

FLORIDA STATE 2015 SEASON PREVIEW

The Florida State women's tennis team is coming off a 2014 season where the Seminoles posted a 16-13 record and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. After a strong showing in the fall, the Seminoles are poised for an even bigger season this spring.

"One of the things that we saw in the fall that was most exciting was the play of our underclassmen and newcomers," head coach Jennifer Hyde said. "Our upperclassmen continue to be very solid with much maturity, but to know that the underclassmen and newcomers are such a great compliment to that has shown us that we have a tremendous amount of depth. Having that confidence and knowing that we can rely on the freshmen through the senior class on our squad gives us a level of confidence that is very exciting for everyone on this team."

Florida State returns five players from last year's squad, including three seniors, Danieka Borthwick, Kerrie Cartwright and Mia Vriens, that will all play an integral part towards the team's success this spring.

"I feel like our senior class is a very special class," Hyde said. "They have grown in to great leaders for this program and have been through a lot in the last 2-3 years. They have been to the ACC Championship Finals. They have been through huge wins in the NCAA Tournament. They have had to step up on numerous occasions when this team was short handed, and they have delivered time and time again. They are a really tough and stubborn group of seniors whom I'm very excited to have leading this season."

Borthwick is starting her third season of competition ranked as the No. 46 singles player in the nation.



The senior won six matches in the fall including a team-high three victories over nationally ranked opponents. She reached the qualifier draw at the ITA All-American Tournament after winning three straight matches in a two-day span in Malibu, Calif. In 2014, Borthwick earned All-ACC Third Team honors with a 15-10 singles record and a 14-6 mark in doubles, including a 13-5 record with fellow senior partner Kerrie Cartwright, as they defeated three nationally ranked pairs and qualified for the 2014 NCAA Doubles Championships.

Looking to improve off her most successful season as a Seminole, Cartwright is ready to become one of the leaders of the team this season. She earned All-ACC Second Team honors in 2014 and was ranked as high as No. 117 in singles and closed out the season ranked No. 124. The Nassau, Bahamas native tied Borthwick for the team lead in wins for both singles (15) and doubles (14), and earned four ranked wins over singles opponents last year. Cartwright reached the quarterfinals in both the Bedford Cup and at the USTA Collegiate Clay Court Invitational this fall.

Vriens enters her last season as the only threeyear starter on the team. She sat out this past fall season because of injury, but will be ready to go in the spring. Vriens brings added experience and has played her best tennis in big matches. She put together a solid 2014 dual match season with a 13-9 mark in singles and a 10-8 record in doubles. Her straight-set victory over Arizona's Lauren Marker, 6-3, 6-2, helped FSU to an upset victory over the No. 27 Wildcats in the first round of the NCAA Team Championships.

"These seniors have goals," Hyde said. "They want to win titles this year. They want to win championships. They've been so close. They want to lead this team this year to farther reaching places than any teams have ever gone. After having had a chance to see the newcomers compete during the fall season and all the success we experienced, I think they have a huge amount of confidence in the great things that are ahead for their team in their senior season. They know based on what they've seen from everyone on this team that we are capable of tremendous things this year."

The other two returning letterwinners are sophomore Daniela Schippers and redshirt freshman Emily Fanning.

Schippers is a ruthless competitor and a will to win that makes her very dangerous deeper in matches. She arrived in Tallahassee in January 2014 and immediately made an impact for Florida State, winning



her first singles match against Paula Castro of UAB (6-1, 6-0) to clinch the team match. She clinched five other team matches, including four ACC matches throughout the 2014 season. This fall Schippers strung together four straight singles wins that included a victory in the finals of the consolation bracket at the Bedford Cup.

Fanning saw her freshman season come to a quick halt last season after an injury forced her to sit out the remainder of the year after just four matches. It didn't take her long to get back into the groove of things this fall as she posted nine singles victories, which was the second most on the team, and a team-best eight doubles victories. She reached the finals at the Bedford Cup in singles and the doubles finals at the USTA Collegiate Clay Court Invitational with Borthwick.

One of the main newcomers that is expecting to make a big impact for the Seminoles this season is junior transfer Yukako Noi. A two-time Atlantic 10 First Team selection at VCU, Noi was ranked as high as No. 81 in singles last season. She began her Florida State career with a victory at the ITA All-American Qualifying in Westwood, Calif. Noi had a 6-5 singles record this fall and looks to add depth to the top-end of the Seminoles' lineup.

