





MEET THE SEMINOLES

Guard BILL DAWKINS of Miami, an Intercollegiate All-State and All-Dixie Conference selection last year, is playing his fourth season as a regular for Florida State and will captain the team. . . Bill sets a great example for the ball club by his own stellar play and has fine leadership qualities. . . . He is a physical education major and hopes to coach in the state after he graduates in June. . . .

GUARDS—CHARLIE BOOTH of Lakeland is a Sophomore with lots of promise. . . . CHARLEY BROWN of Monongahela, Pa., will also be used as a tackle and line-backer on defense. One of the best newcomers on the squad. . . MAC HUEY of Tampa lettered at quarterback last year, outgrew the backfield and is learning fast as a lineman. He plays tackle or backs up the line on defense. . . BOB SCHMELZ of Willoughby, Ohio, like Captain Dawkins, is starting his fourth season as a Florida State regular. He was an All-Dixie Conference selection last Fall and is expected to have his greatest year. . . ROGER SLABAUGH of Mishawaka, Ind., may be the best of the Freshmen candidates at this position. . . . BOB TULLY of Tallahassee was a reserve on the 1949 Seminoles. Bob has lots of fire, likes it rough and backs up the line on defense. . . . BOBBY WALKER of Augusta, Ga., is a newcomer who is improving. . . .

TACKLES—VERN FREEZE of Mishawaka, Ind., is a promising Freshman who also punts well. . . . JOHN KARLOWICZ of Fairbank, Pa., is a newcomer who is outstanding on defense. . . DONALD LINTON of Port St. Joe was a reserve fullback on Florida State's 1950 eleven. He's learning fast as a lineman. . . DOSSEY MERRITT of Lakeland is the largest man on the 1951 Florida State squad at 243 pounds. Dossey, a Freshman, handles his weight well and may become a great player if he continues to develop. . . ERNIE NAGY of South Bend, Ind., is a big newcomer who could help if he can stay away from the injury jinx that seems to follow him. . . EARL O'NEAL of Valdosta, Ga., was a letterman guard last year and looks even better at tackle. Earl is one of the most aggressive players on the squad. He plays guard on defense. . . . NAT POLAK of Miami is another promising Freshman who lacks experience. . . VIC SZCZEPANIK of East Rochester, Pa., is one of the two returning lettermen tackles. He likes the going rough and is at his best on offense. . . BOB WODRICH of Miami lettered at Florida State as a Freshman last Fall and is expected to play lots of ball. He is also battling an early season injury jinx. . . . GORDON DAVIS of Fort Myers, TOM NADRICH of Youngstown, Ohio, CHUCK SANDERS of Monongahela, Pa., and GEORGE KIRBY of Tallahassee are all unproved Freshmen. . .

CENTERS—BUDDY BRYANT of Perry was a letterman on Florida State's first football team in 1947 and has been out of school since. . . . He could help plenty if and when he gets back into shape. . . STEVE KALENICH of Barberton, Ohio, was the Seminole's regular center last Fall and is expected to do better this year. . . ED LOCKARD of Jacksonville is another returning letterman at center. MARVIN MOLLNOW of Jacksonville Beach looks good at times—he's a new-comer. . . TOMMY OWEN of Webster was a reserve center last year and is expected to have a great year. . . BILL WHALEY of Ocala is a promising Freshman who has scrap but lacks experience. . . Ditto JOHN MURCHEK of East Chicago, III., and EARL BROWN of Tallahassee. . . .


ENDS—JIM ARNOLD of Bainbridge, Ga., is one of the smallest men on the squad and one of the surest tacklers. . . . He was a defensive standout for the Seminoles as a Freshman last year. . . CURTIS CAMPBELL of Pensacola is a returning letterman who is a fine pass receiver and is equally good on defense. . . BILL DRIVER of Girard, III., was the Seminoles' regular quarterback last season and is looking even better at end. . . JOE ROBINSON of Coral Gables seems to be the most promising Freshman end. . . BOB WHITMER of South Bend, Ind., is a fine pass receiver and blocker. . . Big and rangy, Bob could be great this Fall if he catches fire. . . . Newcomers GENE BRIDGES of Pensacola, JERRY ELLENWOOD of Fort Wayne, Ind., AL GARRETT of Sarasota, TED MORRILL of Miami and MANUEL MOSHONAS of Tarpon Springs are still unknown quantities. . . .

