

**MIAMI** — Senior pitching flash Frank Davis hurled his second shutout in recent weeks and picked up the 20th victory of his collegiate career as Florida State blanked Miami's Hurricanes, 2-0, here yesterday.

It was the sixth straight triumph for the sizzling Seminoles and their 17th in 21 games this season.

#### **SHARP DUTY**

The teams close a two-game series today with junior left-hander Ray MacShane (4-1) set to pitch for FSU.

Always tough on Miami, Davis worked one of the best games of his sparkling career yesterday. The former Miami Edison student faced only 31 batters, gave up only three singles, and didn't allow a Miami runner past second base.

Davis thus raised his all-time FSU career record to 20-7. The control specialist was 8-3 during both his sophomore and junior season and is 4-1 this year. Davis has allowed 15 earned runs in 56 innings this season for a 2.41 earned-run average.

Davis had shut out Duke in a 4-0 Seminole triumph at Tallahassee last month. He worked yesterday's game with a sizeable blister on the middle finger of his pitching hand.

While Davis had the Hurricanes eating out of his hand, the Seminoles were managing eight hits off Miami's Dean Booth. Second baseman Jack Dull paced the attack with three singles in four trips.

FSU scored both its runs in the

sixth inning. First baseman Doug Walker led off with a single to right. Dull followed with a single to center. Shortstop Roger Zimmerman and centerfielder Bob Madison then flied out.

#### **DOUBLE THEFT**

With two way, Walker and Dull worked a double steal, with Walker taking third and Dull second. Third baseman George Fergusson walked to fill the bases and when Booth walked catcher Buddy Teagle, Walker was forced in with the first run.

Davis then aided his own cause with a high bouncer to third that went for an infield single, scoring Dull.

Moving nearer its fifth NCAA district playoff invitation in six years, FSU has won seven straight games from Miami and now owns a 17-4 edge in the state rivalry.