Freshman Gabriella Castaneda has been spectacular ever since arriving on campus. The Miramar, Fla. native won her first nine collegiate matches en route to a team-best 10 singles wins this fall. During that stretch, Castaneda won singles titles at the Furman Fall Classic and at the Bedford Cup. She defeated No. 39 Frances Altick of Vanderbilt in straight sets and No. 111 Monique Albuquerque from Miami. She was also successful with partner Fanning in doubles with five victories including a win over No. 17 Courtney Colton and Sydney Campbell of Vanderbilt.

The duo of Castaneda and Fanning will start the season as the No. 49 nationally ranked doubles team heading into the spring season.

Lana Rush, the second of three true freshmen on the team, is also expected to see playing time this season after showing promise in her first fall season. Rush won three straight matches at the ITA Southeast Regional Championships to reach the finals of the B Draw. She finished the fall with a 6-4 record.

Freshman Kathryn Phillips rounds out the 2015 Florida State roster. She did not play this fall, but is expected to contribute this spring. Depth and balance will be one of the biggest strengths the Seminoles will have this season. FSU is expected to have eight players fight for the starting six spots and that lineup will most likely change often as the season progresses based on performance and chemistry.

"The people who are going to be No. 7 and No. 8 in our lineup are equally as good as No's. 3, 4, 5 and 6 in our lineup," Hyde said. "This creates a challenging situation for us trying to figure out who will compete in our Top 6 each match, but it is also the best type of situation to be in. Just having confidence in all eight players that are in the lineup is a great thing to have heading into the spring."

The Atlantic Coast Conference is tied for the national lead with seven teams ranked in the Top 25 and 14 of the 15 ACC schools are ranked by the ITA. Conference play will be extremely difficult, but the non-conference schedule isn't much easier with dual matches against No. 3 Florida and No. 39 USF.

"Having a tough schedule is imperative," Hyde said. "Fortunately our conference matches alone are an absolute dogfight and grind every time we step on court. With the addition of other out of conference schools to our schedule, we probably have one of the toughest schedules that we've ever had."

The Seminoles will start its spring season Jan. 17-19 on the road at the Alabama Invitational in Tuscaloosa. No. 8 Alabama will host No. 18 Georgia Tech, No. 30 Florida State and No. 17 Northwestern. This will only count towards individual results as a way to get players back into competition after a long winter break before the dual match season begins. Florida State will then head down to Coral Gables, Fla. for the ITA Kick-off Weekend on Jan. 24-25 to meet No. 12 Miami, No. 39 USF and UNF. Results from that event will decide who will go to Team Indoors in Charlottesville, Va.

The first home dual match will be a double-header against Florida Gulf Coast and Florida A&M (Feb. 14) at 11 a.m. and 5 p.m., respectively. Florida State will also host No. 3 Florida (Feb. 18), Air Force and Mercer (Feb. 21), No. 13 Clemson (Feb. 27), No. 60 Wake Forest (Mar. 1), No. 20 Notre Dame (Mar. 20), No. 73 NC State (Mar. 22), Florida A&M (Mar. 22), No. 68 Syracuse (Mar. 29), No. 4 North Carolina (Apr. 2) and No. 2 Duke (Apr. 4).

The Seminoles road dual matches will be against No. 57 Virginia Tech (Mar. 7), No. 6 Virginia (Mar. 8), No. 39 USF (Mar. 12), No. 18 Georgia Tech (Mar. 17), No. 49 Boston College (Mar. 27), No. 63 Louisville (Apr. 10), Pitt (Apr. 12) and they end the spring season at No. 12 Miami (Apr. 18).

"Playing a tough schedule only better prepares us for the postseason and championship play in April/May," Hyde said. "Being in big moments early in the season and having to work through that adversity will prepare us perfectly to play our best tennis when it counts the most. Our schedule will definitely provide for that week in and week out."

The ACC Championships will be Apr. 23-26 in Cary, N.C. where FSU has reached the quarterfinals in eight straight seasons.



FLORIDA STATE. 2014 FALL SEASON RECAP

The Florida State women's tennis team finished its fall season with a combined 45-32 singles record including wins over three ranked opponents and a 13-14 doubles record. True freshman Gabby Castaneda led the team with 10 singles wins. Five different Seminoles had winning records and will look to take that momentum into the spring dual match season.

ITA PRESEASON RANKINGS

Seniors Daneika Borthwick and Kerrie Cartwright accomplished a No. 9 preseason doubles ranking, which is the highest ranking in school history. Junior Yukako Noi will start the season with a No. 79 singles ranking. Along with Noi, Cartwright was also given a No. 91 singles ranking. With these results, Florida State placed the most players in the ITA preseason rankings since 2010.

