Florida State University, nearing its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution, is poised on the brink of joining the nation's academic elite.

Building rapidly from the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida, the university has emerged as an initiation of national and international esteem, evidenced by a number of exciting advances in many areas throughout the university.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee. Within the state, FSU maintains facilities at its campus in Panama City, its marine laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico, the Appleton Museum of Art in Ocala, and the Film and Theater Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of the main campus, provides extensive credit and no-credit continuing education programs statewide.

These far reaching programs are but a few of the 271 graduate and undergraduate degree programs offered through Florida State's eight independent colleges. With 1,533 members, the FSU faculty currently includes five members of both the National Academy of Sciences and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included five Nobel Laureates.

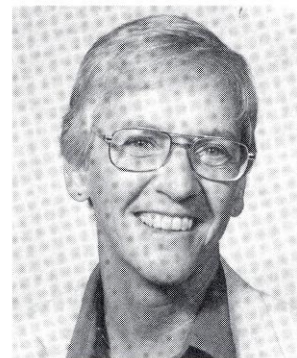
Florida State continues to progress and grow — from its foundation as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women and its coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution. In all area of teaching research and service, Florida State University is advancing boldly into the 21st century.



Dr. Dale Lick became the 11th president of FSU on August 1, 1991. He heads an institution with an enrollment of 29,000 students and an operating budget of \$400 million.



Athletic Director Bob Goin has been at Florida State nine years. He is widely credited with making the single most important move in the school's athletic history when FSU joined the ACC.



Dr. Janice Stocker is the Associate Athletic Director and serves as the coordinator for all the non-revenue sports at Florida State. She is in her sixth year with the FSU athletic department.

The outlook couldn't be brighter in '92.

The Lady Seminoles will reshuffle the infield but still return nine experienced players to the squad for the upcoming season. For two consecutive years, Florida State has made a good showing at the ASA College World Series and look to continue in the same direction.

The largest hole to fill from last season is no doubt on the mound. Nationally ranked and third team All-America Christy Larsen, a strong leader and solid player for the 'Noles will be greatly missed.

"Our biggest loss is at the pitchers position," said Head Coach JoAnne Graf. "Anytime you lose a pitcher of Christy's caliber, you have to make up for it in other areas, but I expect to see our young pitchers step up."

First to respond to the call is junior Toni Gutierrez who finished with some pretty impressive stats as a number two pitcher. Gutierrez finished the season ranked ninth in the NCAA for strikeouts (196) and 15th in ERA (.59) after starting in 27 of the 74 games. Backing up the mound is sophomore Rebecca Aase who gained experience in 14 games in 1991 and Heather Feltman a sophomore transfer from Oklahoma State. Rounding out the battery is South Carolina transfer Leslie Adams and Heather Conway, a junior from Central Arizona JC.

Stepping up into the leadership position are two seniors, both four-year letter-winners who have started in over 400 games combined in their Florida State careers. Shortstop, Penny Siqueiros and third baseman, Shannan Mitchem are the only returning starters in the infield but are expected to pick-up their positions right where they left off - Mitchem led the team with 147 assists followed by Siqueiros with 123. Siqueiros will also return to the Seminoles as the leading offensive power after finishing the 1991 campaign with a .329 batting average. She also led the team in hits, doubles, triples and RBI's as well.

Looking to fill the vacancies left in the diamond are returning sophomores Lisa Davidson and Jennifer Olow and the only freshman

on the squad, Laurie Shepherd.

After graduating six seniors, the outfield amazingly remains intact. Juniors, Leslie Barton (LF), Tina Getherall (CF), and Susan Buttery (RF) will be challenged by Jeannie Dillmore (Hillsborough CC) and Cindy Gordon (Santa Fe CC) who is also a versatile infielder.

