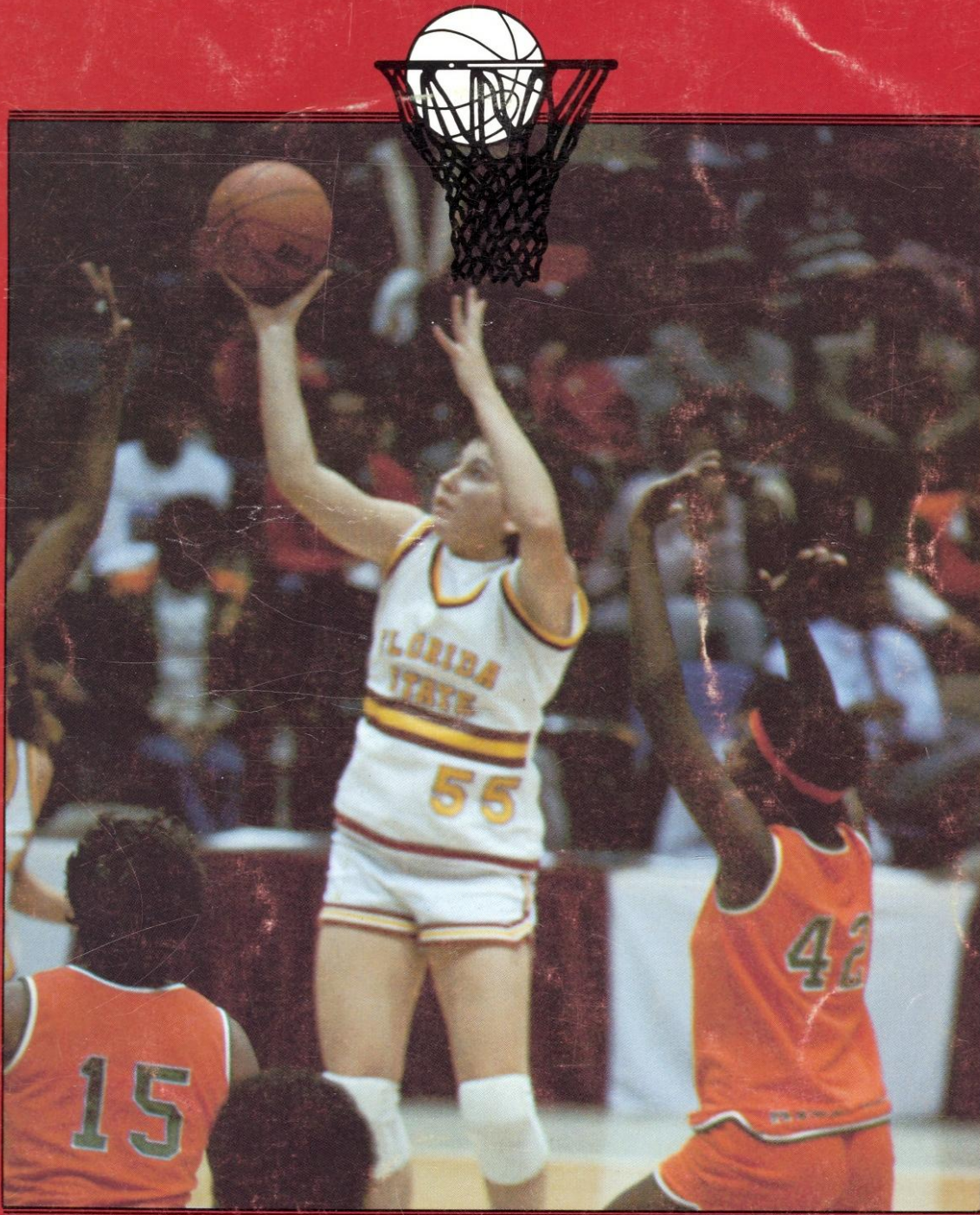

MEDIA INFORMATION

Florida State's 1985-86 basketball guide has been designed for use by the media. Any questions not covered in this brochure concerning FSU Women's Basketball should be directed to the Florida Sports Information Office.