QUARTERBACKS—PRESS BRADLEY of Lake Wales lettered as a fullback last year and has looked even better in his new blocking back role. . . . TOM SEBRING of Tallahassee is the best passer of the quarterbacks and also punts well. . . . JIMMY LEE TAYLOR of Tampa, a newcomer, is a good blocker and may also be used as a defensive end. . . . DICK TURK of South Bend, Ind., gained lots of ground for the Seminoles as a fullback last Fall and will probably be used at two positions this year. Dick's ability as a blocker prompted his shift to quarterback. . . . GERALD SMITH of Miami and JOHNNY SHEPPARD of Tallahassee are promising Freshmen. . . .

HALFBACKS—PHIL ALVERS of Pomona Park was a reserve last year. . . . WAYNE BENNER of LaPorte, Ind., is a great defensive halfback and a good punter. . . . HARRY BRINGGER of Winter Haven is one of the fastest men on the squad, a shifty runner, good pass receiver and fine defensive halfback. . . . TOMMY BROWN of Tallahassee, rated one of the finest pass defense backs in the South, will also do most of the Seminole's punting. . . BOBBY FIVEASH of Bainbridge, Ga., is a Sophomore with great promise as a runner and passer. . . GARY FOLSOM of Jacksonville is at his best when throwing the ball. Gary is a returning reserve. . . ERNIE HUGGETT of Mishawaka, Ind., is the Seminole's kickoff and extra point specialist. . . NELSON ITALIANO of Tampa is the number one tailback of Florida State's single wing attack. Nelson passes and punts well, and is an outstanding runner. . . ROY THOMPSON of Wrightsville, Ga., is probably the best of the new players on the squad this season. Fast, shifty and a hard runner, he is a touchdown threat every time he gets beyond the line of scrimmage. . . . TOM MASSEY of Gary, Ind., and AL WOODHAM of Albany, Ga., are the unproved newcomers. . .

FULLBACKS—GEORGE CARNES of Tampa is a promising Freshman who is at his best on defense. . . . GEORGE GRAHAM of Santa Rosa, Calif., is a hard, fast runner. . . . RONALD KING of Daytona Beach, a Sophomore, is big and looks great at times. . . . MIKE SELLERS of Barberton, Ohio, was an intercollegiate All-State and All-Dixie Conference selection last year when he paced the Seminoles in scoring. Great on offense or defense, Mike is expected to have his best year.

THE TROY STATE RED WAVE

Modern Troy State Teachers College was founded in 1887 as a State Normal School, with administrative and school buildings located in the heart of the city of Troy, Alabama.

In 1927 the institution was moved to its present site on a tract of 310 acres in the southeastern section of Troy. The city of Troy lies 50 miles southeast of Alabama's State Capital, Montgomery, and has a population of around 10,000.

Troy State is a coeducational institution with an enrollment of around 1,000 students.

In 1935 Troy was admitted to the S.I.A.A., and is still a member. Troy was also a charter member of the now disbanded Alabama Intercollegiate Conference. Troy, as a member of the A.I.C. won two Alabama Intercollegiate Conference grid titles and two baseball pennants. They also hold one A.I.C. consolation basketball trophy. In 1939 and 1941 Troy annexed the football titles, and won baseball crowns in 1939 and 1949.

The "Red Wave" dropped intercollegiate football in 1942 because of the war. They rejoined collegiate ranks in 1946 with an abbreviated collegiate program. They played seven games.

In 1947, under the leadership of Buddy Mc-Collum Troy returned to full-time competition.

Athletic teams of Troy State are known by such nicknames as "Red Wave" and "Wavemen." The school's colors are Crimson and Black.


Leaders of the Wavemen for the '51 season will be two outstanding backfield performers.

Allen "Tater" Harrell who hails from Montgomery, Alabama, will captain the "Red Wave." Ersell Beck, 165-pound defensive ace, from Sweetwater, Ala., will act as alternate-captain.

Harrell is a brilliant quarterback, and will do most of the signal calling this season. He is a junior, 5-9 and 175 pounds.

Ersell Beck, known as the "Sweetwater Comet" will lead the defensive eleven. He will also do most of the punt returning.

Troy faces a tough schedule this season under a new coach, Jim Grantham, former University of Alabama star. The Wavemen will be Grantham's first college team. He came to Troy from Peekskill (N. Y.) Military Academy where his teams have gone undefeated in their last 17 starts. Grantham's assistant coach this year will be Leonard Serfustini who played his college ball at University of Buffalo.