As the Seminoles enter the first year for the ACC championship, they will head across the country for some strong competition. The first stop is in Tampa for the 20-team South Florida Tournament, then the Lady Seminoles host their annual 15-team

invitational before heading out to California to the Cal-State Fullerton Pony Invitational which will match FSU with some of the top teams in the nation. Florida State will close out the last part of the season with a visit to conference and regional rival North Carolina-Chapel Hill for an 11 team tournament just before the ACC Championship which will be in Tallahassee. The Lady Seminoles will take a final trip to UConn for the Diamond Classic which will hopefully prepare the team for a trip to Regional playoffs and the World Series.

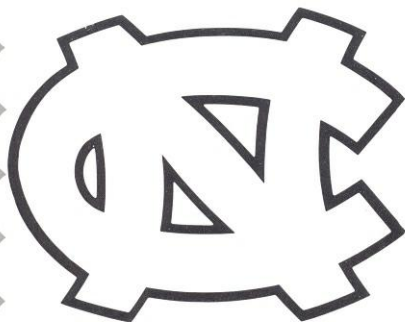

JOANNE GRAF

HEAD COACH - 14TH YEAR - 594-147-4

JoAnne Graf enters her 14th year at Florida State just six wins shy of breaking 600. Graf is listed among the top five most winningest coaches in the country, accumulating an 80% success rate. The record looks impressive as does the path Graf has led the Lady Seminoles down over the past few years.

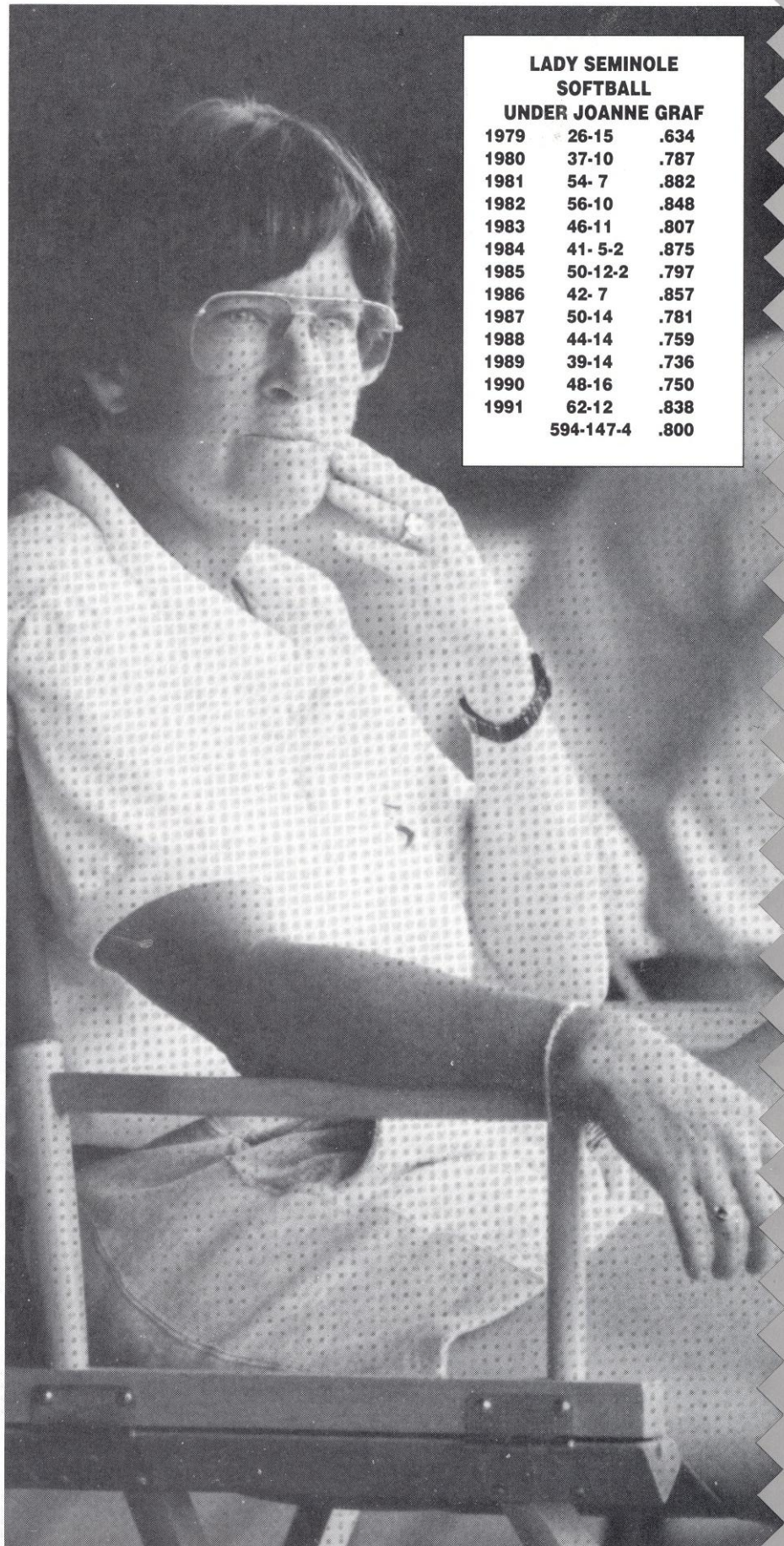
Last season, Florida State went to the ASA College World Series in Oklahoma City, OK for the third time and second consecutive year. Each season the Lady Seminoles gain a little more respect across the country which has been proven in their pre-season rankings and post season play.

