This is Tallahassee

Near, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State — one of powwows, plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as “The Other Florida” with its deep-rooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of moss-draped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee — Florida with a Southern accent.

Best known as Florida’s capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neo-metropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complemented by subtle, old-fashioned charm. It is the perfect two- or three-day diversion for the more than 41 million annual visitors to Florida and 13 million residents.

Tallahassee touts a menagerie of sights including one of the world’s deepest freshwater springs, site of America’s first Christmas, a wildlife habitat, Capitol buildings, fascinating museums of history, sprawling plantations, highly acclaimed fishing and hunting adventures and nearby beaches. Spirited area festivals range from celebrations of Tallahassee’s spectacular spring and swamp stomps to genuine rattlesnake roundups and seafood festivals.

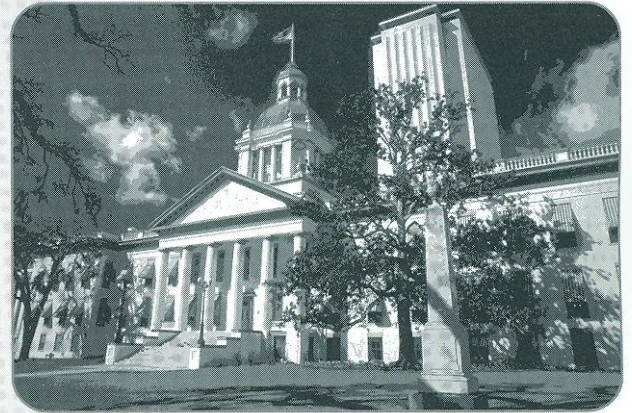
With the Gulf of Mexico just 20 miles south and the Georgia border only 14 miles north, Tallahassee rests between the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains

and the juncture of Florida’s panhandle and peninsula. Nearer in miles to Atlanta than to Miami, Tallahassee more closely resembles its Southern neighbors than Florida in topography, climate and lifestyle.

Accentuating Tallahassee’s Southern persona are lush rolling hills, likened to the seven hills of Rome, and five “official” canopy roads of patriarch oaks. The fertile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant, seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round.

Like the city itself, the story of how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out — one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by boat from Pensacola — to find a permanent, central location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called “tallahassee” — derived from the words “talwa” meaning town and “ahasee” meaning old. The rendezvous point remains Florida’s capital.

The “old town” has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same — it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old

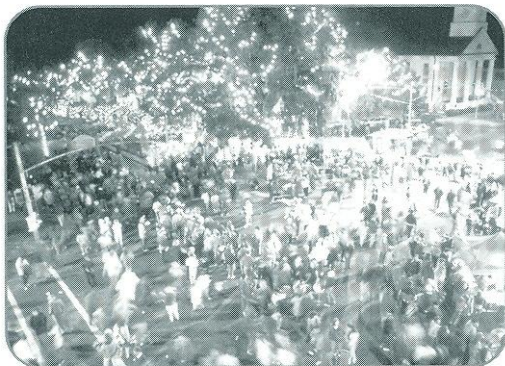


and new, epitomize Tallahassee’s perseverance.

The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a panoramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session.

Below, in the shade of giant live oaks, proudly stands the Old Capitol, originally constructed in 1845 and restored to its 1902 splendor complete with red-and-white candy-striped awnings, a dome adorned with stained glass, antique furnishings and political memorabilia.

Across from the Old Capitol are the 40-foot twin granite towers of the Vietnam



Veteran's Memorial, and the blue stone Union Bank, Florida's oldest surviving financial institution. The nostalgic Old Town Trolley, a replica turn-of-the-century street car, carries passengers through restored Adams Street Commons to numerous other historical downtown shops for free — unheard of even 100 years ago.

Minutes from downtown lies the Governor's Mansion, which resembles the home of Florida's military hero Andrew Jackson; and the 52-acre natural animal habitat and 1880s farm of the Tallahassee Museum of History and Natural Science, which provide the rare chance to walk and talk with native Florida animals.

Tallahassee remains firmly linked with the past as evidenced by the unearthed 1539 winter encampment of Spanish Hernando de Soto, the site of the first Christmas celebration in America. Visitors travel back through time as they stand in the shadow of a giant 12,000-year-old American Mastodon at the Museum of Florida History or explore other historical spots including The Knott House that Rhymes, The Columns, San Luis Mission, Lake Jackson State Archaeological Site, Natural Bridge Battlefield, First Presbyterian Church, Brokaw-McDougall House, Goodwood Plantation and Adams Street Commons.

Nearby, alligators lazing in the sunshine and aninga "snake birds" perched on twisted cypress branches are seen at Wakulla Springs, one of the world's deepest freshwater springs and site of many underwater scenes in the "Tarzan" movies with Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan. Safaris aboard glass-bottomed and jungle cruise boats whisk visitors within arm's length of

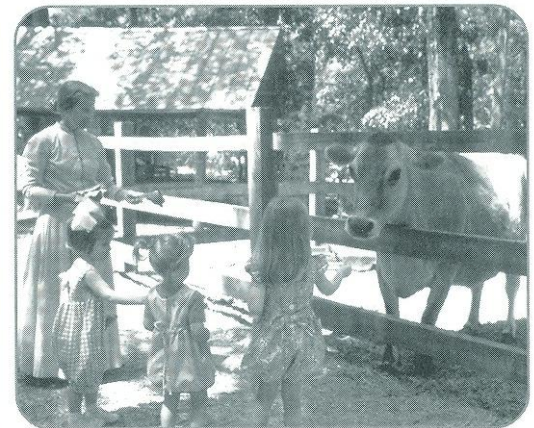
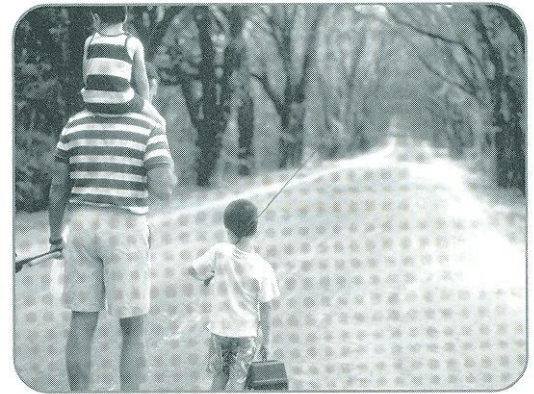


"The Other Florida."

Outdoor enthusiasts enjoy adventures including boating and fishing on area lakes, rivers, ponds and the Gulf — just 30 minutes away. Lakes Seminole, Jackson and Talquin are renowned in the bass fishing world for yielding the "big ones," and dense forests offer an abundance of prize-winning game. Local wildlife areas such as the Florida National Scenic Trail, St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge and Apalachicola National Forest are among many spots for camping, picnicking, swimming, biking and exploring.

