

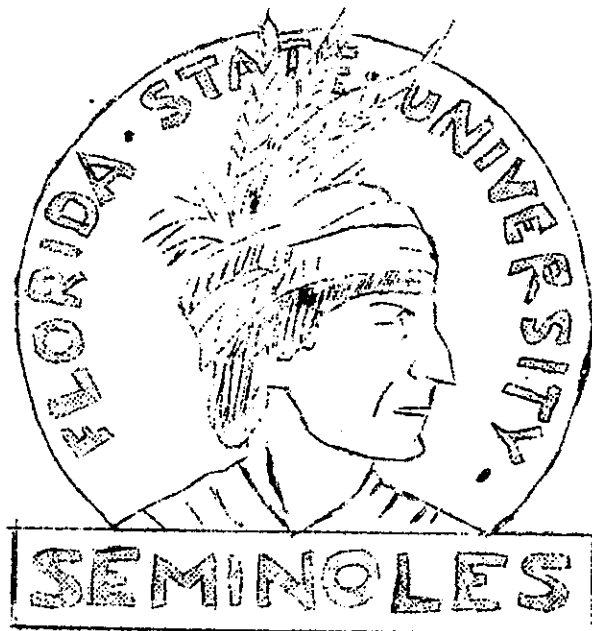

THE FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY

THE FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY AT TALLAHASSEE IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE CAPITAL CITY OF FLORIDA. LOCATED IN THE NORTHWESTERN SECTION OF THE STATE, TALLAHASSEE HAS A METROPOLITAN POPULATION OF APPROXIMATELY 47,000.

THE UNIVERSITY WAS FIRST ESTABLISHED IN 1857 AS A "SEMINARY WEST OF THE SEWANEE," AUTHORIZED BY THE 1851 LEGISLATURE. THE SCHOOL OPENED ON THE GROUNDS OF THE FORMER "FLORIDA INSTITUTE." THE NAME WAS CHANGED TO "FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE" IN 1901 AND THE SCHOOL REMAINED CO-EDUCATIONAL UNTIL THE BUCKMAN BILL OF 1905. THEN IT BECAME THE "FLORIDA FEMALE COLLEGE" AND WAS RE-NAMED IN 1909 "THE FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN." BY ACT OF THE 1947 LEGISLATURE, THE INSTITUTION AGAIN BECAME CO-EDUCATIONAL AS THE "FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY" ON MAY 15, 1947.

GROWTH AND PROGRESS HAVE ALWAYS DISTINGUISHED FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY. THE SCHOOL HAS GROWN FROM A SEMINARY CONSISTING OF THREE BUILDINGS AND AN ENROLLMENT OF 150 TO A UNIVERSITY WITH A PHYSICAL PLANT OF 45 PERMANENT STRUCTURES AND A STUDENT BODY OF AROUND 6,000. A FACULTY AND STAFF OF ABOUT 1,000 COMPRISE THE TEACHING AND ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL. A "MASTER CAMPUS PLAN" DEVELOPED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF PRESIDENT DOAK S. CAMPBELL WILL COORDINATE EXPANSION FOR THE NEXT 47 YEARS. SEVERAL OF THE BUILDINGS FIRST DESIGNATED IN THIS PLAN, SUCH AS DORMITORIES, STADIUM, STUDENT UNION, MUSIC AND MAINTENANCE HAVE ALREADY BEEN CONSTRUCTED. THE GREAT NEED OF THE ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT NOW IS AN ADEQUATE GYMNASIUM.

PRIMARY EMPHASIS AT FSU IS PLACED ON A HIGHLY QUALIFIED FACULTY AND STAFF, SCHOLARSHIP, PERSONAL INTEREST IN THE INDIVIDUAL STUDENT, A CAREFULLY PLANNED CURRICULUM, AND AN EFFICIENT, BEAUTIFUL PHYSICAL PLANT. AT ALL TIMES THE GENERAL OBJECTIVE OF SERVICE TO THE PEOPLE OF FLORIDA AND THE SOUTH IS THE MAJOR GUIDING PRINCIPLE UPON WHICH THE PROGRAM OF THE UNIVERSITY IS BASED.

