Frank Bradley enters his first season as head coach of the Florida State swimming and diving program.

Prior to his hiring at FSU, Bradley was the associate head coach at Auburn University for three seasons where he primarily instructed the distance and individual medley group.

In 2013, Bradley coached junior Zane Grothe to an SEC title in the 1650 freethe Tigers' second-ever mile champion in school history. Under Bradley's instruction, Grothe set new Auburn records in the 500, 1000 and 1650 free events during his freshman year and has lowered each mark since.

Bradley helped Auburn finish among the Top 15 nationally over the last three years. The men's team placed sixth in both 2011 and 2012 before taking eighth at the 2013 NCAA Championships, while the women's squad finished seventh in 2011, eighth in 2012 and 13th in 2013.

Auburn won the SEC men's championship in 2011 and 2012 and totaled 181 All-American honors during his three seasons.

Prior to joining the Auburn staff in 2010, Bradley spent five years coaching at Indian River State College, four of which he served as head coach. During his time at the helm of the NJCAA powerhouse, Bradley's studentathletes turned in 177 NJCAA national titles, 45 NJCAA national records and 53 school records, while 13 athletes garnered Swimmer of the Year accolades. In 2010, Bradley guided the men's team to their 36th straight na-

tional title while the women captured their 29th consecutive championship.

While at IRSC, Bradley worked with former Seminole All-American Mateo De Angulo. De Angulo is the current FSU record holder in the 1000 free and 1650 free and was the 2012 ACC Swimmer of the Year. The Cali, Colombia native still owns the NJCAA national record in the 500 free, a mark which was earned while under the instruction of Bradley. De Angulo moved on to collect nine NJCAA national titles before transferring to FSU.

In just five years, Bradley was named the NJCAA Coach of the Year four times (Men- 2007, 2008; Women-2009, 2010).

Bradley started out as an assistant at the University of South Carolina during 1999-2005. While with the Gamecocks, Bradley worked with 2000 SEC Swimmer of the Year, Zsolt Gaspar in addition to guiding the Gamecocks to 26 All-American honors, 34 school records and three SEC individual titles.

Throughout his coaching career, Bradley has instructed several Olympians including Gideon Louw (RSA), Arianna Vanderpool-Wallace(BAH), Micah Lawrence (USA) as well as De Angulo (COL).

Bradley returns to his alma mater after a 13-year absence from Tallahassee. While a Seminole, Bradley earned his Bachelor's Degree in social science in 1997 before serving as a graduate assistant for the team from 1997-1999. During his swimming career, Bradley was the 1995 ACC Champion in the 200 IM.

A native of Woodbury, N.J., Bradley is married to the former Susan Hawks - a volleyball standout for FSU from 1995-1998 where she was a four-year letter winner and an All-ACC selection in 1997. Hawks brought home the

school's first-ever ACC Championship in 1998. They have two daughters, Grace and Paige.









Entering his 18th season with Florida State, assistant coach Andy Robins continues to produce some of the top athletes in the ACC and the NCAA.

Since 2001 when Robins took over the sprint group, FSU has won 13 ACC titles in the 50 and 100 freestyle events and 13 gold medals in the 200 and 400 freestyle relays.

Robins' produced another championship season, as his group claimed ten medals at the 2013 ACC Championships before moving on to grab three All-America honorable mention accolades. Tiffany Oliver won gold in both the 50 and 100 free, while Kaitlyn Dressel won her first ACC bronze in the 100 free. Both Oliver and Dressel contributed to silvers in the 200 and 400 free relay in addition to setting new FSU records.

Oliver owns the 50 (22.17) and 100 (48.19) free records, while Dressel took down the 200 free (1:46.26) mark.

In the men's events, Paul Murray, Trice Bailey, David Sanders and Mark Weber added more hardware to their shelves, as the four took gold in the 200 free relay at the ACC Championships, the four posted a mark of 1:16.76 at the Georgia Tech Invite, setting new school and ACC records en route to setting one of the fastest times in the country.

Weber and Murray went on to claim individual gold medals at ACC's in the 50 and 100 free.

In 2012, the men's sprint relays highlighted the season by garnering a plethora of accolades during the post season. The team of Murray, Bailey, Sanders and Weber captured their first

All-America honors in the 400 free relay with a seventh place finish.

