

MIAMI—Florida State's baseballers gained their second come-from-behind victory in two days when they smacked Miami's Hurricanes, 10-6, here yesterday.

Trailing 4-3 in the eighth inning, the Seminoles pushed across six runs on only three hits to put the game on ice.

TWELVE MEN

FSU paraded 12 men to the plate in its big inning. It all started when catcher Hank Ross got on first by an error. John Slaton, pinch hitting for John King, got hit by a pitch and the bases became loaded on a bunt single by Ernie Lanford.

A force-out at the plate left the bases loaded. A walk to Ray Bazzell sent one run across and two more followed on a double to center by Jimmy White.

Doug Walker drove in two more runs when he sliced a single to center.

Miami gained a 2-0 lead in the first inning on a pair of hits and two walks.

The Hurricanes added a single run in the third without benefit of a hit.

ALL TIED UP

FSU got one run in the third on a double by Bazzell and a single by Bob Clem. The Seminoles tied the game at 3-3 with two runs in the fourth inning. Three walks, a stolen base, and a double did the damage.

Miami moved out front in the seventh inning when Frank Thurber, who collected four hits in five at bats, led off with a single and came home in a double error by the Seminoles' second baseman.

Miami got its final two runs in the eighth on three walks and another hit by Thurber.

The winning pitcher was FSU righthander Carl Nelson. Nelson allowed only four hits in seven innings but stayed in trouble with seven walks.

The Seminoles open a two-

game series with Stetson at Deland today. Ray McShane is scheduled to be the starting FSU hurler.

The Seminoles return to Tallahassee Friday to open a two-game stand against Georgia and Ohio State. The Seminoles, Bulldogs, and Buckeyes will participate in double-headers Friday and Saturday, with first games set for 12:30 p.m.
