FSU SAND VOLLEYBALL FACTS

AN EMERGING SPORT

- Entering its third season of collegiate competition, sand volleyball is the fastest growing "emerging sport" in NCAA history.
- In 2014, sand volleyball has passed the important threshold of 40 sanctioned programs. With 41 schools participating this season, assuming they all come back for more in 2015, sand volleyball qualifies to be considered for an NCAA National Championship in 2016.
- Sand volleyball has five scholarships to divide among a roster of 15 players in 2014. The sport will have six divisible scholarships in 2015.
- Players will not wear the "traditional" sand volleyball uniform of a bikini. The AVCA concept calls for a two-piece uniform- shorts or briefs and a top, or a one-piece.

THE RULES

- Each team competition is called a "dual" and will consist of five matches of pairs. The winning team will need to win three matches in a best-of-five format. The separate matches will be conducted as best-of-three set competitions, with rally scoring to 21 in the first two sets and to 15 in the third. Teams must win by at least two points in all cases.
- Sand volleyball differs from court volleyball in ways other than the numbers of players. No open hand tipping is allowed. The block touch is allowed as the first of three allowable contacts. Coaches may only speak to players or give any feedback during time-outs or in between sets. Finally, to mitigate the impact of the sun and wind, the players switch sides of the court every seven points in a 21 point set and every five points in a 15 point set. The court is smaller at 8' m x 8' m, while indoor is 9' m x 9' m.

AT FLORIDA STATE

- Head Coach Danalee Corso was the first full-time sand volleyball coach in the country.
- FSU's inaugural sand volleyball team featured 16 players: nine sand-only players and seven players from the FSU indoor squad. The 2014 team has 19 players 14 sand-only players and five players from the indoor team.
- If a player has an indoor volleyball scholarship, they can play sand volleyball, but a sand volleyball scholarship athlete cannot play on the indoor volleyball team.

GAMEDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

- All competitions will be played at the sand volleyball courts, located north of the soccer and softball complex and between the track and field complex and the parking garage.
- Parking will be available in the lot across from the courts and in the adjacent parking garage.
- Spectators are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs to the event, but there will also be eight sets of bleachers.
- No alcohol is permitted. No dogs are allowed. Tents behind the bleachers are permissible.

2014 SEASON PREVIEW

Following back-to-back East Region championships and AVCA National Championship Final Four appearances, the Florida State sand volleyball team's goal for the 2014 season is clear.

Head Coach Danalee Corso and the Seminoles are chasing a national championship in Year 3 of the emerging sport.

"Every year we are gunning for that national championship," Corso said. "We've made it to the Final Four and to get to the final would be our next priority. We've gotten so close. I really believe we can this year. We'll have to play our best. We have some great players on this team. We might surprise some people.

"I feel very confident about this team. They are better than I thought they'd be at this point. We push them really hard. They are ready to play. They are competitive – they are more mature. I believe we can win it all this year."

The Seminoles are coming off a 2013 season where they posted a 15-2 regular season mark and a 17-4 dual match record overall.

The 'Noles had big wins against then-No. 3 USC in Los Angeles, Calif. and defended their Fiesta on Siesta Team Cup title in Siesta Key, Fla. for the second year in a row.

Florida State opened the AVCA National Championship in Gulf Shores, Ala., by routing Louisiana-Monroe, 5-0, before dropping a nail-biter to No. 2 seed and eventual national champion Long Beach State, 3-2. Facing elimination against UNF a few hours later, FSU regrouped and swept the Ospreys, 5-0. The Seminoles eventually fell to national champion runner-up Pepperdine, 3-2, in the semifinals and placed third at the AVCA National Championships for the second consecutive season.

FSU returns nine of its 10 2013 AVCA National Championship participants, as well as five players who are veterans of both national championships. It wouldn't be a stretch to say Florida State – which opened the season ranked No. 4 in the AVCA Preseason Poll – has the most experience of any team in the nation.

"I'm glad that the team isn't satisfied" Corso said. "I get paid to win here at Florida State because that's what we do. That's why I came to Florida State – to win National Championships."

The Seminoles feature four All-Americans among 19 players on their 2014 roster, including juniors Jace Pardon and Sarah Wickstrom, who captured

the honor in a year ago and advanced to the national championship pairs quarterfinals as FSU's No. 1 tandem to close last season.

