

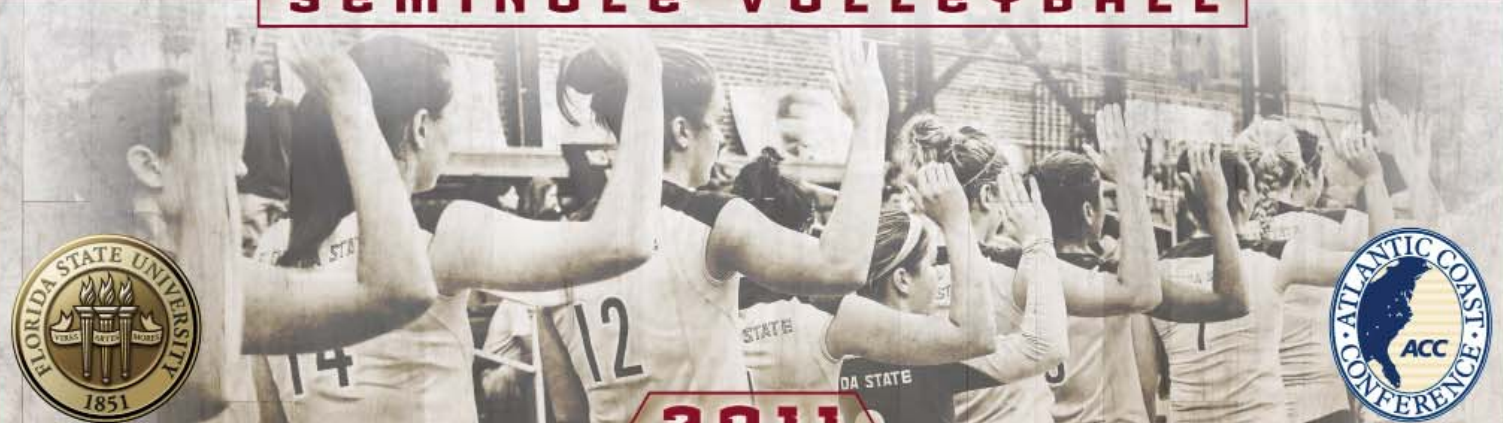

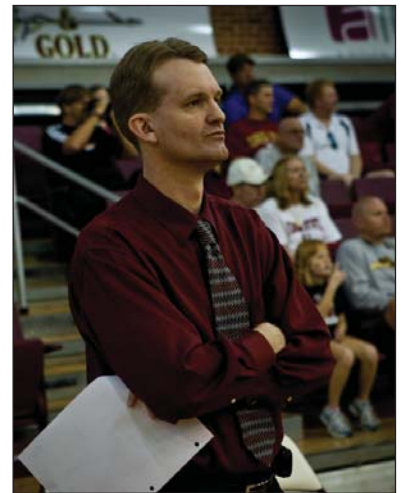
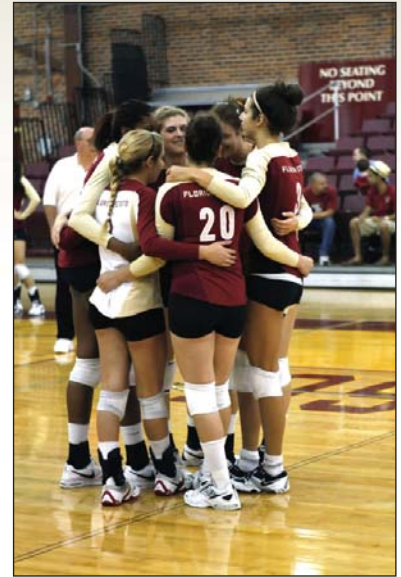

SEMINOLE MOMENTUM



No better phrase describes the current state of the Florida State University indoor volleyball program than the term “building on success.” Beginning his fourth season at the helm of the Seminoles, 24-year coaching veteran Chris Poole has ignited the sport in Tallahassee and helped retain its long-standing tradition of achievement.

FSU volleyball begins its 2011 campaign with its sights set on recapturing the Atlantic Coast Conference title and making another run in the NCAA Championship. There is plenty of momentum carrying over after all the accolades the program attained in 2010:

Seminole Volleyball Momentum From 2010

- Earned consecutive NCAA postseason appearances for the first time since the 1997 and 1998 seasons
- Reached the second round of the NCAA postseason in consecutive appearances for the first time ever
- Amassed at least 20 overall wins in three consecutive seasons for the first time since joining the ACC in 1991
- Finished fourth in one of the best ACC's in recent memory
- Finished the regular season with a 6-5 record against NCAA Tournament participants
- Reached a 24-week streak of being nationally-ranked in the AVCA Poll
- Reached a 19-match winning streak in the ACC (carried over from 2009 season)
- Sixth consecutive year of reaching double-digit wins in ACC play
- Defeated USF on Aug. 28, 2010 for the program's 900th victory
- Finished No. 31 in the NCAA RPI
- 9-2 non-conference record
- Multiple All-ACC Team selections the last four seasons
- Did not lose to an opponent outside of the Top 75 RPI

