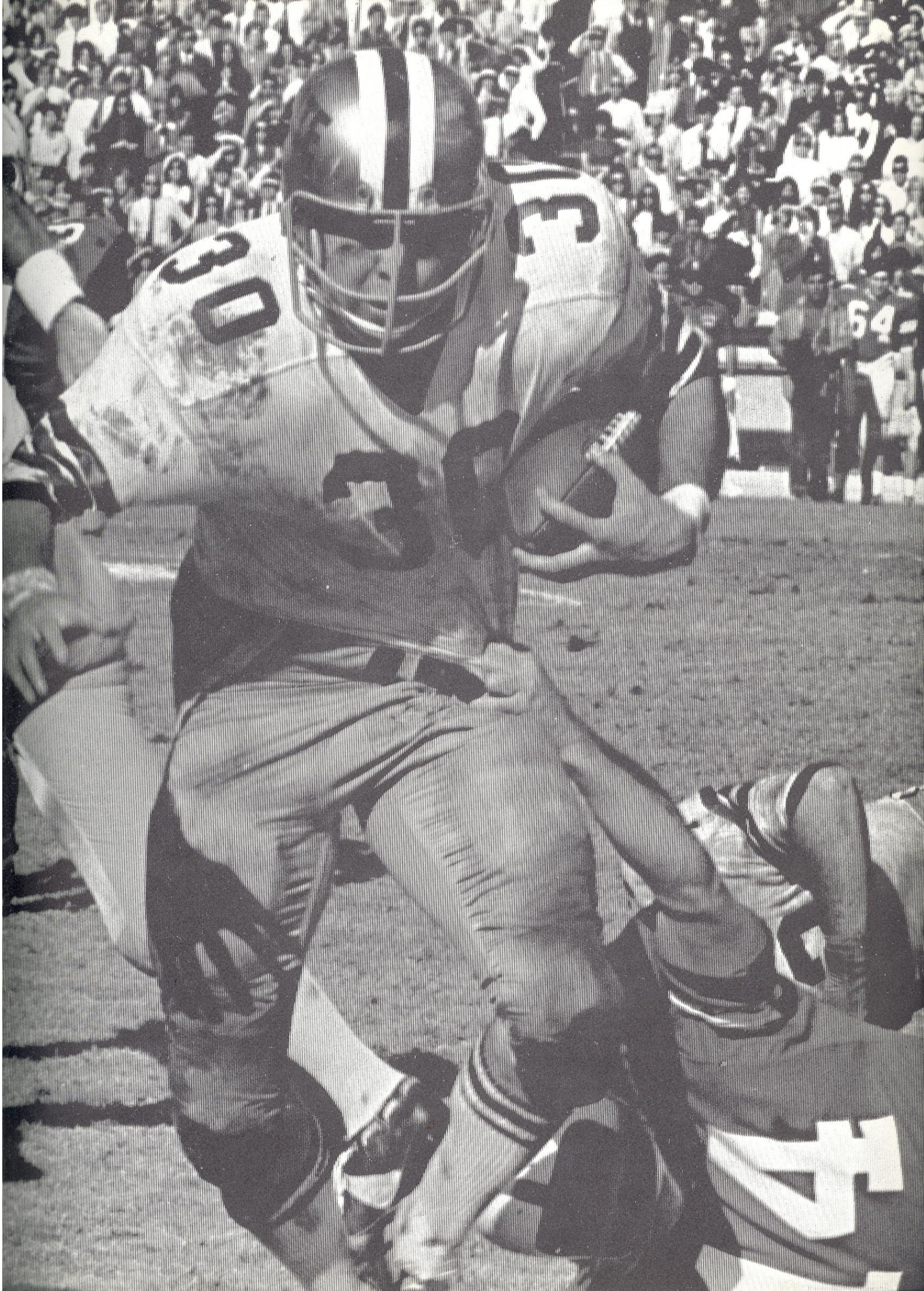
for the first

time in four years, the florida state football team was absent from the post-season bowl picture. fighting through a rough schedule, the seminole gridders finished the season with a 6-3-1 season. tribe signal caller bill cappleman finished his career among the top five in the nation in passing offense for the '69 season with 2,467 yards. he also took the fsu career title with 4,877 yards in two seasons as starting quarterback.

the first game

of the season was held in the mud of campbell stadium as the seminoles easily outswam the wichita state shockers 24-0 in a steady downpour. on to miami the following weekend, the seminoles took on down-state rival university of miami before 55,000 fans in the orange bowl. the talented toe of grant guthrie saved the day when he kicked three tri-pointers, one for 53 yards and a florida state record. a cappleman to gaydos touchdown pass rounded out the tribe scoring as the seminoles edged out the hurricanes 16-14.





