

Florida State's baseball team combed Furman pitching for 16 hits yesterday afternoon as Coach Danny Litwhiler's spirited Tribe smothered the Purple Hurricane 20-0.

Pitcher Max Long, like Tony

Avitable in Friday's opener, proved an enigma to Hurricane batters. He limited Furman to just one hit, a double in the fifth inning by shortstop Jerry Penland.

A double in the sixth inning in Friday's contest, won 6-1 by FSU, was the only other hit the Hurricanes mustered in the two-game series.

Yesterday's contest was limited to seven innings on agreement between Litwhiler and Furman Coach Billy Kerr. The agreement was reached at the end of the 5th inning when the Tribe had moved ahead 17-0.

QUICK PRODUCTION

FSU put the game on ice right at the start by pouring six runs across the plate in the first inning.

Owen McCarron was safe on shortstop Jerry Penland's error. Successive singles by Carlee Hendrix and Ham Bisbee pushed him across the plate. Fred Twomey walked to fill the sacks, and Lee Corso followed suit to push another tally across. Bisbee scored on a grounder by Dick Houser that forced Corso at second, and Twomey tallied on a single by catcher Gary Ashley. Phil Hunt's single scored Houser, and Ashley finished the first inning scoring by coming in on Max Long's infield out.

The Seminoles uncorked an eight-run outburst in the third inning.

Three more runs in the fourth and another trio in the 6th finished the wild scoring spree for the Indians.

TWO FOR SEEVERS

Four doubles by the Seminoles and the one by Furman were the only extra base blows in the game. Fred Twomey, Gale Tuggle and Riley Seevers, who nailed two, were the double producers for FSU.

Litwhiler cleared his bench to start the fifth inning, but newcomers Harvey Sweeney, Gale Tuggle, Seevers and Bob Roselle continued to murder Furman

pitching, collecting six hits in their two innings.