In eight years of fast-pitch competition, Graf has directed the Lady Seminoles to 376 victories for a winning percentage of better than 80%. In her first five years at Florida State, she accumulated 219 wins playing the best slow-pitch competition in the nation and claimed two national titles.

Graf, who was voted the South Region Coach-of-the-Year in 1986 after leading Florida State to its first NCAA post-season tournament, has seen 24 of her players elected to NCAA South All-Region teams. In 1987, FSU produced its first fast-pitch All-America, shortstop Tiffany Daniels and last season was led by third team All-America Christy Larsen.

A 1975 graduate of Florida State, Graf returned to her alma mater after two years at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro where she earned her master's degree in physical education. Graf also worked in the athletic department at UNC-Greensboro as head coach for the university's men's and women's swim teams and assistant coach for softball.

Graf, who serves as director of the Florida State softball camp each summer, is a former president of the Florida Collegiate Athletic Association. She is also a member of the NCAA Softball Committee and chairperson of the NCAA Softball Advisory Committee for the South Region. She is presently seeking her doctorate degree in administration.

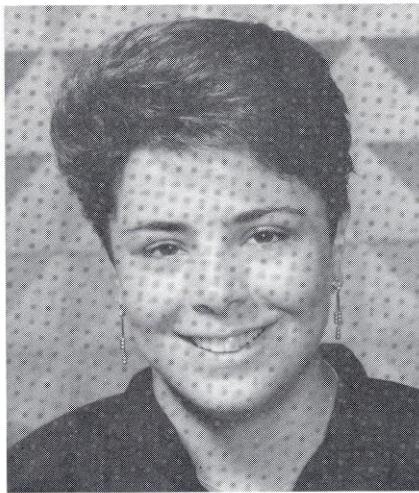
CONNIE CLARK

Former All-America pitcher, Connie Clark joined the Lady Seminole softball staff at the start of the 1990 season, bringing several years of teaching on the national and international level to Florida State.

After earning a bachelor of science degree from Cal State Fullerton in physical education in 1987, Clark worked as a private instructor at the Rod Carew Baseball School in California and conducted clinics in Tokyo, Japan, Auckland, New Zealand and Shanghai, China.

While at Cal State Fullerton, Clark twice participated in the Women's College World Series. In 1986, she led the nation with a 0.18 earned run average pitching for the national championship Titan team. Her senior season, she finished third in the nation with 33 wins, including a 4-0 victory over FSU at the World Series. She was also named All-America and won the prestigious Broderick Award for Collegiate Softball Player of the Year.

A recognized clinician speaker on pitching, Clark works with Florida State's nationally ranked pitching staff in addition to coaching first base for the Lady Seminoles. She is also extensively involved in recruiting new athletes to FSU.