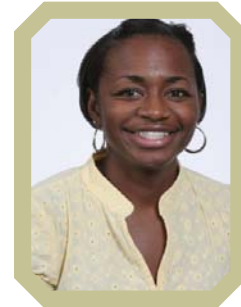

2011 SEASON OUTLOOK

Looking for a Three-Peat

The 2010 season was highlighted by the Seminole volleyball team making its second consecutive NCAA postseason appearance, the first time FSU has accomplished such a feat since the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

The 2011 edition hopes to add to its NCAA Tournament streak and make a return trip. The possible three-peat would mark the first time FSU has gone onto NCAA postseason play for three straight years since 1987-90 as members of the Metro Conference. FSU has never had an NCAA Tournament three-peat since joining the ACC in 1991.

Poole Enters Year No. 25

Florida State fourth-year head coach Chris Poole will embark on his 25th season as a head coach at the Division I level. Not included in his coaching career totals are three seasons at Arkansas Tech from 1983-85, where he helped lead his respective squad to a 92-16 record.

Going into the 2011 season, Poole is neck and neck with several other coaches in various NCAA stat categories. Among the winningest active Division I coaches, Poole is tied with fellow ACC coach Joe Sagula of North Carolina for 12th on the list with 624 career wins.

In terms of winningest active coaches at all division levels, Poole is also tied with Sagula for 21st on the list. He enters the upcoming season with a tremendous winning percentage of .712, the 22nd-highest among active Division I coaches. That mark also places him at 25th among all-time Division I coaches.

The final stat is sentimental for Seminole fans. Poole's 624 career victories, all at the Division I level, are 11 shy of tying FSU coaching legend Cecile Reynaud. Reynaud coached the Seminoles from 1976-2001, a span of 26 seasons that resulted in 635 career victories.

The Outside Hitters

Dissecting each position of the 2011 Seminoles, it is apparent that this season's group of outside hitters is one of the team's strong points. Six student-athletes will vie for court time, led by two-time American Volleyball Coaches Association Honorable Mention All-American Visnja Djurdjevic. The senior Serbian led FSU in an array of hitting categories last year, including kills and kills per set.

Two key pieces to last year's hitting attack return in seniors Rachael Morgan and Jekaterina Stepanova. Morgan is the lone senior of four who will have competed at FSU in all four seasons, and looks to regain her 2009 All-America form after missing part of last year with a stress fracture. Stepanova displayed her hard-hitting talents last season, finishing second on the team with 2.60 kills per set.

Junior Fatma Yildirim was an All-ACC freshman in 2009, and is known as one of FSU's hardest hitters.

Her play on the left side will go a long way toward the Seminole offensive goals for the season. Joining her as the final returnee is junior Marija Milosavljevic, who also figures to earn time at middle blocker as she did in 2010.

A possible X-factor this season includes Wisconsin transfer Elise Walch, a sophomore from Stuart, Fla. who posted 10 double-digit kill performances last year as a Badger. Her presence should be another welcoming sign for a team that has a deep and potent group of hitters.

The Setters

FSU returns two strong setters from 2010 in junior Duygu Duzceler and senior Patricia Figueiredo. Adding depth to the group is freshman Sarah Wickstrom, a 5-foot-11 standout from Jensen Beach High School in Stuart, Fla.

Duzceler brings valuable experience from the Elite Eight season in 2009 that highlighted her freshman year, playing in 127 sets. Last year, she started all 33 matches and split time with Figueiredo as each played 130 sets.

Figueiredo, who hails from Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, improved significantly as last year progressed. She finished behind Duzceler with 619 assists, and had some of her finest performances in the NCAA Championship when she tallied a double-double against Georgia Southern (16 assists, 12 digs) and recorded 25 assists against Florida.

Wickstrom will look to earn some time on the floor as well. She was a PrepVolleyball Senior Ace and a PrepVolleyball All-American who will try to adapt to the college game quickly and give the Seminoles three tremendous options.

The Middle Blockers

Four student-athletes highlight FSU's middle blocking core, with each already having some experience in the Garnet and Gold. Junior Sareea Freeman progressed well in her sophomore campaign, which was highlighted by a dominating 12-block performance at North Carolina. She paired with former player Lauren Young to help make FSU one of the best blocking units in the ACC, and will try to use that experience in making this year's group even better.