FLORIDA STATE WOMEN'S TENNIS ADOPTS A ROAD

It was the team's desire to reach out and support Tallahassee's community and in order to do so this year, the women's tennis team adopted part of Tharpe Road and with it the responsibility to keep it clean and beautiful. We will look for more ways to give back and enrich the city of Tallahassee.

WOMEN'S TENNIS CLAIMS GOLDEN TORCH AWARD

The Golden Torch Award goes to the team with the highest Team GPA amongst Florida State's student-athletes. It is a hard-earned award that the women's tennis team prides itself on year in and year out. The Florida State's women's tennis team GPA was 3.6 and with that the award was secured for the tenth time under head coach Jennifer Hyde. Senior Mia Vriens was named the individual Golden Torch Award winner. She was an ITA Scholar Athlete last year, which contributed to the ITA Academic All-America status earned by the team as well.

FURMAN FALL CLASSIC

Castaneda made a remarkable debut at her very first tournament as a Seminole and took home the Furman Fall Classic Championship title in Greenville, S.C. Along

the way she beat No. 17 ranked Frances Altick from Vanderbilt for her first victory over a ranked opponent. She not only did outstanding in singles, but with redshirt freshman teammate Emily Fanning, the pair went on to play the doubles finals as well, where they lost to Clemson's No. 8 pair of Jessy Rompies and Beatrice Gumulya 8-3, who ended up winning the All-American tournament later in the week. Freshman Lana Rush played extremely well in her first collegiate tournament and earned third place in flight number four.

ITA ALL-AMERICAN TOURNAMENT

The ITA All-American event held in Malibu, California, is one of the biggest tournaments held during the fall season. This event hosts some of the best and highest ranked players in college tennis. Florida State qualified three players this year and was one of only 12 schools in the nation who qualified three or more. Borthwick won three matches in two days to make the qualifier draw, including a win over No. 113 Kenna Kilgo from Texas Tech, and won an additional match against No. 121 Shannon Hudson of Arkansas before losing in a close 6-4, 7-6 match against California's No. 60 Klara Fabikova. Cartwright had an epic battle against Meredith Xepoleas from USC and ended up dropping the match 6-3, 6-7, 3-6 in the final set. Noi defeated No. 69 ranked Gabriella De Santis from Ohio State in her first match before losing in a toe-to-toe match against Texas A&M's No. 34 Saska Gavrilovska 6-3, 7-6.

BEDFORD CUP

Castaneda won her second singles title in as many events by defeating teammate and doubles partner Fanning in straight sets 6-3, 7-5 in the finals of the Bedford Cup in Jacksonville. Fanning showed great advances overall since the beginning of the year as she went 4-1 in singles play. Sophomore Daniela Schippers won her third straight match of the tournament to claim winner of the Consolation B Draw. Schippers defeated Olga Martinez of USF in straight sets 6-4, 7-6. The Seminoles brought home hardware after sweeping the Main B Draw.

ITA SOUTH REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Seminoles finished the ITA South Regional Championship in Atlanta with records of 13-8 in singles and 2-3 in doubles. Rush was the last Seminole standing as she made it to the B Singles Draw finals by winning all six sets in her three matches. She only lost more than two games in a single set once. The London, England, native played against Nerma Caluk of FIU and was unable to continue her weekend success as she fell in straight sets 6-4, 6-2. After winning her first three matches of the tournament, Castaneda improved her season record to an unblemished 9-0. In her third victory, Castaneda was in a grueling three-set fight against Georgia's Mariana Gould that lasted over three hours. After such a demanding match, Castaneda faced off against her toughest opponent of the season in No. 14 Brianna Morgan from Florida. The Florida State true freshman came out in charge taking the first set in a tiebreaker 7-6 (5), but ran out of gas and dropped the match in the third set 6-7 (5), 6-3, 6-4. Noi and Fanning both were able to fight back from opening day losses to end the tournament positively. Fanning won three matches in a row before falling in the semifinals of the A Singles Consolation Draw. No. 79 Noi won her first two matches in the consolation draw before dropping out midway through the second set in her match against Miami's No. 111 Monique Albuquerque.

INAUGURAL MILITARY APPRECIATION EVENT

The Seminoles invited all military service members, past and present, for a clinic with the team at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center on Oct. 24, The event consisted of a hit-around clinic with the women's tennis team and staff, free dinner and prizes. Over 30 veterans and student veterans came out for the event and enjoyed a great night of tennis with the team. The Seminoles will host Air Force on Feb. 21 and has a match set against the Naval Academy in 2016.

