## Auburn Downs FSU In Tenth Plainsmen Win Eighth Straight At Home; Series Finale Today

Special To The Democrat AUBURN, Ala. — It looked as if Auburn's record of seven straight wins in the friendly confides of Plainsman Park was at an end here Monday before the big bat of sophomore Rex Frederick once again came through in the clutch as the Tigers edged Florida State, 10-9, in ten innings.

Big Rex, brought the long afternoon of runs, hits, and errors to a screeching halt with a game-winning single past the Seminole third baseman with the bases loaded and one out in the tenth. Captain Billy Ray Roberson came across with the winning run.

Previously during the game, the 6-5 sophomore had accounted for four runs—batted-in with a inside-the-park homer deep into left-center in the seventh, and two other singles.

His last blow gave him 4-for-5 at bat, and set him back into the team RBI leadership with 20. The lefthanded slugger, who swings a Mickey Mantle model bat and resembles Ted Williams, also moved up in battling percentage from .375 to .415.

This puts Fredericks in a challenging position for teammate L. F. Lanier's SEC-leading .429 average. Lanier who went into yesterday's game at .453, was one of the few Tiger regulars not contributing to the 13-hit attack as he went 0 for 3. Centerfielder Owen McCarron, with three singles, first baseman Jerry Philip with a double and a single, and third baseman Phillip Hunt, with two singles, led the Florida State Attack. Righthander Fred McDuffie, a sophomore, came in as a pinchhitter in the ninth and went on to pitch the tenth to get credit for his fourth win of the season against a single loss.

McDuffie pitched to only four men in his half of the tenth, allowing one hit and striking out one.

Then Roberson's single, a misplayed sacrifice by Jack Crouch, and a walk to Morris Savage loaded the bases to set the stage for Fredericks' winning blow. The winning hit came off Jerry Boxer, the last of the three FSU hurlers, and gave him his second loss against four wins.

The two teams meet here again today with Auburn bidding for its ninth straight home success.
