THE NATION'S NEWEST SPORT

- The NCAA added Beach Volleyball to its list of championship sports in 2016. It became the 90th and newest national championship sport recognized by the NCAA.
- The Seminoles reached the finals at the NCAA Championship in Gulf Shores, Ala. for the second time in May 2018, finishing with a school-record 33 wins as the national runner-ups.
- Florida State introduced what was then called sand volleyball as its 20th varsity sport in the spring of 2012 and competed as an emerging NCAA sport for four seasons.
- The sport changed names from sand to beach volleyball as it is known as the latter at all other levels of play throughout the world.
- Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport with 84 colleges and universities sponsoring the sport as of January 2020.

AN ELITE PROGRAM

- Since the inception of the program in 2012, Florida State has advanced to the AVCA Championships in each of its first four seasons and the first four NCAA Championships in 2016-2019
- Florida State is one of just two beach volleyball programs (along with Pepperdine) to have played in every AVCA and NCAA Championship tournament (2012-19).
- Florida State is the only program to have won four straight conference titles (2016-19).
- The Seminoles finished as the National Runners-up in the 2018 NCAA Championship, advancing through the winner's bracket and taking down No. 5 USC, No. 1 UCLA and No. 3 Hawaii before falling to the Bruins in the finals. It marked the team's second Runner-Up finish after competing in the championship match of the inaugural NCAA Championship in 2016.
- Since 2012, FSU has been recognized with 13 AVCA Beach All-America honors from 10 different players. The Seminoles' ten All-Americans are tied for the third most nationally.
- Through its first eight seasons, Florida State boasts an all-time mark

of 188-41 (.821 winning percentage), including a program record 33 dual match victories in 2018.

- FSU has recorded 78 wins against ranked opponents dating back to the 2013 campaign, including 21 earned in the 2019 season.
- 12 of those ranked wins came against teams in the top-10 and four against teams in the top-5. The Seminoles took down the No. 3, 4 and 5 teams during 2019.
- The Noles took down No. 2 Pepperdine for the first time in school history, 3-2, in Tallahassee during the 2017 season.
- FSU earned the No. 1 overall seed at the 2016 NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship after claiming the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) conference title.
- The Seminoles gathered their fourth-consecutive CCSA Conference title in 2019.

NOLES IN THE CCSA

- Florida State became a charter member of the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association for beach volleyball prior to the start of the 2016 season.
- The Coastal Collegiate Sports Association expanded to 12 members in 2019, welcoming TCU and Southern Miss to a league that also includes Florida State, UAB, College of Charleston, Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Georgia State, LSU, South Carolina, Tulane and UNC Wilmington.
- Florida State is the only school to sponsor beach volleyball in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

ATTRACTING TOP TALENT

- Fourth-year head coach Brooke Niles earned Third Team All-America honors in indoor volleyball at UC Santa Barbara before moving on to a successful professional beach volleyball career. She was named 2009 AVP Beach Defensive Player of the Year and spent four seasons as a member of the USA Beach National Team.
- Niles was named the 2016 AVCA Coach of the Year as she piloted the

Seminole to a then school-record 32 dual-match victories, the CCSA league championship and a No. 1 seed in the inaugural NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship.

- In 2019 Niles was named the 2019 CCSA Coach of the Year. The Seminoles went 13-1 against CCSA competition and earned their fourth straight CCSA Conference Title.
- Assistant coach Jason Lochhead joined the staff full-time in 2019. Lochhead has a plethora of playing and coaching experience on the professional level. He is one of the most famous players to come out of New Zealand as he represented his country in 116 international tournaments. Lochhead played in 131 professional tournaments in his career, earning two third-place finishes and 22 finishes in the top-10. In 2014 he got into coaching as he helped coach Canada's Ben Saxton and Chaim Schalk to the Olympics where they qualified for the main draw, with an upset over Brazil in pool play, before losing in the first round. In 2017 Lochhead took over as the coach for Phil Dalhausser and Nick Lucena. Lochhead helped coach Dalhausser and Lucena to eight AVP wins and four FIVB wins, including wins at the 2017 Gstaad Major, the 2017 World Tour Finals and the 2018 Fort Lauderdale Major.
- Volunteer assistant coach Jon Justice stepped into a leadership position on the team for the first time in 2019. Seminoles fans may recognize his name from his gold medal finish at the USA Volleyball Collegiate Beach Championship last season with partner Adam Wienckowski, as the two donned the Gamet and Gold throughout the competition and onto the FISU World University Championship in Munich, Germany.
- FSU Beach Volleyball has historically attracted some of the nation's best players to the program. Among those include 2016 AVCA All-American Sarah Putt and AVCA High School Beach All-American First Team selections Kate Privett Maddie Anderson