USTA COLLEGIATE CLAY COURT INVITATIONAL PRESENTED BY VISIT FLORIDA

The third annual event, hosted by Florida State University, featured men's and women's singles and doubles competitions comprised of players from 30 different teams from Oct. 30-Nov. 2. The USTA Collegiate Clay Court Invitational presented by VISIT FLORIDA is the largest clay court event in college tennis and was played at Disney's ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Kissimmee, Fla. Borthwick and partner Fanning reached the doubles A Draw finals after winning three straight matches to begin the tournament. The Seminoles pair faced off against a talented duo from Auburn in No. 30 Michala Kucharova and Reka Muller.The championship of the doubles A Draw finals came down to a deciding third-set tiebreaker, which was aired on ESPN3. Borthwick and Fanning continued their second set success into the third and jumped out to a fast start leading 8-5. After Auburn came all the way back to take a 9-8 advantage, Florida State's No. 1 doubles team kept fighting in the back-and-forth tiebreaker until it eventually fell, 12-14. Kucharova and Muller were crowned champions by defeating Borthwick and Fanning 7-6 (5), 1-6, 1-0 (12). Noi and Fanning were both able to reach the semifinal rounds in the singles B Draw after winning five matches combined.

JENNIFER HYDE



HEAD COACH -- 11TH SEASON

Hometown: Alpharetta, Ga. College: Florida State '95

Jennifer Hyde enters her 11th season at the helm of the Florida State program as FSU's winningest women's tennis coach. Hyde surpassed Anne Davis (1980-86) with her 142nd career win on March 22, 2014 against NC State. Hyde has led the Seminoles to eight straight NCAA appearances, including their first ever Sweet 16 in 2010. With an exceptional list of accomplishments and milestones from her career at FSU, including an honor of ITA South Region Coach of the Year in both 2011 and 2007, Hyde looks to guide the Seminoles deep into the NCAA tournament in 2015.

The Seminoles posted a solid 16-13 season in 2013-14 with ranked wins over five opponents, including an exciting 4-3 upset victory over No. 27 Arizona in the first round of the 2014 NCAA Championships. FSU finished eighth in the ACC regular season and with a 4-1 win over No. 64 Syracuse in the opening round advanced to the quarterfinals of the ACC Championships for the eighth straight season.

FSU placed two players on the All-ACC team as Kerrie Cartwright earned second team honors while Daneika Borthwick was named to the third team. The pair of Seminoles were an impressive doubles duo late in the season, winning nine straight matches from March 17 to May 9, with victories over No. 26 Yana Koroleva and Beatrice Gumulya of Clemson and No. 11 Julia Elbaba and Rachel Pierson of Virginia. Cartwright and Borthwick qualified for the 2014 NCAA Doubles Championships and were the first Seminole pairing to compete in the postseason since 2007.

For the third time in school history and second time while leading the Seminoles, Hyde led FSU into the 2013 ACC Championship match after defeating Wake Forest, Clemson and Virginia en route to the final against Miami. During that run, the Seminoles defeated the Tigers for the first time since 2001 in a match that saw well over five hours of play. In addition, Daneika Borthwick earned All-ACC honors while helping the team to a 16-10 overall record.

At the start of the 2012-13 season, Hyde led five Seminoles to the Riviera/ITA-All-American Championships - the most to ever qualify for the event in Los Angeles in FSU history.

Hyde and the Seminoles continued to rewrite the history books in 2011-12 as the squad's six straight NCAA appearances marked the first time in school history the feat had been accomplished. Hyde has also guided the Seminoles to five top-20 finishes.

The Seminoles concluded the 2011 season with an eight-match winning streak, landing the Seminoles back to the ACC Title Match for just the second time in program history. The first time occurred in 1994 when Hyde was an athlete on the team. During that span, FSU recorded the most successful weekend of play in program history by beating No. 3 Duke and No. 4 UNC in back-to-back matches to close out the regular season. Using the momentum into the ACC Tournament, the Seminoles knocked off Wake Forest, No. 8 Virginia and No. 3 Duke for a second time as Hyde earned her 100th career victory in the process.

In addition, the Seminoles jumped to No. 11 in the ITA National Rankings, breaking the previous high mark of No. 12 set by the 2007-08 team.