Appealing to the strokes of different folks, Tallahassee also features 99 holes of golf on six courses and a proliferation of tennis centers. Sideline athletes cheer the nationally-ranked Florida State Seminoles, Florida A&M Rattlers and the Tallahassee Tiger Sharks, of the East Coast Hockey League. And always a sure bet are the nearby greyhound races.

A sport of sorts, shopping at two regional malls and many specialty centers offer many "playing options" — from popular



chains to curiosity and antique shops.

Cultural interests are sparked by widely-acclaimed museums and galleries and elaborate entertainment at the 14,000-seat Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center.

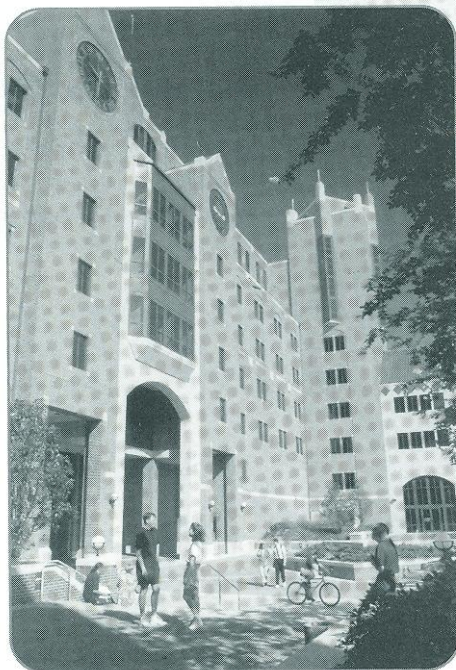

This is Florida State

Florida State University, celebrating its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution in 1997, has joined the nation's elite in both academics and athletics.

Located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida and building rapidly on the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, the University has emerged over the past 50 years as an institution of national and international esteem. Its stature is evidenced by a number of additions to its record of excellence in the 1990s:

- In 1994, Florida State was classified a **"Research University I"** by the Carnegie Foundation, placing it among the nation's top research universities.
- In 1994, the college referral service, "Who's Who Among American High School Students," placed FSU among its top 10 — with such universities as Harvard, Duke,



Stanford, North Carolina-Chapel Hill, Michigan-Ann Arbor and Yale — of most frequent choices of more than 100,000 of the nation's best and brightest high school students who asked that a specific college be notified of their recognition in "Who's Who."

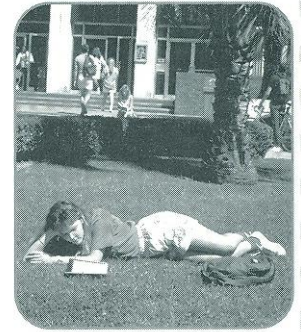
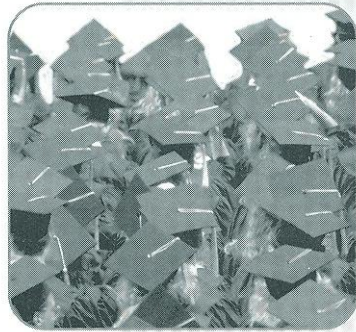
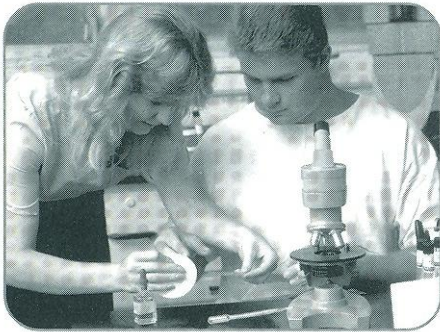
- Vice President of the United States Al Gore spoke at the dedication of the **National High Magnetic Field Laboratory** at Florida State in 1994. The National Science Foundation established the \$100 million magnet lab in 1990 at FSU, which is partnered in research with the Los Alamos National Laboratory and the University of Florida. A Nobel laureate in physics and a top Russian physicist were among the first scholars drawn to the faculty. The **world's largest magnet** — two stories high and capable of generating 45 tesla or 1 million times the Earth's magnetic field — was installed in 1995 at the NHMFL, located in the **off-campus research complex**, Innovation Park. In 1996, the NSF renewed and increased by 50 percent the NHMFL's funding for another five years.
- FSU created the first multipurpose student identification/banking card. The **Card Application Technology Center** is a national leader in "smart card" systems.
- At the forefront of supercomputing since

obtaining its first high-speed computer in 1985, FSU took yet another step in ultrafast and parallel computing in 1990 when it acquired **two supercomputers**, the Thinking Machine Corp. Connection Machine and the Cray Y-MP.

- In fall 1994, the first tenants moved into the east side of the \$100 million **University Center**, a classroom-and-office facility at Doak Campbell Stadium; the stadium's south end zone also was enclosed and the adjacent Moore Athletic Center expanded.

With the completion of the west side in 1996, University Center now provides 550,000 square feet of much needed academic space and a centralized location for student services.

- In 1990, Florida State **ranked second in popularity nationwide** among high school seniors, based on the number of students who request that their Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores be sent to an institution. FSU was the only institution listed among the top 10 choices of both black and white college-bound students.
- FSU's high-tech program in **structural biology** in 1991 received the University's largest single foundation grant, \$4 million.
- Capping more than a decade of national prominence in intercollegiate athletics, Florida State's athletic teams, nicknamed **"Seminoles,"** joined the **Atlantic Coast Conference** as its ninth member in 1990. The FSU football team won the **1993 National Championship** and its quarterback, Charlie Ward, won the University's first **Heisman Trophy**.
- The **Dr. Bobby E. Leach Center**, a state-of-the-art student recreation facility, with a pool, saunas, basketball and racquet-sport courts, was completed in 1991.



• **FSU ranked 20th in the nation for 1990-91 in the number of black Ph.D. students it graduates.** Over the five years, 1986 to 1990, FSU ranked eighth nationally by granting doctorates to 70 African-Americans.

As this list of highlights attests, Florida State is excelling in the 1990s with exceptional strength, energy and vision for the future. Under the leadership of the University's 12th president, **Talbot "Sandy" D'Alemberte**, who took office in January 1994, FSU will continue to build on the foundation of its history of excellence in scholarship, research and service.

A senior member of the 10-member **State University System**, FSU was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act and began in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

Today, FSU's operating budget is **\$474.3 million**. Faculty and administrators generate more than **\$102 million** annually in external funding to supplement state-sponsored research. Three direct-support organizations serve to bolster the University: **FSU Foundation**, which raises millions in private gifts to support academics, **Seminole Boosters** and **FSU Alumni Association**.



The main campus is spread over **451.6 acres in Tallahassee**; FSU, which has one of the smallest campuses in the SUS, has been actively acquiring land in the 1990s after years of being landlocked at 347 acres. FSU owns 1,281 acres in Leon, Bay, Franklin and Sarasota counties.