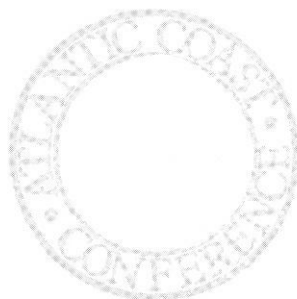


CJ URSE

New to the Lady Seminole coaching staff this year is graduate assistant, C.J. Urse, a native from Columbus, Ohio who has made her way to Tallahassee after a successful four-year career at Ohio State. As graduate assistant, Urse will assist Connie Clark with recruiting, practices, and specialized work with the outfield.

The former Buckeye was captain of her squad for the 1991 season and a two-time All-Big Ten Conference selection as well as a four-time Academic All-Big Ten and Scholar-Athlete. Urse was named 1989 Defensive Player of the Year while at OSU and Academic All-Region her junior and senior seasons.

Urse graduated from Ohio State with a physical education degree and is pursuing a graduate degree in professional prep/athletic administration. She is from a family of five and enjoys rollerblading, waterskiing, golf, and basketball.

Columbia, South Carolina native Kelley Kirkland joins the coaching staff at Florida State for the 1992 season. Kirkland, a four-year letter-winner at the University of South Carolina, will assist Graf, Clark and Urse with practices and game operations.

Kirkland, who was recently named a National Softball Coaches Association All-America Scholar Athlete for her outstanding academic achievements, graduated Cum Laude with a degree in physical education and athletic training. She plans on pursuing a masters of physical education.

While playing for the Gamecocks from 1987 to 1991, Kirkland was a utility infielder. In 1989, her squad won the regional championship in Tallahassee, after defeating Florida State and Louisiana Tech, and earned an appearance in the NSCA Softball World Series in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

After finishing her degree, Kirkland hopes to pursue a career in teaching and coaching on the secondary education level.

REVIEW '91

Coming into the season, the Florida State softball team had high expectations - and with good reason. Returning seven starters in the field and two of their top three pitchers, the Lady Seminoles were determined to make a return trip to the College World Series in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

The 1991 season was not a disappointment. Ranked in the nation's Top 20 all season long, Florida State set a school record for wins with 62, en route to the College World Series, their second straight and third in the past five years.

After a slow start, the Lady Seminoles won 49 of 53 games and entered the Region VIII play-offs as one of the hottest teams in the country. FSU continued its streak by rolling through the tournament with three straight wins. They defeated Southwestern Louisiana 1-0 and Oklahoma State 2-0. In the championship game they beat Oklahoma State again, 4-3, to advance to the College World Series.

As was the case for most of the season, Penny Siqueiros and Christy Larsen led Florida State in the playoffs. Larsen picked up two wins on the mound and Siqueiros went 4 for 8 at the plate with two RBI's. Larsen closed out her career with 33 victories and was named third-team All-America. Siqueiros led the team in seven offensive categories.

In Oklahoma City, FSU opened the College World Series with a 1-0 loss to defending national champion UCLA. The Lady Seminoles bounced back to knock off UNLV 3-1 and finished the 1991 season by falling to Fresno State 3-0 and leaving the Series tied for 5th place.