Just one season earlier, Hyde led the Seminoles to perhaps the most successful season in Florida State history taking her team to its first ever NCAA Sweet 16. After being selected to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Championship for just the second time in program history, both under Hyde, the Seminoles dominated both North Florida and No. 17 South Carolina to punch their ticket to Athens, Ga., and to the highly coveted Sweet 16 round of the NCAAs. Hyde also watched her first 'Nole earn ACC Freshman of the Year when Francesca Segarelli captured the honor in 2010.

The 2007-08 season welcomed several firsts for the program with Florida State hosting the first and second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles reached a No. 12 national ranking, the highest ranking in women tennis program history at the time. With the help of big wins against top ranked programs during the 2008 season, the Seminoles finished the year with an overall record of 19-7, the winningest season since 1999, ranking second on the all-time list at Florida State. Also, Hyde coached freshman Katie Rybakova to a top 20 national ranking in which Rybakova also received a bid to participate in the NCAA Singles Championships as a freshman.

Hyde's players have made seven appearances at the NCAA Championships in singles as well as three doubles pairs. Rybakova is one of two players in FSU history to qualify for the NCAA Championships three out of her four years (2008, 2009, 2011) in singles.

Off the court, Hyde's student-athletes have continued their brilliance in the classroom by securing the Golden Torch Award nine times since her arrival, which is given to the Florida State athletic team with the highest GPA. In addition, numerous Seminoles have landed spots on the All-ACC Academic team, All-ACC Honor Roll and ITA Scholar-Athletes list in Hyde's ten years as head coach.

Both Federica Suess and Rybakova earned ACC postgraduate scholarships. Suess was awarded the scholarship in 2009 during her senior year, while Rybakova earned the honor for her fifth-year in 2011.

HYDE'S HEAD COACHING RECORD

After graduating from FSU in 1995, Hyde began her coaching career as an assistant for the Seminoles prior to heading north to the University of Iowa in 1995. Hyde spent two years in the Midwest before returning to the south with an assistant coaching stint at the University of Alabama (1997-98). Hyde moved on to coach at the University of North Carolina in 1998-99 where she established herself as one of the best young coaches in the sport. With her assistance, UNC enjoyed one of its best seasons in program history, moving from outside all the national polls to a top-25 ranking and the school's first NCAA tournament berth.

In 1999, Hyde accepted her first head coaching position at the University of Houston. Hyde spent five increasingly successful years with the Cougars before returning to Tallahassee, where she first started her collegiate tennis career.

The Alpharetta, Ga., native posted an impressive career with the Seminoles establishing herself as a four-year letterwinner, NCAA Tournament participant (1994) and ACC flight champion in doubles alongside teammate Jenny Graf. Hyde captained the 1994 Seminole squad whose No. 17 ranking previously stood for sixteen years as the highest year end ranking until 2010's No. 14 finish. Hyde earned a Masters Degree from Florida State in Sport Management in 2011.

ASSISTANT COACH -- 2ND SEASON

Hometown: Budapest, Hungary College: California, Berkeley '07

Zsuzsanna Fodor begins her second season as assistant coach of the Florida State women's tennis program. A two-time All-American in both singles and doubles at Cal, who also spent several years playing professional tournaments around the world, Fodor looks to continue to build and bring success to the Seminole tennis program.

In 2013-14, the Seminoles posted a 16-13 record and qualified for the NCAA Championships for the 18th time in school history. Kerrie Cartwright and Daneika Borthwick each reached flight finals at the Furman Fall Classic while Majlena Pedersen won the singles B draw at the ITA Southeast Regional.

The team posted an 11-3 record at home, including ranked wins over USF, LSU and Virginia Tech. The Seminoles advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2014 ACC Championship and reached the second round of the NCAA Championships after defeating No. 27 Arizona, 4-3, to open the tournament.

As a six-time Hungarian national champion, Fodor brings an extraordinary array of experience to the Florida State Seminoles coaching staff.

In 2008, Zsuzsanna Fodor was the assistant coach of women's tennis at the University of California, Berkeley where the Cal Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA team championship finals and completed the season ranked No. 3 in the ITA. That same year, the Golden Bears' pairing of Jana Juricova and Mari Andersson also captured the NCAA doubles title.

As a player at Cal, Fodor was twice named to the All-Pac-10 first team (2006 and 2007). She first earned the honor as she captured the 2006 Pac-10 singles championship on her way to being named Pac-10 Player of the Year.

Coupled with fellow All-American Susie Babos, Fodor also received conference recognition as part of the 2007 Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year as they posted a 21-7 record together.