Working Media-Requests for working credentials should be made to Dan Pearson, FSU Sports Information Office, at least one week prior to the game in which credentials are being requested for. At the Leon-County Civic Center, working media will be seated at the press table on the floor in front of the East stands. For games at Tully Gym, media will be placed along the press table on the floor in front of the West stands.

Parking-For games played at the Leon-County Civic Center, a parking pass must be requested along with game credentials. Parking will be at the Civic Center Lot or at the FSU Law Library. For games at Tully Gym, ample parking is readily available and no pass is required.

Photographers-Accredited photographers will be admitted to both the Leon-County Civic Center and Tully Gym upon presentation of appropriate credentials. Working credentials should be requested at least one week in advance from the FSU Sports Information Office.

Radio-Sections for radio broadcast are reserved at both Tully Gym and at the Leon-County Civic Center.

Phones-Telephone service is available at both Tully and the Leon-County Civic Center. In order to obtain an individual line for broadcasting, contact Centel Telephone Company of Tallahassee. Call Centel at (904) 222-2236 and have them contact FSU Sports Information Office for placement.

1986 OUTLOOK: LOOKING TO REBOUND



Florida State returns nine veterans, but only one senior. It must look for leadership from this group of juniors and sophomores if it is to return to the success it enjoyed in 1983.

OUTLOOK '86

Going into last year, Florida State head coach Jan Allen knew she would have a young, inexperienced team facing the toughest schedule in the school's history. The result was a team that finished with a 7-21 record, but had shown the potential of becoming a fine team. For the first time in two years, Allen returns a team with more veterans than newcomers. Given the amount of playing time these veterans accumulated last year, Allen has reason to believe that Florida State's basketball fortunes will begin to turnaround.

"Without question it runs in cycles," Allen says. "We ran off back-to-back 20 win seasons a few years ago and then lost those players to graduation. For the past two seasons we have been in a rebuilding process. Those players are now sophomores and juniors and because we threw them in the fire early, I believe they are now ready to play."

Allen returns nine veterans off of last year's team. Of that total, eight have started at least one game and three started the majority of games. It is from this group of veterans that Allen will build the nucleus of the 1986 team.

If FSU is to be successful this season it must get production from the shooting guard position. With the departure of Celia Slater (11.7ppg), this slot is wide open. Bev Burnett, a sophomore who averaged 8.8 points per game last year, is number one on the pre-season depth chart. Look for senior Penny Stone and sophomore Val Garrett to challenge Burnett. Freshman Valene Harris may also see action here, as well as at small forward. Angela Tucker, another freshman, will play mainly at forward but could also see action at the two guard spot.

Three experienced players will fight for playing time at point guard. Sheri Kaminski has two years experience as a part-time starter and is already seventh on the all-time FSU assist list. Injuries slowed Kaminski last season and opened the door for Jan Piatnik, who started several games last season as a freshman. Junior college transfer Cheryl Glover could be a surprise. Glover was nominated for Kodak Junior College All-America last season and could become a factor once she learns FSU's system.

"Our guard play was erratic last season," Allen says. "When our outside shooting was off, defenses would pack in around our inside players and cause us trouble. We need to get steady offensive production from our guards this year in order to avoid the problems of last season."

A strong point of the 1986 Lady Seminole team will be at the post position. Sarah Hall averaged 6.8 points and 7.0 rebounds as freshman last year and became FSU's first legitimate shot blocker since Brenda Cliette. An excellent off season conditioning program has left Hall in a position to become FSU's most dominant center ever. FSU also has depth here with junior Linda-Ann McGowan. A part-time starter for two seasons, McGowan averaged 5.0 points and 4.9 rebounds. Add 6-6 freshman Mary Buchanan to the list and the Florida

State is solid. FSU's tallest recruit ever, Buchanan has looked strong in pre-season practice, but may be a year away from contributing on a regular basis.

"I feel good about the post," Allen adds. "Sarah dedicated herself to basketball this summer and could become a tremendous player. Linda-Ann gives us an experienced backup and a possible spot starter at forward. Mary Buchanan has all the tools and just needs some experience. Overall, this is the strong part of our team."

At forward, FSU returns its leading scorer in Lorraine Rimson (16.3ppg). A two-year starter, Rimson gained international experience this past summer when she played for the gold medal winning team (USA) at the Maccabiah Games in Israel.