Robins guided those same four at the 2012 ACC where they started the competition with a new meet, school and Christiansburg Aquatic Center record in the 200 free relay with a time of 1:17.73 en route to a first place finish. They would finish ninth in the event at the NCAA Championships, capturing All-America honorable mention honors. The same four added another ACC gold in the 400 free relay.

Under Robins, Oliver became the first FSU female to break the 49 second mark in the 100 free as she turned in a time of 48.93 en route to an NCAA appearance.

In 2009, Robins' group earned Honorable Mention All-American status in the men's 400 free relay at the 2009 NCAA Championships and Jarryd Botha ended his storied career as a Seminole with a pair of All-ACC honors in the 100 free and 100 fly.

Robins helped add a new chapter to FSU's illustrious sprinting history in 2008. Under the coaching of Robins' junior Scott Baker had a career year culminating with All-America honors in the 50 free at the NCAA Championships. Robins' also helped lead senior Lauren Sparg to her first career individual honorable mention All-America honors with her 11th place finish in the 100 fly. Sparg was also the ACC Champion in the 100 fly and still holds the school record in the event.

In 2007, five Seminoles qualified for the NCAA Championships in sprint events.

While first taking over the spirnt group, Robins helped Christy Cech to back-to-back (2001-02) All-America awards in the 50 freestyle.

Prior to 2000, Robins worked primarily with the stroke disciplines and individual medley specialists. He most notably worked with Stephan Parry, an NCAA Finalist, as well as a 2004 Olympic bronze

medalist. During that time Robins also coached Seminole All-Americans Anne Blachford, Keam Ang and Nelson Mora.

Even prior to his graduation from college, Robins had been actively involved in coaching and his involvement with local swimming and diving dates back more than 20 years. His association with swimming in the Big Bend began in 1985 when he took a position with the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club. Robins took over the head coaching duties for ATAC in 1993 and led the squad to a top ten finish at the 1996 Junior National Championships.

In conjunction with his work with ATAC, Robins served as the head coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee from 1986-91. After only his second year on the job he was named High School Coach of the Year by the Tallahassee Democrat.

Robins also served as head coach for the Florida All-Star Team in 1990 and 1991 after spending the previous two seasons as an assistant coach. Away from the pool Robins served on the Florida Swimming Board of Directors, the House of Delegates and the Technical Planning Committee from 1987-98.

A 1983 graduate of The College of William & Mary with a bachelor's in psychology, he earned his master's in science education from Florida State in 1987. While in college, Robins swam both the backstroke and distance freestyle events. His swimming accomplishments at William & Mary include setting the school record in the 1650 freestyle while also serving as co-captain.

Robins and his wife Karen have three daughters and one son, Beth, Kurt, Jenna, and Annemarie.

To mold a championship diver it takes a true champion, and Florida State's Patrick Jeffrey certainly fits that bill. A three-time NCAA Champion and two-time Olympian, Jeffrey was inducted into the Ohio State University Athletics Hall of Fame in 2005. Entering his 15th year in Tallahassee, his experience has helped Florida State divers re-write the ACC and Seminole record books year after year while maintaining one of the strongest diving programs in the country. In fact, Jeffrey has coached at least one diver to an All-American honor in 11 of his 14 years while at the helm of Seminole diving.

In 2013, Tom Neubacher became the sixth Seminole in FSU history to garner All-America accolades on the 1-meter, as he placed seventh in the event at the NCAA Championships. He closed his meet with a 13th place on Platform, netting honorable mention accolades. Kelsey Goodman qualified for her first-career NCAA Championships, while Ariel Rittenhouse took home her first

ACC crown in the 3-meter.

After the collegiate season, Jeffrey led Katrina Young to a fifth place finish at the 2013 World Championship Trials on Platform, qualifying her for the World University Games in Kazan, Russia. The Shoreline, Wash. native took sixth on platform with Jeffrey by her side as Team USA's head coach, contributing to a silver medal in the Team Classification.

At the 2012 ACC Championships, all eight divers competed in at least one championship final with a team of four ladies and four men. Jeffrey coached six of those eight to All-ACC performances including an ACC Champion in Young. Young became the first-ever female platform ACC Champion for the Seminoles since the event was added back in 2008. She went on to qualify for the NCAA Championships, where she turned in a fourth place finish on the platform claiming All-America honors. Her fourth place showing tied the highest individual finish by a female Florida State swimmer or diver at the NCAA event.

