5,600 FANS

A lively sudience of some 5,000 fans turned out for the sixth meeting between the state rivals and the third in Gainesville. For awhile, it looked like the game might turn out like the two previous games played here.

In 1956 and 1957, the Getors nipped the Seminoles by two points and one point, respectively. It was a sec-saw affair again last night until Florida pulled away just before the half and maintained a margin of five or more points the rest of the way

It was the second win for the undefeated Gators and FSU's third straight loss in three games on foreign courts.

Junior guard Bobby Shiver of Florida and senior center John Richter of FSU gave the crowd most of the thrills. Both hit for 13 points in the first 20 minutes. Shiver finished with the game's scoring honors, bagging 23 points. Richter wound up with 22 points.

The big difference came on the boards. With 5-8 forward George Jung pulling in 19 rebounds and center Bobby Sherwood setting 18, the Galors outrebounded the Seminoles, 70-58, Both teams had four players to soble in double flatter. Forward Rufus Ainworth and guard Tim Béney, both sophomores, sot 11 and 19 points for FSU.

Shooting was about equal. Florida canned 32 of 30 shots for a 40 per cent effort, and PSU hit on 29 of 76 for 38 per