Milosavljevic reaffirms her status as a key component, being versatile enough to jump in at right-side hitter or in the middle. Expected to make a giant leap this year is sophomore Ashley Neff, who began playing midway through the 2010 season and became very effective. Neff has only gotten better through the offseason, and will be another important piece to this year's squad.

Junior Amanda Saxton continues to improve at the position as well, progressing each day in practice. Saxton also can be used at one of the outside hitter spots.

The Liberos/Defensive Specialists

The back-row players are high on talent. Redshirt freshman Katie Mosher sat out her entire first year to learn behind former player Jenna Romanelli at the libero position. Mosher, who is a Fort Myers, Fla. native, has put forth an impressive offseason and is ready to keep the entire team on its game with precise passing. She carries the right work ethic, maneuverability and mindset to have not only a productive first year on the court but a tremendous career as well.

Defensive specialist Kalee Schlabach is a junior transfer from South Florida Community College who was with the team all spring and benefitted from getting a chance to work with her teammates. She is another valuable back-row player who is quick along the lines and has the capability to consistently put her offense in good position.

Another Tough Slate

Head coach Chris Poole always lives by his philosophy that "in order to be the best you have to beat the best." It is why FSU has been among the highest of teams in the RPI each season he has been in Tallahassee.

The 2011 season proves to be no different, based on last year's finishes and this season's expectations. The 2011 schedule features 12 NCAA Championship participants from a season ago and a home mid-week matchup against Miami that will be televised nationally on ESPN.

This year's competition will feature 16 of 30 matches against NCAA Tournament teams from 2010. The rest of the slate includes quality competition in every match. The Seminoles will host the Florida State Invitational for the 10th consecutive season, facing non-conference rival Kentucky to open the year on Friday, Aug. 26 at 7 p.m. The two schools have competed in back-to-back five-set thrillers in 2009 and 2010, with the former match leading to FSU's first-ever trip to the Elite Eight in Minneapolis, Minn.

The Seminoles are pitted against every Atlantic Coast Conference opponent twice except Boston College and Maryland. FSU will only make road trips to face those two teams on Oct. 21 and 23, respectively. The disparity means that the Seminoles play nine conference matches at home and 11 on the road.





2011 SEASON OUTLOOK

More on Visnja

While FSU returns plenty of key parts from last year, perhaps the most well-known of them all is senior outside hitter Visnja Djurdjevic. She came to FSU as the Conference USA Co-Player of the Year after her sophomore season, and is looking to end her career as a three-time AVCA All-American.

Djurdjevic's game is all about versatility. She ended last season as one of just two players in the ACC to finish in the conference top five in kills per set (3.42), services aces per set (0.30) and points per set (3.99). She led FSU with 15 double-doubles last season, nearly half of her matches played, and finished second on the team with 357 digs.

Finishing up Strong

Four seniors in Visnja Djurdjevic, Patricia Figueiredo, Jekaterina Stepanova and Rachael Morgan hope to finish their senior seasons on a promising note. Of the four, only Morgan will have spent all four years in Tallahassee.

Morgan, who is from Tauranga, New Zealand, is a focal point on the right side this season. As a junior, she registered 191 kills in 24 matches but had to sit out a key stretch of nine matches due to injury. Her first match back was a critical late-season contest against Maryland, and she helped spark FSU to a win that nearly locked in another NCAA Tournament bid.

Morgan looks to stay injury-free in what is a long and arduous 3 1/2 month marathon of a season. She will be counted on for leadership and has the makeup to produce another fantastic year similar to her All-America campaign as a sophomore.

International Flavor Once Again

It is the second straight season that FSU volleyball carries a large international presence, as half of this year's student-athletes hail from somewhere outside the United States.

FSU's culturally diverse squad boasts seven international players from five different countries. They are as follows:

Mosher, Walch Have Productive Offseason

Redshirt freshman Katie Mosher and sophomore transfer Elise Walch set forth their goal to play for a USA-represented squad this past offseason when they attended the U.S. Women's National Volleyball Team Open Tryouts held at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. in late February.

Both student-athletes ended up representing FSU on the USA A2 Junior National Team at the European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia. After competing against the British National Team in London days before, both Mosher and Walch helped their squad capture the tournament championship after defeating the Czech Republic Junior National Team in the finals, 3-1.

With both players coming into the year with no floor time experience as a Seminole, their interesting journey overseas should prepare them adequately for the 2011 season.

Going for Four

Another sign that the FSU volleyball program has enjoyed a Renaissance-like period is its renewed climb in the Atlantic Coast Conference, which tied a record with five NCAA postseason teams in 2010.