FLORIDA STATE BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Through its first eight seasons, Florida State boasts an all-time mark of 188-41 (.821 winning percentage), including a program-record 33 dual match victories in 2018.

Florida State advanced to the AVCA Championships in each of its first five seasons and the NCAA Championship in 2016-2019

FSU is just one of two beach volleyball programs (along with Pepperdine) to have played in the first four AVCA Championships (2012-15) and the first four NCAA Championships (2016-19).

Since 2012, FSU has been recognized with 13 AVCA Beach All-America Honors from 10 different players. The Seminoles' 10 All-Americans are the third most all-time.

Brooke Niles was named the 2016 AVCA Coach of the Year as she piloted the Seminoles to a CCSA Championship, the top seed in the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship and a school-record 32 dual match victories. In 2019 she was named CCSA Coach of the Year as she guided the Noles to their fourth straight CCSA Championship

SEMINOLE BEACH VOLLEYBALL COURTS



Completed in 2011, the Seminole Beach Volleyball courts was one of the first facilities to be built specifically for collegiate beach volleyball. Located north of the Seminole Soccer Complex and JoAnne Graf Field between Mike Long Track and the Spirit Way Parking Garage, the facility is wrapped in Florida State University graphics and logos highlighting the enormous success of the FSU Beach Volleyball team during the sport's first eight years. The Seminole Beach Volleyball Courts remain one of the premier facilities in the nation.

There are three entrances where patrons can enter the facility, with seating for approximately 150 people on the bleachers at sand level. The multi-level parking garage adjacent to the courts can also be used for spectator viewing. Spectators are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs to the event as well. The courts are also equipped with permanent lighting to allow matches to be played at night.

The Seminole Beach Volleyball Courts were built using two types of sand. The lower level of sand is more powdery to allow precipitation to filter through to the drainage system. The upper level of sand is more dense, allowing student-athletes a competitive playing surface each time out.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL LOCKER ROOM



- Tully Gymnasium is the home of the Florida State beach volleyball team, housing the coaches' offices, team lounge and locker room. Renovations to the Seminoles' new locker room were completed in January of 2016 thanks to the support of the FSU Athletics Department and Seminole Boosters.
- The locker room features individual lockers for each student-athlete identified with their own personal name plate, individual shower stalls and bathrooms. The lockers include plenty of storage for both hanging clothes and folded items along with power outlets that also feature USB ports.
- The team lounge provides ample space to hold team meetings, watch film or to give the beach volleyball student-athletes a quiet place to study. The lounge is equipped with a 64 inch HD-television screen, couches and chairs for plenty of comfort.
- A satellite workout facility is located just outside the beach volleyball office in Tully Gym featuring state-of-the-art equipment. The Tully Gym weight room is a clean and spacious 4,500 square foot facility equipped with mondo-rubber flooring, 10 squat racks, and houses 10 platforms for Olympic lifting. With an iPad on every rack and a change of facility design, Florida State continues to improve each of its strength and conditioning facilities.

THE CCSA

The FSU Beach Volleyball program joined the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) as a charter member prior to the spring 2016 season.

CCSA Beach Volleyball began play in the spring of 2016 with eight founding members: University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), Florida Atlantic University, Florida International University, Florida State University, Georgia State University, Louisiana State University (LSU), the University of South Carolina and Tulane University. The CCSA announced the addition of College of Charleston and UNC Wilmington to the sport of beach volleyball, expanding the conference to 10 members for the spring 2017 championship. In the spring of 2020 the CCSA added two more institutions with the addition of Missouri State and Louisiana Monroe to bring the conference to 12 institutions.

The CCSA, which was formerly known as the Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association at the Division I level, rebranded to include beach volleyball for the upcoming season.