Florida State also returns senior Aurora Davis, a 2012 All-American who is a three-time team captain, and senior Fatma Yildirim, who was an indoor volleyball All-American for the Seminoles in 2012 and came back to FSU for a third sand season this spring after spending the fall practicing with the Turkish indoor volleyball national team.

Pardon, Wickstrom, Davis, Yildirim and junior Stephanie Pellitteri are all seeking to compete in their third straight national championship event giving FSU a talented veteran core.

In addition to being the program's leader in wins (73) and an All-American, Pardon has found success on the international scene as a member of Team USA. She won the USA Volleyball High Performance U21 Gold Medal in 2013 and finished ninth at the 2013 U21 World Championships in Umag, Croatia.

Wickstrom, the starting setter on the indoor team, teamed with Pardon at the end of last season and has the versatility to mesh seamlessly with many different partners through the course of the season as she also practices with the indoor Noles.

Davis has won 82 percent of her contests over two years while typically competing on Courts 1, 2 and 3. Davis was a walk-on defensive specialist on the indoor volleyball team in the fall, giving her even more valuable experience to draw from for the upcoming sand season.

Yildirim has spent time on Courts 1 through 5 over the past two years and has accumulated 34 wins.

Stephanie Pellitteri has improved every season and matured into one of the Seminoles' leaders. Last season she teamed with her sister, sophomore Kristina Pellitteri, to dominate the all-comers en route to a teambest 34-5 record and a silver bracket championship at the Florida State pairs tournament in April.

The Seminoles also return junior Melanie Pavels, and sophomores Julie Brown and Katherine Plessy – all of whom saw significant time in the sand last season.

Pavels competed at the 2013 national championship event, but suffered an injury right before the inaugural National Championships in 2012. She teamed with Brown to capture the No. 7 seed at the 2013 national championship pairs event, but lost in the first round.

following her drastic improvement from the beginning of her freshman season to the end. Classmate Kayla Joyce collected the 2013 Seminole Warrior Award for her work ethic and performance in the weight room. Joyce is expected to have a more prominent role in the lineup this spring.

Junior Katie Mosher, sophomores Lexy Ryan, Annie
Montgomery and Blyss Harkness round out the 2014
returners on the roster, while the Noles welcome sandonly freshman Sierra Sanchez and Julia Thompson.

Mosher is an All-ACC libero for the indoor team. Junior Mercedes Vaughn and freshmen Milica Kubra and Hailey Luke also join the sand volleyball team from the indoor squad.

Depth will not be an issue for Head Coach Danalee Corso. She will have plenty of options leading up to the AVCA National Championships May 2-4 in Gulf Shores,

Their first matchup of the season will be a trip to St. Augustine Beach in a two-day event against North Florida, Florida International, Louisiana-Monroe and Jacksonville from March 8-9. Florida State has yet to lose to a school from the East Coast.

"The East Coast gets stronger every year." Corso said. "We have some new teams joining this season. I'm never one to take anyone lightly. It will be great to be tested by some of the top teams on the East at the start of the season.

FSU will then take its annual trip to the West Coast where the Seminoles will face off against some of the best schools in the nation, including a much anticipated head-to-head dual match against defending national champion Long Beach State on March 12 in Long Beach, Calif.

Two days later, Florida State will travel north to Los Angeles for a two-day event against USC, UCLA, Loyola Marymount and Long Beach State.

The 'Noies will host their first home match of the season March 29-30 when UAB and LSU come to Tallahassee for a two-day event.

The Seminoles will look to defend their Fiesta on Siesta Team Cup title April 12-13 in Siesta Key, Fla. Florida State has won the Fiesta on Siesta Team Cup title the past two seasons.

The FSU Pairs Tournament kicks off April 18-19 in Tallahassee, Fla. Georgia State, Louisiana-Monroe, and South Carolina will compete.

Florida State will stay home the next weekend for an intrasquad tune-up on April 26 before the National Championships.

HEAD COACH • 3RD SEASON • CAREER RECORD: 33-6

In just two years, the Florida State sand volley-ball program has produced five All-Americans, advanced to consecutive AVCA National Championship Final Fours and collected a 30-2 mark in regular season dual match competition.