Under head coach Chris Poole's guidance, FSU has amassed at least 20 wins in each of the last three years. The Seminoles' 22-11 overall record last year broke a school record for consecutive 20-or-more-win seasons since joining the ACC in 1991. FSU's previous best marks were from 1992-93 and 1997-98 under coaching legend Cecile Reynaud.

Included in the current streak is the unprecedented 31-3 season in 2009 that culminated with an Elite Eight appearance.

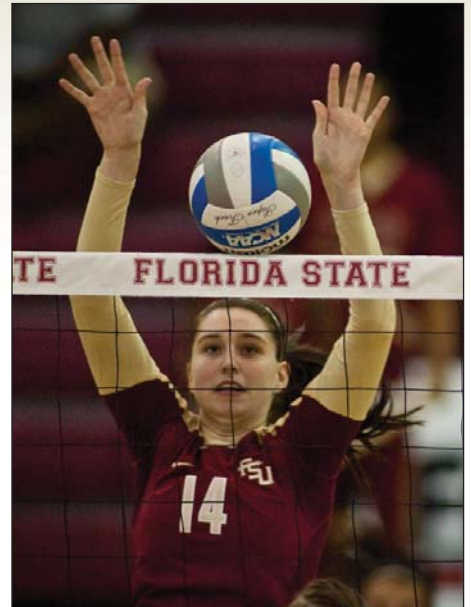

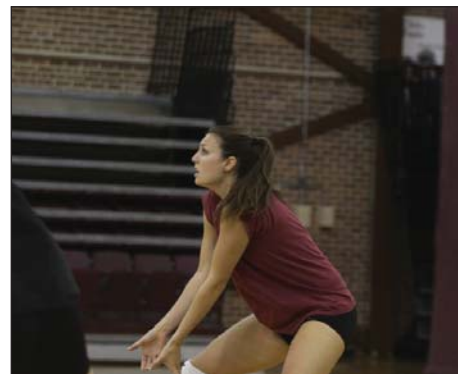

The transformation has been thorough and quick.

When Chris Poole inherited the Florida State volleyball program in the summer of 2008, he took over a team that had failed to reach the 20-win plateau in five-straight seasons and hadn't been to the NCAA Tournament since 2002. It was a program looking for answers; a program looking to get back to the winning ways it had grown accustomed to in the 1980s and early '90s.

Three years later, Poole, associate head coach Holly Watts and assistant coach Gokhan Yilmaz have made their mark and revitalized a program that is not only making itself known across the state, but across the nation as well. The Seminoles earned 21 wins in Poole's first season in 2008 and then followed that up with a 2009 campaign that is currently the best-ever in school history. FSU not only posted a 31-3 overall record, but under Poole's tutelage the 'Noles captured their first regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championship in school history and made it to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

In addition to those program firsts, Poole's Seminoles also set the school standard for most conference wins in a season with 16 and wins in a row with 19. A national ranking of No. 11 was the highest ever for a Florida State volleyball team and its No. 3 national seed in the NCAA Tournament was also the highest ever.

For his squad's multiple successes, Poole garnered ACC Coach of the Year and AVCA Division I East Region Coach of the Year honors.

He also coached a handful of players that generated quite a few accolades. Brianna Barry became the first Seminole to ever be named the ACC's Player of the Year and she also garnered AVCA

Division I Second-Team All-American honors. Barry, an ESPN The Magazine Academic All First-Team member, was joined by Jordana Price, Mira Djuric and Rachael Morgan on the 2009 All-ACC Team - a record at FSU for most players on that list in one season. Price, Djuric and Morgan also each achieved an AVCA Division I Honorable Mention All-American nod. Poole also coached an ACC All-Freshman Team performer in Fatma Yildirim.

The 2010 season featured several roadblocks for the Seminoles, ranging from life-altering misfortunes off the court to devastating injuries that inhibited the team's continuity. Despite all the hardships, the gutsy FSU squad finished 22-11, including 12-8 within the ACC. Several program feats were accomplished - making back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in over a decade, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Championship in consecutive years for the first time in school history and finishing with at least 20 wins for the third straight season.

Veterans Jenna Romanelli and Stephanie Neville capped off their four-year careers in excellent fashion. Junior outside hitter Visnja Djurdjevic was one of the top transfers in the country, being named an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and an AVCA Honorable Mention All-East Region member. She joined Neville as members of the All-ACC Team as well.

The fact that Poole has breathed life in the FSU volleyball program should come as no surprise as he brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to the school after heading the program at the University of Arkansas for 14 accomplished seasons.

Poole started Arkansas' volleyball program in 1994 and was not only successful, but led the Lady Razorbacks to 11 Southeastern Conference Western Division titles. Add to that 11 postseason appearances - two NIVC and nine NCAA - along with an SEC Tournament title and numerous individual player honors.

