Ray Swain, who hit 58 per cent of his 12 field goal attempts, ended with 15.

Fedor and Long also led the rebounding with nine recoveries apiece. Swain pulled down eight.

Lou Alix turned in an iron-man performance for the Hurricanes, hitting on 11 of 25 field goals, finishing with 23 points, and grabbing 17 rebounds. Mike McCoy had 14 rebounds for the 'Canes.

Florida State, ranked second in the nation in field goal accuracy with a .497 going into last night's game, hit 30 of 62 for 48 per cent.

FSU led by five in the first half when Dale Reeves' layup put it at 43-38 with 15 seconds left. Lou Alix put Miami ahead by four with 12:28 left in the first half.

LEAD PARED

With 13:46 left in the game, FSU had moved to a 54-47 advantage, then Miami came roaring back to tie it at 56-56, go ahead 63-60, with 9:14 left.

Dale Ricketts tied it up quickly when he hit two of a 1-and-1 free throw situation and sank one for a Miami technical foul.

Fedor put FSU ahead to stay with 3:16 left with a short jump shot to make it 76-74.

FSU, now 13-8 for the year, plays at Tampa tomorrow night, takes on Georgia in Tallahassee Friday night. WTAL will broadcast the Tampa game.