The Seminoles are a bona fide juggernaut and unquestionably the nation's top program in the East as sand volleyball enters Year 3 of emerging sport status.

The architect of the success is Danalee Corso (formerly Danalee Bragado), a former professional beach volleyball player and coach, whose detailed instruction, motivation and recruiting has jump-started the Garnet & Gold program to the top of the pack among sand volleyball teams.

As one of the most respected teachers of the sport in the world, Corso continues to push the NCAA's latest emerging sport and the Seminoles to new heights.

Florida State finished the 2012-13 season with a 17-4 dual match record. Corso led the Seminoles to their second consecutive semifinal at the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships after falling to No. 1 seeded and national champion runner-up Pepperdine, 3-2. Top pair and 2013 All-Americans, Jace Pardon and Sarah Wickstrom, reached the pairs quarterfinals at the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships. The `Noles had big wins against then No. 3 USC in Los Angeles, Calif. and defended their Fiesta on Siesta Team Cup title in Siesta Key, Fla. for the second year in a row.

FSU was at the forefront of sand volleyball's first season of collegiate competition in 2012. The Seminoles hired Corso as the nation's first full-time head coach in the summer of 2011 and she went to work building and preparing a championship caliber team. The results were impressive to say the least.


In her first season, the Seminoles didn't lose a regular season dual match, sporting a 15-0 mark and a 72-3 overall record in pairs play in dual contests. Florida State also captured the team titles at Clash of Collegians, FSU Sand Tournament, UNF Invitational and the Fiesta at Siesta Key.

The Garnet & Gold won six pairs championships throughout the season and the top tandems of Jekaterina Stepanova and Jace Pardon and Aurora Newgard and Brittany Tiegs advanced to the semifinals and quarterfinals, respectively, of the first-ever AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships in Gulf Shores, Ala., in April.

At the national tournament, Stepanova, Newgard and Tiegs earned three of the 10 individual All-America awards from the AVCA.

FSU's success should come as no surprise since Corso has enjoyed a standout career as a player and coach. She is well-known throughout the beach volleyball circuit after a highly successful professional career both domestically and internationally.

Corso was born and raised in Hawaii and graduated from Punahou School. Corso is a graduate of Loyola Marymount University, in Los Angeles, Calif., where she majored in business and played indoor volleyball from 1989-92. She captained the team and was a First Team All-West Coast Conference pick. After graduating she went straight to the women's pro beach tour for one year prior to 13 seasons excelling in several professional double



tours. In 1989, Corso played professional court volleyball in Paris, France for Racing Club de Villibeon.

In 2004, Corso received a Brazilian Pro Beach Coaching Accreditation and helped coach the United States National Beach Volleyball Team from 2004-07 as the coach of national team members, Rachel Wacholder and Tyra Turner. She has also coached 2008 Summer Games Olympian Nicole Branagh as well as top professionals Makare Wilson, Michelle More and Suzanne Stonebarger.

In 1993, Corso started Aloha Ball Club, a beach volleyball academy in Hermosa Beach, Calif. In 2004, her husband Brian Corso, another pro beach player joined her in the business which branched out to a full service academy that offers classes and private lessons for amateurs and professionals as well as sport specific fitness training.

She was also head coach of the USA Junior National Beach Team where she coached 12 pairs of men and women that competed at the Under-19 and Under-21 U.S. National Teams, and of the World University Championship (WUC). Her teams' accomplishments included a silver medal in the Boys Under 19 team World Championships and a bronze medal in the Boys WUC.

Some of Corso's greatest playing achievements include being ranked among the top 10 teams for nine years on the USA Volleyball Pro Tour. In 1996, she was the No. 15 ranked team in the world on the FIVB tour. Her finishes include a 2nd place finish at a FIVB World Series event in Osaka, Japan, a 3rd place finish in Deerfield Beach, Fla. on USA Pro Beach Tour and a 1st place finish at a FIVB Satellite Tournament in Jona, Switzerland. In 1998, on the Switzerland Pro Beach Tour, her team was ranked the No. 1 team of the tour and she was voted MVP. Corso won the 1995 Motherlode Open in Aspen, Colo. Corso also took first place at two NORCECA Tournaments in both San Juan, Puerto Rico and Mexico City in 2003.