Look for one of five players to grab the remaining starting position. Freshmen Veronica Bouknight and Valene Harris have an inside edge for the job, but another freshman, Angela Tucker, has also performed well in pre-season. Sophomore Gussie Clark will provide quality depth, as will Garrett—who may move to forward from the guard position.

"For the first time in a number of years, we will have two or three players battling for playing time at every position," Allen says. "This will make us a stronger team in several aspects. More competition leads to a higher level of intensity. In addition, more depth allows for better practices. Our first team will have a strong unit to practice against."

Allen's major concern again centers around youth. Although 9 letterwinners return, only one senior dots the roster. Eleven players have been in the program for one year or less. "We are lacking in senior leadership," Allen says. "We are going to rely on sophomores and juniors to carry the load this year. I think once we play a few games, we should be able to come together as a unit."

Florida State will play a more balanced schedule this season, with 13 of 27 games scheduled for home—along with the traditional Florida A&M game at the Civic Center.

Metro Conference action begins January 2 at Columbia, SC and will include eight conference matchups. Home and home contests with long time rivals Tulane, Florida, and South Florida are included on the schedule; as is a matchup with perennial top 10 team Tennessee in Knoxville. FSU will play in two tournaments this season, traveling to the Pizza Hut Classic in Wichita, Kansas in November, before hosting the Duval Hotel Classic in December. The season winds down with the annual Metro Conference Championship in Columbia on March 1-3, where the winner will receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Championship tournament.

"The league will be more balanced this year," Allen says. "Graduation took a toll on a lot of teams. South Carolina and Memphis State will probably be the pre-season favorites, but several teams will have a chance to make a run at the title."

Janice D. Allen
Head Coach

Janice D. Allen enters her seventh year as head coach of the Lady Seminole basketball team. During that time period, Allen has seen Florida State play in its first two national tournaments and break into the nation's top 20 for the first time ever.

In only her third season at Florida State, Allen led the Lady Seminoles to a 28-10 record and a second place finish at the National Women's Invitational Tournament-the first time an FSU women's basketball team made an appearance in a national tournament.

One year later, the 1983 team realized several dreams. Several times over the course of that season, FSU appears in the Associated Press-Mel Greenburg Top 20 basketball poll. That marked the first time FSU ever received a national ranking. Finishing with a 24-6 record, that Florida State team also appeared in the NCAA national championship tournament-another first for the Lady Seminole basketball program.

Despite a pair of rebuilding years, FSU has still won over 58 percent of their games during the last four years-against schedules that have ranked among the hardest in the nation.

Allen's coaching abilities have been recognized several times. She has been nominated for Coach of the Year by several publications after both the 1982 and 1983 seasons. She won the Florida Coach of the Year award after the 1983 campaign.

Because of her experience, Allen has landed spots on several key committees-including the NCAA regional selection committee, Associated Press 'Top 20 Coaches' Poll, and the Wade Trophy selection committee.

A quick glance at Allen's background reveals the reason for her success. She possesses a wealth of experience as both a player and teacher of the game.

After a fine career at Grand Rapids Junior College, Allen transferred to Grand Valley State College where she paced her squad to a 38-12 mark over two seasons. Behind Allen's 12 points and 11 rebounds per game average, Grand Valley went 22-6 during her senior season-advancing to playoff action.

Following graduation with a degree in physical education, Allen went on to play AAU ball in Pennsylvania, before concluding her career with Union Sportive Vierzon-a French national team. During her last season, Allen led the squad to a 22-4 record and coached the junior team to an undefeated season.

Her coaching credentials also include stops at Lehigh University (PA), American High School in Paris, and Spring Lake High School (MI). Allen moved on to the University of Denver, where she served as assistant coach.

She left Denver in 1979, becoming the third Lady Seminole basketball coach in the school's history.

Over the last seven years, Allen has conducted the Lady Seminole Basketball Camp, one of the most successful in the southeast that annually attracts hundreds of aspiring players.

The 31-year-old coach hopes the success of the past has laid a solid foundation for the future. "Our primary goal is to help each player obtain a marketable degree from Florida State while maximizing the potential in each player. If we can accomplish that, success on the court will follow. Our goal include having FSU a regular member of the national tournament field.