Beach Volleyball became the 90th championship sponsored by the NCAA in 2015-16 after being officially recognized as an NCAA sport for 2011-12. The first NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shores, Alabama, was hosted by CCSA member UAB. The creation of CCSA Beach Volleyball provides student-athletes the opportunity to compete

for conference honors and championships. The NCAA does not currently offer automatic qualification (AQ) into the beach volleyball championship for conference winners (a two-year championship history is required), but the CCSA will be in position to qualify for an AQ should they be offered in 2018.

The CCSA formed in 2007 as a partnership among swimming and diving programs in the Atlantic Sun Conference, Big South Conference, Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference and Southern Conference to provide championship opportunities for men's and women's swimming and diving student-athletes.

Conference growth in swimming and diving now shows 15 institutions with competitors from eight separate Division I multisport conferences. With the addition of beach volleyball, the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association now has 22 member institutions with participants from 11 different NCAA Division I multisport conferences.

Entering her fifth season with the program, head coach Brooke Niles has shaped Florida State beach volleyball into one of the most elite teams in the country, establishing the Seminoles as a national contender every year and a fixture in the AVCA Beach Top-10. In only four seasons with Niles at the helm, the Seminoles have earned two NCAA National Runner-Up finishes and secured four consecutive Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) conference championships.

Niles has led the Seminoles to 42 AVCA Top-10 wins in her four seasons, and since taking over the program prior to the 2016 season, Florida State has lost only once against East Coast teams and teams in the CCSA.

Since establishing the program as a powerhouse in the NCAA beach volleyball community, the Seminoles have seen a number of top performers come through the program to play for Niles. She has led six AVCA All-Americans (Julie Brown and Jace Pardon in 2016, Leigh Andrew and Brooke Kuhlman in 2017, and Vanessa Freire and Tory Paranagua in 2018), one CCSA Pair of the Year (Brown/Pardon, 2016) three CCSA Freshmen of the Year (Nikki Esposito in 2016, Francesca Goncalves in 2017 and Kate Privett in 2018), and 12 All-CCSA performers (Brown/Pardon in 2016, Paranagua/Pellitteri in 2016, Andrew/Kuhlman in 2017, Freire/Paranagua in 2018, Horton/Luke in 2018 and Fitzpatrick/Chacon in 2019).

The team's academic performance has flourished under Coach Niles, as the team continually records one of the best GPAs across the athletics department every year. Macy Jerger became the first three-time CCSA All-Academic Team honoree in 2019, securing the CCSA Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in 2017, 2018 and 2019. Julie Brown, Jace Pardon and Katherine Plessy were all named to the CCSA All-Academic team in 2016. Hailey Luke became the first Seminole to be named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll five times, while Niles has seen 53 ACC Academic Honor Roll awards earned by 31 different athletes. One of her players earned the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrican Postgraduate Scholarship in each of the first three of her tenure, with Katherine Plessy winning in 2016, Leigh Andrew in 2017 and Vanessa Freire in 2018.

2016

Niles led the Seminoles to unprecedented heights during the program's first season as an official NCAA Championship sport. Her first year in Tallahassee was highlighted by a series of program firsts including a school-record for dual-match victories (32), a conference championship, the top seed in the inaugural NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship and a national runner-up finish.

Florida State hit the ground running under Niles, winning its first 14 matches, all on the road, with eight of those victories coming against ranked foes including five ranked in the top-10. One of those wins came against then-No. 2 Southern California in Los Angeles as the Seminoles snapped the Women of Troy's 19-match home win streak. FSU went on to earn the No. 1 overall seed at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship after claiming the 2016 Coastal Colle-

giate Sports Association (CCSA) Conference title.

