LAINE LASSETER – a 6'0" freshman from Macon, Georgia where she was an outstanding player under her high school coach, Grady Smith at Stratford Academy. Laine was highly recruited by several colleges and universities in the Southeast and is a starter for the Lady Seminoles. Great things are expected from Laine on the basketball court as Coach Murphy describes her as a potential All-American. Laine is an excellent rebounder and scorer from the post position and could be the key in the Lady Seminoles offensive attack.

CHERRY RIVERS – a 5'8" junior from Miami, Florida, is returning as a two year starter for the Lady Seminoles. Cherry has the much needed experience and playing time the Lady Seminoles need so desperately. Cherry is an excellent shooter and rebounder and is a probable starter at a post position. She has been selected on several All Tournament teams and was selected an All State player in the 1977-1978 playing season.

"SCOOBY" GOLDEN – a 5'7" freshman post from Tampa, Florida will provide the Lady Seminoles with additional depth and quickness at the post position. She is a potential starter at the post position and will be counted heavily on by the Lady Seminole coaching staff. She is an excellent rebounder and is an extremely coachable player. Her biggest asset is her desire to play.

KAREN BARRINEAU – a 5'10" sophomore from Whigham, Georgia adds playing experience and knowledge to the young Lady Seminole basketball team. What Karen gives up in quickness, she makes up for in the knowledge of the game. She is an excellent inside player and is a second year potential starter for the Lady Seminoles. She is an excellent shooter from ten feet on in and is a leader both on and off the court.

MARTHA LAPPE – a 5'9" freshman from Towson, Maryland will give the returning players stiff competition at the wing position. She is fundamentally sound, well coached and could see considerable action as a freshman. She is a good passer and has a thorough knowledge of the game.

OUTLOOK

Basketball will be super exciting this year with the Lady Seminoles. Highlighted by a successful recruiting year and the return of 5 veterans, the 78-79 season should prove to be a success.

The Lady Seminoles are returning one senior, a part-time starter from Bay Port, New York, 5'7" Cheryl Weigand. Other starters returning are a 5'8" Junior playing at the post position, Cherry Rivers, high scorer and excellent rebounder from Miami, Florida; Sophomore 5'8" wing Rose Harper from Milledgeville, Georgia; Sophomore 5'8" wing Jackie Arnold who is also from Milledgeville, Ga., and Sophomore 5'10" Karen Barrineau from Whigham, Georgia. Chris Brokas, three year starter hurt by a knee injury, will be sidelined. She was a High School All-American and is from Key Stone Heights, Florida. The Lady Seminoles will miss Chris Brokas in the line-up but with a highly successful year in recruiting, rebounding problems have nearly been eliminated. The Lady Seminoles signed 6' Laine Lasseter, potential All-American from Stratford Academy in Macon, Georgia, who was highly recruited by several colleges and universities in the Southeast. The Lady Seminoles also signed 5'9" forward, highly recruited Martha Lappe from Towson, Maryland. Other signees are: Darlene Shannon, 5'7" guard, outstanding playmaker from Thomasville, Georgia; 5'9" super quick rebounding whiz, "Scooby" Golden from Tampa, Florida, Teresa Tinsley, ball handler, playmaker and point guard who has super quickness from Orlando, Florida.

Several walk ons will add competition to the team and the Lady Seminoles will have their first Junior Varsity team which will add a new dimension to the program.

Overall, from the Lady Seminoles, you will see a much improved, sound, fundamental, well coached team. Super-quickness, pressing player to player defense, and a fast breaking team should prove exciting to watch.

Another plus this year has been the addition of two outstanding assistant coaches, Sharon Adamson from Calhoun, Georgia, and Paula Dean from Leary, Georgia.

HEAD COACH – Dianne Murphy



She's young, she's successful. But something is missing from Dianne Murphy's life. Murphy, head coach of the Lady Seminole basketball team is still looking for a state championship. She's been close several times, but the state crown has managed to elude her for the past three years.

What hasn't eluded her is super success in building respected, winning basketball traditions. In her three seasons at Shorter College in Rome, Georgia, where she started the women's basketball program from scratch, she coached the Hawketts to 7-11, 20-8 and 13-11 seasons.

Murphy is a 1969 graduate from Putnam County Senior High School in Cookeville, Tennessee. She earned B.S. and M.A. degrees from Tennessee Technological University, one of the most respected women's basketball powers in the country. For the past two seasons, she has been at the helm of the Florida State Lady Seminole basketball program and has turned the basketball program around in a very short time. Her first year the team finished 11-12 while only after one year of recruiting the 1977-78 season finished at 19-15 and a second place finish in the FAIAW State Tournament.

Murphy is highly respected as a successful recruiter, master teacher, and is a producer of sound fundamental players and teams. She has published numerous articles appearing in *Coach and Athlete* and *Woman Coach* and is completing requirements for a Ph.D. degree in Physical Education at Florida State.