Within the state, the University maintains facilities at its **25-acre campus in Panama City**, its **Marine Laboratory** on the Gulf of Mexico, the Appleton Museum in Ocala and the Asolo Performing Arts Center in Sarasota. The **Center for Professional Development and Public Service**, housed in the **Augustus B. Turnbull III Florida State Conference Center** on the edge of the campus, provides extensive credit and non-credit continuing education programs statewide.

Florida State offers **286 graduate and undergraduate degree programs** through its **eight colleges** — Arts and Sciences; Business; Communication; Education; Engineering (operated jointly with Florida A&M University, a historically black institution); Human Sciences; Law; and Social Sciences (which also incorporates the Reubin Askew School of Public Administration and Policy) — and **eight schools** — Criminology and Criminal Justice; Information Studies; Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Work; Theatre; and Visual Arts and Dance.

With 1,655 members, the FSU faculty has included **nine National Academy of Sciences elected members, nine American Academy of Arts and Sciences fellows** and **five Nobel laureates**. It is backed by 2,887 administrative/professional and support staff.

Library holdings at Florida State include **2.1 million book titles, 16,384 serials and 4.5 million microforms**. The main library facility, the **Robert M. Strozier Library**, is linked by computer to other state university and national research libraries. The **Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library** is located at the heart of the University's science research complex. FSU also maintains extensive music, library science and law libraries.

Graduate students, who number more than 5,929, pursue advanced degrees in fields as diverse as business administration and theoretical particle physics. A majority of research done at FSU is the direct result of student effort, culminating in numerous books, monographs and journal articles relating to the whole spectrum of intellectual interests and the practical needs of society.

FSU, a residential campus, places a high priority on its **30,264 students** and their needs and interests (of the student population: 45 percent are male; 55 percent are female; 20.1 percent are minorities; and 2.5 percent are foreign students). The **University Honors Program, Disabled Student Services, International Student Center, Student Government, Flying High Circus** and intramural sports are among more than 200 organizations and activities in which students may participate.

In all areas of its mission — excellence in teaching, research and public service — **Florida State University** is advancing boldly toward the 21st century.

Women's Preview

The Lady Seminoles are looking to continue their success from last season on a regional and national level. The team is focused on contending for an ACC title with the addition of several strong freshmen and face a tough schedule this year with six meets against teams that finished in the top 20 at the NCAA Championships last season. The coaches hope this schedule will better prepare the team for the ACC Championships as well as a Top 25 finish at the NCAA competition at the end of the season.

There are high hopes for the incoming class this year. Among the newcomers is sophomore transfer Sarah Kate Havens who transferred to Florida State from the University of Nebraska where she competed in the 100 Back at the NCAA Championships in 1997. While depth has been a factor in the past, Florida State is deeper in every event this year. The addition of freshmen Kristen Adams, and Karin Holmstedt helps make the overall outlook for the Lady Seminoles even brighter. "The points



coming in outweigh the losses," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "We have a great class of freshmen which add depth to every event."

Assistant Coach Cashel Mack is looking for exciting things from the women. "Our recruiting last year was huge and we have gained the potential to move up in the standings at both ACC's and NCAA's," Mack said.

All-American returnees Samantha White and Anne Blachford will set the standard for the newcomers and hope to lead the team to top finishes at both the league and national meets. Also looking to perform strong are senior diving captain Sarah Henderson and

sophomore Marya Sabesky, who both could be strong contenders at the ACC Championships. "We had a successful year last year but we are hoping to build on it," Coach Gary Cole said. "We have the experience and youth that will be an impact in all of the meets."

Freestyle

The Lady Seminoles are very strong in the freestyle events this year. In the sprint events, sophomores Sarah Scobey, Katie Wright and senior Rachael Amman will lead the sprint events with the addition of freshmen Karin Holmstedt and Dana Moxley. Junior Tenelle Ramer and freshmen Kristen Adams and Ann Parker will lead middle distance. Juniors Kristie McRoberts and Meagan Bradley will lead the distance squad along with Sophomore Danielle Stafford.

Backstroke

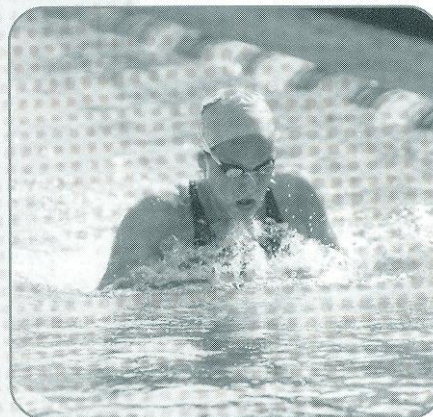
The Lady Seminoles are looking to transfer Sara Kate Havens for some added support in the backstroke events as well as on the relays. Sophomore Sarah Scobey will also be a contributor in the backstroke events at the ACC Meet.

Breaststroke

This is the team's deepest event from top to bottom, with the return of three letter winners and the addition of three newcomers. ACC champion Samantha White and NCAA qualifier Anne Blachford will lead the breaststroke squad. The return of Jenny Engelbrecht along with the addition of freshmen Polly Jaskowski and Katie Decker add to the talent of the Lady Seminole breaststrokers.

Butterfly

Returnees Sherri Fowler and Katie Wright, both finalists in last year's ACC Meet, look to improve upon their performance and lead the way for



this butterfly squad. Providing much needed depth in this event are senior captain Maria Toole, sophomore Danielle Stafford and freshman Dana Moxley.

Individual Medley

Gibb is looking for some great things from this group this

season. With some new faces and experienced returnees, this event looks strong for the Lady Seminoles. Leading the pack is NCAA qualifier Anne Blachford as junior Sherri Fowler and freshman Polly Jaskowski are focused on providing the team with some important points in these events at the ACC Championships.

Diving

Leading this diving squad will be senior captain Sarah Henderson. After a 1997 5th place finish on the 3-meter, she and 1997 FSU Most Improved Diver Marya Sabesky are ready to take on the ACC. Adding Kirsty Carrihill, Pam Kuznia, and freshman Cristine Battista, the Lady Seminoles look for some high finishes at the ACC's and are focused on making the NCAA competition in March.

Relays

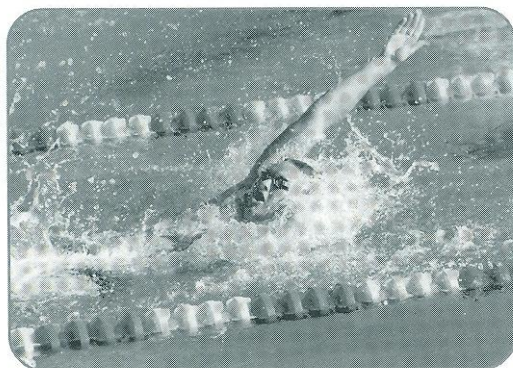
Both Medley and Free relays are expected to step up this year and challenge for ACC top finishes with the primary focus being on relay representation at the NCAA meet. With the influx of strong versatile freshmen along with the addition of transfer Sara Kate Havens, the possibilities for some very competitive medley relays are numerous. The freestyle relays benefit greatly from the addition of freshmen Karin Holmstedt, Dana Moxley, Ann Parker and Kristen Adams. Returning members of last season's freestyle relays are Anne Blachford, Tenelle Ramer, Sarah Scobey, Krisite McRoberts and Katie Wright.