Upon arriving in Fayetteville, Ark. in 1993, Poole personally handled every element of building the program from buying the first pieces of equipment, hiring the assistants and recruiting the players, to renovating the court and building locker room facilities.

With head coaching stints at Arkansas, Arkansas State and Arkansas Tech, Poole earned a 550-230 career record in 21 seasons prior to his hiring at FSU and had been named conference coach of the year seven times and was pegged the South Region Coach of the Year in 1997.

During his 14 seasons at Arkansas, in which he compiled a 316-161 record, Poole produced two AVCA All-Americans, three AVCA honorable mention All-Americans, 24 players with 44 All-SEC honors, three SEC Freshmen of the Year and 25 AVCA All-District/All-Region honorees. In addition to the success on the court, Poole's Arkansas teams excelled in the classroom as well with 67 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, 10 CoSIDA All-District selections, two H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete finalists and one McWhorter winner.

Poole certainly made his mark in the SEC as he guided Arkansas to a 159-65 record in the SEC regular season for a 71 percent league-winning mark. Poole and the Lady Razorbacks were even more impressive against the Western Division, winning 11 of 14 titles.

Poole spent an entire year away from competition preparing for the Razorback's inaugural season in 1994 and it was time well spent as he led Arkansas to a 19-17 overall record, a 10-5 SEC mark and an SEC Western Division title with a perfect 10-0 divisional record in the first year of competition. The Lady Razorbacks finished third overall in the league that year and played well enough to earn a postseason bid to the National Invitational Volleyball Coaches Tournament in Kansas City where they finished seventh in a field of 20 teams. Poole was selected as the 1994 SEC Coach of the Year while two of his players earned All-SEC honors and one player earned All-District honors.

Poole's ability to build a program was proven first with Arkansas Tech then at Arkansas State. He took over days prior to the 1987 season at ASU and his first team showed the effects with a 8-24 record. But with one season under Poole's careful tutelage, virtually the same team was 41-1 the next year, launching a five-year run of winning seasons for the Lady Indians.

His 1988 team had a 33-match win streak, longest in the nation, and posted a school-record 41-1 overall mark. The next year, ASU had a 34-match win streak, notched a Lady Indian record with 43 wins (43-6 overall) and was ranked ninth in the South Region.

In his last season at ASU, the Lady Indians were 41-6 and received an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament in 1992. ASU entered the 32-team NCAA field with the most wins of any team, but lost a tough four-game match to the Northwest Region's top-seeded team, Long Beach State.

Prior to ASU, Poole was an assistant and later head coach at Arkansas Tech. In two seasons as head





coach at ATU, he posted a 53-20 record, winning the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference title in 1985 as co-head coach and finishing runner-up as head coach in 1986. He started his collegiate career in 1983 as a graduate assistant for the nationally ranked Arkansas Tech Golden Suns. Tech was 58-9 with a perfect 24-0 conference mark in two seasons with Poole as an assistant coach.

A native of Heber Springs in north-central Arkansas, Poole is a 1983 graduate of Arkansas Tech and earned a master's degree from there in 1989. He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association and has served on the AVCA's All-American, All-South Region and All-South Region Ranking committees and is also an AVCA Top 25 voter.

Poole and his wife, Toni, a former Arkansas State track and field standout, have two children, son Joshua and daughter Taylor.

Holly Watts prepares for her fourth season as the associate head volleyball coach at Florida State.

After helping head coach Chris Poole build the University of Arkansas volleyball program into a consistent NCAA postseason team, Watts has done the same in Tallahassee as the Seminoles are coming off two of their best seasons in program history in 2009 and 2010.

In 2009, FSU earned the first regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championship in school history and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. Watts helped coach a team that also set the school record for most wins in the ACC (16) and most wins in a row (19). FSU also garnered a No. 11 ranking in the entire country, which was also a program best.

Watts' effective coaching style was key yet again for FSU in 2010, helping guide Visnja Djurdjevic and Stephanie Neville to stellar seasons while meshing in a talented blend of newcomers and transfers. The result was another trip to the NCAA Tournament for a unit that amassed a 22-11 overall record.

Although her duties have been many and varied, one of Watts' most critical jobs has been to coordinate all of the recruiting efforts including correspondence, evaluation, visits and tracking athletes at Florida State.

She is also in charge of scheduling the fall and spring travel for the team and coordinating many of the day-to-day activities in the office.

Prior to Florida State, Watts joined the Arkansas program in 1996. The Lady Razorbacks accomplished a 262-129 record, nine Southeastern Conference Western Division titles and nine NCAA Tournament appearances with Watts in the

second chair. Her hard work and commitment to the program was rewarded at the conclusion of the 2002 season when she was promoted to associate head coach.