As a team Jeffrey's divers displayed dominance at the 2012 ACC Championships with all eight members qualifying for a championship final. He guided three men to the finals in both springboard events, before placing

four in the final on the platform. For the ladies, three dove in the championship on 1-meter, while two competed in the finals of 3-meter.

Young wasn't the only diver in the spotlight during the 2011-2012 season. Rittenhouse grabbed the silver medal on the women's 1-meter springboard at ACC's before she qualified for NCAA's. Goodman improved from her freshman season as she took third on the women's 3-meter springboard. Nick Klein and Ford McLiney also took home All-ACC honors.

Prior to the 2011-12 season, Jeffrey coached a number of Seminole gems including Terry Horner and Landon Marzullo. Horner is the most decorated diver in Florida State history with six All-America performances including one NCAA Championship showing back in 2007. Horner is also a three-time ACC Champion. In 2011 Marzullo finished out his career as a Seminole with an All-America performance on the 3-meter springboard.

In addition to Young and Horner, Jeffrey has also coached six other ACC Champions. Josh Edelman, Louis Gagnet, Dan Friebel, Chelsie Lerew Courtney McClow, Tiffany Manning, Brittany Lerew, Young, Rittenhouse and Horner have earned the Seminoles 21 gold medals in the diving events in 14 years.

Jeffrey has helped usher in a new era in international competition for the Garnet and Gold with Horner earning a place on the 2009 World Championship team. Horner earned a 16th place finish in the one-meter second in the one-meter at the USA Diving National Championships later in the summer of 2009 and seventh in the three-meter. Maruzullo would follow those footsteps two years later in 2011 by representing the U.S. at the World University Games. In 2010, the men's team took the team championship at the U.S. Winter Nationals.

The 2008 season was business as usual for Florida State divers with three All-American performances, four All-ACC results and two ACC Championships. On the men's side Jeffrey's four divers earned 10 top-eight finishes at the ACC Championships led by a pair of victories by Horner (one-meter, three-meter) and a pair of second place finishes by Frebel (three-meter, platform). The women also contributed at the ACC Championships with the team's four divers earning points in 11 out-of 12 opportunities.

An NCAA Division I Champion himself, Jeffrey can now say he's coached one with Terry Horner's victory in 2007 on the one-meter hoard.

Since Jeffrey's arrival in 1999, he's not only put Florida State Diving on the map, he's set the standard for diving in the entire conference. Seminole divers have captured 21 of the 83 ACC championships on the boards during Jeffrey's tenure. Under his guidance Florida State has claimed at least one conference title on the men's side in seven of the past 12 seasons and the school's four-straight championships on the one-meter and three more in the three-meter have not been equaled in nearly 20 years.

Florida State divers have claimed four Women's ACC Diver of the Meet awards, three Men's ACC Diver of the Meet honors as well as a Women's ACC Swimming & Diving Rookie of the Year accolade.

The only records not owned by Jeffrey's divers are from All-Americans Paul Spray and Wendy Fuller which will stand forever because of event format changes.

Jeffrey's coaching accolades also stretch internationally. He was among the staff at the 2009 World Championships in Rome, Italy where he coached Horner. In 2007 Jeffrey was a member of the United States World University Games staff where he coached two of his own student-athletes, Horner and Frebel. He was on the 2000 U.S. Olympic team coaching staff along with the 1997 and 1999 US Senior World Cup staffs. He also coached the 2001 U.S. World Championship team in Fukioka, Japan. He has served as a Senior National team coach from 1997-2000 with a one year stint (1998) with the Junior National Team. Under Jeffrey's tutelage, divers have won five U.S. Senior National titles, three Junior National championships, and a pair of third place finishes for the Senior Men's team in U.S. national competition.

Jeffrey's wealth of diving knowledge is a direct result of his own career. A seven-time All-American, he highlighted his tenure at Ohio State with a tremendous senior season in 1988. He became the first, and still only, diver in NCAA history to sweep all three diving events with championships on the onemeter, three-meter and platform, earning him 1988 NCAA Diver of the Year. Leading up to those NCAA Championships, he swept the Big Ten Conference meet as well and was honored with 1988 Big Ten Diver of the Year.

On the international scene, Jeffrey was a finalist on the ten-meter platform at the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, South Korea and the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. He is a five-time U.S. National Diving Champion splitting those championships between disciplines with three in the ten-meter platform event while holding a pair of titles in the three-meter springboard event. He was also the U.S. Olympic Trials Champion on platform in 1996. In addition, he won bronze medals at the 1991 and 1995 Pan-Am games. He competed as a member of the U.S. 1989 and 1995 World Cup teams as well as the 1993 Goodwill Games Team.