a tough

defense and an unstoppable passing combination were all the gators needed in the mud of florida field to beat the seminole 21-6. cappleman was harrassed all afternoon by the gators' defensive line and was able to connect for only one tally. the florida combination of quarterback john reaves to all-america flanker carlos alvarez picked the tribe defense to pieces. the seminole bounced back the following weekend as fsu hounded the university of tulsa 38-20 on the losers' home field. back in campbell stadium, the tribesmen barely got by a surprisingly tough mississippi state team 20-17 before meeting south carolina the following weekend for homecoming. the seminole awoke with a roar as they ran the peach bowl-bound gamecocks out of tallahassee by a score of 34-9.

the gobbler

jinx struck again as the tribesmen found themselves knotted with virginia tech 10-10 at the end of a cold and windy afternoon in blacksburg. grant guthrie gained the tie with his tremendous 52-yard field goal. with several bowl scouts in attendance, the seminole wanted to be at their best. but their best wasn't enough, however, as the tribe fell to a bowl hungry memphis state squad 28-26 in campbell stadium. key interceptions and fumble recoveries by the tigers knocked the 'noles out of the bowl picture for the year.





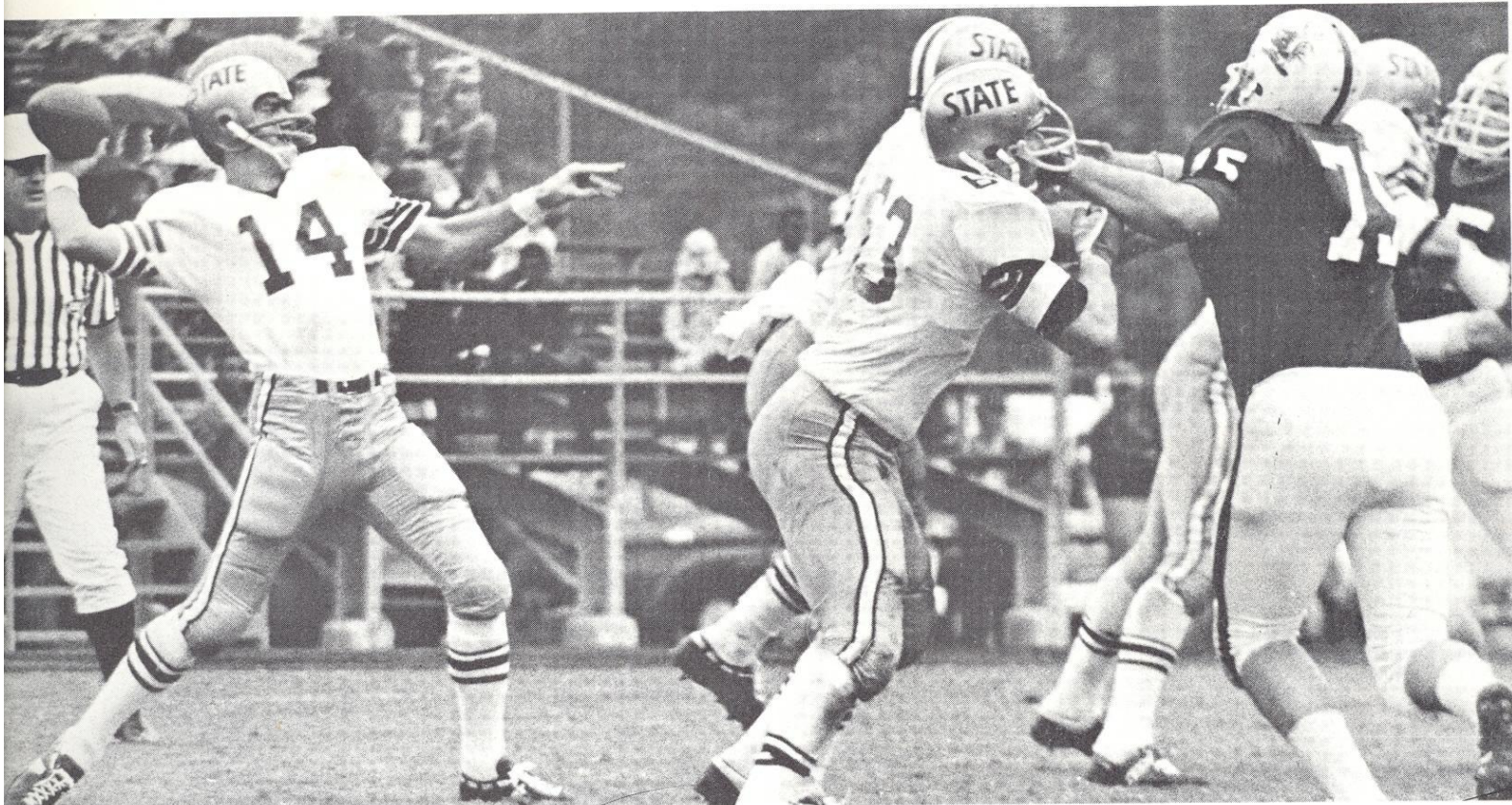

appearing

on regional television from tallahassee, the seminole put on a good show for the viewers with a convincing 33-22 win over north carolina state. smarting from their 40-20 loss from the seminole at the end of the previous season, the houston cougars put it to the 'noles in the astrodome 41-13. fsu was trailing by 31-7 at the half, but injuries to magalski and bailey slowed and narrowed the seminole attack as the cougars made the tribe's final note of the season a sour one.