Men's Preview

The Seminoles finished their 1996-97 season with a 2nd place finish at the ACC's and a 9th place finish at the NCAA's in Minneapolis from the previous year. Yet the coaches see even more from this year's team and are shooting to contend for the ACC Championships and finish in the top 5 at NCAA's.

Returning for the Seminoles are Stephen Parry, 1997 NCAA Champion in the 200 Fly, Brendon Dedekind, who brought home three individual All-American finishes as well as three ACC titles, and top finishers Danny Chocron, Matt McVittie, Darren Milun, and Brett Petersen. The relays remain strong even with the loss of Rob Braknis and Eduardo Coelho because of a strong recruiting class this year. "Our goal is to finish in the top 5 at NCAA's this year," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "This team has a wealth of potential and strength as well as experience. This makes our goal very realistic."

Florida State also brought in some strong newcomers this season. Transfer junior Julio Santos last year's National Junior College champion in the 50 and 100 free, will make an incredible impact in all of his events as well as the relays. Freshman Greg Main-Baillie will take the spot where Braknis left off and is an all-around swimmer. Richard Cowling and Chris Clark are also potential points at the ACC Championships. "We see lots of talent from these guys," Gibb said. "The new talent mixed with the experience and dedication will give us the opportunity



to be a dominant team at the ACC's and NCAA's."

The main goals this year are to compete for the ACC title, and to finish in the top 10 at NCAA's as well as sending more men to the NCAA Championships in individual events.

Freestyle

The sprinters continue to be a powerhouse and will build on success from last year, where junior Brendon Dedekind won the 50 free at the ACC meet and finished 3rd at the NCAA's. Joining Dedekind are Matt McVittie, Darren Milun and Brett Petersen, all who attended NCAA's last year. Returning in the middle distance events are 500 free ACC finalist Stephen Parry and sophomore Bill Schultz. The distance events will be bolstered by the return of Danny Chocron, who had an impressive first year, and Bill Schultz.

Backstroke

Even with the loss of ACC Champion Rob Braknis, the Seminoles have the depth and talent that will step up and fill any gap left from graduation. Experience will outweigh the losses with the return of Ross Clement, who has the potential to score at ACC's, Kerwin Deese and Kevin Rowley. Coming in to fill Rob Braknis' shoes is freshman Greg Main-Baillie, an All-Around swimmer and competitor.

Breaststroke

Returning for the breaststroke event are top scorers Brendon Dedekind and Brett Petersen. Dedekind was 5th at the NCAA Championships while Petersen placed at ACC's in both events. Junior transfer Julio Santos is also a possible contender in the breaststroke events.

Butterfly

The butterfly should be a strong area for the Seminoles. The shining point of the event last year was NCAA 200 Fly Champion Stephen Parry, who also placed at NCAA's on the 100 Fly. The

coaches are also looking for great things from freshman Keam Ang.

Individual Medley

Swimming the 200 IM for the Seminoles are freshmen Greg Main-Baillie and Wil McReynolds. Also returning are Chad Onken, Kevin Rowley and Kerwin Deese. Sophomore Bill Schultz leads the Seminoles in the 400 IM.

Diving

The Seminoles return Brett Burkman, who finished 7th on both 1-meter and 3-meter springboards at the ACC Championship, Glenn Gonzales, who could be a surprise af-



ter a summer of hard work and dedication, and Ben Nuttall, who finished 6th on the 1-meter and 9th on the 3-meter at the ACC Championships. Their youth and experience will be something to reckon with this year.

Relays

This year the coaches are looking for the relays to climb the ladder at the NCAA after winning four of five relays at the 1997 ACC Championship. Returnees Brendon Dedekind, Matt McVittie, Darren Milun and Stephen Parry will contend for ACC wins once again with the help of Jay McGarity and Julio Santos in the freestyle relays. Dedekind, Parry and Brett Petersen return for the medley relays while freshmen Keam Ang, Greg Main-Baillie and junior Julio Santos will step in and round out the medley relays, all who have the potential to qualify for NCAA's.

DON GIBB

HEAD COACH (FLORIDA '85)



Entering his fifth year as head coach of the Florida State men's and women's swimming and diving program, Don Gibb looks to improve on both

team and individual performances from last season and use gained experience to further enhance the program.

Gibb, the 1995 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Coach of the Year, continues to strengthen the men's and women's programs on the regional and national levels. With a perfect 10-0 regular season mark in 1996-97, the first undefeated swimming campaign by FSU since 1965, Gibb earned his 25th victory as coach of the men's squad. Gibb also coached the team to a second place finish at the ACC Championships, the fourth top three fin-

ish in as many years. The accolades which the swimmers from his men's team received last season include 11 out of a possible 20 ACC Champions at the conference meet in Chapel Hill, the MVP of the ACC Championships, seven swimmers named to the All-ACC team, and Co-Swimmer of the Year honors by FSU's Brendon Dedekind and Stephen Parry. Nine Seminole swimmers also participated in the NCAA Championships in Minneapolis competing in five relay events and 10 individual events. Gibb's swimmers accumulated 10 All-American finishes, a ninth place team finish, a ninth place all-around individual effort from Dedekind, and the school's first swimming national champion as Parry won the 200 Fly in a pool record time.

Gibb also had a successful season at the helm of the women's squad. The Lady Seminoles once again improved on their NCAA finish in 1997, jumping up four places to 30th in the nation. The women also took fourth place at both the Nike Sprint Classic and Husker Shootout and fifth at the Georgia Bulldog Invitational. Following a 5-5 dual meet record, the Lady Seminoles finished fourth at the ACC Championships. Their success included an

ACC meet record in the 200 Breast, an ACC championship in the 100 Breast from Samantha White, and two swimmers on the women's All-ACC team. Gibb also coached White and Anne Blachford to All-American status as well as an impressive showing from Helen Jepson at the NCAA Championships. Two Lady Seminole divers also advanced to the NCAA Preliminaries during the season.

Prior to becoming head coach for the Seminoles, Gibb spent one year as an assistant on the Seminoles' staff and was the top assistant for the University of Florida's men's program for five seasons.

Gibb, who graduated from the University of Florida in 1985 with a degree in psychology, swam for the Gators for two seasons (1981-1983). In 1982, he was the SEC champion in the 100 Free and was a finalist in the United States World University Games Trials in the 100 Free. A year later, he swam on the NCAA champion 400 Free Relay for the Gators and also added a seventh place finish in the 100 Free at the NCAA Championships.

Gibb and his wife of 12 years, Gena, a 1994 graduate of the Florida State School of Nursing, have two daughters, Sarah (7) and Emily (1).