Just as she does now at Florida State, Watts served as the primary coach for the middle blockers and quick attack at Arkansas. Her blocking talents are evident as the Lady Razorbacks consistently ranked in the top of the SEC and the nation in blocking during her 12-year stint.

Watts' impact was immediate at Florida State in 2008 when the team finished sixth in the ACC with a 2.32 blocks-per-set average after finishing in 12th (last place) with only 1.96 blocks per game average in 2007. In 2009, the 'Noles finished second in the league in the category with a mark of 2.51 blocks per set, and ended in second yet again in 2010 with 2.42 blocks per set. Watts helped elevate the play of middle blockers Lauren Young and Sareea Freeman in creating one of the best blocking tandems in the ACC in 2010.

Watts coached the best blockers in Arkansas volleyball history, including All-Americans Jessica Field and Kim Storey along with Sara Kincaid, an honorable mention All-American, and many all-conference and all-district selections. The last two seasons at FSU, she coached All-Americans Jordana Price and Brianna Barry, who also earned ACC Player of the Year honors in 2009.

Watts also played a vital role with the summer camps where she helped build Arkansas from

ground level to averaging around 600 campers. At Florida State, she now plays an important role in drawing all talent levels to FSU in an effort to introduce volleyball to beginners and elite players alike.

While with the Lady Razorback program, Watts founded Ozark Juniors Volleyball Club, which played nationally and provided playing opportunities for all ages. Watts also served on the board for Ozark Juniors, which has continued to expand with each season.

Watts was invited to assist with the U.S. National Team for several weeks in the summer of 1998, working with the country's elite volleyball players and with then-head coach Mick Haley.

As an athlete, the former Holly Graham helped the University of Texas national dominance and was the Lady Longhorns' MVP as a senior. An all-conference pick, she was an All-SWC and All-SWC Tournament selection as well as being named to the all-South region team in her final year. She went on to play basketball in her final year before graduating with a degree in Kinesiology from the University of Texas in 1994.

Watts began her coaching career while in college working with Haley at the University of Texas volleyball camps. Watts accepted the assistant coaching job at Texas-Arlington in 1994, a position she held until going to Arkansas in the spring of 1996.

Watts is married to John Watts and the couple has two sons, Jeremiah and Jared.

Gokhan Yilmaz is heading into his fourth season at Florida State after joining the staff in 2008 following two seasons as an assistant coach for the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks under current FSU coach Chris Poole.

Yilmaz's primary role is as the team's training coordinator where he is in charge of the day-to-day training while working to enhance the skills of all players. Yilmaz has also taken on an expanded recruiting role to help establish Seminole volleyball at the regional, national and international level. His efforts have been rewarded with a strong 2009 recruiting class that included two National Team-level players from his home country of Turkey and an up-and-coming middle blocker from California. Outside hitter Fatma Yildirim and setter Duygu Duzceler made the transition to American volleyball from Turkey and became key contributors as true freshman in 2009 with Yildirim even earning ACC All-Freshman team honors. Sareea Freeman has also made great strides in her first two years after playing behind veteran stars Brianna Barry and Jordana Price in 2009.

As for the 2010 recruiting class, Yilmaz once again landed a group of talented prospects that continue to push the program to new heights. In addition to Americans Ashley Neff and Katie Mosher, Yilmaz helped in the signing of junior college All-American transfers Jekaterina Stepanova (Riga, Latvia) and Patricia Figueiredo (Rio de Janeiro, Brazil) from Missouri State University-West Plains. Both JUCO transfers aided the Seminoles tremendously in a return run to the NCAA Championship.

Yilmaz continued his splendid recruiting efforts for the 2011 season by helping land standout setter Sarah Wickstrom of Stuart, Fla. The addition provides FSU with incredible depth at the setter spot, as Wickstrom joins Duzceler and Figueiredo



in what should be a tremendous offensive attack for the upcoming year.

Yilmaz had a busy spring in 2009 after being selected as an assistant coach for the Florida Region Girls Junior National Team. This allowed him to make inroads in the Florida recruiting base and gave him a chance to work with plenty of young talent.

While at Arkansas with Poole and FSU associate head coach Holly Watts, Yilmaz went to work on re-energizing practices as the training coordinator for the Lady Razorbacks. He was also involved with recruiting by making trips both nationally and internationally to spread the Lady Razorbacks' name.

Yilmaz's first exposure to Arkansas came in the spring of 2005 when he worked with the Lady Razorbacks as a volunteer coach. Prior to Arkansas, Yilmaz was at Northwood University, where he helped the Timberwolves to a regional semifinal in 2005 with a 23-11 overall record. They were conference runners-up with a 14-4 mark that same season. Northwood was 16-11 and had three players selected to the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic all-conference team in 2006.

