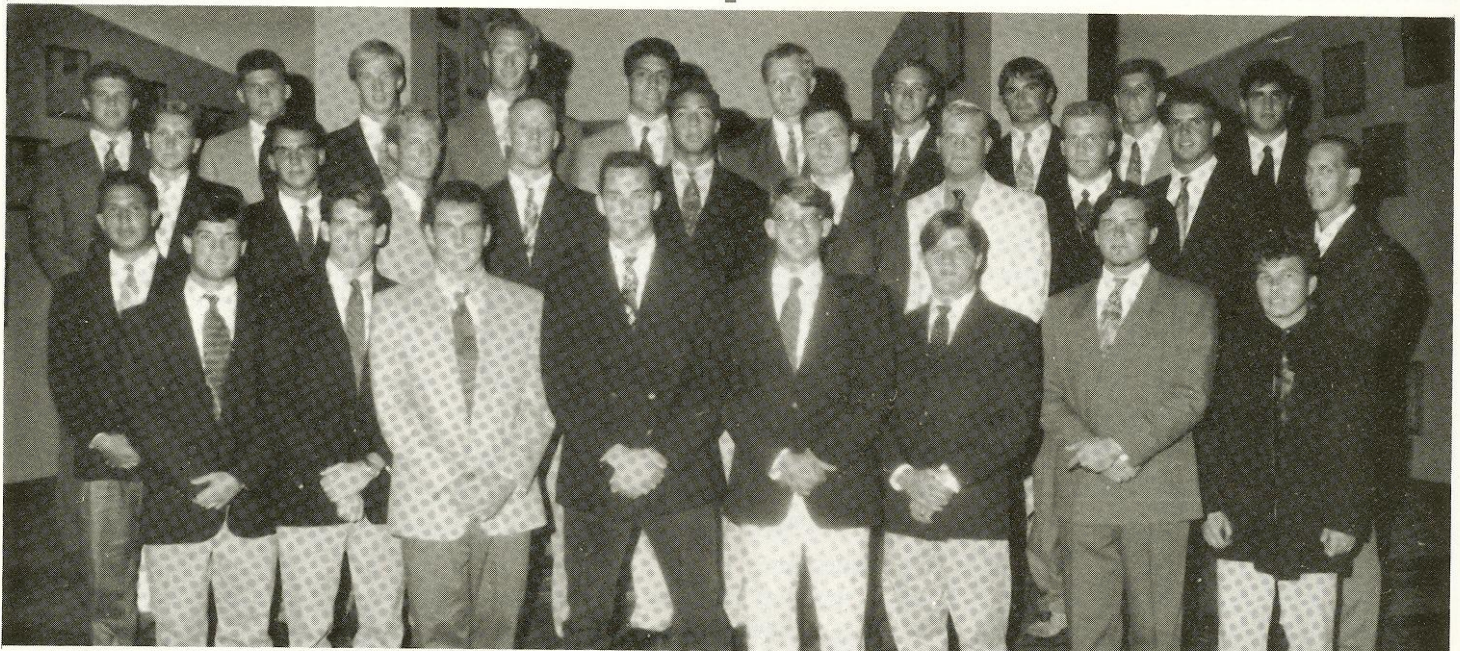
"I think we will be peaking at the end of the year," said Gibb. "And with the ACCs here in Tallahassee, we could be in very good position to finish at the top."

# The Bobby E. Leach Center

The 1993-94 season will mark the Florida State swimming and diving program's third year of competition in the Dr. Bobby E. Leach Center. FSU's first two seasons in the Leach Center have been very successful. Combined, the Tribe's men and women have won 17 of 25 dual meets in Leach (a .680 winning percentage) and have set 13 school records since moving into the new building at the beginning of the 1991-92 season.

This year the Atlantic Coast Conference Swimming and Diving Championships will come to Tallahassee and be held in the Leach Center.

It will mark the first time since 1986, when the University of Virginia hosted, that the events will be held outside the state of North Carolina. The ACC Diving Championships will be held Friday, February 18th and Saturday, February 19th, while the ACC Swimming Championships will run from Wednesday, February 23rd through Saturday, February 26th.