Most importantly, Jeffrey has drawn from all his experiences on the boards and as a coach to structure a program that is designed to develop up and coming athletes into national and world level contenders. He takes from the knowledge that he obtained in his 20 years as an athlete and the subsequent 15 years at the world and national levels.

While a Seminole from 1995-99, McVittie was known as the ultimate relay swimmer, contributing six ACC titles and 10 All-America honors during his career, guiding FSU to its highest team finish in 1997 at the NCAA Championships (Ninth).

In addition to his relay excellence, McVittie earned his highest finish at the ACC Championships in 1999, where he took silver in the 100 free.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Communications, McVittie ran the Kamehameha Swim Club in Honolulu, Hawaii for three years as one of the head coaches. The club claimed three-consecutive state titles under McVittie with swimmers ranging from age

group speed all the way up to senior national finalists

Following his time in Hawaii, McVittie followed his former FSU head coach Don Gibb to the University of South Carolina, where he served as an assistant from 2003-2007.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities at South Carolina, McVittie maneuvered administration tasks, such as maintaining the budget, implementing communication strategies and providing logistical support on top of serving as the academic liaison to the athletic advisors.

McVittie guided a total of 14 Gamecocks to All-America honors, highlighted by an 11th place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2004.

He was also valued for his recruiting skills, where he helped South Carolina sign the ninth best recruiting class in the country for the 2007-2008 season.

A native of Chelsea, Mich., McVittie is engaged to Lindsey Williams. The couple have an infant daughter named Ashlyn Mae.

Tori Richmond returns to Florida State to serve as a first-year Interim Assistant Coach.

Richmond swam for the Seminoles for two seasons, joining the team in January of 2011 from Tennessee. Richmond instantly made an impact, breaking the school record at the 2011 ACC Championships with a fourth place finish in the 200 IM with a time of 1:59.04.

The Palm City, Fla. native served the 2011-2012 season as the team captain, where she led the Seminoles to a third place showing at the ACC Championships in 2012. Richmond was named to the All-ACC Academic Team and was awarded the Coaches' Award in 2012.

Richmond also participated in the Coach for College program in the summer of 2011.

In addition to her duties with the Seminoles, Richmond also coaches various ages and levels of Club Seminole, including the newly found U.S. Maters Program.

Richmond graduated from FSU in the fall of 2012 with a degree in Finance and Management of Information Systems.



# Amy Cozad Diving Assistant Coach 1st Year - Indiana '13

Amy Cozad joins the Florida State swimming and diving program as a first-year assistant diving coach.

Cozad capped off her four-year diving career at Indiana with her first-ever Big Ten title in 2013 as she won the platform crown with a Big Ten record score of 390.05. During her four years, Cozad had four top-eight finishes at the Big Ten meet, including all three events in 2013. Cozad is a four-time NCAA All-American, including third-place finishes on the platform in 2012 and 2013.

During her career Cozad has also competed internationally, as she recently represented the United States at the FINA World Championships in Barcelona, Spain. She was 14th on platform. Cozad also competed donned the red, white and blue at the 2012 FINA World Cup and the 2011 World University Games.

Domestically, Cozad finished third on the platform at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials and won the synchronized platform competition at the 2010 USA Diving National Championships. Cozad is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

Cozad has coached at various diving camps hosted at Indiana University.

A native of Indianapolis, Ind., Cozad majored in mathematics and graduated from Indiana in 2013.

## 2013-2014 Women's Swimming and Diving Outlook

Despite the levels of talent on the Florida State women's swimming and diving team, the theme for the year will be 'Massive Development' according to first-year head coach Frank Bradley.

"Massive development is something that we will push over and over," Bradley said. "Especially with the women's team, there is tremendous upside and talent and I think we can really improve into something special."

The Seminoles will return four of their NCAA qualifiers from a season ago in seniors Tiffany Oliver and Kelsey Goodman along with junior Kaitlyn Dressel and sophomore Madison Jacobi. Seniors Ariel Rittenhouse and Julia Henkel as well as redshirt junior Katrina Young return as NCAA qualifiers from the 2011-12 season.