THE FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY HAS 14 MAJOR DIVISIONS -- THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES, SCHOOL OF EDUCATION, SCHOOL OF HOME ECONOMICS, SCHOOL OF MUSIC, SCHOOL OF LIBRARY TRAINING AND SERVICE, SCHOOL OF JOURNALISM, SCHOOL OF BUSINESS, SCHOOL OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION, SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WELFARE, SCHOOL OF NURSING, HOME DEMONSTRATION, AIR R.O.T.C., ORDINANCE R.O.T.C. AND THE GRADUATE SCHOOL.

COURSES LEADING TO THE MASTERS DEGREES ARE PROVIDED IN 36 AREAS AND FOR THE DOCTORATE IN NINE AREAS.

FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY'S BASKETBALL COACHING STAFF, 1951-1952.

HEAD COACH J. K. "BUD" KENNEDY. BUD GOT OFF TO A GOOD START, SO HE SAYS, "IF I NEVER GET ANY FURTHER" IN BASKETBALL BY BEING BORN AT LAWRENCE, KANSAS -- RIGHT IN THE HEART OF "BASKETBALL COUNTRY." HE ATTENDED COLLEGE AT UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS, BAKER UNIVERSITY AND KANSAS STATE TEACHERS COLLEGE -- PLAYING BASKETBALL AT ALL THREE SCHOOLS. HE ALSO STARRED IN FOOTBALL AT BAKER AND KANSAS STATE TEACHERS.

KENNEDY ACTUALLY GOT HIS FIRST COACHING EXPERIENCE BEFORE FINISHING COLLEGE, AFTER A SUCCESSFUL YEAR AT BAKER, BUD WAS CALLED TO SAN DIEGO, CAL, WHERE HE WAS PLAYING COACH OF THE SAN DIEGO ATHLETIC CLUB FOR TWO YEARS.

KENNEDY'S NEXT COACHING JOB WAS AT WARRENSBURG, MISSOURI, HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HE DIRECTED BASKETBALL, BASEBALL AND TRACK WITH MARKED SUCCESS FOR TWO YEARS AFTER HE GRADUATED FROM KANSAS STATE TEACHERS. BUD'S WARRENSBURG TEAM WENT TO THE MISSOURI STATE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT EACH YEAR, AND WENT AS FAR AS THE SEMI-FINALS THE SECOND SEASON.

FROM WARRENSBURG KENNEDY WENT TO KANSAS CITY WHERE HE SUPERVISED PHYSICAL EDUCATION IN THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS, AND AT WESTPORT HIGH SCHOOL. AFTER SIX YEARS WITH THE SCHOOL SYSTEM, BUD WAS APPOINTED ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF RECREATION FOR THE CITY OF MADISON, WISCONSIN. HE STAYED AT THIS JOB THREE YEARS, THEN WENT INTO THE NAVY FOR THE NEXT THREE.

WHILE IN THE NAVY KENNEDY GOT BACK TO COACHING BASKETBALL. HE DIRECTED TEAMS AT THE NAVAL TRAINING STATION AT PURDUE, AND WHILE OVERSEAS AT TUBABO, PHILLIPINE ISLANDS.

KENNEDY CAME TO FLORIDA STATE AS ATHLETICS BUSINESS MANAGER IN 1948, AND TOOK OVER AS HEAD BASKETBALL COACH THE FOLLOWING YEAR. HIS THREE TEAMS AT FLORIDA STATE HAVE WON 45 AND LOST 31 GAMES. LAST YEAR BUD HAD HIS FINEST SQUAD, THE TEAM WINNING 18 AND LOSING ONLY 9. THE 1951 SQUAD WON THE DISTRICT 25 N.A.I.B. TOURNAMENT, BRINGING FLORIDA STATE ITS FIRST BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, AND WENT TO THE QUARTER-FINALS OF THE NATIONAL N.A.I.B. TOURNAMENT BEFORE BEING ELIMINATED.