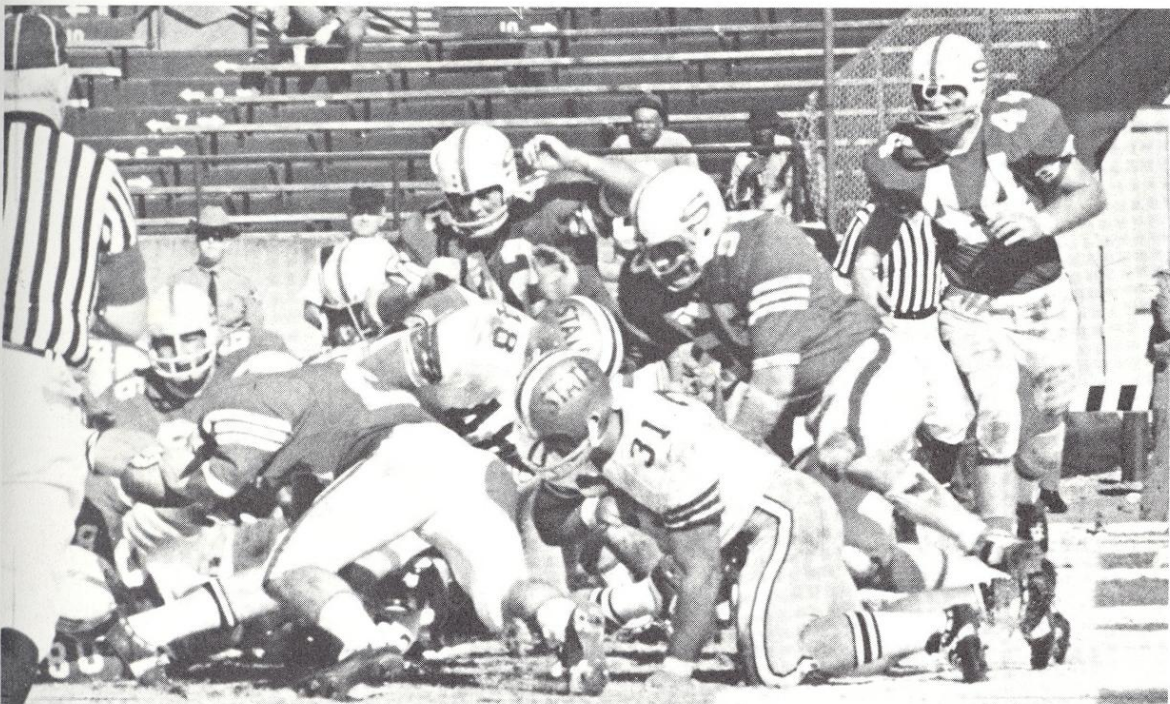

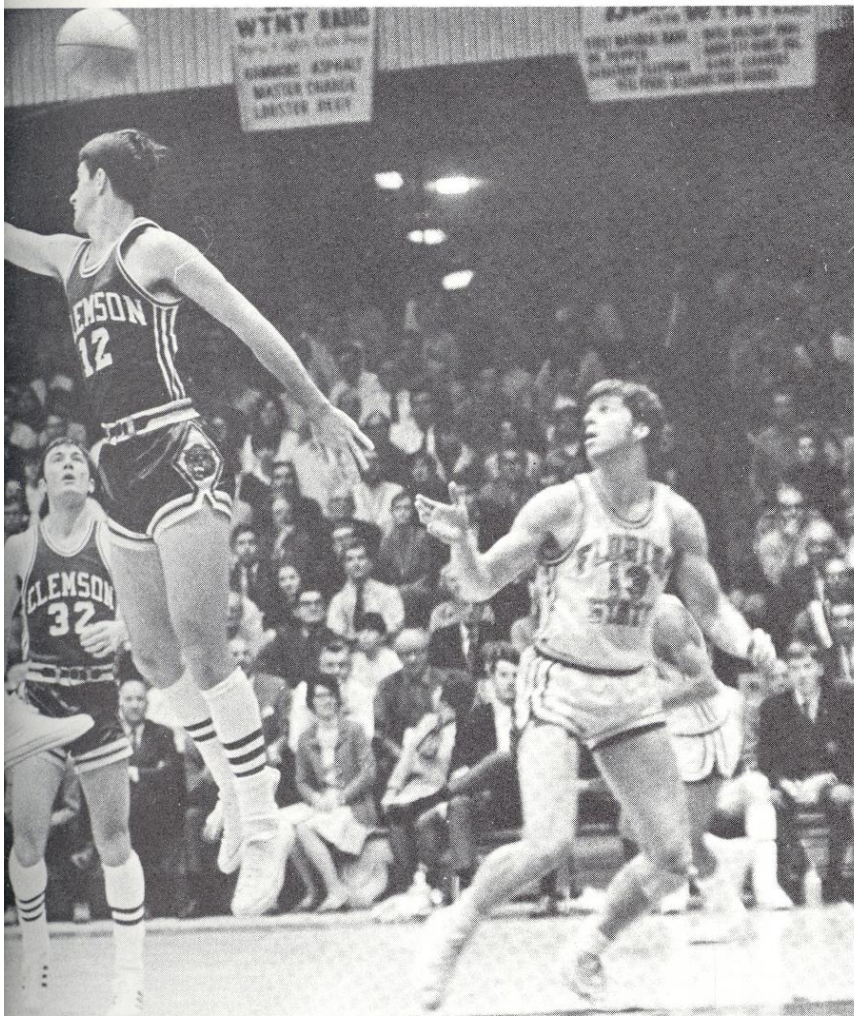
playing the

roughest schedule in seminole history, the varsity basketball team went on to its best record in fsu basketball history and gained national ranking in the ap and upi wire polls. the cagers finished the season with a 23-3 record and ranked as high as ninth in the nation during the season. the seminoles finished eleventh in both polls. led by such outstanding seniors as dave cowens and willie williams, the tribe went on to defeat such powers as oregon, louisville, army, dayton and gave second-ranked jacksonville university one of its two losses for the season in an 89-83 tully gym thriller. fsu's three losses came at the hands of nationally ranked north carolina, southern california and an 85-81 loss to the dolphins in the jacksonville coliseum.