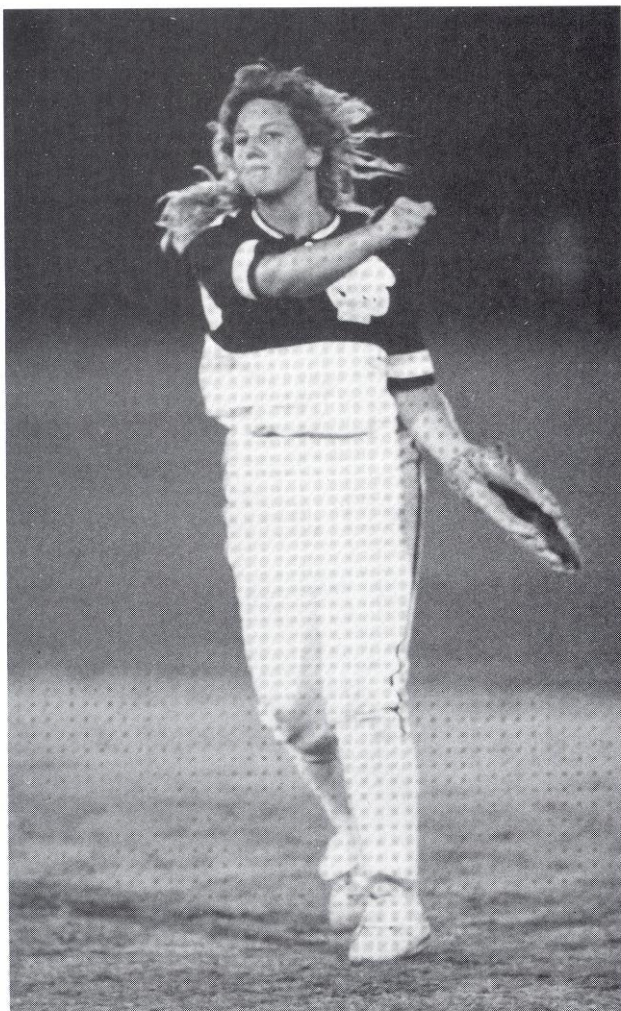

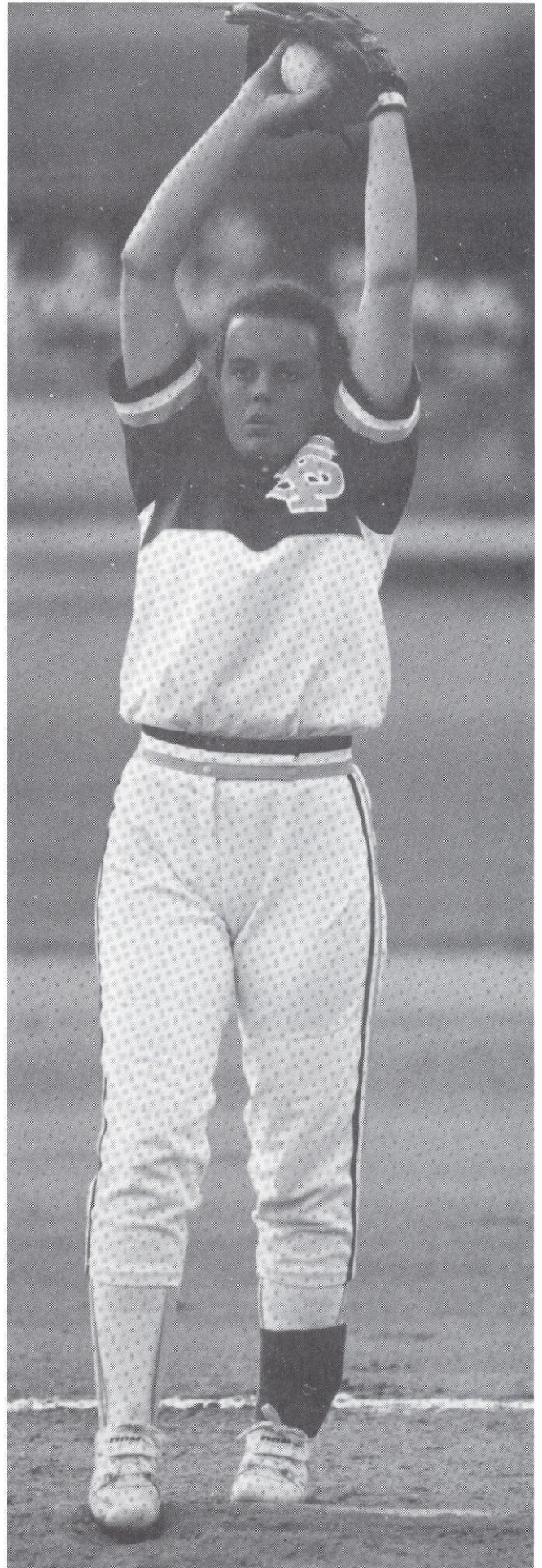