#### Freestyle

Last season, the dynamic duo of Oliver and Dressel leaned on each other for support and motivation in addition to their speed. They added to the Seminole relays and turned in one of the most successful seasons for FSU sprinting, setting six new school records while grabbing three ACC medals and three AII-America honorable mentions at the NCAA Championships.

Dressel had a breakout year, especially in the 200 free, where she set the school record in the lead-off leg of the 800 free relay at the NCAA Championships, while two-time ACC Champion Oliver will look to defend her ACC titles in the 50 and 100 free from 2013.

"Having Kaitlyn and Tiffany coming back is huge," Bradley said. "I think there are a few people sitting in the chamber and if they adapt to workload and other changes I think the environment will be very fruitful for them. The potential for improvement is enormous, but as far as the leaders of that group, you're looking at Kaitlyn and Tiffany all the way up to the 200 free."

Hannah Wilson and Haley Powell Hicks all have tremendous upside and could be called upon in relay roles.

In the distance events, sophomore Madison Jacobi will look to build off her rookie season where she placed fourth in the 500 free and sixth in the 1650 at the ACC Championships before making an appearance at the NCAA Championships. In the final of the 500 free at ACC's, Jacobi dropped six-seconds off her best time in order to set a new FSU record at 4:41.85.

Sophomores Lauren Hine and Josie Cuda will contribute in distance as well.

"I think both Josie and Lauren have the ability to improve and I think both of them will absolutely do just that," Bradley stated.

As one of FSU's most versatile swimmers, Henkel will be utilized in the middle distance races in addition to her specialty, the 400 IM. Henkel swam the third leg in the school record-breaking 800 free relay at the ACC Championships in 2013, while claiming All-ACC honors with a third place finish in the 400 IM. She also scored points in both the 500 and 1650 free at the ACC Championships for the past two seasons.

#### Backstroke

The Seminoles are poised to have a solid backstroke group this season as three ladies have recorded times in the 100 back within a second of each other.

Sophomore Bianca Spinazzola (53.45) returns as the defending school record holder in the 100 back, breaking senior McKayla Lightbourn's previous mark (54.26). Spinazzola placed fourth at ACC's in the 100 back in addition to contributing on the medley relays. In addition to the trio of veterans, freshman Chelsea Britt could be in that mix as well.

"Lots of potential here," Bradley said. "That's a really good group of girls, all the way up through the 200. It gives us a lot of flexibility to move people around. This could prove to be a big part of championship season and I'm excited to watch this group."

#### Breaststroke

Breaststroke is another strong suit for the Seminoles, as sophomore Samantha Pochowski returns to improve on her sixth place finish in the 100 breast from the ACC Championships. Junior Laura Flewelling will be called upon to make moves in both races as she took sixth in the 200 distance and ninth in the 100 at the ACC Championships.

"They're talented ladies," Bradley said. "I've watched them train this summer and it has me pumped for the fall and spring. I think they're going to do well. Both Sami and Laura have tremendous ability to improve and Laura has just a powerful stroke and it's just about learning how to connect the 100 and 200. It's going to be great to see."

#### Butterfly

With ladies moving from different groups the butterfly races are tricky for the Seminoles due to the vastly different strategies of the 100 and 200 distances. Some ladies will be able to adapt to the underwater speed work required for the 100, while others will be fit to endure the 200.

Britt and Spinazzola will be key assets in the 100 along with Wilson, however the 200 distance could be shaken up a little bit. Mary Elizabeth King a 2012 U.S. Olympic Trial qualifier in the 200, will be used in both races, however Henkel could be seen more in the 200 fly throughout the year.

"Once again a talented group," Bradley stated. "They're going to develop, the question is going to be how much they can in six months. I think they will improve a ton and it's going to be a lot of fun to watch."

#### **Individual Medley**

The 400 IM will mostly contain Henkel. As the school record holder in the event, Henkel will look to get back to the NCAA Championships in her final season.

"I think it's her senior year and she's going to do great," Bradley said, "She had a great summer and she fit into the system right away."

In the 200 IM, Flewelling, Lightbourn and Pochowski did great things last season in the event. Both Flewelling and Lightbourn were under the 2-minute benchmark, while Pochowski fell a few seconds behind. Flewelling placed seventh in the event at the ACC Championships in 2013.