GARY COLE

Florida State diving has been very successful under the guidance of Gary Cole who, in the past 15 years, has produced some of the best divers in the nation.

A member of the Professional Diving Coaches Association and NCAA Diving Rules Committee, Cole has coached four collegiate All-Americans as well as two World Age Champions. In 1988, Cole was named the Olympic coach for the host country of South Korea.



In the 1994 season, Cole was named ACC Women's Diving Coach of the Year. This was his fifth coach of the year honor since arriving to Florida State. He also has the distinction of winning the ACC team title without having a champion.

A 1975 graduate of Bowling Green, Cole was a standout diver in college and high school. He was tutored by eight-time Olympic coach Ron O'Brien. In his free time, Cole is an avid golfer and his biggest fans are his wife Vicki and daughters Angela (5) and Savannah (2).

CASHEL MACK

Cashel Mack begins her second year as assistant coach with Florida State's swimming program. Mack continues her responsibilities with both the women's and men's squads, but her primary duties will be with the women's team. Mack will handle administrative duties for the swimming program including assisting with recruiting, planning the travel itineraries, overseeing the academic support, and supervising strength training and conditioning. During the 1996-97 season, she helped guide the women's team to a 6-6 record and a 30th finish in the nation.



Mack came to FSU after serving as the head age group coach for Clearwater Aquatics in Clearwater, Fla, since August of 1993. She was nominated the 1996 Florida Age Group Coach of the Year. Prior to her head coaching position in Clearwater, Mack served as graduate assistant coach at her alma mater Drury College in 1993. She helped the 1993 Drury team to a NAIA Championship.

While a student-athlete at Drury, Mack swam the sprint freestyle and butterfly events. She was named Most Valuable Swimmer in 1989 and 1990 and was captain of Drury's first NAIA Championship women's team in 1992.

Mack graduated in 1992 with a degree in elementary education.

ANDY ROBINS

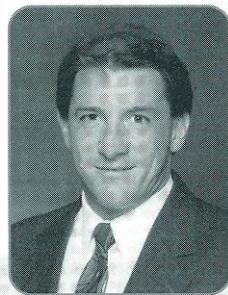
*ASSISTANT COACH

Robins currently serves on the Florida Swimming Board of Directors and House

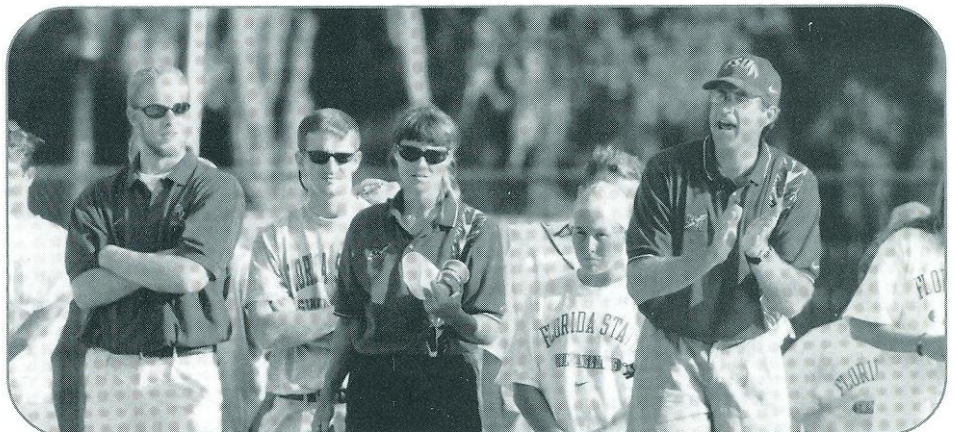


of Delegates, which he has been a member of since 1987.

Academics

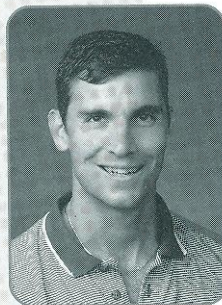
Academic, personal and professional support are essential to college success. At Florida State University, we have developed an outstanding support program which enables student-athletes to reach their full potential.

Strength Training & Conditioning

Strength training and conditioning is an important part of an athlete's performance in the pool and on the boards. At

Florida State, a supervised program is developed for swimming and diving, emphasizing the objectives of not building bodies, but strengthening and conditioning them. Women's strength coach **Joe Beckham** and men's strength coach **Russ Barbarino**, customize programs for each of the athletes beginning with pre-conditioning before the season gets underway.

Beckham and Barbarino work with the swimmers and divers in sport specific training which includes conditioning the major muscle groups used in swimming and diving. FSU takes pride in customizing the programs to help student-athletes reach their maximum potential.

Prevention Care & Treatment

Being an athlete at Florida State University means receiving the best care and treatment possible. All of the student-athletes undergo pre-season screening so a certified trainer can detect any potential injuries an athlete may incur. If a problem is detected, the athlete is placed on a prevention care program which may include any kind of treatment from icing to exercising. The program is closely monitored by swimming trainers **Cherish Buturla** for the women and **Terrance Jackson** for the men.

Rehabilitation is another important component of the Seminole training room. Though preventing injuries is the main objective, they are unavoidable for the athletes who participate in sports. More serious injuries and illnesses are referred to the Seminole team physicians at the Tallahassee Orthopedic Center who, for many years, have worked in conjunction with the FSU training room in successfully rehabilitating numerous athletes after an injury.

1996-97 Women's Review

With improvements at the regional and national level, the Lady Seminole swimming and diving team made great strides in 1996-97 to make the season a successful one. Following a 5-5 regular season, the Florida State women produced a strong showing at the ACC Championships and a 30th place effort at the NCAA Championships, up from 34th the previous season. Freshman Anne Blachford and sophomore Samantha White led the squad to its 4th place finish at the ACCs to earn All-ACC individual honors. Blachford, White, and senior second team All-American Helen Jepson propelled FSU to a 30th place performance at the NCAA Championships in Indianapolis.

The Lady Seminoles opened the fall season with a split in a tri-meet at Miami. The team defeated Florida Atlantic but fell in a close meet to then-#25 Miami 111-132. Florida State rebounded with victories over FAMU and Georgia Southern at home, a 5th place finish at the University of Georgia Invitational, and a 199-115 win over conference rival NC State. The women brought home a 4th place finish at the Nike Sprint Classic and the Husker Shootout before a tough loss at home to #7 Florida. The fall



season rounded out with a split in a meet in Charlottesville, Virginia, as FSU fell to Virginia early but came back with an impressive victory over Villanova.

A pair of Top 20 teams awaited Florida State at the start of the spring season. The Lady Seminoles fell to a talented #11 Auburn squad and were narrowly-defeated by #18 LSU 121-122 to finish the dual meet season at 5-5. At the ACC Championships in Chapel Hill, the women posted several top finishes to take 4th overall behind Clemson, North Carolina, and Virginia. The breaststrokes were the strength during day two of the conference meet leading the women to their 4th place position. White won the 100 Breast and Blachford

finished 3rd in same event. The duo also finished 2nd and 3rd respectively in the 200 Breast. Henderson grabbed 5th in 3-meter diving with teammate freshman Marya Sabesky and senior Erin Gilooly taking 7th and 8th, respectively. Blachford and White's performances placed them on the All-ACC team.

