If you know about Florida State University's basketball team you'll recognize the name of the Seminoles' head coach. If you follow the Tribe closely, you'll also understand the title.

It seems Bud Kennedy knew what he was talking about in November when he predicted his team would better last year's 11-11 record. He also felt pretty sure of his boys early in January after the Seminoles lost a 78-61 decision to Miami. He made the blunt statement, "We'll beat Miami in Tallahassee on February 5."

Even with the hindrance of an untimely automobile accident involving five top players, the bustling tribesmen have raced to 11 victories already and have three more chances to increase the total. They've lost only six. Florida State's overall record is the top college mark in the state. The Seminoles may also lay claim to the mythical state championship with an 8-2 record against Florida opponents.

State's victory over Miami Friday night was witnessed by an

overflow crowd of 800, largest in the west campus gym this season.

FSU led until midway in the third quarter and gained a tie at the same point in the final period. With a minute and 50 seconds left, the score read 69-69. Seven straight charity shots by the Seminoles completely dominated this remaining time as FSU won 76-69.

Jim Oler's 26 points led the Seminoles as they connected on 32 of 40 foul attempts, a new single-game high.
