

MEMPHIS, Tenn. —

Florida State continued on its winning ways Saturday night behind the hot hands of Ron Malmén and Jerry Shirley toppling Memphis State for the second time this season 81-70.

Shirley was the big gun for the Seminoles in the first half netting 13 of 15 points on outside poppers on the clicking shuffle offense.

After Gary Schull got the Seminoles rolling with a free throw, Shirley hit three straight jumpers for a 9-7 FSU lead.

Florida State, held a 37-28 margin at the half which saw rough going all the way. A total of 25 fouls were assessed on Memphis State, 24 on FSU. Florida State was successful on 33 of 39 foul line attempts.

In the second half, Malmén provided the impetus with his long jump shots as the Semi-

noles hit 24 - for - 50 from the field for the evening.

Memphis State narrowed the lead to 60-67 with 5:22 remaining before Malmén shook loose for a layup with an assist from Gonzalez. Memphis State came right back with a bucket but Gonzalez hit a 10-footer and Malmén a long one to put the Tribe out of reach.

Florida State held the edge in rebounding, 50-47, with big Gary Schull pulling down 15 and controlling both backboards.

Shirley, Malmén, Schull and guard Bobby Lovell were all saddled with four fouls in the late going but reserves Ken Leakey and Bill Peacock filled in hitting seven and nine respectively.

Malmén led the Tribe with 22 points, Shirley had 15 and Schull 12.

Tim Morgan headed the Memphis State attack with 18

points while heralded John Hillman was held to 12. He managed only six against the Tribe in the first meeting.

Florida State is now 13-7 on the year after a successful road trip which saw the tribe trim Duquesne Thursday night and now the Tigers.