In the NCAA Zone B Regional Diving Championships, Henderson and Sabesky missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships but put out tremendous efforts. Henderson took 7th on the 10-meter platform, 16th on the 3-meter, and 19th on the 1-meter event. Sabesky finished 28th on the 3-meter.

All-ACC performers White and Blachford were joined Jepson in Indianapolis to represent Florida State at the NCAA Championships. White finished 9th and Blachford 23rd in the 100 Breast. Blachford also took 13th in the 200 Individual Medley. Jepson ended her collegiate career with a 36th place effort in the 100 Butterfly. The trio's performance earned the Lady Seminoles its 30th place finish in the national meet, the best ever during Coach Don Gibb's tenure at Florida State.

1996-97 Men's Review

An undefeated regular season, a second place finish at the ACC Championships, a ninth place effort at the NCAA Championships, and the first national champion swimmer in program history marked a record year for the Florida State men's swimming and diving team. Seminole swimmers earned ACC Swimmer of the Year honors and 11 All-American finishes in 1996-97.

The #18-ranked men's squad completed its fall season with a perfect 9-0 record, beginning with a big road victory over the #14-ranked Miami Hurricanes. FSU added a victory over Florida Atlantic for its first two wins of the season. Wins over FAMU, Georgia Southern, and Georgia Tech at home improved the Seminoles' record to 5-0 before a second place finish at the Georgia Bulldog Invitational. Following a close 165-152 win over #25 NC State in Raleigh, FSU took second at the Nike Sprint Classic and Husker

Shootout in Lincoln, Nebraska. FSU returned home to record an impressive victory over #12 Florida and concluded with road wins over Virginia and Villanova.

FSU's outstanding start was sparked by the return of 1996 Olympians Rob Braknis and Brendon Dedekind. Seniors Eduardo Coelho, Corey Geraghty, and Chip Haberstroh and sophomores Stephen Parry and Matt McVittie also played key roles in the Seminoles' success.

A victory over #13 LSU to begin the spring season gave Florida State its 10th victory of the year and Coach Don Gibb his 25th as head coach of the Seminoles. The triumph in the final dual meet of the season also put FSU at a perfect 10-0 for the regular season, the first undefeated season for the Tribe since 1965.

The Seminoles jumped to 13th in the national rankings prior to its second place finish at the ACC Championships in Chapel Hill. The team took over half of the first place finishes in the meet with 11 out of a possible 20. Seminole swimmers broke eight conference records and 10 ACC Championship meet records. With record times individually in the 50 and 100 Free and 100 Breast and as part of the 200 Free, 400 Free, and 400 Medley Relay teams, Dedekind earned MVP honors.

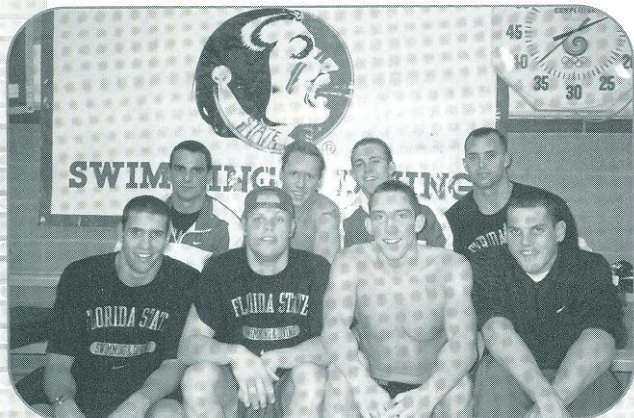
For the year, seven FSU swimmers were named to the All-ACC team with

Dedekind and Parry garnering Co-Swimmer of the Year honors in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Senior Corey Geraghty represented Florida State at the NCAA Zone B Diving Championships. He finished just short of the NCAA Championship qualifying mark with a 15th place effort in the 1-meter and 17th place finish in the 3-meter.

The Seminoles wrote another chapter in FSU swimming history with a school-record ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships in Minneapolis. Eight team members competed in 10 individual events and five relays at the national meet. Dedekind became the first FSU swimmer to achieve three individual All-American finishes with top five finishes in the 50 Free, 100 Free and 100 Breast. He placed eighth overall, the best individual finish in Seminole history. All five relay teams scored points for the team with finishes of seventh in the 200 Free, 200 Medley, and 400 Medley, 11th in the 400 Free, and 16th in the 800 Free. The greatest achievement, however, came from Parry who brought home Florida State's first-ever national championship in swimming by winning the 200 Fly in a pool-record time of 1:44.28.

With its perfect 10-0 regular season record, a runner-up finish at the ACC Championships featuring eight meet records, a ninth place effort at the NCAA Championships including Dedekind's eighth place individual finish and Parry's national title, Florida State moved into the Top 10 of the final CSCAA national poll at number eight, tied with Miami, the team the Seminoles defeated to open the 1996-97 season and start its record run.

The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 45th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 59 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 27 in men's competition and 32 in women's.

1996-97 In Review

The 1996-97 academic year concluded with the league pocketing three more national titles and four individual NCAA crowns. The ACC's 1996-97 national champions were North Carolina in women's soccer and field hockey and Maryland in women's lacrosse. In addition, the ACC had two other teams participate in national championship title games — Florida State in football and Maryland in men's lacrosse. Overall, the ACC posted a 54-48 (.529) mark in NCAA tournament play.

The ACC placed at least one team in the Top 10 nationally in 16 of the 24 sports sponsored by the league. Other records of note during the 1996-97 season include 84 teams competing at NCAA Championships, four bowl teams and 33 Top 10 showings.

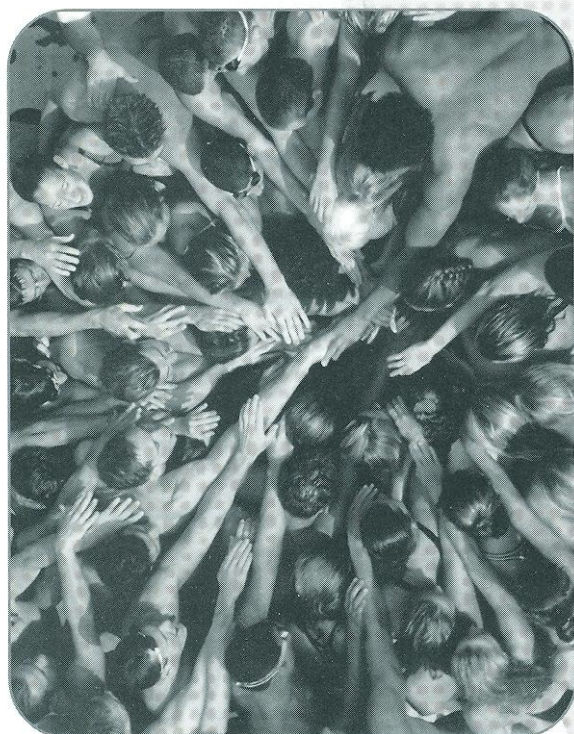
Seven ACC teams, in six different sports representing five of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the past academic year.