Kelly Jordan

Assistant Coach

In her Second year in the Lady Seminole basketball program is Assistant Coach Kelly Jordan.

As assistant coach, Jordan has the responsibilities of senior recruiter on the FSU staff. Her on the floor duties include handling the guards and situation zone offenses. In addition, Jordan handles several administrative duties as assigned by head coach Jan Allen.

Jordan came to Florida State prior to last season after spending six years as head coach at Stetson. During her time in the Lady Hatter program, Jordan saw her team rise from division II to division I status. She was also named Florida AIAW Coach of the Year in 1980 and 1981.

In addition to coaching the basketball team, Jordan was head softball coach from 1978 to 1981. Kelly also held the title of women's athletics coordinator for the University.

A 1976 graduate of Wake Forest, Jordan lettered in basketball and volleyball. Following completion of her degree in physical education and health, she remained at alma mater for one year serving as graduate assistant coach in volleyball and basketball. She was elevated to assistant coach the next season in both sports, coaching for an additional year.

Jordan's experience includes a year of coaching in the prep ranks.

A member of several committees, Jordan has worked extensively with several camps; including a stint as associate director of the Stetson Basketball School from 1981 to 1983.

Jordan, 31, has also been the featured speaker at several basketball clinics around the state.



Wayne Allen

Assistant Coach

One of the most successful prep coaches in the state's history, Wayne Allen begins his second year on the Florida State Basketball staff.

Allen's duties include monitoring the academic progress of players, local promotions and team travel. Floor assignments include defensive zones coach and assisting in the development of the post position.

A 1975 graduate of Bethune Cookman College, Allen spent one year as running back with Kansas City

Chiefs professional football team, before joining the coaching staff at Ocala's Vanguard High School.

In nine years at Vanguard, Allen wore many hats-including head coach of girl's basketball, assistant coach of the boys' team and head volleyball coach.

As the girl's head coach, Allen led his team to back-to-back state championships in 1982 and 1983. His 1984 team finished at 28-6 and made it to the state semi-finals-where it was just two wins shy of an unprecedented third consecutive state title. Allen's teams ran up a two-year record of 55-10.

In eight years as the boy's assistant coach, Allen helped direct Vanguard to a 134-38 record and three state championships. His volleyball team compiled a 115-12 record-reaching the state championship playoffs three times.

A staff member at several summer camps, Wayne was selected state 3A Coach of the Year in 1982 and repeated the honor the following year. He was selected to coach state all-star teams on numerous occasions.

In addition to his education degree from Bethune, Allen has completed course work towards a master's degree from Nova University.



Anucha Browne

Graduate Assistant Coach

A first-team Kodak All-American selection last season, Anucha Browne begins her first season on the Florida State basketball staff. Browne, 22, lettered four years at Northwestern University, before graduating with honors in communications studies this past spring.

As graduate assistant coach, Browne will assist head coach Jan Allen with practices, scouting, post development and administrative duties.

Browne brings solid credentials to her new post. As a senior last year, she was the most prolific scorer in college basketball-averaging 30.5 points per game, the second highest total in NCAA history. A two-time Wade Trophy finalist, Browne finished her career as the all-time leading scorer in Big Ten history with 2,307 points. She was named all-conference three times and had a single game record 45 points against St. John's last year. In addition, Browne is also the school's all-time leading rebounder with 952 boards to her credit.

She was a member of the US select team that played in Tiawan for the Jones cup and also a three-time selection to the Kodak All-District team.

"We're excited about Anucha joining our staff," Allen says. She was an excellent player who will be able to relate well to our players." While at Florida State, Browne will pursue a master's degree in communications. She is a native of Brooklyn, NY.

This is Florida State



Florida State University, a coeducational institution with an enrollment of 21,500 students, is located in Tallahassee, the capital of Florida.

The beautiful 345-acre campus is wrapped in greenery that combines the blossoms of camellias, azaleas and dogwoods with palm trees and moss-hung oaks. The campus looks enough like Ivy League schools, particularly around its older, Gothic buildings, that several times each winter New York

advertising agencies fake summer scenes supposedly shot at Princeton or Harvard. On the west side of campus, the scene is dominated by the contemporary, high-rise science complex.

