

Lanky senior righthander Jim Daniel (1-0) and junior southpaw Ray McShane were probable pitching choices as Florida State's heavy-hitting baseball nine went after a series sweep in a double-header with Auburn today.

The twin bill was to start at 12:30 at Seminole Field.

Frank Davis' good right arm was up to its old tricks yesterday and the senior pitcher batted in three runs himself as the Tribe dumped Auburn, 10-1. It was the third straight win for Danny Litwhiler's unbeaten Seminoles.

Davis was touched for only six hits and one unearned run in notching his 17th career victory for FSU. He walked one and struck out six to run his career strikeout record to 152.

The Seminoles rapped three Auburn pitchers for 15 hits, three each by Davis, rightfielder Neil Martin, centerfielder Gary Elliott, and shortstop Roger Zimmerman. Second baseman Jim Douglas and leftfielder Bo Davis had two hits apiece for the Tigers.

Leftlander Jim Boyd, reached for 12 hits and six runs during the first five innings, was the losing pitcher. FSU has hammered out 41 hits and scored 30 runs in its first three games.

Catch Erskine Russell's Tigers picked up their only run in the third inning on Douglas' single and two errors. Elliott promptly erased that one-run deficit by leading off the last of the third with a towering drive that carried over the left-field wall at the 360-foot mark.

Three more FSU runs crossed in the third on a walk to second baseman Jack Dull and singles by leftfielder Dwight Smith, first baseman Doug Walker, and Zimmerman.

Singles by Zimmerman, third baseman George Fergusson, Martin and Elliott produced two more Seminole runs in the fifth. Three walks and Davis' single made it 8-1, FSU, in the sixth.

The Seminoles' final two runs came in the eighth on an error, a walk, and hits by Davis and Martin.

Elliott's home run gave the Tribe an average of at least one round-tripper a game. Martin and Smith smacked homers against Georgia last week.

Dull turned in the day's best fielding play. Auburn's Bo Davis singled with one away in the ninth. Catcher Vic Svetlev hit a sharp grounder through the box. Dull raced in behind second, back-handed the ball, and flipped it to shortstop Kyle Spitzer to force Davis.