Also at Northwood, Yilmaz coached a first team All-American and Regional Player of the Year in Gorana Maricic, as well as four other All-Conference players. Yilmaz was also in charge of camps, recruiting and training for the Timberwolves.

Yilmaz got his coaching start in the United States as an assistant at Cameron University from 2003 to 2004 and at Western New Mexico from 2002 to 2003. Before coming to the states, Yilmaz worked for various club programs in Istanbul, Turkey, as well as with the Turkish National Team. While working with the Turkish National Team, Yilmaz guided multiple age groups to eight National Titles. He also worked with the Turkish Junior National Team during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. He has also worked with national team coaches from Cuba, Russia and Bulgaria, assisting in their practices and working in the physical training aspect of the game.

Yilmaz received his bachelor's degree in European Studies in 2002 from Istanbul University and completed his master's degree in Sports Psychology while coaching at Cameron in 2005.

2010 SEASON IN REVIEW

In a marathon season that spans the course of three months or more, it is nearly impossible for any team to voyage through without any adverse situations. The 2010 Florida State volleyball team will be known as a unit that furthered the program's steady rise, but perhaps more importantly, learned several valuable lessons after dealing with plenty of heartbreak throughout the season.

With the Atlantic Coast Conference coaches picking both FSU and Duke to slug it out in the preseason poll, expectations were high despite the Seminoles losing four impressive performers from a season ago, including All-Americans Brianna Barry, Jordana Price and Mira Djuric. However, FSU backed up its praise in the beginning of the season, rolling past a talented New Mexico State squad in the season opener before defeating FIU and USF in straight sets at Tully Gym.

Although much of the team was already talking about her many on-court talents, it was at the season-opening FSU Invitational where tournament MVP Visnja Djurdjevic started turning heads. She recorded a combined 36 kills, 26 digs and a .359 hitting percentage while putting down balls in impressive fashion in FSU's 3-0 start. The Serbia native who transferred from Tulane also was named the conference co-player of the week.

FSU got a small dose of reality at the Houston Invitational, but simultaneously put together some strong performances to go 2-1 at the invite. It began in thunderous fashion by defeating host Houston, 3-0, in what was its best offensive performance of the season with a .416 team hitting percentage. However, FSU fell in the next contest to eventual national seed Tennessee, but picked up one of its best nonconference victories of the season against Oklahoma, 3-1. The Sooners would advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 before losing to national champion Penn State.

One of the peak moments of the season came at the Kentucky Tournament, where a rematch of the 2009 Sweet 16 matchup between the Seminoles and Wildcats was imminent. FSU first defeated Kansas State in five sets on Sept. 10 behind junior Jekaterina Stepanova's 20 kills. The Seminoles were forced to play

later that evening against host Kentucky and won in another five-setter, recording 64 kills as a team and picking up a key road win against a nationally-ranked opponent at the time. FSU won the tournament the following day after defeating Virginia Commonwealth, as setter Duygu Duzceler, Stepanova and Djurdjevic were all named to the Kentucky Invitational All-Tournament Team.

Conference play proved to be a challenging slate, with several coaches saying the conference was as deep as it had been in the last 20 years. FSU got off to an auspicious start, defeating a difficult Miami team on the road behind senior Stephanie Neville's 16 kills in 30 attacks. FSU reached its high point of the season with a No. 13 ranking by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, while a showdown at Tully Gym between eventual top seed Florida and the Seminoles loomed.

The annual state clash featured a new twist on Sept. 24 - it was the first time two Top 15 teams had ever played at Tully Gym. As a result, a raucous crowd of 1,322 packed into the Seminole home arena before watching the Gators get the best of FSU with a 3-0 win. The match-turning point came in the second set when UF climbed back from a 17-10 deficit to

win the frame, 31-29.

The next two matches featured quality home wins over Virginia and Virginia Tech, allowing FSU to boast a 19-match win streak in conference play that dated back to the memorable 2009 season. The victory against the Hokies did not come easy, as Virginia Tech stormed back from a 2-0 hole and lost on a service error in a wild fifth set.

Although the short month of August and September symbolized everything that was right about the Seminoles, the month of October created some turbulent times for a team that knew how to withstand a challenge. FSU ended its September run with a five-set loss at UNC to snap its streak, but rebounded with a win at N.C. State behind Lauren Young's career-high 12 blocks.