The History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, near Greensboro, N.C. with seven charter members - Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again and officially admitted the University of Virginia. The only withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971 when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.

The conference operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when Georgia Tech was added. The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State.

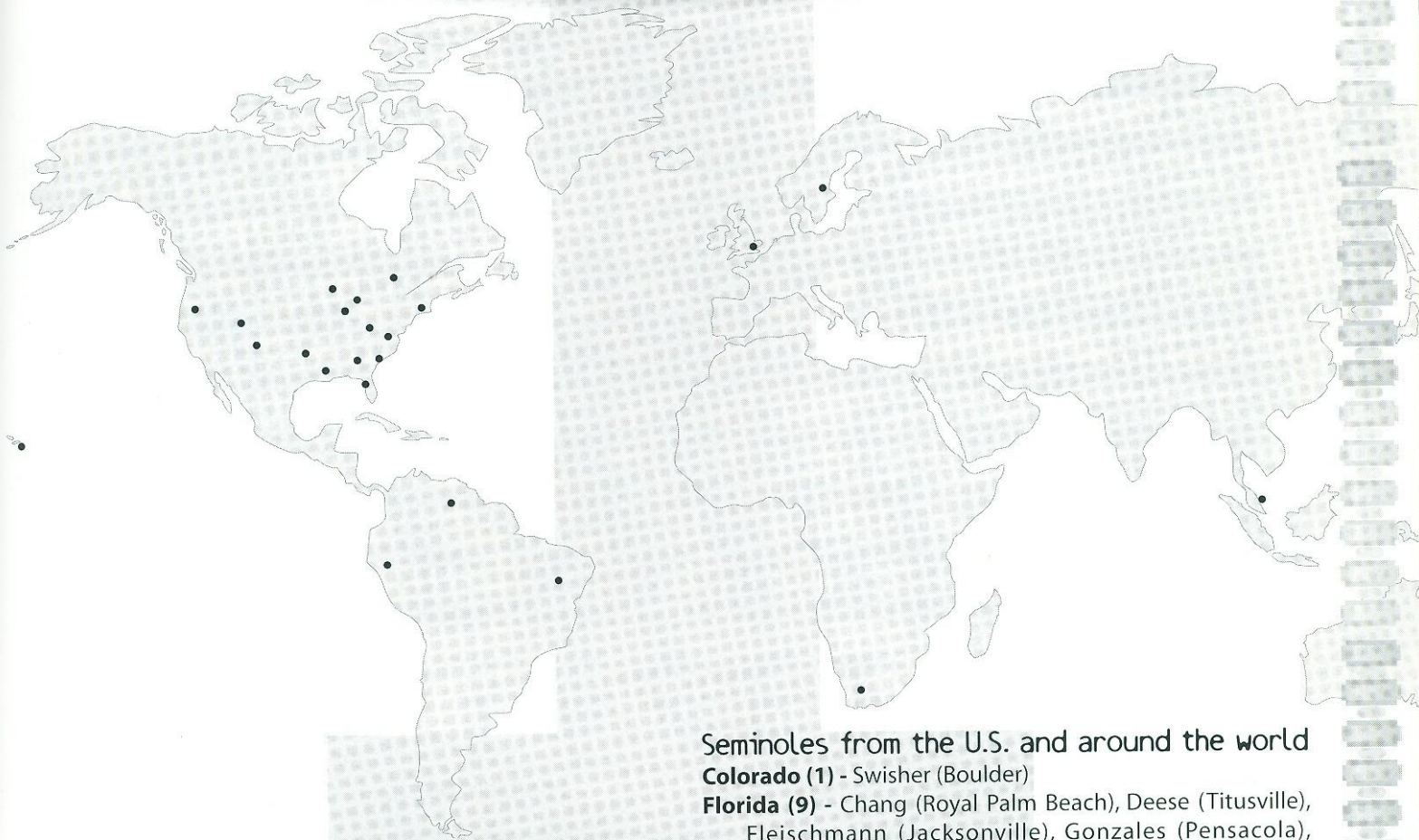

NCAA Information

The following information is provided by the Florida State Office of Compliance for prospective student athletes. It is intended as a guideline to introduce some of the rules governing NCAA athletic involvement.

Who is permitted to recruit for FSU?

Only Florida State University coaches who have successfully completed the NCAA Recruiting Rules Examination on an annual basis may be involved in the recruitment process. Representatives of our athletics interests **may not** make any recruiting contacts. This includes letters, telephone calls or face-to-face contact on or off campus with a prospect or the prospect's parents.

Key terms you should know

You become a **prospective student-athlete** if you have started classes for the ninth grade. Before the ninth grade, you become a prospective student-athlete if the college provides you (or your relatives or friends) any financial aid or other benefits that the college does not provide to prospective students generally.

A **contact** is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletic representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of greeting. **NOTE:** At the Division I level, athletic representatives (boosters) may not contact you for the purpose of recruiting. A college coach may contact you in person off the college campus beginning July 1 after completion of your junior year in high school.

An **evaluation** is any off-campus activity designed to access your academic qualifications or athletic ability, including any visit to your high school (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of any practice or competition in which you participate.

During your senior year, you can have one expense-paid **official visit** to a particular campus. You may receive no more than five visits. During your official visit, which may not exceed 48 hours, you may receive round-trip transportation between your home and the campus, and you (and your parents) may receive meals, lodging and complimentary admission to campus athletics events.

Phone calls and Letters

Phone calls from faculty members and coaches (but not boosters) are permitted beginning July 1 (August 15 for football) after completion of your junior year. A college coach or

faculty member is limited to **one telephone call per week** except when it is:

- During the five days immediately before your official visit to the university
- On the day of a coach's off-campus contact with you
- During the time beginning with the initial National Letter of Intent signing date in your sport through the two days after signing date

• In the sport of football only, during the permissible off-campus contact periods and during the 48 hours prior to and 48 hours after 8:00 a.m. on the initial signing date for the National Letter of Intent.

Letters from coaches and faculty members (but not boosters) are not permitted until September 1 at the beginning of your junior year in high school. A Division I university may provide you with the following printed materials:

- General correspondence, including letters, U.S. Postal Service postcards and institutional note cards
- Game programs which may not include posters and one Student Athlete Handbook can be provided only during official or unofficial visits to the university's campus
- NCAA educational information
- Pre-enrollment information subsequent to signing a National Letter of Intent with the university
- One athletic publication which may include only one color of printing inside the covers
- Official academic, admissions and student services publications published or videotapes produced by the institution and available to all students

• Schedule cards

• Questionnaires which may be provided prior to your junior year

• Summer camp brochures which may be provided prior to your junior year.

