

Florida State exploded with 20 hits against the University of Miami here yesterday afternoon to crush the Hurricanes for the second straight day, 21-3, at Seminole Field.

Junior righthander Frank Slusser went the route for the Seminoles to clinch his second victory of the season, beating the Hurricanes 21-3. Slusser pitched a heavy-hitting performance, hitting home runs and drove in runs across the plate. Slusser left FSU with a 4-1 record for the season, and a 1-1 record in Florida Intercollegiate Baseball Conference play. Miami now has a 7-9 season record.

The Tribe spread out the

scoring over seven of their eight innings at the plate, being blanked only in the sixth by reliever Al Patz. Miami starter Roger Newman was the victim of 14 Seminoles runs. Newman was pulled in the first of the first two coming on a homerun over the right field wall by first baseman Gerald Philp. Philp had three hits and three RBIs in the afternoon.

The losers also had a home run, third baseman John Mathews driving one over the left field barrier with nobody on in the sixth.

In the Seminole first, with one down, Carlos Hendrix walked. Phil Hunt beat out a bunt single. Dick Howser walked and Lee Corso's single and heads up base running by Howser produced three runs. Philp's homer brought in the last two.

DOUBLE PLAYS

Slusser fanned five men during the afternoon, and three Seminole double plays helped him out of the trouble spots. The only serious Miami threat came when they tallied their last two runs in the sixth.

In addition to Slusser's four hits, Howser and Philp had three apiece while Corso drove in four runs with two hits.

Friday, the Seminoles begin a long road trip against Georgia Teachers College at Statesboro, Ga. They will play 10 games on the road to close out their season, ending May 1-2 against Rollins at Winter Park.