FLORIDA STATE. SCOTT SPEICHER TENNIS CENTER

With the first stage of construction completed in the summer of 1993, the Donald Loucks Courts at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center opened its gates to the public for the first time at a Children's Miracle Network charity tournament. Since then, many successful tournaments including the 1996 NCAA Women's Championships and 2007-2010 NCAA Regionals have graced the courts at one of Florida State University's premier athletic facilities. During the fall of 2012, the Seminoles hosted the ITA Southeast Regional Championships for the first time.

Costing \$1.2 million to build and then another \$800,000 for recent additions, Florida State's Speicher Tennis Center has become an example of the increasing dedication and commitment the University has to all of its 19 varsity athletic programs.

The Speicher Tennis Center houses 12 lighted hard courts, over 1,000 court level seats, coaching offices, men's and women's locker rooms, equipment and storage rooms, a team lounge and a public address system. The growing pride Florida State has for its tennis program and its premier tennis center was honored just after it's opening in 1994, when the United States Tennis Association (USTA) awarded the structure with its "Top Notch" facility award.

The Speicher Tennis Center was named in honor of Lieutenant Commander Michael Scott Speicher, a graduate of Florida State University. Speicher was considered the first American casualty during Operation Desert Storm, but was later reclassified by the United State's government as missing in action in 2001 and missing or captured a year later. However, in 2009 Speicher's remains were found in the Anbar province of Iraq after a nearly 20-year search. The Scott Speicher family was later honored by Florida State at a home football game with a missing man formation flyover from the Navy. By Presidential directive, the facility bears the name the "Scott Speicher Tennis Center."

In 1947, Loucks became Florida State's first basketball coach and a year later was named the school's first tennis coach. His tennis team was the first athletic team. The varsity tennis courts were named for Loucks in 1981. He served as Dean of men from 1957-1967 and was known as a servant of leader-ship, service and devotion to many worthy causes.

The Speicher Tennis Center was designed by EMO/Architects, Inc., a Tallahassee-based architectural firm, in collaboration with Global Consult Group, Inc., an internationally recognized Tennis Facility Design Consultant. The complex was funded by private sources and supervised through the state university system of Florida.

Through its 21 year existence, the Scott Speicher Tennis Center at the Donald Loucks Courts has served as the home courts for all Florida State men's and women's home dual matches, the annual Seminole Fall Classics, City of Tallahassee tennis championships, various USTA regional and zonal tournaments, the 1994 and 1995 Men's Intercollegiate tournament and the annual Children's Miracle Network Charity Invitational benefiting Shands Hospital in Gainesville. The tennis center has also been the site for the ITA Summer Circuit for men's and women's tennis in which high school and collegiate athletes participate in singles and double matches. The facility was resurfaced in the winter of 2012.

After breaking ground on construction in January of 2010, the Indoor Tennis Facility was completed in April of 2011. The multimillion dollar indoor practice facility serves as an additional playing arena for the Florida State tennis teams. Since the completion in spring of 2011, the facility has served as both a site for training and competition.

The building hosts six regulation courts, locker rooms, athletic training room, equipment room, office and lobby . With this new facility, both Seminole Tennis teams are equipped with the tools to host both regional and national championships now and in the future. For the next phase, plans are in place to add spectator seating, team lounges, extended locker rooms, offices and a press box.

Besides use from the tennis programs the Multi-Purpose Educational Facility is used for academic classes, clinics and camps. The facility is the largest indoor tennis facility approved for college competition in the state of Florida and only one of a few in the southeast.

Florida State Head Women's Tennis Coach Jennifer Hyde stated, "We are very excited about the indoor facility that is being built for the tennis programs. This facility will ensure a consistent training program, with weather never being an issue affecting our practice schedules and training regime. It will allow us to host conference, regional and national championships in the future, which will only bring about more positive attention to our program. This facility highlights the continued support for our Women's Tennis Program demonstrated by the administration at Florida State. We are very excited for the completion of this project."

The women's tennis team had its first practice on April 6, 2011 while the men practiced the next day on April 7. At the men's Seminole Invitational during September 2011, the back draws were played there for the facilities first competition. The first women's dual match was played on January 21, 2012 against UCF where Florida State won 6-1. The men's team played Furman on January 22, 2012 and came off the courts with a 7-0 victory.

The three million dollar building was designed by Lewis + Whitlock while construction was completed by Rippee Construction.

The facility is located adjacent to the Morcom Aquatics Facility and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course and Club at 2566 Pottsdamer Rd. and is open to the public.
