




#### FLORIDA STATE vs. FLORIDA


- Florida State moved up to 16th in the AP and Coaches polls this week after its 49-17 win over Louisiana. The Seminoles have won four straight games by at least 25 points, the longest active streak in the nation and the 2nd-longest streak by any team in 2022.
- FSU has an ACC-best five 30-point victories this season, which trails only Ohio State and Tennessee's six each among P5 programs. The Seminoles are one of two P5 teams with two 30-point wins on the road and one of only five P5 programs with three 30-point victories in conference play.
- During its current four-game winning streak, Florida State has outscored its opponents 173-39 while
  outgaining them 1,956-903 in total offense. The Seminoles are averaging 239.0 rushing yards and 250.0
  passing yards per game while holding opponents to 104.8 rushing yards and 121.0 passing yards per game.
  Florida State has completed 70.1 percent of its passes and is 21-of-22 on red zone opportunities in that
  stretch.
- Florida State is 1st in the ACC and 4th in the country in pass defense, holding opponents to an average of 155.4 yards per game through the air, and also are 1st in the ACC and 4th nationally holding opponents to an average of 5.7 yards per pass attempt.
- FSU has rushed for at least 200 yards in six straight games, the longest active streak in the nation and the program's longest streak since starting the 1995 season with six consecutive 200-yard games. The Seminoles lead the ACC in yards per rush and rushing offense, with their average of 5.54 yards per rush 9th nationally, and their average of 217.0 rushing yards per game 14th.
- FSU leads the nation with seven touchdown drives of 90+ yards and is 2nd nationally with 15 touchdown drives of 80+ yards this season.

#### **QUICK HITS**

- · Florida State, Georgia and Ohio State are the only teams ranked in the top-10 in yards per play on offense and defense. The Seminoles are 9th nationally with an average of 4.57 yards per play allowed and 10th with an average of 6.87 yards per play.
- •FSU is one of six teams in the nation that ranks in the top-25 in total defense, scoring defense, total offense and scoring offense. The Seminoles are 11th in the country allowing an average of 293.4 yards per game on defense, 13th with an average of 18.0 points allowed per game, 16th with 473.7 yards of total offense per game and 23rd scoring an average of 35.4 points per game.
- $\cdot$  FSU is one of three teams in the country, and the only team in the ACC, averaging at least 250 yards of passing offense and at least 210 yards of rushing offense per game this season. Of the three ACC teams averaging better than 250 yards of passing offense, the next-closest rushing offense is North Carolina's 163.8 yards per game.
- · Florida State has scored on 16 of 22 first drives of a half this season, with 15 touchdowns on those 16 scoring drives for a total of 106 points. The Seminoles lead the ACC and are 2nd in the country with a 68.2 percent touchdown rate on opening drives of a half (via ESPN Stats & Info).
- · Florida State is one of two teams in the country that is ranked in the top-20 in kickoff return average, punt return average and punt return defense. FSU is 9th in the country and 4th in the ACC with an average of 24.77 yards per kickoff return, is 2nd in the conference and 18th in the nation allowing an average of 3.56 yards per punt return and is 3rd in the conference and 20th nationally with an average of 11.58 yards per punt return.
- $\cdot$  Florida State's defense has held opponents to an average of 128.8 yards of total offense in the first half, with opponents gaining only 56.3 yards rushing and 72.6 yards passing in the first 30 minutes. The Seminoles are outscoring opponents 230-84 in the first half and have held eight opponents to three or fewer first-half points.
- Mike Norvell is 19-5 (.792) in November, including 3-0 this season, with an average margin of victory of 41.0-25.2.







#### QUARTERBACK



### JORDAN TRAVIS

- Redshirt junior **Jordan Travis** leads the country with an 81.6 completion percentage and 205.09 passer rating in November.
- and 205.09 passer rating in November.

  Travis became the second player in school history and first since Red Parish in 1949 with a rushing, passing and receiving touchdown in the same game when he accomplished the feat in FSU's 38-3 win at Syracuse. Travis completed 21-of-23 passes against the Orange for a career-best 91.3 completion percentage.
- With three more touchdowns against Louisiana (two rushing and one passing), Travis has five consecutive games with three or more touchdowns and one or fewer turnover. That is tied with USC's Caleb Williams for the longest active streak in the country (via ESPN Stats & Info). He is the second Seminole in school history to do it and first since Bill Cappleman in 1968.
- Among ACC quarterbacks, Travis is 2nd in yards per attempt (8.86), yards
- per completion (13.58) and completion percentage (65.3); and 3rd in passing efficiency (161.2), points responsible for (164), passing touchdowns (21), passing yards (2,526) and passing yards per game (229.6). He has completed at least 60 percent of his passes in 12 of his last 15 games.
- Over the last three games, Travis has accounted for 11 touchdowns and thrown nine incompletions.

