MIAMI, Feb. 23—Miami's fast-closing Hurricanes, almost unbeatable at home this season, wrapped up their best basketball campaign in years with an 86-66 victory over Florida State's Seminoles here tonight.

It left Miami with a 14-8 mark and reversed a 71-70 licking the Hurricanes got from PSU in Tailahassee last month.

The 'Canes opened fast and ran up a 10-2 margin while it took the Seminoles almost six minutes to bag their first field goal. Bud Kennedy's Seminoles pulled within two points at 21-19, but Miami pulled away again for a 37-25 halftime lend.

Forward Marty Burdette's four successive long shots just before intermission proved too much. Burdette wound up as the game's high scorer with 23 points.

FSU had four starters in double figures, aithough usually
high-scoring guard Hugh Durham was checked with a more
five. Burt Deckel led the Seminoles with 18. Jim Liteky had
13. Danny Boltz 12, and Larry
Strom 10.

Miami hit a whopping total of 32 free shots in 37 attempts as PSU was assessed with 23 personal fouls. FSU made good on 14 of 23 charity efforts.

From the floor, the 'Canes were hotter, too, Miami hit 36 per cent of its field goal attempts, FSU 33 per cent.

Rebounding was much closer. Miami pulled in 44 rebounds to FSU's 41.

The Seminoles, now 8-15 for the season, face Tampa at Tampa Monday night in their road finale, PSU plays Georgia in a season-ender in Tallahassee March 3.