Corso and her family moved to Tallahassee after she spent 20 years in Los Angeles. Her husband Brian Corso has a Master's Degree in Sports Science, and coaches with her as the assistant coach of the FSU sand volleyball team. They have two young children, Camryn and Asher.

ASSISTANT COACH BRIAN CORSO



A former professional beach and indoor volleyball player, Brian Corso is married to Florida State sand volleyball head coach Danalee Corso. He and his wife form a cohesive coaching tandem that has produced two consecutive appearances for FSU in the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships.

Last year, FSU had two All-Americans in Jace Pardon and Sarah Wickstrom, and finished third at the 2013 AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships for the second consecutive year. The Seminoles finished 17-4 overall in dual match play.

In 2012, Florida State finished third at the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships and collected three individual All-America honors, while capturing a 15-0 dual match record in the regular season.

In two seasons as the Seminoles' assistant head coach, Corso has helped the Seminoles become a national power in the growing sport. FSU is returning four of its top five teams from the 2013 season and will look to challenge for the National Championship again.

Brian Corso has already coached five All-Americans in two seasons. In addition to Pardon and Wickstrom capturing the honors in 2013, Aurora Davis (formerly Newgard), Jekaterina Stepanova and Brittany Tiegs were part of the inaugural sand volleyball All-America class in 2012.

Corso played collegiate indoor volleyball at San Diego State from 1995-99 and was an assistant coach with the University of San Diego in 2002-03. He played on the AVP Tour and was the head coach of the L.A. College's women volleyball team in 2009 in addition to his career as a beach volleyball fitness and conditioning specialist since 2003.

He also coached the Costa Rican junior national squad from 2006-08 and was a USA junior national beach team coach during that same span.

He and Danalee are the proud parents of two young children, Camryn and Asher.

DIRECTOR OF VOLLEYBALL CHRIS POOLE



As Florida State's Director of Volleyball, Seminoles' indoor volleyball head coach Chris Poole has been in charge of developing FSU's newest sport. Poole has been very successful at the helm of the FSU indoor volleyball program since coming to Florida State in 2008.

He has led the Garnet & Gold indoor volleyball team to unprecedented heights, including the Seminoles' and the ACC's first-ever trip to the NCAA Final Four in 2011 and back-to-back seasons with at least 28 wins in 2011 and 2012.

In 2012, the Seminoles won their third Atlantic Coast Conference title under Poole and the program's fourth overall. Florida State finished with a remarkable 28-4 overall record, earning back-to-back conference crowns for the first time in the ACC since Maryland achieved the feat in 2003 and 2004.

In 2013, the Seminoles advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament and finished second in the Atlantic Coast Conference. FSU finished with a 26-8 overall record and a 16-3 conference record.

The Seminoles tied a school record with the 2011 squad by defeating five AVCA Top 25 opponents and are one of just three teams (Southern California and Western Kentucky) who have garnered 28 wins or better in the last two seasons (2011 and 2012).

Poole has a 130-34 overall record with the Noles, including a 31-3 campaign in 2009.

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT TYLER BERRY



Tyler Berry is in his first year as the volunteer assistant coach with the Florida State sand volleyball team. Berry arrives to Tallahassee after spending a year as a volunteer assistant coach with the women's indoor volleyball program at UW-Milwaukee.

Berry's responsibilities with the Seminoles include operations, administrative duties, player development and directing summer camps.

Berry earned his undergraduate degree and played collegiate volleyball at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wis.

Following college, Berry became the beach director and coach for the North Shore Milwau-kee Beach junior club boys' volleyball team, training over 80 boys and girls in the club's first year.

Berry grew up in St. Louis, Mo. and played for the St. Louis High Performance. His club team won junior boys nationals in 2007. Berry played high school volleyball and earned all-conference and all-state accolades at Kirkwood High School.

He is currently pursuing a master's degree in sports management at Florida State.



FSU took two other matches to three sets against the 49ers in a dual that was closer than the score indicated.



The Seminoles improved to 11-2 on the season with a 5-0 victory over No. 9 Tulane and a 4-1 win over GSU.