The Seminoles finished the 2016 campaign as the national runner-up at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shores, Ala. after posting a 3-2 record at the tournament. FSU went on to set the single-season school record for victories in a season with 32 and ranked in the Top 5 of the AVCA national poll all year. Along with their 14-match win streak, the Seminoles also put together a school-record 17-match win streak which saw Florida State outscore the opposition 71-10. At season's end, Florida State registered 19 victories over ranked schools, while posting an 11-3 mark against teams ranked in the Top 10. Niles was recognized for her outstanding effort in her first season at the helm of the Seminole beach volleyball program as she was named National Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

2017

In her second year under the helm, Niles continued the winning tradition of Florida State beach volleyball. The team finished with the second most wins in school history and the third most in the country (29). Niles and the Niles secured back-to-back CCSA Championships after they defeated FIU 3-0 in 34 minutes. Florida State reached their second consecutive NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship appearance and sixth straight postseason appearance, tied for most of any school.

The Seminoles finished the 2017 season in fourth place at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shore, Ala. after going 2-2 at the tournament. The Niles defeated a school record 22 ranked teams during the 2017 season including 13 wins over top-10 teams and three over top-5 teams. The 2017 season saw the Garnet and Gold defeat Pepperdine for the first time in school history as they took down the second-ranked wave in Tallahassee.

Under Niles, Florida State garnered two AVCA All-Americans, six CCSA All-Conference selections, a league-best three student-athletes named to the CCSA All-Academic team in 2016, the CCSA Scholar-Athlete of the Year (Macy Jerger) in 2017, the CCSA Pair of the Year in 2016 (Julie Brown/Jace Pardon) and 10 Seminoles who earned a spot on the CCSA Academic Honor Roll.

2018

Niles set the bar even higher in her third season, scheduling 13 dual matches against ranked opponents in the regular season and finishing with a program-record 33 wins. Florida State reached its third consecutive NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship appearance, and seventh-straight postseason appearance, making FSU one of only two programs to make every NCAA and AVCA National Championship (along with Pepperdine).

The Seminoles went undefeated to make it to the finals of the NCAA Championship for the first time, taking down No. 1 UCLA, No. 3 Hawaii and No. 5 USC along the way. FSU fell to No. 1-overall UCLA in the finals for the team's second NCAA Runner-Up finish under Niles.

FSU tallied 14 wins against AVCA Top-20 opponents in 2018, picking up four wins against higher-ranked teams. Through her three seasons at the helm, the Seminoles have remained undefeated against every East Coast team, and have not lost to a CCSA team since joining the conference in Niles' first year.

Niles saw two more All-Americans in her third season, as Tory Paranagua and Vanessa Freire became the program's 12th and 13th All-Americans. Four Seminoles were named to the CCSA All-Conference team, Macy Jerger earned her second consecutive CCSA Scholar-Athlete of the Year recognition, and the program placed 19 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

2019

Niles had continued success, finishing the 2019 season with another 29 wins. The Seminoles reached their fourth consecutive NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship, and eighth-straight postseason trip, keeping the Seminoles as one of just two teams to do so (Pepperdine). Florida State also won their fourth-straight CCSA Championship Title as they dominated the competition and capped it off with a 3-0 win over LSU in the championship match.

Florida State earned a win in the first round of the NCAA Championship with a 3-0 win over Cal Poly, before losing their next two matches to the top two seeds, UCLA and USC.

Florida State earned a program-high 21 wins over ranked opponents, picking up 12 wins over teams in the AVCA Top-10.

Niles earned her first career CCSA Coach of the Year award as the Seminoles saw two more join the CCSA All-Conference team and Macy Jerger earned CCSA Scholar-athlete of the Year honors for the third straight season. Kate Privett became the third Seminole to earn CCSA Freshman of the Year honors.

Florida State University athletics announced the hiring of U.S. beach volleyball professional Brooke Niles as the Seminoles beach volleyball head coach on June 16, 2015. Niles, a California native who earned All-America honors as a player, has coached at the collegiate, junior college, club and high school levels working with both indoor and sand volleyball teams.

Niles, who earned a law and society degree from UC Santa Barbara in 2003, was a third-team All-American while playing for the Gauchos where she also was a three-time All-Big West selection and named conference freshman of the year. Following her playing career at UCSB, Niles spent three years as an assistant indoor coach at her alma mater before beginning a successful professional beach volleyball career in 2007 that saw her win numerous pro tournaments along with being named the AVP Beach Defensive Player of the Year in 2009.

