FSU came back with one run in the third inning when Miami pitcher Vic Stenson walked Bazzell and White with two out, then gave up a line single to rightfielder Bob Clem.

The Seminoles tied the game in the sixth inning on a single by Doug Walker and a double by Catcher Hank Ross and moved ahead in the seventh on consecutive doubles by Bazzell and White.

Miami evened the game at y three runs apiece in its half of the seventh when conferfielder Luis Deli slammed a 370-foot home run to right-center.

The winning pitcher for Florida State was Frank Davis who struck out 10 and walked only one.

The same two teams meet again this afternoon at 3 p.m. Carl Nelson is scheduled to pitch for FSU.