FSU swept every court in two sets against Tulane, led by sophomore Stephanie Pellitteri and freshman Nina Pellitteri on court five, who won 21-10, 21-16 as Stephanie recorded six aces.

Senior Mallory Kiley and sophomore Sarah Wickstrom (Court 4), sophomore Melanie Pavels and freshman Julie Brown (Court 3), senior Fatma Yildirim and junior Aurora Davis (Court 2), and senior Maria Milosavljevic and sophomore Jace Pardon (Court 1) all also grabbed easy victories and didn't drop a set against their Green Wave opponents.

Following the morning victory, Florida State took care of a tougher Georgia State squad.

With the same lineup, the Seminoles swept courts No. 3, 4 and 5 with the Pellitteri's leading the way again by cruising to a 21-5, 21-6 victory.

Davis and Yildirim used three sets to dispatch GSU's Jansen Button and Sara Olivora on Court 2, while Pardon and Milosavlejevic were the only Noles to lose in the dual matches, falling on Court 1 to the Panthers' Lane Carico and Katie Madewell.

The day wrapped up with opening pool play for the "Gold" bracket tournament, featuring the No. 1 and No. 2 teams from FSU, GSU, Tulane and ULM.

Milosavljevic and Pardon fell by forfeit to ULM's McNamee and Grabiec after Milosavljevic rolled her ankle early in the first set. Freshman Katherine Plessy replaced her during play on April 7.

Brown and Pavels moved up to No. 2 for the "Gold" bracket and fell to ULM's No. 1 team of Sukach and Markova.

DAVIS AND PLESSY LEAD NO. 3 FSU AT GEORGIA STATE

ATLANTA, Ga. - Junior Aurora Davis and freshman Katherine Plessy captured the pairs championship in the "Silver" bracket to lead the No. 3-ranked Florida State sand volleyball team on April 7 during the final day of competition at Georgia State's tournament.

Davis and Plessy defeated teammates senior Mallory Kiley and sophomore Sarah Wickstrom for the "Silver" title, 21-16, 21-16, at the GSU sand volleyball complex to wrap up the two-day event.

"Today was the best day we've had so far this season," head coach Danalee Corso said. "Aurora and Katherine were great and Julie and Melanie, who moved up to No. 2, were very solid. Today was the first day I felt like we really got everything in our control right. We had some injuries (seniors Fatma Yildirim and Marija Milosavljevic), but our subs really stepped up. We got a lot of rest this past week and it paid off. The team is rounding into shape and I'm looking forward to the next few weeks leading up to the National Championships."

Also, competing on April 7 were sophomore Stephanie Pellitteri and freshman Nina Pellitteri and the pair of junior Jeassica McGregor and sophomore Jace Pardon.

The Pellitteri sisters lost to Davis and Plessy in the "Silver" bracket and finished in a tie for third, while McGregor and Pardon fell in a tough threeset affair, 16-21, 21-19, 15-11, to GSU's Carico and Madewell in the "Gold" bracket. Carico was an All-American indoor player at Miami, but Pardon went toe to toe with her in one of the tournament's most exciting matches.


All 10 FSU pairs played two best-of-three matches in a warm-up for the national championship event from May 3-5 in Gulf Shores, Ala.

FSU RETURNS TO NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP SEMIFINALS

GULF SHORES, Ala. - The No. 3-seeded Florida State sand volleyball team advanced to the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championship semifinals for the second straight year, finishing 2-1 in dual match play on May 3.

2013 MATCH RECAPS

NOLES FALL TO PEPPERDINE IN NATIONAL SEMIFINALS

GULF SHORES, Ala. - The No. 3-seeded Florida State sand volleyball team battled hard, but ultimately fell to defending national champion and No. 1-seeded Pepperdine, 3-2, in the 2013 AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championship Semifinals on May 4.

The Noles advanced to the nation's "Final Four" for the second consecutive year and have firmly planted the Garnet and Gold as the East Coast's top program, having only lost to the Waves and No. 2 seeded Long Beach State in two years.

Florida State's No. 1 and No. 2 tandems still have an opportunity to capture a National Championship in the 16-team, single-elimination pairs tournament on May 5.

The Garnet and Gold opened the semifinals with a 1-0 lead before play even started after Pepperdine chose to forfeit on Court 1 following an injury.