COACH KENNEDY IS MARRIED -- HIS WIFE'S NAME IS LAURA -- AND THEY HAVE TWO SONS, HUGH AND BOB.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH BILL WEIGEL. BILL, WHO IS SERVING HIS SECOND YEAR AS GRADUATE ASSISTANT, WAS A STAR OF COACH KENNEDY'S 1949 AND 1950 BASKETBALL TEAMS AT FLORIDA STATE. ALWAYS AN AGGRESSIVE PLAYER, WEIGEL BRINGS SOME OF THAT SAME AGGRESSIVENESS TO HIS COACHING. HE HAS DON A FINE JOB WITH THE FLORIDA STATE B TEAM, AND HAS PROVEN VERY HELPFUL TO COACH KENNEDY WITH THE VARSITY. HIS HOME IS BATESVILLE, INDIANA.

TRAINER EDDIE KWEST. EDDIE CAME TO FLORIDA STATE IN THE FALL OF 1948 AS HEAD TRAINER OF ALL SPORTS. WELL SCHOOLED IN HIS PROFESSION, KWEST HAS PROVEN INVALUABLE TO THE BASKETBALL TEAM. HIS HOME, BEFORE COMING TO FLORIDA STATE, WAS SOUTH BEND, INDIANA.

N. B. "BIM" STULTS CAME TO FLORIDA STATE AS HEAD SWIMMING COACH IN JANUARY, 1948. IT WAS RATHER LATE TO ORGANIZE A TEAM, BUT THE SEMINOLES MANAGED TO GET IN TWO MEETS THAT SEASON, LOSING BOTH. IN SPITE OF THE FACT THAT MANY OF THE BOYS ON HIS SQUAD HAD NEVER SWUM IN COMPITITION BEFORE ENTERING FLORIDA STATE, BIM BROUGHT THE TEAM ALONG UNTIL IT WON THREE OUT OF NINE MEETS IN 1949. IN 1950 THE SEMINOLE NATATORS REALLY BEGAN TO CHURN, CHALKING UP SEVEN DUAL MEET VICTORIES AGAINST TWO DEFEATS; AND LAST SEASON FLORIDA STATE WAS UNDEFEATED IN SEVEN MEETS, TIED FOR FIRST IN THE SOUTHEASTERN A.A.U. CHAMPIONSHIPS AND WAS RATED THE BEST COLLEGE SWIMMING TEAM IN THE DEEP SOUTH. SO, IN FOUR YEARS, COACH STULTS' FLORIDA STATE TEAMS HAVE WON 17 MEETS, LOST 10 AND TIED 0.

COACH BIM GRADUATED FROM WASHINGTON AND LEE UNIVERSITY IN 1930 WITH AN AB DEGREE IN ARTS AND SCIENCES. HE WENT FROM W&L TO ROSS HIGH OF FREMONT, OHIO, AS HEAD SWIMMING COACH. IN HIS LAST SEVEN YEARS AT FREMONT, BIM'S SWIMMERS WON THE OHIO HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP FIVE TIMES AND FINISHED SECOND THE OTHER TWO YEARS. FOUR TIMES HIS ROSS TANKMEN FINISHED FOURTH NATIONALLY.

STULTS ALSO SERVED AS ASSISTANT COACH AT OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY, AND WAS IN THE U.S. NAVY FIVE YEARS BEFORE COMING TO FLORIDA STATE.

BIM IS MARRIED -- HIS WIFE'S NAME IS JEAN -- AND THEY DO NOT HAVE ANY CHILDREN.

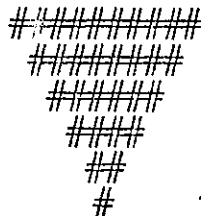

COACH ODENEAL GRADUATED FROM SPRINGFIELD COLLEGE IN THE SPRING OF 1949, AND RECEIVED HIS MASTERS DEGREE IN EDUCATION THERE AT THE SUMMER SESSION OF THAT SAME YEAR. HE WAS ONE OF AN ARDENT GROUP AT SPRINGFIELD WHO SOLD VOLLEY BALL AS AN INTERCOLLEGIATE SPORT TO MANY NEW ENGLAND COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES.

ODENEAL WAS ALSO PROMINENT IN OTHER ATHLETICS AND STUDENT AFFAIRS AT SPRINGFIELD.
