Working Media—Requests for working credentials should be made to Dan Pearson, FSU Sports Information Office, at least one week prior to the game in which credentials are being requested for. At the Leon County Civic Center, working media will be seated at the press table on the floor in front of the East stands. For games at Tully Gym, media will be placed along the press table on the floor in front of the West stands.

Parking—For games played at the Leon County Civic Center, a parking pass must be requested along with game credentials. Parking will be at the Civic Center Lot or at the FSU Law Library. For games at Tully Gym, ample parking is readily available and no pass is required.



Three new players will augment the group that returns. The addition of 5-8 freshmen Brenda Cliette and Lahna Wood will add much-needed quickness to the program while 5-11 forward Kim Hinote is the physical inside player who could fill the void created by Lasseter's departure.

"We're still short by national standards," says Dykehouse. "We recruited in that area but we didn't get what we had hoped for. However, we were very successful in recruiting the speed and quickness that we need. I see the guard position as being very, very solid for us this year.'

While Dykehouse allows a smile to surface, she labels last year's squad as 'short and slow'. "We were a great shooting team (Florida State finished sixth in the nation with its 50.2 percent field goal accuracy) but we ran a very deliberate offense most of the time." she says. "Now we're 'short and swift'. We'll throw pressure defenses and a quick transition game at some folks this year.

'But just when they get used to that, we can come back with the slow deliberate play because we've still got the players around who ran that so well last year."

While Dykehouse will keep 'em guessing on which style she'll go with, there won't be any surprises about who will do most of Florida State's scoring. Count on the offensive production coming from junior forward Sue Galkantas and senior guard Lisa Foglio.

Galkantas, already the second all-time leading scorer in the program after two years (she need just 299 points to take over the top slot), averaged over 20 points both years in earning honorable mention All-American honors. She'll also average right around nine rebounds.

Foglio is somewhat of a question mark. She had a terrific junior season (16.9 ppg) but broke her shooting arm with 11 games remaining. A full recovery could lead to a repeat performance of last year's 59 percent field goal accuracy.

Joining Galkantas and Foglio as holdovers from the starting lineup will be senior center Glenda Stokes, the squad's most underrated player. The defensive specialist also contributed in the scoring column, especially late in the season when the squad's offensive punch was threatened with injuries. She finished with averages of 9.2 points and 7.5 rebounds.

Returning at the other forward slot is LeeVayn Oliver, a 5-10 junior who finished third in scoring (10.5) and

rebounding (7.4) a year ago.

The remaining guard slot will be open for a number of players to vie for. Seniors Lynn Marnie and Sunnie O'Neal as well as sophomore Joye Burroughs all started at one time or another last year. Marnie runs a deliberate offense while O'Neal and Burroughs will see playing time when the action picks up.

Also returning for FSU are senior center Nancy Galkantas and junior Jill Baker. Galkantas came alive in the NWIT Tournament, scoring more points in that three game set than she had the entire season which merited her being named to the all-tournament team.

With an improved team comes an improved schedule. "The toughest part of the schedule is the first half of the season," says Dykehouse. "We have three tournaments before Christmas plus a few other tough games. The Mid American Classic in Missouri will be a big test with #10 Penn State and #20 Missouri in attendance."


While Dykehouse will keep 'em guessing on which style she'll go with, there won't be any surprises about who will do most of Florida State's scoring. Count on the offensive production coming from junior forward Sue Galkantas and senior quard Lisa Foglio.

The rest of the schedule is demanding too. Florida State will have a Big Eight team (Nebraska) on its schedule for the first time as well as a Big Five team (Temple). The Seminoles will also play three schools in the state of Alabama (Alabama, Auburn and Alabama-Birmingham) as well as instate competition.

The Metro Conference has been divided into a north and south region. Florida State will play a home and home series with Tulane and top 20 Memphis State before Louisville hosts the Metro Tournament at the end of the season.

"Our conference gets an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament," says the 28-year old mentor. "But if another team has a 20-win season, the conference stands an excellent chance of having two teams reach the NCAA's.

Reaching the NCAA's, of course, is Florida State's goal for the 1982-83 season. If a highly experienced, short and swift team can make it, count on seeing the Seminoles in attendance.

Janice Dykehouse Head Basketball Coach

In just three short seasons, Jan Dykehouse has turned the fortunes of Florida State basketball around. Under the leadership of Dykehouse, the Lady Seminoles have gone full circle from a losing team to a championship team.

Taking over a squad that consistently hovered around the .500 mark against a regional schedule, Dykehouse built Florida State into a championship

calibre team in just three years.

After two rebuilding seasons in which the Lady Seminoles won 27 of 64 games, Dykehouse led FSU to a 28-10 mark in 1982. With an all-time school mark of 28 wins, FSU also placed second in the National Women's Invitational Tournament (NWIT) in Texas.

In addition to the runner up spot at the NWIT, Dykehouse coached Florida State to two invitational championships, a state championship and the school's first win ever over a top 20 school—a 63-61 thriller over Mississippi.

The performance of the 1982 Lady Seminoles earned Dykehouse Coach of the Year honors in Florida and also helped get her nominated for national Coach of the Year honors—one of only 20 coaches across the nation to be nominated.

Dykehouse came to Florida State from the University of Denver, where she worked as an assistant coach at that program while pursuing a master's degree in

sports sciences.

When she was hired at Florida State, Dykehouse also brought a wealth of playing experience to the position. After playing two seasons at Grand Rapids Junior College, Dykehouse transferred to Grand Valley State College where she graduated with a degree in physical education. In two seasons as a player, she helped pace Grand Valley to a 38-12 mark.

