

MIAMI — Scoring all its runs in three big innings, Florida State's hustling baseball team spoiled Miami's Hurricanes, 14-6, to complete a two-game sweep here yesterday.

The Seminoles, ranked sixth nationally in a college baseball poll, thus have won seven straight games and now have a glittering 18-4 season record.

A four-game road sweep, two from Florida Southern and a pair from Miami, virtually assures FSU of an at-large invitation to the NCAA District 3 playoffs in June.

Boosting their team batting average to .303, the hard-hitting Seminoles rapped three Miami pitchers for 16 hits, four by e

Zimmerman, reliable sophomore shortstop, batted in three runs with his timely hitting. Outfielder Bob Madison, third baseman

George Fergusson, and catcher Buddy Teagle each had two RBIs.

The score was tied at 2-2 when FSU sent 12 batters to the plate in its seven-run fifth inning. Four walks, an error, and hits by Zimmerman, Hal Mangin, McShane, and Martin did the damage.

FSU scored five more runs in the ninth on four straight hits, an error, and two more safeties. Ten Seminoles went to bat in the ninth.

The Tribe travels to Athens Friday to open a two-game series with Georgia's Bulldogs.

Martin boosted his average to a team-leading .381.

The pitching decision went to senior Jim Daniel, who bailed starter Ray McShane out of trouble in the fifth inning. Daniel now has a 6-1 record to pace the FSU mound staff.