The Noles battled hard on all four courts during the match, but only Stephanie and Nina Pellitteri captured a victory, taking down Pepperdine's Emily Cook and Katie Messing, 21-12, 21-17, to finish the 2013 season with a remarkable 34-5 record together.

On Court 4, seniors Mallory Kiley and Fatma Yildirim traded leads with Waves Victoria Adelhelm and Taylor Racich in the first set before ultimately losing, 21-19, 21-15.

Kiley, a co-captain this season, wrapped up a brilliant two-year stretch on the sand volleyball team, finishing with 59 career wins and competing in two National Championships.

Junior Aurora Davis and freshman Katherine Plessy battled tough on Court 3, but couldn't overcome the Pepperdine duo of Kelley Larson and Kellie Woolever, falling 21-18, 21-18.

Davis joined Stephanie Pellitteri, Kiley, Pardon, Yildirim and Wickstrom as twotime National Championships participants.

Brown and Pavels also fought to the end on Court 2 against Lara Dykstra and Caitlin Racich, of Pepperdine, but lost, 21-16, 21-19. The duo tied the match 19-19 in the second set, but Pepperdine rallied back.

FSU finished the second season of collegiate sand volleyball with an impressive 17-4 dual match record.





FSU CAPS SEASON IN PAIRS QUARTERFINALS

GULF SHORES, Ala. - The No. 3-ranked Florida State sand volleyball team's 2013 season came to a close on May 5 during pairs tournament play at the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championship.

FSU's No. 1 tandem of sophomores Jace Pardon and Sarah Wickstrom won their first round match against UNF's Anna Budinska and Dagnija Medina, 21-12, 19-21, 15-8, in the 16-team, single-elimination pairs bracket, before falling in the quarterfinals to FIU's Jessica Mendoza and Maryna Samoday, 21-19, 21-15 on a morning filled with heavy gusts of wind.

It was the second consecutive year that Pardon advanced to the quarterfinals. The Manhattan Beach, Calif., native made the semifinals with former Nole Kate Stepanova last season.

High speed winds and a scattered shower made for an interesting morning of play. Early in the first round matches teams relied completely on ball control as unpredictable winds dictated where the ball would land.

Pardon and Wickstrom dominated their Osprey opponents in the first set in round one, 21-12, before dropping a close second set, 19-21. Led by a couple of resounding Wickstrom kills, the Noles ran away with the third set by opening with a 5-0 lead en route to a 15-8 win.

In the quarterfinals, Pardon and Wickstrom hung with the FIU duo early in the first set and were barely edged 21-19. In the second set, the All-America pair couldn't get in rhythm, however, as the Panthers built leads of 7-2 and 14-7 before winning 21-15.



NATION'S FIRST-EVER SAND VOLLEYBALL WIN - MARCH 3, 2012



History was made by the Florida State sand volleyball team on Saturday, March 3, 2012, as the Seminoles won the nation's first ever collegiate sand volleyball match at UAB in Birmingham, Ala.

Florida State swept the Blazers, 5-0, only losing one set in the No. 4 matchup.

"We made history today," Florida State head coach Danalee Corso said. "We won the first ever collegiate sand volleyball match. It was awesome. It was great to share it with our team. Everyone felt it. It's something we can look back on and be proud of."

Five dual matches and three exhibitions were played at UAB's newly completed sand volleyball facility located next to West Campus Field in Birmingham.

FSU's No. 1 team of Brittany Tiegs and Aurora Newgard defeated Heather Thomas and Kisten Gallagher, 21-10, 21-12. Tiegs had 13 kills and Newgard recorded a double-double with 10 kills and 14 digs.

The No. 2 tandem of Kate Stepanova (13 kills) and Jace Pardon (14 kills) downed Sarah Secley and Alison Woods, 21-16, 21-18.

FSU's No. 3 pair of Visnja Djurdjevic and Melanie Pavels handled Kate Morrell and Ally Slaughter, 21-15, 21-11. Pavels had 10 kills and 14 digs.

The Garnet & Gold's No. 5 squad of Jeassica McGregor and Sarah Wickstrom dispatched Michele Simmons and Becca Howard, 21-15, 21-14, behind McGregor's 12 digs.