Carrying an average of 15 points and 11 rebounds a game, Dykehouse helped pace her squad to a third place region finish in 1976.

Dykehouse played one year of AAU ball in Allentown, Pa. (Allentown Crestettes) before concluding her playing career as a player-coach for Union Sportive Vierzon, a French national team. Playing for the senior team for Vierzon, Dykehouse averaged 22 points a game in leading the team to a 22-4 record and a division championship. Coaching the junior team, Dykehouse paced the squad to an undefeated season.

Dykehouse also has previous coaching experience at Lehigh University (Pa.), American School in Paris, and Spring Lake High School (Michigan).

The 28-year old coach hopes successes of the 1981–82 season will be a foundation of future Lady Seminole successes.



"Right now the program is 60 percent on its way to achieving the level where I want it," Dykehouse says. "We are over the hump, but we must continue to improve. I want to see the day when FSU is an automatic member of the NCAA national championship field."

Success on the floor is just part of Dykehouse's goals. Academic progress towards a marketable degree is an important priority with the popular coach. Since her arrival on the FSU campus, team grade point average has improved every year.

"Florida State offers its student athletes an excellent opportunity for a quality education," Dykehouse says. "It is my sincere hope and goal that every young

woman we recruit obtains a degree."



Dennis McNelis Assistant Coach

Dennis McNelis begins his third season as Jan Dykehouse's number one aide. As

assistant head coach, McNelis is responsible for coaching the defense, fast break, and the guards. In addition, McNelis heads up the recruiting efforts of FSU.

McNelis arrived at Florida State from Clemson University where he was head volleyball coach and assistant basketball coach for two years. As head of the Tiger volleyball program, McNelis coached squads ran up an impressive 61-23 record and captured one state championship.

As a top assistant of the basketball team, Clemson consistently finished in the nation's top 20.

Before arriving on the collegiate scene, McNelis was a top coach in the prep ranks. He coached at Walsingham Academy in Williamsburg, Va. for three seasons, leading his charges to the Catholic League state championship in 1975. The season earned McNelis state Coach of the Year honors.

After leaving Walsingham, McNelis became head coach at Poquoson High School in Virginia. During two seasons as head coach, McNelis led his squad to a 25-0 and 26-1 record. His 1976–77 team won the state championship and earned McNelis the 1977 Kellogg's Coach of the Year honors for the State of Virginia. His 1978 team made it to the state finals.

In five years, McNelis coached teams recorded a hefty 99-18 record—good for an .846 winning percentage.

A 1971 graduate of Belmont Abbey College with a degree in sociology, McNelis obtained a Master's degree of Education in Personnel Services from Clemson in May, 1980.

The 33-year-old McNelis is single.

Following her career at FSU, Rivers went on to play semi-professional women's basketball before becoming a fifth round draft selection of the Chicago Hustle of the former WBA. She played with the Hustle for a short period of time.

Returning to her native Miami, the popular FSU coach was named assistant coach at Miami Dade South Junior College for the 1980–81 season. At Dade South, Rivers helped coach the squad to the Florida Division I Junior College Championship with a 22-5 record.

A graduate of FSU with a degree in Counseling, Health and Rehabilitation, Rivers spends the off season as a counselor at the University of Miami's Upward Bound Program.


No stranger to the collegiate basketball scene is second year assistant Heidi

THE UNIVERSITY



The University's location in the capital city of Florida affords excellent study and research opportunities in the areas of government, social sciences and policy sciences. Additionally, the presence of state government provides widespread opportunities for internships and on-the-job study.

However, Florida State students aren't found only in Tallahassee, as the University also maintains a branch campus in Panama City, Florida. In addition, FSU is a member of the "academic common market" and overseas study programs in fields ranging from law to hotel and restaurant administration are offered in Florence, London, Switzerland, Yugoslavia and the Panama Canal Zone.


In terms of scientific research, FSU excells as a basic research-oriented university. The nuclear physics laboratory is ranked by the National Science Foundation as one of the top four in the nation. FSU also maintains a large marine laboratory on the coast of the Gulf of Mexico.

Florida State counts among its faculty six member of the National Academy of Sciences, including Paul Dirac, a Nobel Prize winner in physics. Kurt Waldheim, former secretary general of the United Nations, recently joined the university faculty as a distinguished visiting lecturer in international relations and law.

When it comes to the performing arts, Florida State ranks among the best schools in the nation.

The School of Theatre is recognized nationally for its leadership and training of talented young people. Burt Reynolds, acclaimed for his work with aspiring theatre professionals at the Reynolds Institute for Theatre Training in Jupiter, Florida, is an adjunct professor of professional and regional theatre at FSU.

The Department of Dance is ranked as one of the top five in the country.

Florida State also offers many varied activities outside the classroom. The Union Program Office presents concerts, movies, lectures, flea markets and other activities throughout the year. For those with more classical tastes, the University annually presents the Fine Arts Festival, featuring the University's best artists and performers, and the Artist Series, which brings big name entertainment to campus. The intramural office also has much to offer, with year-round sports activities available to students and faculty.

The University is home to the only collegiate circus in the country. The Flying High Circus carries a reputation of quality, professional aerial and stage entertainment for children of all ages.

When it comes to intercollegiate athletics, Florida State has established a winning tradition. The athletic program, including both men's and women's athletics, is among the top 20 in the nation.

But it's not just good programs that make the university great. As President Bernard Sliger proclaims, it is the people who make Florida State the successful monument to learning that it is. And he takes special pride in the people—students, faculty, administrators and staff—who are Florida State University.