#### Diving

Florida State will continue to be a juggernaut on the boards this season. 2013 ACC Champion Ariel Rittenhouse returns for her final season, while senior Kelsev Goodman looks to continue to build off her success from last year. Goodman qualified for her first NCAA Championships before having an outstanding summer, reaching the finals at both the World Championship Trials and AT&T National Championships, After suffering an injury last season, Katrina Young comes back into the lineup after competing at the World University Games, placing sixth on Platform. Young also contributed towards Team USA's silver medal in the team classification. Between the three ladies, each qualified for at least one NCAA Championships throughout their careers in addition to competing on the national and international levels.

"Ariel, Kelsey and Katrina all have valuable experience at the ACC and NCAA levels," head diving coach Patrick Jeffrey said. "I think this is going to be a big year. They're all experienced veterans and I know we're going to

have a great year."





## 2013-2014 Men's Swimming and Diving Outlook

During the 2012-13 season, Florida State spent the entire year ranked within the top 20 in the country, however with the loss of three heavy contenders in the sprint event, first-year head coach Frank Bradley still thinks the Seminoles could be a factor when it's championship season.

#### Freestyle

With the departures of Mark Weber, Trice Bailey and David Sanders, the sprint group has a lot of ground to make up if they want to get back to the country's elite, however they aren't too far off that pace.

Returning for his final season with his All-American speed is ACC Champion Paul Murray.

"Paul's the leader of that group, that's for sure," Bradley said. "He's had a great summer. He adapted to the philosophy right away and he has tremendous upside. I think this is the year he could be utilized at his fullest potential."

Ian Apple, Jake Kingsford, Kevin Rogers and Tyler Fozkos could step into those relay roles, in addition to several freshmen. Pavel Sankovich could also be exercised on the free relays as well.

There are also a few newcomers that will be tossed into the hunt - JR Sims and Jason Mc-Cormick, both of which have been teammates and great friends through both club and high school swimming (Boca Raton), can contribute to relay depth.

Fresh off the World Championships, Jemal LeGrand will start his rookie season looking to race in sprint events as well. LeGrand was also an Olympian for Aruba in 2012.

"We've got some guys in here that can do some work, "Bradley said. "It's funny because I still remember when I swam, my relay team broke a record and the great thing about it was Sims and McCormick were on the team that took the mark down. It's cool. If you want to talk about the freshmen in general, it's a pretty tight class because they all know each other and I think that can be very powerful leadership down the road because of their bond up front.

"The distance group will be the land of opportunity this year. There are guys here with the talent, they're just going to have to make the adjustments in order to do what they need to do at the end of the year."

Leading that distance group is sophomore Derek Pridemore, who was the only freshman who made the ACC roster last season. Pridemore is also the lone returning distance swimmer from that team as well.

"The upside, potential and ability is there," Bradley said. "We have solid kids coming back but that will be a group that is focused on repetition. We could be three or four deep at conference if they can master the transition."

#### Breaststroke

Looking to carry the load for the Seminoles will be the breaststroke group. As the deepest group on the team seniors Jared Pike, Alex Rodriguez and Richie Hildebrand all will be looked upon for leadership in addition to their speed.

"This is such a cool group of guys," Bradley said. "The personalities are awesome. Pike, Rodriguez and Hildebrand all had an outstanding summer. It will be interesting to see how it plays out. I think if they put it all together, they could be a dangerous group. The competition is going to be awesome between these guys and the environment alone will elevate their performances because they'll be used to racing each other."

Junior Juan Sequera will be added in that mix at the 200 distance and newcomer Jason Coombs can make an impact as well.

#### Butterfly

Connor Knight returns for his junior year after turning heads with his improvements from a year ago. From the start of the 2012-13 season, every time Knight dove in the pool he consistently dropped time throughout the year in both the 100 and 200. This season he looks to climb the ladder with hopes of a NCAA berth after his fifth place finish in the 100 and ninth place showing in the 200 at the ACC Championships.

Adding to the fly will be Sankovich. With his arrival in January, Sankovich didn't swim much fly, however the Belarusian did post a good swim at the World Championships in the 100 fly this past summer in Barcelona.

"Connor had a great summer and really developed and Pavel has a lot of range and can do a ton for us," Bradley said.

Senior Max Mitchell and Kingsford have 100 speed and Sequera could be raced in the 200 distance too.

#### Backstroke

"I think this might be the group with the biggest potential for development we have on our team." Bradley said. "It could be huge. The kids really want it, they're putting in the work and I think from where they are right now, we can push them deep into that progression. They're a great bunch."