Alumni and Boosters Do's and Don'ts

You may forward information about prospective student-athletes to the appropriate coaches.

You may have contact with a prospect regarding permissible pre-enrollment activities such as summer employment, provided the prospect has already signed a National Letter of Intent and the Compliance Office is aware that you are making these contacts in regard to employment.

You may have a telephone conversation with a prospect **only** if the prospect initiates the call. Such a call may not be prearranged by an institutional staff member and you are not permitted to have a recruiting conversation, but may exhibit normal civility. You must refer any questions about our athletics programs to an athletics department staff member/coach.

You may view a prospect's contest at your own initiative provided you do not contact the prospect or his/her parents. In addition, you may not contact a prospect's coach, principal, or counselor in an attempt to evaluate the prospect.

You may continue established family relationships with friends and neighbors. Contacts with sons and daughters of these families are permitted as long as they are not made for recruiting purposes or encouraged by Florida State University coaches.

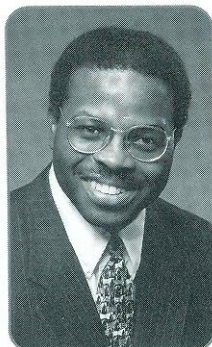
You may not become involved in making arrangements to receive money or financial aid of any kind for a prospect or the prospect's family and friends.

You may not make contact with a prospective student-athlete and his/her parents when the prospect is on campus for an official or unofficial recruiting visit.

You may not transport, pay or arrange for payment of transportation costs for a prospect, and his/her relatives or friends to visit campus (or elsewhere).

You may not pay or arrange for payment of summer camp registration fees for a prospect.

You may not provide **anything** to a prospect, the prospect's family or friends without prior approval from the athletics' Compliance Office.

A National Champion

Since its inception in 1949, the Florida State men's swimming and diving program has had 19 men and 8 relay teams earn the distinction of All-American. In 1961, Curt Genders won FSU's first diving NCAA title on the one and three meter springboards. And now, 36 years later, Seminole swimmer Stephen Parry has again made history for the program, bringing home FSU's first individual swimming NCAA championship.

Parry, now a junior, trained in crowded pools and limited facilities in Liverpool, Great Britain, but from that setting came great accomplishments. He was the 1994 Junior European Champion and the 1995 England National Champion in the 200 Fly. When Parry came to FSU, he brought with him his greatest ambition — to make the Olympic finals. Parry chased that dream competing to qualify for the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta. He finished second at the British Olympic Trials but did not reach Great Britain qualifying times.

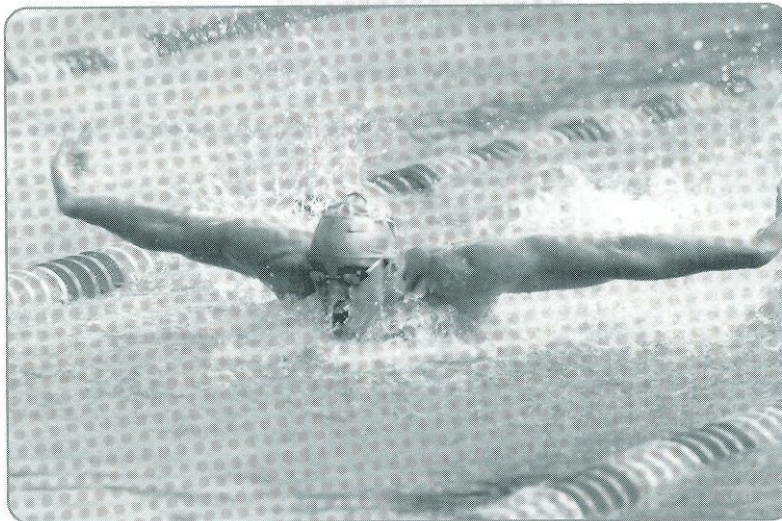
"I was disappointed," Parry said. "The Olympics has been a goal for me for a long time. I just didn't swim as well as I could have."

"Stephen supported Rob (Braknis) and Brendon (Dedekind) at the Olympics but I think watching his teammates swim in Atlanta really hit home for him," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "He knew he should be at the Olympics and realized he had to work that much harder to make it. Juggling school, swimming and a personal life was a challenge and he realized he would have to prioritize."

Parry found his first year at FSU to be a challenge, having to adjust to a new training program, a new school, and new country all together. But it was after the British Trials that he knew he had to change something. He returned to FSU with a new ambition — a team victory at the Atlantic Coast

Conference Championships and a top five finish in the NCAA. He took advantage of the training facilities and started working harder and longer.

"Coming from Liverpool, the training facilities



were completely different," Parry said. "It took the summer of '96 for me to realize what I had available to me."

All his hard work and dedication paid off for Parry. He improved his times throughout the season, but saw the biggest improvements at the ACC Championships. Going into the championships, Parry was ranked first in the 200 Fly and he did not disappoint. Not only did he win the event, but he set an ACC record in the process. He went on to win the 200 Free and was on the 200 and 400 Medley Relay Champion teams, leading to Co-Swimmer of the Year honors in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

At the NCAA championship meet in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Parry and his teammates achieved several honors. Dedekind became the first FSU swimmer to achieve three All-America finishes and all five Seminole relay teams scored for the Seminoles. But perhaps the greatest accomplishment came on the night of March 29th when Parry, who was seeded first in the 200 Fly going into the finals, won the first national championship for swimming in FSU history. His pool record

time of 1:44.28 won him the title and helped him restore some confidence.

"I wasn't really thinking about it (the championship) at the time," Parry said. "Going into the race seeded first, there was some pressure but I wasn't expecting to win. It was more of a shock than anything else. I just swam the race the way coach planned it out. It really didn't hit me until I got back to Tallahassee that I had won a national championship. And it wasn't even until this summer that I realized I'm as good as the best swimmers in the nation."

Parry continued to compete internationally this summer, representing England in the European Championships and winning a Bronze Medal in the 200 Fly. He next competed in the World University Games in the 200 Fly and finished fifth overall.

"The Europeans were exciting," Parry said. "I was representing my country and was pleased with finishing third. I was just excited to be there. As for the World University Games, it wasn't my best swim but swimming against the best swimmers in the world made me realize I am among the best."

Much to the pleasure of Florida State and Coach Gibb, Parry has two more years to compete for the Seminoles. After a summer of international competition, he has set his sights on training for another year of collegiate swimming, but the Olympic experience still sits in the back of his mind.

"Stephen Parry has just scratched the surface," Gibb said. "The national championships and this summer have proved to him he is on of the best in the country and the world. He's England's number one swimmer right now. He learned how to prioritize this summer realizing he's one of the best because of his dedication and hard work. The 2000 Olympics are a realistic goal for him."