While climbing to a Top 5 ranking in the National Volleyball Beach League and spending 2010-13 as a member of the USA Beach National Team, Niles was a first alternate for the USA 2012 London Olympic Beach National team. The Woodland Hills native returned to coaching in 2010 at Oxnard Junior College with the indoor team. In 2012 she began coaching professional beach volleyball teams competing on the FIVB World Tour from the USA, Costa Rica and the Netherlands. Most recently Niles coached at Mira Costa High School in California and she was the director, founder and head coach of The Beach Team Club in Hermosa.

"I'm very excited that Brooke joined our volleyball family," said FSU Volleyball Head Coach Chris Poole. "She played beach volleyball and indoor volleyball at the highest level. She has also coached indoor volleyball at a Top 10 level in the NCAA Division I and she has coached and trained with some of the best beach players in the world. The references we got from National Team level players/coaches and Gold Medalist were outstanding. She had a very impressive resume and made an impact on everyone during her visit."

"Brooke will lead the squad in a fantastic way and help the ladies grow and learn in so many ways," said Kerri Walsh a three-time Olympic gold medalist in beach volleyball. "Her competitiveness is truly an asset as it leads her to work hard and push for excellence. She practices what she preaches and this to me is what coaching/teaching is all about."

Niles is married to Nick Lucena, a Florida State graduate, professional beach volleyball player on the AVP Tour and Olympian in the 2016 Olympics in Rio. They have two children, Gunnar and Cole.

FIRST SEASON



Florida State beach volleyball head coach Brooke Niles announced the hiring of Jason Lochhead as the assistant coach on September 18th for the 2019 season.

“I am really excited to have Jason on our staff and working fulltime with our players,” said head coach Brooke Niles. “He has a vast knowledge of volleyball and I love all of his training techniques. He is proven to know how to develop players. He is going to bring a lot to Florida State and we are excited to get started with him.”

Lochhead has a plethora of playing and coaching experience on the professional level. He is one of the most famous players to come out of New Zealand as he represented his country in 116 international tournaments. Lochhead played in 131 professional tournaments in his career, earning two third-place finishes and 22 finishes in the top-10.

In 2014 he got into coaching as he helped coach Canada’s Ben Saxton and Chaim Schalk to the Olympics where they qualified for the main draw, with an upset over Brazil in pool play, before losing in the first round. In 2017 Lochhead took over as the coach for Phil Dalhausser and Nick Lucena.

Lochhead helped coach Dalhausser and Lucena to eight AVP wins and four FIVB wins, including wins at the 2017 Gstaad Major, the 2017 World Tour Finals and the 2018 Fort Lauderdale Major.

In 2018, Lochhead got back in the sand in Hermosa Beach with Dalhausser after Lucena had to pull out from the tournament. In his first professional event since 2016, he and Dalhausser made their way to the quarterfinals before losing to the No. 1 seed and eventual tournament native.

During the 2018-19 season for Florida State, Lochhead served as the Director of Player Development for the Seminoles. With his help, the Noles won their fourth straight conference title making yet another NCAA Tournament. With his help four newcomers earned over 15 wins in their first season, while Kate Privett earned CCSA Freshman of the Year. He also helped develop Madison Fitzpatrick and Alaina Chacon into a formidable No. 1 pair as the two went 14-7 at the top position a season ago, earning themselves second-team Volleyballmag.com All-American honors.