Sankovich's specialties are the backstroke events, especially on the sprint end. He returns as the defending ACC Champion in both the 100 and 200, in addition to leading off the 200 medley relay with a scorching 20.99 split that also won gold.

Junior Josh Friedel is a top-end performer, who qualified for the NCAA Championships last season in his specialty - the 200 back. Friedel's talents also led him to a 10th place finish at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials in Omaha, Neb.

"It's a top heavy group," Bradley said. "Josh and Pavel will lead this group and I know they can do big things, but others can improve and help out in these events as well."

Senior Cadell Lyons has been known to produce a solid 100, while junior Harrison Brogden can makes some moves in both races.

#### Individual Medley

As a natural individual medley swimmer, Sequera will lead the charge in both 200 and 400 races. Sequera headlines a very nice group along with Mike Thomas and Kyle Doxtater as well as a few others that could float in and out of the 200 IM (Friedel, Pike, Sankovich.)

"Where we are right now and what I saw out there this summer, I know this could be a good group," Bradley said. "It's a great group of guys that feed off each other really well and when you tie it in with the whole team, I like it. Their personalities mesh well, and they've adapted to our philosophy."

#### Diving

This season, the Seminoles are loaded with talent on the boards. All-American Tom Neubacher returns for his senior year, looking to continue to re-write the FSU history books. With his seventh place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2013, Neubacher became just the sixth Seminole to garner All-America accolades on 1-meter.

Classmate Mikey Lewark looks to get back to the NCAA Championships after just missing out on the field a season ago.

In addition to the pair of seniors, head diving coach Patrick Jeffrey brought in an outstanding freshmen class that includes a wealth of international diving experience. Dominic Giordano joins the squad after placing 11th on platform at the World Championship Trials. In addition to his platform specialty, Giordano was the 2013 PIAA State Champion on 1-meter, where he set the district and state records for Pennsylvania.

Hailing from Toronto, Dylan Grisell is an international competitor representing Canada for several junior competitions. Grisell was a 2012 Olympic Trial Qualifier.

"This year is going be unique," head diving coach Patrick Jeffrey said. "We have experienced upperclassmen with Mikey and Tom, but we also have a lot of young talent. Between those two elements, there is no way we aren't going to do well. It's a very exciting year. The tides are coming and going at the same time."



## THE MORCOM AQUATICS CENTER



In 2008 Florida State opened its new \$10.5 million Morcom Aquatic Center. The state-of-the-art facility is located off-campus next to the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course. The main pool features up to 30 practice lanes and maintains a temperature of 80 degrees. FSU will be swimming in the same pool that hosted the 2005 FINA World Championships in Montreal, Canada, During those World Championships nine world records were broken. Included in the record breaking performances were American's Aaron Peirsol (200m back), Ian Crocker (100m fly) and Jessica Hardy (100m breast).

The diving well features two one-meter and two three-meter springboards as well as one, three, five, seven-and-a-half and 10 meter platforms. The platforms are 10 feet wide making them the widest in the nation. The diving pool is kept temperature controlled at 82 degrees and also features a compression bubble used to soften

a divers impact during entry while practicing platform dives. Divers will also be able to practice their dives using the dryland equipment which includes two springboards attached to an intricate rope and pully system and a trampoline.

Spacious locker rooms and coaches offices are located in the adjoined 10,000 square-foot building, which house the athletes equipment and coaching staff

Since the unveiling, Florida State has hosted several prime events. The Morcom Aquatics Center served as host to the 2009 USA Diving Nationals, the 2010 National Zone Diving Championships and the 2010 US Master Championships. It also was the diving training site for the 2009 World Championships, which took place in Rome, Italy.

In 2013, the Morcom Aquatics Center was host to the 2013 World Championship Trials, which consisted of a week-long display of the country's best divers, including 2012 U.S. Olympic Gold Medalist, David Boudia, and silver medalists Kristian Ipsen and Troy Dumais.



Florida State diver Terry Horner accomplished many things as a Seminole, but perhaps one of his greatest achievements was representing his country at the 2009 World Championships in Rome, Italy. The NCAA Champion qualified for the event on the one-meter and earned the opportunity to compete against the worlds elite on one of the events biggest stages. Current transfer from USC, Ariel Rittenhouse earned fifth place on the 3-meter synchronized event.

While representing the United States, Ariel Rittenhouse placed fourth in the 3-meter synchronized event alongside Kelci Bryant. Pavel Sankovich represented Belarus.