There are more than 1,300 faculty including four members of the National Academy of Sciences. Florida State is one of only five universities in the nation to have its own supercomputer.

Academic programs in the sciences (notably physics, chemistry, biology and meteorology) and the performing arts (music, theater, visual arts and dance) have high national rankings. Other strong departments among the 15 schools and colleges include criminology, hospitality administration, accounting, statistics and interior design. FSU's pre-med program has a much higher than average medical school placement rate for its graduates.

Today, FSU offers students the opportunity to choose from more than 100 career options in arts and sciences, business, communication, criminology, education, home economics, law, library and information studies, music, nursing, social sciences, social work, theater, visual arts and engineering, which operates in cooperation with Florida A&M University. The most popular majors at FSU are business, biology, computer science and communication.

Florida State has honors programs for its top students. Overseas study program in fields ranging from law to hotel and restaurant administration are offered in Florence, Italy; Oxford and London, England; Switzerland, Costa Rica, Yugoslavia and the Panama Canal Zone.

Social life for many centers around 24 fraternities and 20 sororities. Wind surfing, swimming and sunning are among the activities to be enjoyed at FSU's convenient lakeside "Reservation" or along the sandy beaches of nearby coasts.

A unique extracurricular activity is the Flying High Circus, the nations only all-collegiate circus. Students from every academic major can become stars on the flying trapeze, on the highwire or in clown acts.

Fine entertainment is provided year-round by the FSU Schools of Music and Theater and the Department of Dance.

Student Campus Entertainment presents concerts, movies, lectures and other activities throughout the year and the Artist Series brings professional entertainers to campus.

Student government at FSU is one of the most powerful in the country. Elected students spend an annual budget of about \$1.7 million. Student government funds intramurals, activities at the Student Union and more than 200 interest organizations.



C.W. "HOOTIE" INGRAM *Athletic Director*

Cecil Ingram, known to most of his friends and associates as simply "Hootie," has headed the Florida State athletic department since 1981 after serving as associate commissioner of the Southeastern Conference for eight years.

Since his arrival in Tallahassee, Ingram has initiated a \$10 million dollar building program for athletic facilities, including the Moore Athletic Center - home of Florida State athletics.

A native of Tuscaloosa, Ala., Ingram played for the Crimson Tide from 1951 to 1954 and led the nation in interceptions as a sophomore. He also lettered in baseball as an infielder. Following a stint in the army, Ingram turned to coaching. After several years of high school coaching, Ingram moved into collegiate athletics; making assistant coaching stops at Wake Forest, Virginia Tech, Georgia and Arkansas.

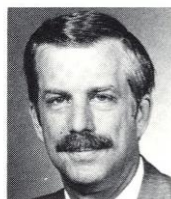


BOB GOIN *Associate Athletic Director*

A member of the Florida State athletic staff since 1981, Bob Goins begins his fifth full year as Associate Athletic Director.

All men's non-revenue coaches report to Goins and he also assists in the day-to-day operations of the department. A large portion of football, basketball and baseball game-day operations fall under his leadership.

A 1959 graduate of Bethany College, Goins received his master's degree from West Virginia in 1961. From 1960-76, Goins served Bethany in several administrative and coaching capacities before moving on to West Virginia as an assistant athletic director. He was named athletic director at California (Pa.) State College in 1980, where he formed that institution's first scholarship fund for athletics and the college's first booster club.



CHARLES W. EHRHARDT *Faculty Athletic Committee Chairman*

A Florida State University professor of law, Charles W. Ehrhardt is in his second year as Chairman of the Athletic Committee.

He is currently in his second stint on the committee, having served 1969-71 and then being reappointed to the board in 1983. As chairman, Ehrhardt succeeded Dr. James Jones, who held that position since 1980. Ehrhardt becomes Florida State's representative to the NCAA and was also president of the Metro Conference in 1984-85.

A native of Elkader, Iowa, Ehrhardt received his bachelor's degree from Iowa in 1962 before earning a law degree at Iowa State two years later. He came to Florida State in 1967.

A widely respected expert in the field of Evidence, Ehrhardt is frequently called on to lecture on the subject by lawyers and judges nationwide.