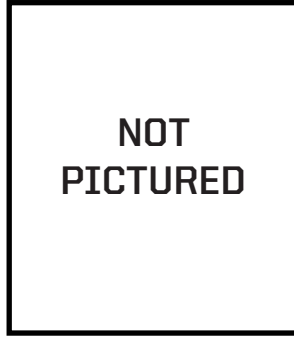

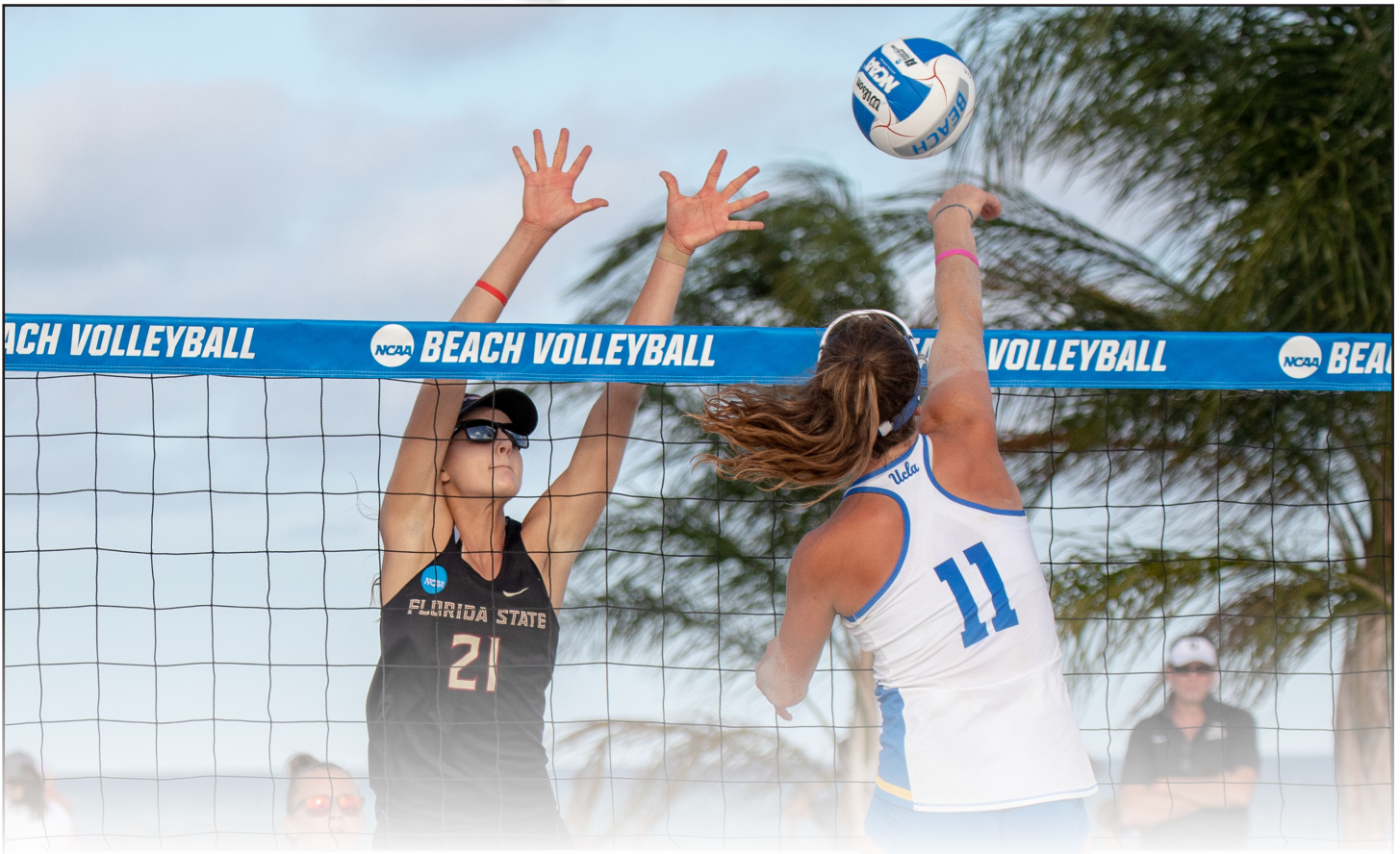

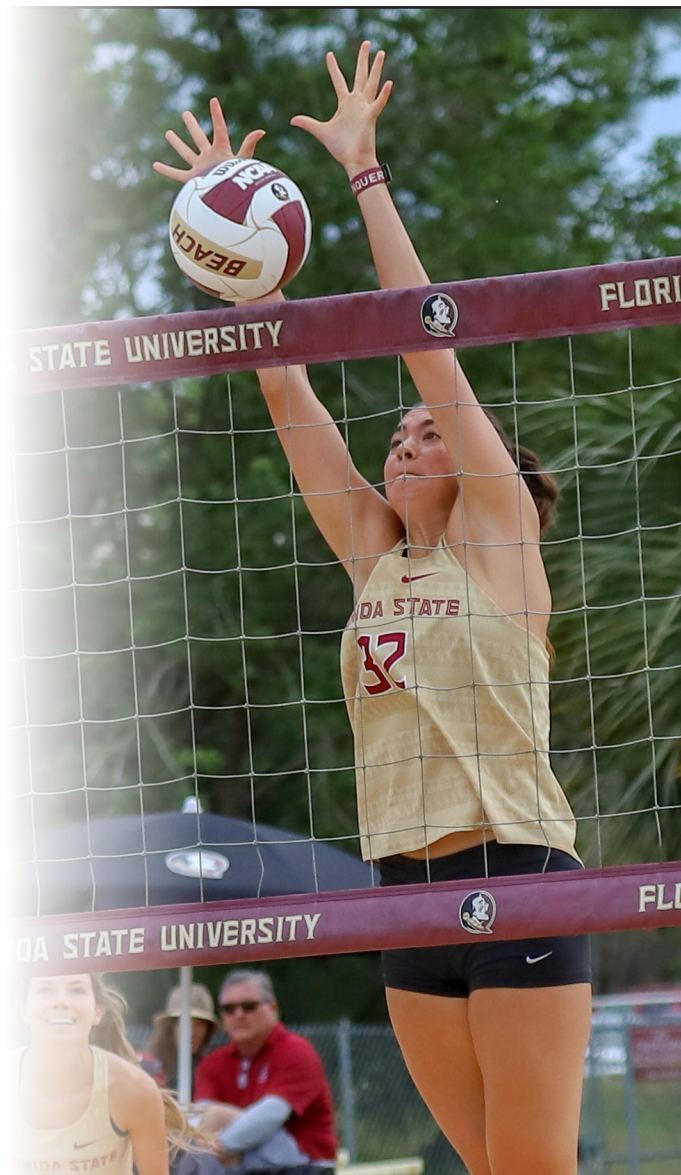

AN ELITE PROGRAM

- » Florida State remained in the AVCA Top-5 for the entire 2019 season, with its highest ranking coming in at No. 3. The Seminoles have been ranked in the top-7 in every AVCA Coaches Poll since the polls inception on Feb. 16, 2015 (51 straight weeks).
- » The program captured its 12th and 13th All-American honors in 2018, which is tied with the most among any beach program.
- » Florida State is one of just two programs to have made every AVCA/NCAA Championship since the sports inception in 2012 (along with Pepperdine).
- » The Seminoles' second-place finish in 2018 is the program's third National Runner-Up finish in its eight years of competition.
- » FSU lost just one match at home, and is now 42-2 in Tallahassee.
- » The Noles are the only program in the country to win four straight conference titles

NOLES GO 29-7 IN 2019

- » 28 of FSU's 36 matches were against opponents ranked in the AVCA Top-20.
- » The Garnet and Gold won 21 matches against ranked opponents, including nine wins over teams in the top-10.
- » The Noles went 9-7 against opponents ranked in the Top-10.