#### RUNNING BACK






- With 251 rushing yards against Louisiana, Florida State has rushed for over 200 yards in six consecutive games and seven times this season. The last time FSU had a longer 200-yard rushing streak was 1987, when FSU did it in seven consecutive games.
- The Noles have seven 200-yard rushing games this season, including a season-high 406 yards against Duquesne that is the 5th-most for any Power 5 team this season. FSU leads the ACC with 2170 rushing yards per game and 5.54 yards per carry.
- Benson is 3rd in the country, averaging 7.06 yards per carry. He ran for over 100 yards and set a career
- high in three consecutive games after rushing for 163 yards on 18 carries (91 ypc) at Syracuse. It was the most rushing yards for a Seminole in an ACC road game since Dalvin Cook's 225 at Syracuse in 2016 (Cook was also the last player with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games). Benson's 163 yards are the most for an ACC player on the road this season.
- most for an ACC player on the food unis season.

  On November 5, Benson ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns at Miami; against Georgia Tech on October 29, Benson had filf rushing yards and two touchdowns in his first career start. He was named the ACC Running Back of the Week in all three games, the
- first player in ACC history to be named outright ACC Running Back of the Week three straight weeks.

  Benson led FSU with 80 yards against Louisiana,
  adding his team-high sixth rushing touchdown.
  Travis and Ward each scored twice on the ground,
  and FSU is the only team in the ACC and one of just
  four nationally (No. 1 Georgia, No. 6 LSU and No. 9
  Tennessee) to have four players score at least five
  rushing touchdowns this season (Benson 6; Travis,
  Toafili, Ward 5).





# WR #14 JOHNNY WILSON

- Florida State has had seven different players lead (or co-lead) the team in receiving yards this season after Ja 'Khi Douglas caught hiree passes for 43 yards at Syracuse. Florida State has had 12 players catch at least one touchdown this year, tied for the 2nd-most in the country and the most for Florida State since 1982.
- Johnny Wilson is 2nd in the ACC and 7th nationally with 19.7 yards per reception. Wilson leads FSU with 33 catches, 649 yards and five receiving touchdowns.
- At Louisville, Wilson was named ACC Receiver of the Week after setting career highs with seven catches, 149 yards and two touchdowns, both in the fourth quarter of FSU's 35-31 win.
- Wilson caught a 69-yard pass from Tate Rodemaker against the Cardinals. On the next play, Wilson caught a 10-yard touchdown. In the fourth quarter, Wilson caught a two-yard touchdown from Rodemaker on 3rd-and-goal that proved to be the game winner.
- Wilson's 149 receiving yards were the most for any
- Seminole receiver since 2019 and the 2nd-most in FSU's 23-game series against Louisville (Kermit Whitfield, 172 in 2015).
- Against the Yellow Jackets, Wilson caught a 78-yard touchdown from Jordan Travis, the longest catch in Wilson's career and Travis's longest completion. It was FSU's longest offensive play of the season and the longest pass for the Noles since a 91-yard completion in the 2019 Sun Bowl.
- Wilson led FSU against Georgia Tech with 111 receiving yards, his second career 100-yard game.

#### DEFENSE



### JARED VERSE

- Defensive end Jared Verse leads FSU with 14.0 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks, leading the ACC in sacks per game (0.75), TFL per game (1.40) and total TFL. After missing the previous game-and-ahalf due to injury, Verse had 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack against No. 22 Wake Forest. He played just 23 snaps against the Demon Deacons.
- Verse is 11th nationally in tackles for loss. He is one
  of three players in the ACC with three games of 2.5
  tackles for loss this season.
- Aside from the Louisville game, when he left with an injury, Verse has at least 1.0 tackle for loss in every game he has played. Against Louisiana, he had a seven-yard sack, one of FSU's four in the game, tying a season high (Georgia Tech, Wake Forest, LSU).
- At Miami, Verse had a 12-yard sack and returned a fumble 10 yards, the first fumble recovery of his career. FSU's four takeaways at Miami were a season high. Verse added a six-yard sack at Syracuse and was one of three Noies to lead the

team with four tackles.

- In a breakout game against LSU, all three of Verse's tackles were behind the line of scrimmage - 2.0 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. He also blocked a field goal in the second quarter, FSU's first since the 2020 season opener against Georgia Tech.
- In his FSU debut against Duquesne, Verse had the Seminoles' only sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. The Albany transfer - one of the top newcomers of the 2022 class - has 19 career starts.