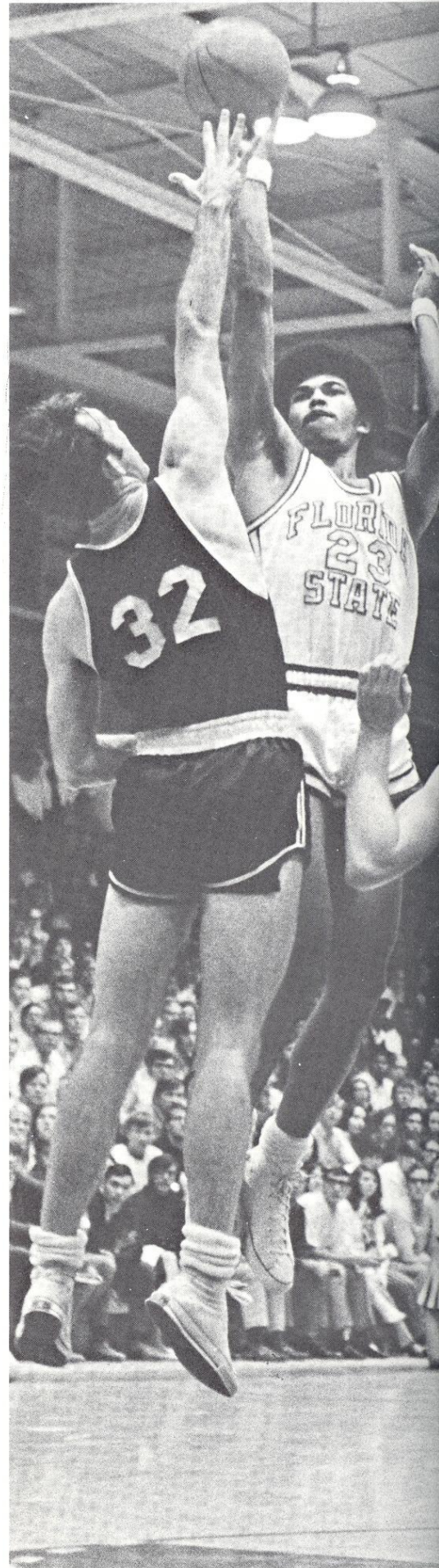
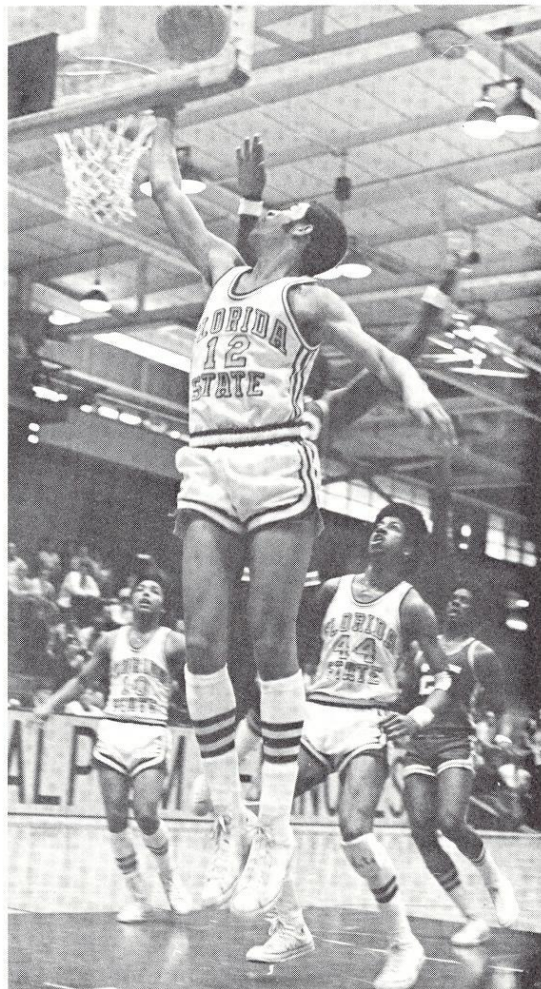
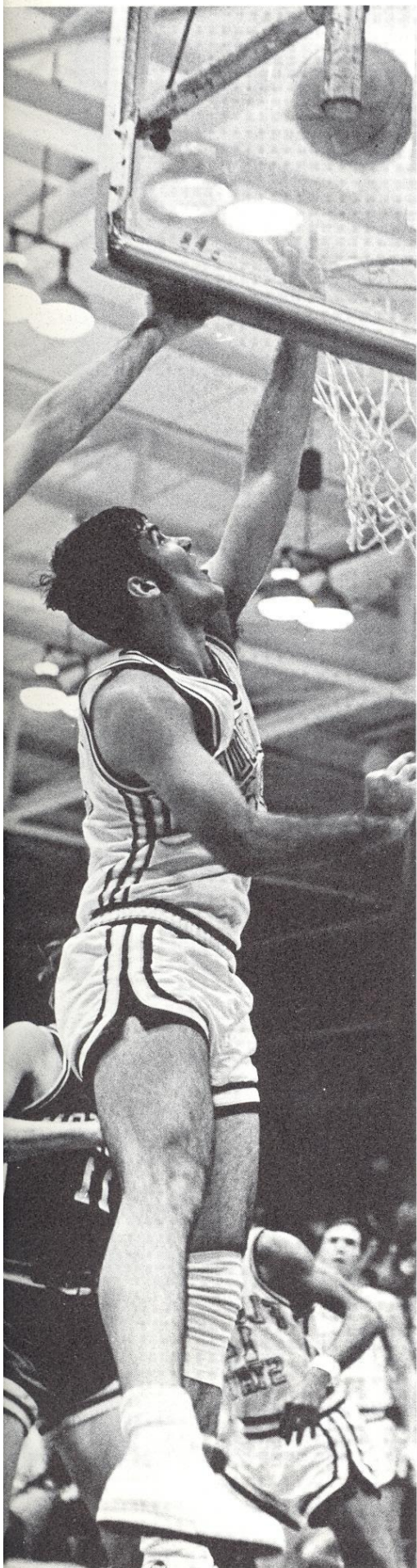