- » Florida State played 25 different pairs with 18 different athletes in 2018, and saw 17 different lineup combinations over the course of the season.

- » FSU continued to make the postseason as they are just one of two teams (Pepperdine) to have made every AVCA/NCAA Championship in Gulf Shores since the sports inception in 2012.
- » For the seventh time in eight trips to the beach volleyball championships Florida State earned at least one win.
- » Florida State's second-place finish in 2018 is the program's third National Runner-Up finish in its eight years of competition.
- » FSU is the only program in NCAA beach volleyball history to have won four straight conference championships

NEWCOMER IMPACT

- Florida State had four student-athletes earned 15+ wins in their first season of competition at Florida State.
- In her first season of beach volleyball, indoor standout, Payton Caffrey led the team in overall wins with 31. She earned CCSA Pair of the Week with Sara Putt (Mar. 13, 2019) and was named the CCSA Pair of the Tournament with Molly McBain. Caffrey earned 26 win on court four putting her tied for third in all-time wins on court four at FSU.

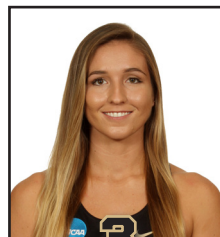

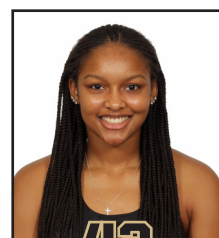