The Leach Center was built to serve the students of Florida State University as a recreation facility. Named after Florida State's Vice President for Student Affairs from 1980-1989 Dr. Bobby E. Leach, the Center cost \$12.9 million to build and was financed through student funds. The building opened at the beginning of the fall 1991 semester and offers the students, faculty, and staff of Florida State a variety of recreational space including: a natatorium, gymnasium, spas, racquetball and squash courts, weight training and fitness rooms, indoor track, and other multi-purpose areas.

## 1992-93 Season Review

Coaches were not sure what to expect of their teams at the beginning of Florida State's 1992-93 swimming season. Both the men's and women's teams were relatively young and inexperienced. But by the end of the year, those same coaches were pleased with what their program had accomplished and were eagerly looking forward to this year's swimming and diving season.

The Tribe swimming and diving program produced four Atlantic Coast Conference individual champions and had six team members chosen to the All-Conference team, as both the FSU men and women finished fourth at the ACC meet. Florida State also advanced three swimmers, two men and one woman, to the NCAA Championships.

Helen Jepson, Dora Bralic, Robert Braknis, and Ignacio Merino were FSU's four ACC event winners and were also selected to the All-ACC team. Divers Rob Caicedo and Julie Henderson joined them on the All-Conference squad. Jepson, Braknis, and Merino were the Tribe's NCAA qualifiers.

"Our kids really had a gutty performance at the ACCs," said Florida State coach Don Gibb. "We had four individual champions at a high performance level and that is something Florida State has never really had."

The most notable other season highlight were the nine school records that were shattered over the course of the year. Kiki Steinberg set the 100 and 200 backstroke marks at the Seminole Winter Invitational in December. The other seven records were broken at the ACC Championships. Ignacio Merino set three: 100 butterfly, 200 butterfly, and the 200 breaststroke. Robert Braknis shattered two 100 backstroke and the 200 backstroke. Helen Jepson set the 200 butterfly mark and the team of Braknis, Merino, Greg Miller, and Jose Gutierrez set the 400 medley relay mark.

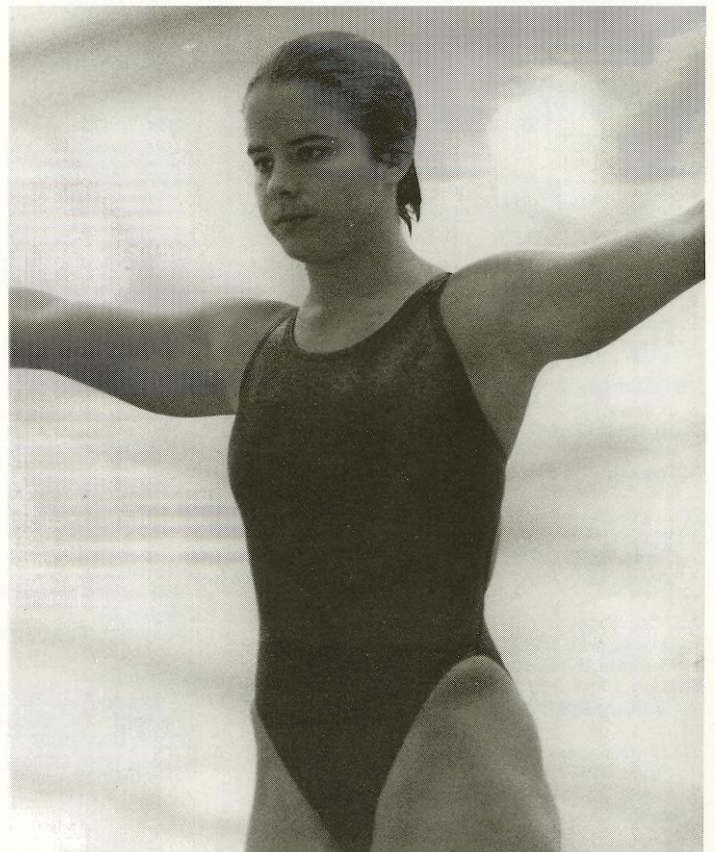