FSU wasn't itself despite winning 3-1 over Clemson on Oct. 8, as Djurdjevic learned shortly before the match of a medical issue involving her family. After the Seminoles lost in straight sets to Georgia Tech the following match, and split the following weekend with a win over Boston College and a loss at Maryland, Djurdjevic learned that her father had passed away on the trip back to Tallahassee. The

insurmountable loss forced everyone to play with a chip on their shoulder after the standout outside hitter returned to Serbia for the week of the Wake Forest and Duke matches.

During that week, FSU was out of sync and lost to the Demon Deacons, 3-0, at home. Duke then entered Tully Gym as the conference leader and fellow preseason favorite, and also came on the "Paint it Pink" match. FSU once again lost the first two sets, but through the inspirational play of seniors Stephanie Neville and Jenna Romanelli as well as junior Jekaterina Stepanova, FSU pulled off a stunning, short-handed upset by coming back to win 3-2. A block by both freshman Ashley Neff and sophomore Fatma Yildirim won the heartfelt match, sending Tully Gym into a frenzy. FSU also played its first match without returning AVCA honorable mention All-American Rachael Morgan, who missed seven more matches due to a stress fracture.

The Seminoles were hoping to rally back with the presence of Djurdjevic in its upcoming road trip, but went 1-3 in matches at Virginia Tech, Virginia, Georgia Tech and Clemson. FSU picked up its lone win with a 3-0 victory over the Yellow Jackets, but returned with a loss to the Tigers that followed with senior Neville being placed in the hospital with an irregular heartbeat.

The medical issues for the team mounted, with several student-athletes experiencing a great amount of soreness and sickness toward the end of the season. However, FSU still had its postseason hopes alive after carrying a 16-9 overall record, including an 8-7 mark in the ACC, with the 29th-best RPI. The following five-match homestand which featured high RPI teams North Carolina and Miami would be crucial toward postseason seeding.

FSU started off with perhaps its biggest win of the season, defeating the Tar Heels in five sets after nearly relinquishing a 2-0 lead. Young continued her defensive tormenting of UNC with nine blocks, while Stepanova posted two huge back-to-back kills late in the fifth set to preserve the win. FSU then looked back into mid-season form with straight-set wins over N.C. State, third-place Maryland and Boston College. The victory over B.C was significant because it marked the first time FSU had



recorded three straight 20-win seasons since joining the ACC in 1991.

In a battle for third place, FSU lost in its regular-season home finale against Miami in an exciting five-set match. It was one of 12 five-setters the Seminoles played during the 2010 campaign, going 6-6. Djurdjevic had an astounding stat line against the Hurricanes, recording a season-high 25 kills and 16 digs.

After defeating Florida A&M to finish the regular season with a 21-10 overall record, FSU achieved its preseason goal of making consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1997-98 seasons. The Seminoles landed a spot in the Gainesville regional, taking on Georgia Southern of the Southern Conference in the first round. FSU received a test from the Eagles, but came away with a 3-1 win behind a combined 42 kills from Neville, Stepanova and Djurdjevic. The victory marked the first time FSU reached the second round in consecutive postseason appearances.

Unfortunately, FSU's whirlwind season came to an end in a five-set heartbreaker against No. 1 seed Florida. FSU played one of its best matches of the season in front of a boisterous crowd in Gainesville, and even held a 13-9 lead in the fifth and final set. However, momentum swung in UF's way after an initial four-hit call in FSU's favor was reversed by the head judge who made the initial call. Florida then stormed back to win, 17-15, in a difficult ending for a Seminole squad that overcame so much in the 2010 season.

Finishing with a 22-11 mark, FSU made even more progress in establishing itself as a well-respected program. Head coach Chris Poole continues to mold the program into not only a statewide challenger, but a contender to the rest of the country. With the valuable lessons learned on how to deal with adversity both athletically and personally, the Seminoles grew together and rallied around each other in a dramatic, twists-and-turns year. With the influx of several new faces who were forced to quickly learn the system and buy into the team concept, the 2010 Seminole volleyball season will always be considered a success on any level. It is no secret to the rest of the country that FSU volleyball is standing tall and ready to make the next big step toward national prominence.

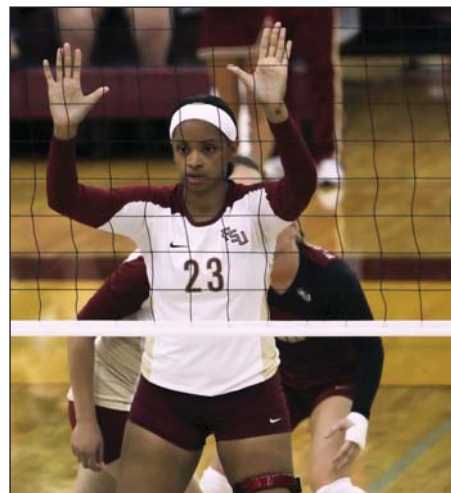
