

**GAINESVILLE (AP)**—Florida kept its basketball slate clean for the season when Joe Hobbs hit a 30-foot left-handed push shot in the final second last night for a 67-65 victory over Florida State.

This first regularly scheduled basketball game between the two state universities gave a crowd of 5,500 plenty to shout about in the wild finish.

FSU went in front after about five minutes, built a 42-36 half-time edge and stayed ahead by as much as eight points until there were only six minutes left.

Then Burt Touchberry put Florida in front 61-59 and the Gators pulled away to 65-61. FSU's Hugh Durham stole the ball and scored, then Bobby Waites repeated the feat and the score was tied with eight seconds left.

Hobbs raced the clock down the court, dribbled through Florida

State defenders and let fly the shot that fell through as the final buzzer sounded. Hobbs and Waites shared scoring honors with 20 points each.

In addition to giving Florida its third straight victory, it kept the Gators dominant over FSU. Florida won both their previous meetings in the Gator Bowl Basketball Tournament.
